TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their last road trip of the season with the third and final game against the Los Angeles Angels (0-2)...following an off-day tomorrow, Seattle will face the Colorado Rockies for a 3-game set (9/18-9/20) to close out the trip...the Mariners opened the road trip with a weekend series in West Sacramento against the Athletics (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Angels by a 2-1 final score last night, dropping the series in Anaheim...Seattle is 30-47 (.390) on the road this season, as opposed to 40-35 (.533) at T-Mobile Park.

- **Streak Broken** - The Mariners franchise-best streak of winning seasons ended at 5 (2021-25) after the Mariners suffered their 81st loss of the 2026 season on Monday...the Mariners .533 winning percentage since 2021 ranks 10th in the Majors and 5th in the AL.
- **Slim Margins** - Seattle has played 48 one-run games this season, the T-3rd most such games in MLB, and has gone 23-25 (.479) in those contests.
- **Young & Thriving** - In 14 games in September, **Cole Young** is batting .292 (14x48) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 8 RBI and 2 walks.

RODRÍGUEZ NAMED MARINERS CLEMENTE AWARD NOMINEE...on Monday, Major League Baseball announced the 30 nominees from each club for the 2026 Roberto Clemente Award, with **Julio Rodríguez** representing the Mariners for the first time...in addition to his highlights on the field, which include becoming the first player in MLB history to begin his career with 5-consecutive 20+ HR, 20+ SB seasons, J-Rod has demonstrated a profound commitment to expanding youth baseball access and aiding under-resourced communities in his hometown of Loma de Cabrera, Dominican Republic, in the greater-Seattle community and across the globe...for more information and to vote for Rodríguez, visit mlbtogether.com/clementeaward.

KIRBY'S KINGDOM...in 12 career starts against the Angels, RHP **George Kirby** is 8-4 with a 3.28 ERA (27 ER, 74.0 IP), 92 strikeouts, 11 walks and a 0.946 WHIP...his 11.19 strikeouts-per-9 innings against the Angels is also his best mark against any opponent he has faced in his career (min. 5 GS), ahead of his next closest 10.41 SO/9 against the Detroit Tigers...in his last appearance against the Angels on June 29 at T-Mobile Park, Kirby tossed a season high-tying 8.0 innings pitched and allowed only 2 runs (2 ER) on 7 hits (1 HR) with 1 walk and 7 strikeouts.

RANDY ON A RUN...**Randy Arozarena** went 1-for-4 in last night's contest and has reached base safely in his last 15-consecutive games (8/31-c), the T-7th longest on-base streak of his career and his longest since recording a 16 game streak from Sept. 24, 2025-April 6...during the 15-game streak, Randy is batting .350 (21x60) with 15 runs, 4 doubles, 5 home runs, 17 RBI, 5 walks and 3 stolen bases, reaching base at a .420 clip and slugging .667 for a 1.087 OPS...Arozarena ranks 5th in OPS, 6th in slugging and 4th in fWAR (1.0) among AL batters since Aug. 31.

- **Randy's Career Year** - Randy is batting .277 (149x537) with 100 runs, 30 doubles, 1 triple, 25 home runs, 75 RBI, 23 stolen bases and 61 walks, a .373 OBP, .477 SLG and an .850 OPS this season... he has set a career-high in runs and is on pace for career-highs in bWAR (5.1), average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage, OPS and OPS+ (145).

ALL RALEIGH GOOD THINGS COME TO AN END...**Cal Raleigh** snapped a 16-game on-base streak (8/28-9/14) last night, the 4th-longest on-base streak (via hit, walk or HBP) of his career...during the streak, Cal batted .262 (16x61) with 14 runs, 5 doubles, 4 home runs, 11 RBI and 9 walks, reaching base at a .357 clip and slugging .541 for an .898 OPS...despite breaking the streak, in 27 games since Aug. 16, Raleigh has posted a 1.023 OPS, batting .261 (24x92) with 20 runs, 5 doubles, 10 home runs, 20 RBI, 18 walks, a .382 OBP and slugging .641...during that span, Cal leads the American League in HR and OPS and ranks T-1st in fWAR (1.6), 3rd in slugging, and T-4th in walk-rate (16.4%).

THAT'S SIR. TO YOU...over his last 12 appearances since Aug. 21, **Seranthony Domínguez** owns an impressive 0.64 ERA (1 ER, 14.0 IP) with just 5 hits and 3 walks allowed plus 9 strikeouts, a 0.57 WHIP and a .109 opponent batting average...among MLB relievers during that span (min. 10.0 IP), he ranks T-5th in innings pitched, T-5th in opponent batting average, T-6th in WHIP and T-8th in ERA.

ARROYO AND MONTES ARE MAKING AN IMPACT...OF **Lazaro Montes** (Sept. 1 at BOS) and INF/OF **Michael Arroyo** (Sept. 6 vs. ATH) have both impressed since making their Major League debuts this month...Montes is batting .250 (7x28) with 1 double, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and a .930 OPS in his first 13 MLB games, while Arroyo is batting .308 (4x13) with 3 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 4 walks and a 1.059 OPS over his first 6 MLB games.

SEPTEMBER SURGES...the Mariners offense has rallied in September, combining to hit .278 (137x493) in 14 games during the month, the highest September batting average in the American League and the 2nd highest in the Majors this season, trailing only the Milwaukee Brewers (.298 AVG)...during the month, Seattle batters also rank among the MLB leaders in on-base percentage (3rd, .350), slugging (7th, .438) and OPS (5th, .788)...3 players from the Mariners everyday lineup are batting over .300 during the month: **Randy Arozarena** (.309 AVG), **J.P. Crawford** (.320 AVG) and **Josh Naylor** (.309 AVG).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Logan Gilbert** was solid yesterday, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 6 hits (1 HR) and 2 walks with 7 strikeouts...**AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...with his 7 strikeouts, Gilbert reached 1,078 career strikeouts, tying Mark Langston for 4th-most strikeouts in Mariners history, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Gilbert has amassed 194 strikeouts this season and is 6 strikeouts away from becoming only the 4th pitcher in franchise history to record multiple seasons with 200+ strikeouts?...he would join Randy Johnson (7x), Félix Hernández (6x) and Mark Langston (4x) as the only Mariners pitchers to accomplish the feat.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 16

- **1986** - Harold Reynolds hit his first career ML HR and Mike Morgan pitched a complete game shutout in a 7-0 blanking vs. Kansas City.
- **2000** - Mariners beat the Orioles, 14-0, to match largest margin of victory in a shutout...the 2nd such time in 2000 (3rd overall). Jaime Moyer earns his 11th consecutive win against Baltimore.
- **2011** - Blake Beavan threw 8.0 shutout innings, the first Mariners rookie to accomplish that sine Félix Hernández in 2005, leading the Mariners to a 4-0 win over the Texas Rangers.
- **2022** - **Julio Rodríguez** hits a leadoff homer in his second-consecutive game, the first Mariners player to accomplish the feat since Ichiro Suzuki in 2004.
- **2025** - **Dominic Canzone** went 5-for-5 with 3 home runs in a 12-5 win over the Royals, becoming the 12th player in franchise history with a 3+ home run game and first since Kyle Seager...became the 2nd player in franchise history to have a 5+ hit game with 3+ home runs...**Cal Raleigh** hit his MLB-leading 55th and 56th home runs of the season, tying Ken Griffey Jr. (2x, 1997-98) for the Mariners record for most home runs in a season...Raleigh collected his 10th multi-homer game of the season and 5th career game homering from both sides of the plate...became the first player in MLB history to have a multi-homer game against 10+ different teams in the same season.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 29th start of the season and 2nd against the Angels...will be the 141st start of his career and his 13th career start against the Angels.
- Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on Sept. 11 at Athletics, tossed 6.0 innings, allowing 4 runs (4 ER) on 4 hits and 2 walks with 5 strikeouts...threw 101 pitches and 62 strikes...is his 4th start with 100+ pitches thrown this season and the 16th of his career...marks the 2nd time in his career he has thrown 100+ pitches in back-to-back starts (last: 9/14/25-9/20/25).

HALOS STRUCK DOWN...is making his 13th career start against the Angels which will be tied for the most starts Kirby has made against a single opponent (also: TEX)...his 92 strikeouts against the Angels are the most he has recorded against any single team and are the 8th most by any pitcher against a single opponent since 2022...among all-time MLB pitchers against the Angels (min. 50.0 IP) his 8.36 SO/BB ranks 2nd-best while his 0.946 WHIP ranks 12th-lowest...his 11.19 K/9 ranks 7th...each of Kirby's 2 career-high 14 strikeout games have been against the Angels with his 1st such outing being at Angels Stadium...in each of his last 2 trips to Anaheim has recorded 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs and 9+ K's.

SHERIFFS IN TOWN...will be making his 3rd consecutive intra-division start in tonight's game...across 47 career starts against AL West teams, Kirby is 28-8 and owns a 2.95 ERA (93 ER, 284.0 IP) with 279 strikeouts to 44 walks (6.34 K/BB)...among all-time MLB pitchers with 200.0+ innings pitched against the AL West, he ranks 2nd in K/BB and ranks 8th in WHIP (1.05).

CALIFORNIA CRUISIN...has faced California-based teams (SD, ATH, LAA) in their home ballpark in 15 career games...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 11 of those games, including 9 quality starts...5 of his 7 outings at Angels Stadium have been for quality starts, all with 2-or-fewer runs allowed, including 2 outings over 7.0+ IP.

GO LONG...has tossed 6.0+ IP in each of his last 2 starts...marks the first time he has recorded back-to-back starts of 6.0+ IP since 7/8-7/20...has logged 6.0+ IP in 3 of his last 4 starts since Aug. 25, combining for 25.1 innings of work over that 4 game span for the most he has recorded over 4 games since 6/23-7/20.

MAINTAINING THE RATIO...on Aug. 25 vs. PHI, recorded his 16th career game with 9+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks...his 16 such career games rank 6th most in the AL since 2022...has made 16 starts this season with 5+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks, including his last start on Sept. 11, to rank T-9th most in the AL...his 78 career games are 11th most in MLB since 2022...ranks 10th among qualified AL pitchers with a 3.54 K/BB this season...his career 5.75 K/BB ranks 3rd-best in MLB all-time (min. 400.0 IP).

PREMIUM PERFORMANCES...his Sept. 5 start marked his 15th quality start of the season, tied for T-8th most in the AL...with his quality start against the A's on Sept. 5, Kirby became 1-of-9 pitchers with 15+ quality starts in 3+ seasons since 2023...he is also 1-of-6 pitchers with 10+ QS in each of the last 5 seasons since 2022...also marked his 12th QS with 1-or-fewer walks this season...is 1-of-8 pitchers in MLB with 12+ such starts this season...his 66 career such starts are tied for the league lead since 2022 (also: Logan Webb-SF).

MAKING HIMSELF AT HOME...is making his 14th road start of the season and the 71st road start of his career...among pitchers with 50+ career road starts, his 5.37 strikeout-to-walk ratio on the road ranks 2nd among all-time MLB pitchers, just trailing Tarik Skubal's 5.85 K/BB...ranks 16th in the AL (min. 65.0 IP) in K/BB (3.05) on the road this season...his 1.48 walks-per-nine innings on the road ranks 4th-best all-time (min. 50 GS), trailing Hall of Famer Cy Young (1.09), Deacon Phillippe (1.34) and Josh Tomlin (1.36)...ranks 12th in BB/9 (2.39) on the road in the AL in 2026 (min. 65.0 IP).

EARLY BIRD...records a first pitch strike 65.6% of the time in 2026, 7th highest in MLB among qualified pitchers with a first pitch swing 37.4% of the time, 4th highest in MLB this season...owns 109 strikeouts to 13 walks (8.38 K/BB) with a 1.080 WHIP after an 0-1 count.

KEEPING THEM ON THEIR TOES...owns a 37.9% chase rate this season, for 5th-best in MLB among qualified pitchers (*Fangraphs*)...has earned 77 out of zone swing and misses on his sweeper this season, 4th most by a pitcher on a sweeper on the pitch in MLB...ranks 24th most in the AL including all pitch types.
