IN THE STANDINGS (30 days): The Brewers have spent the following number of days alone or tied at each position in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 11, SECOND: 7, THIRD: 5, FOURTH: 6, FIFTH: 1.....the team is currently in first place, leading the second-place Cardinals by 2.5 games.

AT HOME: The Brewers are 10-4 at home, going 3-1-1 in series play.....the team went 45-36 at home last season, going 14-10-2 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 9-4 on the road, going 3-1-0 in series play....they have won 6 straight road games.....the team went 50-31 on the road last season, going 18-7-1 in series play.....their 50 road wins in 2021 broke the franchise record set by the 1982 team (47-33).

MANAGER: Craig Counsell - the longest-tenured active manager in the National League and third in the majors - is in his eighth season as Brewers manager (548-487) and seventh full season.....he is second in franchise history in managerial wins and games managed (1,035), trailing only Phil Garner (563 wins/1,180 games).....under Counsell, the Brewers made the postseason in four consecutive years (2018-21) for the first time in franchise history.....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke.....he is signed through 2023.....only the Guardians' Terry Francona (10/8/12) and Rays' Kevin Cash (12/5/14) have longer active tenures.

COACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (2nd season), pitching coach Chris Hook (4th season), third base coach Jason Lane (7th season, 2nd as 3B coach), associate pitching, catching and strategy coach Walker McKinven (3rd season) and bench coach Pat Murphy (7th season) all returned from the 2021 staff.....new to the staff is hitting coach Connor Dawson, infield/assistant hitting coach Matt Erickson, bullpen coach Jim Henderson and hitting coach Ozzie Timmons.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made four replay challenges this season, going 3-1.....their last challenge (won) came on 4/30 vs. Chicago-NL as an out call at first base involving Lorenzo Cain in the bottom of the first inning was overturned.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #39 - RHP CORBIN BURNES (5gs, 1-1, 1.93)

BURNES AT A GLANCE: Corbin Burnes, 27, is making his sixth start.....he last started last Sunday vs. Chicago-NL in 2-0 loss (7ip, 4h, 2r, 2er, 1bb, 10k, 1hr, 97 pitches).....it was his third consecutive start with 10+ strikeouts (10-11-10), joining **Yovani Gallardo** in 2011 (12-13-11) as the only pitchers in franchise history to accomplish the feat.....it marked his 15th career double-digit strikeout game.....the team is 2-3 in his starts.....he has 4 quality starts, all in his last 4 outings.....opponents are batting .153 (17-for-111, 4hr)..... Burnes was selected by Milwaukee in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of St. Mary's (CA) College.

LAST SEASON: Burnes won the 2021 National League Cy Young Award after going 11-5 with a Major League-best 2.43 ERA in 28 starts last season.....he became just the third pitcher in franchise history to win a Cy Young Award, joining Rollie Fingers (1981) and Pete Vuckovich (1982).....he became the first pitcher in franchise history to lead his league in ERA.....the first-time All-Star and All-MLB First Team selection also led the majors in K/9IP (12.61) and K/BB (6.88).....the team went 19-9 in his starts.....he made 18 quality starts.....opponents batted .201.....he produced 234 strikeouts in 2021 - third in franchise history for a single season - compared to just 34 walks in 167.0 innings.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Burnes began the season with 58 consecutive strikeouts before walking his first batter (Tommy Edman) on 5/13 vs. St. Louis.....his streak was the longest in MLB (since 1893) to begin a season.....the previous record (51) was held by reliever Kenley Jansen (2017 with LAD).....Burnes also broke the overall record of 56 by Curt Schilling (2002 with ARI) and Gerrit Cole (2021 with NYY).....Cole since reclaimed the record (61).....on 8/11 at Chicago-NL, Burnes tied the MLB record with 10 consecutive strikeouts - between the second and fifth innings - a mark he shares with the Mets' Tom Seaver (4/22/70 vs. SD) and the Phillies' Aaron Nola (6/25/21 at NYM).....his 15 strikeouts rank second in franchise history for a game, trailing Ben Sheets (18 on 5/16/04 vs. ATL).....on 9/11 at Cleveland, Burnes combined with Josh Hader on the second no-hitter in franchise history as the Brewers won, 3-0 (Bip, Oh, 1bb, 14k, 115 pitches).....the only other no-hitter was thrown by Juan Nieves on 4/15/87 at Baltimore.....Burnes recorded 8 starts of 9+ strikeouts without a walk last season, tying a MLB record shared with Curt Schilling (2002), Clayton Kershaw (2014) and Gerrit Cole (2019).

CAREER: Is 24-12 with a 3.25 ERA in 107 games/46 starts (346.1ip, 125er).....is in his fifth Major League season, all with the Brewers (2018-22).....is 16-9 with a 2.79 ERA as a starter (264.1ip, 82er) and 8-3 with a 4.72 ERA in relief (82ip, 43er).....notched saves on 7/10/18 at Miami (MLB debut) and 6/2/19 at Pittsburgh.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 11-9 with a 3.53 ERA in 51 games/24 starts (183.2ip, 72er)....is 1-1 with a 1.74 ERA in 3 starts this season (20.2ip, 4er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 13-3 with a 2.93 ERA in 56 games/22 starts (162.2ip, 53er)....is 0-0 with a 2.25 ERA in 2 starts this season (12ip, 3er).

CAREER vs. BRAVES: Is 1-0 with an 18.90 ERA in 4 games/1 start, all coming in Atlanta (6.2ip, 14er).....received no decision in his only start last season on 7/30 at Truist Park (4ip, 9h, 5r, 5er, 2bb, 6k, 1hr).....also started Game 1 of the 2021 NLDS on 10/8 in Milwaukee (ND, 6ip, 2h, 0r, 3bb, 6k, 1wp).....Brewers won, 2-1.
