AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game set at Seattle (through Wed.)...were swept in a three-game set at St. Louis this weekend, the first time they were swept in a series of at least three games this season...will also make play a threegame set in Boston (Fri.-Sun.).

- Are 70-39 (.642) to start the season, the best record in the American League and tied for the second-best record in the Majors, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (75-33, ...marks just the third time in the last 61 seasons (since 1962) the Yankees have won at least 70 of their first 109 decisions (went 80-29 in 1998 and 60-39 in 2019). Their 29 comeback wins are the most in the AL and the
- second-most in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL-32). Have lost a season-high five straight games...marks their
- longest losing streak since a seven-game streak from 9/4-10/21.
- Their +201 run differential is the best in the AL and secondbest in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL +226).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost their season-high fifth straight game with a 12-9 loss at St. Louis on Sunday...

Yankees pitchers allowed a season-high 12R...RHP Frankie Montas (3.0IP, 5H, 6ER, 3BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP) made his Yankees debut and did not record a decision...**1B DJ LeMahieu** (3-for-6, 2R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 1RBI) tied his season high in hits and recorded at least three extra-base hits for the fifth time in his career...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-5, 1 double, 4RBI, 1BB) drove in four of the Yankees' 9R, hitting a two-run single in the second inning and a two-run double in the fifth inning... **CF Aaron Hicks** (3-for-4, 2R, 1RBI, 1BB) tied his season high in hits and snapped an 0-for-32 stretch...**LF Andrew**

Benintendi (2-for-5, 2R, 1 double) picked up his first multi-hit game as a Yankee...2B Gleyber Torres (3-for-5, 2R) tied his season high in hits...C Jose Trevino (2-for-5, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the eighth inning...Yankees relievers (5.0IP, 6H, 6ER, 5BB, 5K, 1HR) combined to allow a season-high 6ER.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters recorded 16H on Sunday at St. Louis, their third-most hits in a game this season (22H on 7/6 at Pittsburgh and 17H on 6/12 vs. Chicago-NL)... marked their most hits in a loss since 4/8/18 vs. Baltimore (also 16H)...have recorded double-digit hits in four of their last six games, nine of their last 19 games and 15 of their last 32 games (since 7/6).

- Yankees batters lead the Majors with 186HR this season... their 186HR are 19HR more than second-place Atlanta (167) and 35HR more than third-place Houston (151) and Milwaukee (151).
- Their 186HR are their most HR through 109 games of a season in franchise history and tied with the 2005 Rangers for the second-most by any Major League team through their first 109 games of a season, trailing
- only the 2019 Minnesota Twins (211HR). Lead the Majors in runs (579), runs per game (5.31) and walks (433) and ranks second in SLG (.445), OBP (.331) and OPS (.776).

MILESTONE MAN: Manager Aaron Boone has 398 managerial wins and needs two wins to reach 400... would be just the ninth Manager in Yankees history to accomplish the feat, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460-867), Joe Torre (1,173-767), Casey Stengel (1,149-696), Miller Huggins (1,067-719), Ralph Houk (944-806), Joe Girardi (910-710), Billy Martin (556-295) and Clark Griffith (110-370)

- Martin (556-385) and Clark Griffith (419-370).

 Under his helm since 2018, the Yankees have posted the third-best record (398-257, .608) in the Majors during that span, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (422-233, .644) and Houston Astros (404-252, .616).

 Boone has recorded 398 wins in 655 decisions...is seeking
- to become the fourth-fastest Yankees Manager to reach the milestone...according to Elias, Casey Stengel reached the mark in 644 decisions, Joe McCarthy did so in 635 decisions, Joe Torre accomplished the feat in 647 decisions and Ralph Houk reached the mark in 674 decisions.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have had 34 of their 39 losses decided by 3R-or-fewer...26 of their 39 losses have been by 2R-or-fewer...15 have been decided by one run.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU: 1B Anthony Rizzo turns 33 today (DOB: 8/8/1989).

LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu tied his season high with 3H on Sunday at St. Louis, going 3-for-6 with 2R, 2 doubles, 1HR and 1RBI...recorded at least three extra-base hits in a game for just the fifth time in his career (first since 9/16/20 vs. Toronto).

- Has reached base in 36 of his last 37 starts (since 6/21), batting .338/.467/.500 (50-for-148) with 35R, 6 doubles, 6HR, 16RBI, 35BB, 1HP and 3SB in that span...has reached base in 43 of his last 46 starts since 6/9.
- Has reached base at least three times in 26 games this season, tied for the most such games in the AL and tied for the fourth-most in the Majors.
- Since 6/21, ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.468, first in AL) and walks (36, first in AL) and seventh in BA (.338, third in AL).
- Has reached base multiple times in 21 of his last 26 starts.
 Has reached base multiple times in 53-of-99 games this year.
 His 60BB this year are the second-most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors...also ranks third in the AL and sixth in the Majors in OBP this season (.393).
- Has multiple hits in five of his last eight games and six of his last 10 games.

SEA-ING CLEARLY: <u>The Yankees have won their last 10 series at T-Mobile Park (since 9/12/11)...according to Elias, matches the Yankees' longest road series winning</u> streak against any opponent in franchise history...the Yankees also won 10 straight road series against the Boston Red Sox from 5/16/30-4/22/33.

Their 23-6 (.793) record since 2012 is the best by any team at any stadium in that span (min. 15G).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge drove in four of the Yankees' 9R on Sunday at St. Louis...has recorded at least 4RBI in six games sunday at St. Louis....has recorded at least 4RBI in Six games this season...his six such games match the most by a Yankee in a single season in the last 10 years since 2013 (also Giancarlo Stanton's six in 2021)...has 15RBI in his last nine games, 27RBI in his last 15 games and 31RBI in his last 18 games.

Is batting .433/.548/1.030 (29-for-67) with 22R, 4 doubles, 12HR, 31RBI, 15BB, 2HP and 3SB in his last 18 games (since 7/16)

 Has 6HR in his last 13 games vs. the Mariners and 8HR in his last 21G against Seattle... has 5HR in his last nine games at T-Mobile Park. Is just the third Yankee (fourth time) and the sixth

- (43HR in 1961 with NYY). Is hitting .366/.481/.756 (30-for-82) with 5 doubles, 9HR, 53RBI, 21BB, 1HP and 4SF with RISP...marks the highest OPS (1.238), third-highest SLG (first in AL) and fourthhighest OBP (first in AL) with RISP in the Majors
- Has reached base multiple times in 16 of his last 18 games
- Has reached base multiple times in 16 of his last 18 games and 17 of his last 20 games.

 Has reached base multiple times in 60 games this season, tied with Chicago-AL's Jose Abreu for the most such games in the AL and the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL's Freddie Freeman (61).
- His 43HR lead the Majors...no other player has more than 34HR...also leads the Majors in runs scored (91), RBI (97), SLG (.669) and OPS (1.058), is tied for second in XBH (61, tied for first in AL), tied for third in multi-hit games (37, first in AL), tied for sixth in walks (58, tied for third in AL)and ranks eighth in OBP (.389, fifth in AL).
- Has 5BB in his last four games, 9BB in his last seven games and 12BB in his last 12 games.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP JAMESON TAILLON (10-2, 3.96 ERA)

RHP Jameson Taillon will make his 22nd start of the season tonight at Seattle...the 30-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...last pitched on Tuesday vs. the Mariners at Yankee Stadium, allowing a season-high-tying 6R over 4.2IP without recording a decision (2H, 5ER, 4BB, 6K, 2HR)... made his fifth Opening Day roster (2017-19 with Pittsburgh and 2021-22 with the Yankees)...in his first season with the Yankees in 2021, went 8-6 with a 4.30 ERA (144.1IP, 130H, 73R/69ER, 44BB, 140K, 24HR) in 29 starts...underwent a right ankle tendon repair on 10/28/21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Justin Greisberg at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital...is in his sixth Major League season...was acquired by the Yankees from the Pittsburgh Pirates in exchange for RHP Roansy Contreras, INF Maikol Escotto, OF Canaan Smith-Njigba and RHP Miguel Yajure on 1/24/21...was originally selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (second overall) of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft First-Year Player Draft.

LAST START: Made his 21st start of the season on Tuesday vs. the Mariners at Yankee Stadium, allowing a season-high-tying 6R over 4.2IP without recording a decision (2H, 5ER, 4BB, 6K, 2HR)...also surrendred 6R/ER on 7/10 at Boston and 6/23 vs. Houston...surrendered a season-high 4BB...marked his most walks allowed as a Yankee and just the third time in his career that he walked at least four batters (5BB on 8/22/17 vs. Los Angeles-NL with Pittsburgh and 4BB on 8/27/17 at Cincinnati with Pittsburgh).

SEATTLE: Will be making his second consecutive start vs. Seattle... is 2-0 with a 3.57 ERA (17.2IP, 7ER) and 21K in three career starts vs. the Mariners... tossed at least Yankee Stadium (2H, 4BB, 6K, 2HR).

In two career starts at Seattle, is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (13.0IP, 2ER) and 15K...made one start vs. Seattle last season at T-Mobile Park, surrendering just 1ER over 7.0IP and earning the win (4H, 1ER, 1BB, 9K)...made his first career start against the club on 6/29/16 in Seattle, earning the win after allowing 1ER over 6.0IP (6H, 0BB, 6K).

In four starts vs. the AL West this season, is 2-0 with a 5.79 ERA (23.1IP, 15ER)...in 14 career starts vs. the AL West, is 6-2 with a 5.22 ERA (79.1IP, 46ER).

2022: Is 10-2 with a 3.96 ERA (113.2IP, 50ER) in 21 starts this season... has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 16 of his 21 starts this season and 2ER-or-fewer in 13 of those

- games.

 + Over his last 11 starts (since 6/7), has posted a 5.73 ERA (55.0IP, 35ER) compared to recording a 2.30 ERA (58.2IP, 15ER) in his first 10 starts of the season...has also
 - Over his last 11 starts (since 677), has posted a 5.73 ERA (55.0IP, 35ER) compared to recording a 2.30 ERA (58.2IP, 15ER) in his first 10 starts of the season...nas also surrendered at least 3R in seven of his last 11 starts after doing so just once in his first 10 starts.

 Has walked just 21 of his 472BF this season...among pitchers who have tossed at least 85.0 innings this season, his 21BB are tied for the ninth-fewest in the Majors...his 1.66 BB/9.0IP ratio is the sixth-best mark in the AL and the 10th-best in the Majors.

 His 4.67 K/BB ratio is the sixth-highest in the AL and 10th-highest in the Majors.

 - His 10 wins are tied for the ninth-most in the Majors... is his second-highest win total in a single season in his career, trailing only his 14 wins in 2018 with Pittsburgh.
 - Has allowed at least 2BB in three consecutive starts for the first time since a three-start stretch from 8/26-9/6/21...has issued multiple walks in four consecutive starts twice in his career (also 4G from 5/13-31/21 and 7/11-30/21).
 - Issued 2BB on 6/18 at Toronto, snapping his 14-game stretch (9/28/21-6/12/22) of allowing 1BB-or-fewer...his 14-start streak was the third-longest streak by a Yankees starting pitcher in franchise history (excluding openers), trailing only David Wells (19GS from 9/6/02-6/27/03) and Jon Lieber (15GS from 5/1-7/23/04)...Chad Green did so in 16 straight opening assignments from 6/11/17-9/29/19.

 Went 9-1 in his first 15 starts this season...according to Elias, is the sixth Yankees pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to have a 9-1 record or better in his first 15 starts of a season, joining Ron Guidry (12-0 in 1978), Jimmy Key (10-1 in 1994), Kevin Brown (9-1 in 2004), Roger Clemens (9-1 in 2001) and Whitey Ford (9-1 in 1964).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In 62 career starts on the road, has gone 24-17 with a 4.09 ERA (334.2IP, 152ER) and 288K. over his last 35 road starts (since 7/25/18), has tossed 6.0-or-more innings 17 times and 7.0-or-more innings in eight

- Has made nine road starts this season, going 4-1 with a 4.47 ERA (46.1IP, 23ER) and 34K.
- Has allowed 13ER over his last three road starts after surrendering just 10ER in his first six road starts of the season...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of nine road starts, 2ER-or-fewer in five of those games and 1ER-orfewer in three of those starts
- Is 7-2 with a 4.04 ERA (93.2IP, 42ER) over his last 18 road starts (since 7/6/21), limiting opponents to a .236 (83for-351) BA in that span.

RISPY BUSINESS: Has held batters to a .173/.213/.347 (17-for-98) slash line with runners in scoring position thi season...<mark>leads the Majors in opponents' OBP, ranks fourth in opponents' BA and ixthth in opponents' OPS (.560</mark>)

THE TEA ON TAILLON: Pitched in four seasons with Pittsburgh to begin his career (2016-19) before missing the 2020 season...among National Leaguers with at least 450.0IP from 2016-20, ranked ninth with a 1.66 ground ball to fly ball ratio, 10th with a 32.7 outside the zone swing percentage, 11th with a 48.2% ground ball rate and 14th with a 19.5% soft contact rate (FanGraphs).

Spent the entire 2020 season on the injured list recovering from "Tommy John" surgery and flexor tendon repair surgery performed on 8/13/19...the surgeries were performed by Dr. David Altchek at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York City.
