METSELLANEOUS: The Mets took both games of a twinbill against the Giants yesterday...New York swept a doubleheader from the Giants for the first time since July 13, 1979 at Shea Stadium...They have won six of their last seven games and clinched a winning homestand...Tonight, the Mets go for their fourth straight series victory...The Mets play their penultimate game their first homestand of the year, a seven-game stand against the Arizona Diamondbacks (2-1) and the San Francisco Giants (2$0)$...Following this series, the Mets head to Arizona (three games) and St. Louis (three games).

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won three consecutive games for the third time this season...Also April 7-9 and April 12-15...The Mets are the only team in baseball this year to put together three separate winning streaks of three or more games...The team put together seven such streaks for all of 2021 two during the 60-game schedule in 2020... Courtesy of Sports Radar.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASSITT: Chris Bassitt has not allowed more than three hits in his last six consecutive starts dating back to August 12, 2021...Only 20 pitchers (including openers) in modern history have had a longer streak...He has allowed only five runs in that span...The right-hander also has not given up more than three runs in his last eight consecutive starts, a streak that began on July 30, 2021 and still holds up.

A DOZEN IN: The Mets are 9-3 through their first 12 games...That is tied for the third-best record through 12 games in franchise history...Also, 2015, 1986 and 1985...The best record through 12 games is $11-1$ done by the 2018 Mets, followed by 10-2 by the 2006 team...The Mets have posted an ERA of 2.36 through 12 games, the fourth-best mark in franchise history... The have struck out 124, only one behind the 2019 Mets for the franchise record through 12 games.

1010 WINS: The Mets have recorded eight games with 10 or more strikeouts this season...That leads the major leagues...Max Scherzer became the fifth pitcher to strike out 10 or more batters in his first home start for the Mets...The four others all did so at Shea Stadium: Dick Selma (13 vs. Braves in 1965), Nolan Ryan (11 vs. Dodgers in 1968), Dennis Ribant (10 vs. Pirates in 1964), and Aaron Harang (10 vs. Nationals in 2013)... Courtesy of Elias...It was the 105th time in his career that he struck out at least 10...That is the fifth all-time behind Nolan Ryan (215), Randy Johnson (212), Roger Clemens (110), and Pedro Martinez (108)...Courtesy of ESPN Stats \& Info.

LEADING OFF: As a collective, the Mets are batting .290 when leading off an inning this year...That ranks third in the majors and second in the National League.

ONE, SINGULAR SENSATION: The Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1, in game two of the doubleheader yesterday...The Mets have held opponents to one or zero runs in five games this year, the most in the major leagues... The Mets have posted three shutouts this year, also the most in the big leagues.

SAN FRANCISCO LINDOR: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in all 12 games this year...He is batting . $310(13-42)$ with 10 runs, four doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, nine walks, a . 442 OBP, a . 619 SLG with a 1.061 OPS...He ranks sixth in the Senior Circuit in OBP and OPS and eighth in SLG.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 7-0 with a 1.56 ERA (11 earned runs/63.1 innings) with 16 walks and 73 strikeouts...The starting staff leads the majors in ERA, opponent's batting average (.161), strikeouts...Their 63.1 innings rank third.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York leads the majors with a . 350 OBP...They are tied for second with 59 runs, are third with 50 walks, sixth with a .748 OPS and seventh with a .251 batting average...The Mets have blasted 12 home runs this year...That is tied for sixth in the majors and tied for second in the National League...Through 12 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 59-30.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost the season series against the Giants in each of the last two years...New York won the series, in the prior three seasons (2017-2019).

NEED FOR SPEED: The Mets have totaled 11 stolen bases through 12 games...That is tied with the Dodgers for the major league lead...The Mets did not record their 11 steal until May 17 last season in the team's 36th game...Overall, the Mets stole a total of 54 bases in 2021...Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte are tied for fifth in the majors with three steals.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso hit his 109th career home run on Sunday vs. Arizona...That breaks his tie with Jose Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120)...Alonso has socked 47 home runs at Citi Field... That is fourth in Mets history...David Wright is third with 49, followed by Michael Conforto (66) and the franchise leader, Lucas Duda (71).

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is toed for fourth in the NL with 14 RBI...He is batting $.217(10-46)$ with eight runs three doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, two walks, a . 478 SLG and a . 761 OPS in 12 games this year... He is batting .353 (6-17) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.389 OPS in four games as a designated hitter this year.

DOUBLE DARE: Eduardo Escobar collected his sixth double of the season in game two yesterday...Seven of Escobar's 11 hits have gone for extra bases...He is tied for the NL lead in doubles... He has drawn 10 walks in nine games this year...Escobar drew a total of 48 walks in 146 games last season.

EL JEFF-E: In nine games this year, Jeff McNeil is batting .293 (12-41) with five runs, a double, a home run, six RBI, five walks, a steal, a . 383 OBP and a . 773 OPS...He has reached base safely in nine of his 11 games... He has collected four multi-hit games this year, which is tied for the 11th-most in the NL.

OPS, I DID IT AGAIN: J.D. Davis owns a lifetime OPS of . 889 OPS at Citi Field...It is the highest total in franchise history (min. 100 PA)...Jeff McNeil is second with an . 868 OPS and Brandon Nimmo is third with a . 844 OPS at the home of the Mets.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 12 pitches this year, which leads the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 319 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 56 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (40) in the last four seasons.

THE CHARMING MAN: Drew Smith is one of five relievers to pitch six or more innings without allowing a run this year...In six games this season, Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only three hits, two walks and striking out seven in 6.2 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.93 ERA ( 27 earned runs/83.0 innings) with 26 walks and 73 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has record 65 saves as a member of the Mets....That places him tied for 10th with Skip Lockwood on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets... He has recorded 174 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is $9-14$ with 65 saves, a 3.93 ERA ( 66 earned runs/ 151.1 innings) with 62 walks and 246 strikeouts... His 246 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (281) and Josh Hader (278) have struck out more...Additionally, his 246 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.


LAST TIME OUT: In his Citi Field debut, Bassitt faced the Diamondbacks on April 15 ...He pitched 6.0 innings of one-run ball, giving up only two hits... He struck out six batters and walked two on 98 pitches.

VS. SAN FRANCISCO: Is set to face the Giants for the fourth time in his career... The first three starts he's made against them were as a member of the A's as part of the Bay Bridge rivalry.... He has not allowed more than two runs in a start against the Giants and owns a lifetime 1.96 ERA against the club.

LET'S GET STREAKY: Chris Bassitt has not allowed more than three hits in his last six consecutive starts dating back to August 12, 2021...Only 20 pitchers (including openers) in modern history have had a longer streak... He has allowed only five runs in that span...The right-hander also has not given up more than three runs in his last eight consecutive starts, a streak that began on July 30, 2021 and still holds up.

HOME SWEET HOME: In 2021, Bassitt went 4-3 in home games at RingCentral Coliseum with a 2.44 ERA ( 19 earned runs/ 70.0 innings pitched)...Across 11 starts at home, he gave up 50 hits in 70.0 innings with 12 walks and 69 strikeouts..In 49 career games ( 43 starts) at home, he holds a 13-14 record with a 2.58 ERA (79 earned runs/ 275.2 innings) allowing 227 hits, with 256 punchouts and 71 walks... That 2.58 home ERA is the 11th-best mark in the majors among active pitchers (min. 275.0 innings).
TRIPLE THREAT TRIO: Tylor Megill, Max Scherzer, and Chris Bassitt have each won their first two starts of the season...The last time a trio of Mets starting pitchers won at least their first two outings of the year was in 2015, when Bartolo Colon won his first four starts, Matt Harvey won his first five and Steven Matz won his first two...The last time three members of the Mets' Opening Day rotation accomplished the feat was in 1973 (Tom Seaver, Jerry Koosman, Harry Parker).

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Bassitt's six-pitch arsenal allows him to have multiple strikeout pitches...Across his 14 strikeouts through two starts he has four strikeouts with his slider (57), three with his cutter (27) and two with both his curveball (50) and four-seamer (22)...His most effective strikeout pitch thus far has been his slider where he has a 57 percent strikeout rate (four punchouts in seven plate appearances ending with the pitch)...Last season, his best strikeout percentage came on his four-seam fastball ( 55 strikeouts in 147 plate appearances)

DAZZLING DEBUT: Chris Bassitt became the second Mets pitcher to debut with a line of at least 6.0 scoreless innings with eight or more strikeouts... The only other Mets debut of 6.0 or more innings, no runs and eight or more strikeouts was Collin McHugh's MLB debut in 2012.

2021 RECAP: Last season, Chris Bassitt pitched his way into his first career AllStar game and into AL Cy Young contention, posting a 3.15 ERA (55 earned runs/ 157.1 innings) in 27 starts, striking out 159 batters and walking only 39 ... Was 10-2 with a 3.28 ERA ( 43 earned runs/118.0 innings) in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...Threw his first career complete game shutout, a two-hitter, on May 27 vs. the Angels...Finished the first half on a career-best 10-game winning streak...Held or shared the AL lead in innings (118.0) and wins before the break... Had a 2.75 ERA (12 earned runs/39.1 innings) in eight starts after the break...On August 17 at Chicago-AL, he took a line drive to the face and suffered multiple facial fractures...Underwent surgery on August 24 and returned to the mound less than one month later on September 23 to make his final two starts of the season ( 6.1 IP, $4 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{ER}, 4 \mathrm{BB}, 5 \mathrm{~K}$ )...Received two fifth-place votes for AL Cy Young and finished 10th in the balloting.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO [0-0, 0.84]

LAST OUTING: On April 16, Carlos Carrasco made his 2022 home debut against Arizona...He went 5.0 scoreless innings, allowing just three hits with eight strikeouts and two walks on 82 pitches.

K IS FOR KARRASCO: In his last start, Carrasco struck out eight batters the most he has throw in a game in a Mets uniform...The last time Carrasco struckout eight in an game was with Cleveland on September 25,2020 vs. Pittsburgh...This was also the righthander's first scoreless outing as a Met...Held Arizona hitless in four at-bats with runners in scoring position, striking out three of the four men he faced in those situations.
