YESTERDAY: The Mets fell to the Braves, 6-2, at Clover Park...RHP Carlos Carrasco made his first start of the spring and allowed two runs over 2.0 innings of work...3B Brett Baty went 2-3 and put the Mets on the board with an RBI single in the ninth... Minor leaguer Matt Winaker added an RBI single in the ninth...SS Francisco Lindor went 1-2 with a walk... Lindor has reached base safely in all five games played this spring.

VS. WASHINGTON: The Mets will play their second of six Grapefruit League games against the Nationals today...New York defeated Washington, 6-3, on February 26 at Clover Park...Last season, the Mets went 14-4 against Washington, their most victories against the Nationals in a single season since the team relocated from Montreal...The Mets first regular season series against Washington will take place from April 25-April 27 at Citi Field.

SPRING LEADERS: This spring, Ronny Mauricio is tied for the major league lead with three home runs and is tied for third in the majors with 12 total bases... Francisco Lindor ranks second among qualifiers in OBP with a .600 clip...Brett Baty is tied for second in the majors in hits with six...Baty also is tied for fifth among qualifiers in batting average with a .500 mark and Lindor ranks eighth with a .455 average...Pete Alonso ranks eighth in SLG among qualifiers with a .833 mark and the trio of Alonso, Lindor and Baty rank eighth, ninth and 10th respectively in OPS...Tim Lincecum is tied for third in stolen bases with three.

WELCOME BACK: Former Mets OF Darryl Strawberry and former Mets INF Edgardo Alfonzo will be in camp from March 2 until March 6...Strawberry was selected to seven consecutive All-Star games (1984-1990) and won two Silver Slugger Awards while with the Mets...The 1983 NL Rookie of the Year is the Mets all-time leader in home runs (252) and ranks second in franchise history in RBI (733), slugging percentage (.520) and OPS (.878)...Alfonzo played in Queens from 1995-2002 and was a National League All-Star in 2000...A 1999 Silver Slugger Award winner, Alfonzo slashed .292/.367/.445 with 120 home runs and RBI in 1,086 career games with the Mets.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: In his first season as Mets skipper, Buck Showalter took home the NL Manager of the Year Award...He led the club to 101 wins and its first playoff berth since 2016...Showalter was also named Manager of the Year in 1994 with the Yankees, 2004 with the Rangers and 2014 with the Orioles...His four Manager of the Year Awards are tied for the most in the award's history with Bobby Cox and Tony La Russa...Showalter ranks 18th all-time and third among active managers with 1,652 managerial wins...Showalter is the first Mets manager to record 100 or more victories in his first season with the club...He joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide both the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

THE BATTING CHAMP IS HERE: Last season, INF/OF Jeff McNeil became the first Met ever to win a major league batting title and joined José Reyes (2011) as the only other Met to win a National League batting title...The two-time All-Star owns a .307 career batting average, the second-best clip by a Met through their first five big league seasons behind David Wright's .309 mark (min. 1,500 AB).

YES, THE CLOSER: RHP Edwin Díaz won the 2022 Trevor Hoffman NL Relief Pitcher of the Year Award... The two-time All-Star joined Craig Kimbrel as the only pitchers in major league history to win Reliever of the Year in both leagues...Díaz pitched to a 1.31 ERA (9 ER/62.0 IP) and led all major league relievers with 118 strikeouts...His 50.2 strikeout rate was the third-best in major league history for a single season...The right-hander became the 12th pitcher in major league history to strike out at least 100 batters, record 30 or more saves, and sport a sub-1.50 ERA.

POLAR POWER: Last season, INF Pete Alonso tied for the major league lead with 131 RBI, the most ever by a Met in a single season...Alonso finished third in the majors with 40 home runs in 2022 and became the first Met ever with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...His 146 career home runs are the fourth most by a major leaguer through his first four major league seasons trailing Ralph Kiner (168), Albert Pujols (160) and Eddie Mathews (153)...Alonso ranks seventh in franchise history in home runs...He is three home runs behind Carlos Beltrán and trails Dave Kingman by eight long balls.

GLOBAL GAME: 11 players in major league camp with the Mets will compete in the 2023 World Baseball Classic...INF Pete Alonso, INF/OF Jeff McNeil, RHP Adam Ottavino and LHP Brooks Raley will play for Team USA...INF Eduardo Escobar, RHP Elieser Hernández and C Omar Narváez will compete for Team Venezuela...RHP Edwin Díaz and INF Francisco Lindor will play for Team Puerto Rico... LHP José Quintana will pitch for Team Colombia...INF Jonathan Araúz, a non-roster invitee, will compete for Team Panama...Minor leaguers RHP Dominic Hamel (Puerto Rico), RHP Humberto Mejía (Panama), LHP Cam Opp (Great Britain) and RHP Claudio Scotti (Italy) will also participate in the 2023 World Baseball Classic...Baseball Hall of Famer & Mets Hall of Famer Mike Piazza will manage Team Italy.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES: The 2023 Mets enter Spring Training with several new players on the roster...These include: OF Abraham Almonte (minor league free agent), INF Jonathan Araúz (minor league free agent), RHP Jeff Brigham (trade), OF Lorenzo Cedrola (minor league free agent), RHP Sam Coonrod (waiver claim), RHP Zach Greene (Rule 5 Draft), RHP Elieser Hernández (trade), OF Tim Lincecum (minor league free agent), LHP T.J. McFarland (minor league free agent) INF Danny Mendick (free agent), LHP Zach Muckenhirn (minor league free agent), C Omar Narváez (free agent), INF José Peraza (minor league free agent), OF Tommy Pham (free agent), LHP José Quintana (free agent), LHP Brooks Raley (trade), RHP Denyi Reyes (minor league free agent), RHP Stephen Ridings (waiver claim), RHP David Robertson (free agent), RHP Kodai Senga (free agent), OF DJ Stewart (minor league free agent), RHP William Woods (minor league free agent), RHP Justin Verlander (free agent) and RHP Jimmy Yacabonis (minor league free agent).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Last season, INF Pete Alonso, RHP Edwin Díaz, OF Starling Marte and INF/OF Jeff McNeil were selected to play for the National League in the 2022 All-Star Game at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles...The Mets four All-Star selections in 2022 were the most in a season since 2016 (Noah Syndergaard, Yoenis Céspedes, Jeurys Familia and Bartolo Colón)...McNeil started for the National League at second base and was the first Met to start an All-Star Game since David Wright and Matt Harvey both started in the 2013 All-Star Game at Citi Field...McNeil joined Ron Hunt (1964) as the only other Met to start at second base in the All-Star Game.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Last season, INF Francisco Lindor set a Mets shortstop record for most RBI in a season with a career-high 107 RBI...The 28-year-old has led all shortstops with 184 home runs since he debuted in 2015...Lindor is one of 11 players to hit 150 or more homers and swipe 100 or more bags since 2015.

METS TOP PROSPECTS: The Mets have their top four prospects in major league camp...All four cracked MLB Pipeline's list of the top 100 prospects in baseball: C Francisco Álvarez (#3), INF Brett Baty (#21), C Kevin Parada (#36) and OF Alex Ramirez (#96)...Also in big league camp are Mets No. 6 prospect INF Ronny Mauricio and No. 7 prospect INF Mark Vientos.

EXPECTED TO START

RHP MAX SCHERZER: Will make his second spring training start today...Allowed one run over 2.0 innings with five strikeouts in his first spring start on February 26 vs. Washington...The three-time Cy-Young Award winner, eight-time All-Star and 2019 World Series Champion made 23 starts with the Mets last season, posting a 11-5 record with a 2.29 ERA (37 ER/145.1 IP) and 173 strikeouts...Ranked sixth in the majors (min. 140.0 innings) with a 2.29 ERA, ninth with a 10.71 K/9 ratio, second with a 0.91 WHIP and third with a 7.21 K/BB ratio...Among pitchers to face 500 or more batters, his .207 opponent average ranked 14th in the majors, while his .574 OPS against ranked eighth... Made five starts in July after being activated from the IL on July 5...He went 1-1 with a 1.39 ERA (5 ER/32.1 IP) while striking out 45 and walking just four...His 1.39 ERA in July ranked seventh in the majors and fourth in the NL, while his 45 punchouts were tied for third in MLB. Reached his 200th career win on September 19, 2022 at Milwaukee after throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his return from the 15-Day IL...Has appeared in 430 career games (421 starts) over a 15-year major league career and owns a lifetime record of 201-102 with 3.11 ERA (927 ER/2692.0 IP)...One of 19 pitchers all-time to accumulate 3,000 career strikeouts...His 3193 career strikeouts are five behind teammate Justin Verlander for the most by an active pitcher... Ended the season tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martínez...Roger Clemens also had 110 in his career...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets finished the 2022 season with a 101-61 record and finished in second place in the National League East...The club clinched their first playoff berth since 2016 and fell to the Padres in the National League Wild Card Series, 2-1.

THAT'S A LOTTA HARDWARE: With Justin Verlander and Max Scherzer, the 2023 Mets are the third team in major league history to boast multiple three-time Cy Young award winners on their roster in the same season, joining the 1986 White Sox (Tom Seaver and Steve Carlton) and the 2021 Dodgers (Scherzer and Clayton Kershaw).

NO DOUBT ABOUT IT: Ronny Mauricio is 3-8 this spring, and all three of his hits have been home runs...Mauricio's three homers have traveled 450 feet, 413 feet and 413 feet respectively good for a total average of 425.3 feet.
