TONIGHT'S STARTERS: RHP MAX SCHERZER (2-7, 6.16) vs. RHP SETH LUGO (6-8, 5.03)

LAST NIGHT: The Royals suffered a 9-2 loss in last night's series opener vs. Toronto, falling to 1-3 on the homestand.

- + They've lost 4 of the last 5 games, following a 12-1 stretch.
- + **Carter Jensen** doubled with 2 outs in the 8th inning to extend his on-base streak to 10 games, and each of his last 7 hits have gone for extra bases, which is tied for the 2nd-longest streak by a catcher in Royals history, trailing only **Fran Healy** (10) in 1974, according to *Elias*.
- + Making his 6th start of the season, **Daniel Lynch IV** worked a season-high 5.0 innings, his most since June 12, 2024 vs. the Yankees, when he pitched 6.2 innings in relief.

THE LAST 20 GAMES: Despite losing 4 of their last 5 games, the Royals have gone 14-6 in their last 20 games since the start of their series in Anaheim on Aug. 14, during which they have the best record in the American League.

- + Since Aug. 14, the Royals have the 3rd-best run differential in the American League (+22) and lead all AL teams in slugging percentage (.454), OPS (.799) and runs per game (5.3), rank 2nd in on-base pct. (.345) and tied for 2nd in batting average (.274).

SERIES SPEAKING: The Royals dropped last night's series opener to the Blue Jays, and must win each of the next 2 games to avoid losing back-to-back series for the first time since Aug. 7-12 vs. the Cubs (1-2) and at the Dodgers (0-3).

- + Their 1-3 start to this 9-game homestand comes on the heels of a 5-series win streak from Aug. 14-30, during which they went 13-3 and had their longest series win streak since April 22-May 8, 2025 (also 5 straight series).

HOME: The Royals tonight continue their penultimate stay of the season, a 9-game homestand vs. the Marlins (1-2), Blue Jays (0-1) and Diamondbacks...Tuesday night began a stretch in which they are playing 15 of their last 24 games at Kauffman Stadium, where they are 37-33 (.529), which is tied with Seattle for the 5th-best home record in the AL.

- + The Royals are 18-7 (.720) in their last 25 games here at Kauffman Stadium, which is tied with the Red Sox and Brewers for the 3rd-best home record in the Majors since July 5, behind only the Padres (19-7) and Braves (21-8).
- + The Royals are 5-3-3 on 11 homestands this season.
- + The Royals are tied for the American League lead in home batting average (.266), rank 2nd in on-base pct. (.332), slugging pct. (.438) and OPS (.771) and 3rd in R/G (4.9).

SECOND THOUGHTS: The Royals are 25-20 (.556) since the All-Star break, which is the 6th-best record in the American League, trailing the Red Sox (31-17), Rays (28-19), Astros (26-18), Yankees (26-19) and Blue Jays (26-20).

- + Their 2nd-half play marks a significant improvement for the Royals, who were 21 games under (38-59) before the break, which tied for the worst record in the Majors.
- + The Royals win pct. has improved from .392 before the break to .556 since, for a difference of +.164, best in MLB.
- + The Royals are 8-5-1 in 14 completed series since the All-Star break, after going 9-19-3 in 31 sets in the 1st half... their 8 series wins since the break are 1 behind the Red Sox (9) for the most in the American League.

AMERICA'S SHORTSTOP: Since returning from the Injured List on Aug. 4, **Bobby Witt Jr.** leads the American League with 28 runs in 29 games and ranks 2nd in the Majors, trailing only **Pete Crow-Armstrong** (30).

- + Last night, Witt Jr. hit his 17th home run of the season, a solo shot in the 1st inning...he's on pace to finish the season with 19 HR, but if he does reach the 20-HR mark, he would extend his record as the first player in Major League history to record at least 20 HR and 30 steals in each of his first five MLB seasons, as no other player has done so in more than three seasons to begin a career.
- + Witt Jr., who has won the American League *Rawlings* Gold Glove at shortstop each of the last two seasons and won the American League Platinum Glove last year, is tied with Crow-Armstrong for the lead among players at all positions with 24 Outs Above Average in 2026.
- + He leads the AL in fWAR (6.5) and is 3rd in the Majors behind Crow-Armstrong (9.5) and **Shohei Ohtani** (6.8).

OUTS FROM THE OUTFIELD: The Royals have 31 outfield assists this season, 1 shy of the Red Sox (32) for the Majors lead, and their most since 2023, when they led the American League and ranked 2nd in the Majors with 37 outfield assists.

- + **Isaac Collins** ranks 3rd in the AL with 9 outfield assists, 3 shy of leader **Wilyer Abreu** (12), and all have come from left field, which leads the Majors at that position.

DAILY DOUBLE: The Royals rank 2nd in the Majors with 257 doubles, only 2 shy of the Red Sox (259)...they are attempting to lead Major League Baseball in doubles for just the sixth time in franchise history, following 1977 (299), 1978 (305), 1982 (295), 1990 (316) and 1992 (284).

- + They have recorded a double in 9 straight games since Aug. 26, with 22 total doubles in that span.
- + The Royals boast a Majors-most seven players who have recorded at least 20 doubles this season, led by **Bobby Witt Jr.** and **Carter Jensen's** 28 doubles apiece, which rank tied for 7th in the American League.
- + Jensen's 28 doubles are T-1st among Major League rookies.

LEADING OFF: **Carter Jensen** has 6 leadoff home runs in 64 games from the leadoff spot, which are tied for the 2nd-most leadoff HR in the American League, 1 shy of **Joc Pederson** (7).

- + Jensen's most recent leadoff homer on Wednesday night broke a tie with **Johnny Damon** (1998) and **Alex Gordon** (2011) for the single-season franchise record...Jensen's 6 leadoff HR (all as a catcher), are the most in a season by a player at the position since 1900, according to *Elias*.
- + Jensen now has hit 3 home runs in his last 3 games and has 5 home runs in his last 8 games, giving him 22 HR this year, matching **Carlos Beltrán** (1999) and **Bo Jackson** (1987) for the 2nd-most home runs in a season by Royals rookie, only 2 shy of **Bob Hamelin** (24) in 1994.
- + Jensen's 22 HR are the 2nd most by a rookie left-handed-hitting catcher, trailing Detroit's **Matt Nokes** (32) in 1987.
- + Jensen leads AL rookies with 52 extra-base hits and each of his last 7 hits have gone for extra bases, tied for the 2nd-longest such streak by a catcher in Royals history.
- + He's recorded at least 1 XBH in a career-high 4 straight games, tied for the 2nd-longest run by a Royal in 2026, behind only **Lane Thomas'** 7-game streak from July 2-9.
- + Carter started batting leadoff regularly on May 30, and in 85 team games since, the Royals rank among the Major League leaders in the 1st inning in batting average (.282, 1st), on-base percentage (.341, 1st), runs (58, T-1st), slugging percentage (.499, 3rd) and OPS (.840, 3rd).

THE ADVENTURES OF CARTER AND CAGS: **Jac Caglianone** and **Carter Jensen** are just 23 years old, but they rank 1st and 2nd on the team in home runs with 23 and 22, respectively...as first noted by **Dave Holtzman**, they're the first set of Royals teammates age 23 or younger to have 22 HR in a season.

- + Among American League players age 23 or younger, they rank 2nd and 3rd, respectively, in HR, trailing only **Junior Caminero** (37)...the Royals record for HR by a player in his age-23 season is 30, set by **Bobby Witt Jr.** in 2023.
- + Prior to Carter and Cags this season, the last two teams to have two players hit 22 HR at age 23 or younger were the 2025 Athletics (**Nick Kurtz** and **Tyler Soderstrom**) and the 2021 Blue Jays (**Bo Bichette** and **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.**).

RALLY ON 2: The Royals have scored 41.1% of their runs this season with 2 outs, the 3rd-highest rate in the Majors, trailing only the Astros (45.2%) and Mets (41.4%) and well above the Major League average of 37.6%.

- + On the flip side, 41.3% of the runs allowed by the Royals this season have scored with 2 outs, the 3rd-highest rate in the Majors to Texas (43.4%) and the Yankees (41.4%).

HEATING UP!: The game-time temperatures for the 1st 4 games of this homestand have been 97°F, 98°F, 97°F and 97°F...this 4-game streak matches the Royals record for consecutive games played at 97°F or warmer, done previously from July 30-Aug. 2, 2006, a stretch that included 1 game in Texas and 3 here at Kauffman Stadium.

- + Wednesday night's 1st-pitch temp of 98°F was the 2nd warmest in the month of September in the 54-season history of Kauffman Stadium, trailing a 99°F game here on Sept. 8, 2013 vs. the Tigers.
- + More hot weather is on deck tonight, as Kansas City's temperature is projected to reach a high of 100°F.

VS. BLUE JAYS: The Royals dropped last night's series opener to the Jays after taking 2 of 3 in Toronto last week, which was their 5th straight series win vs. them dating back to 2024...another loss tonight or tomorrow would mark the Royals 1st series loss to the Blue Jays since Sept. 8-10, 2023 at the Rogers Centre, where they were swept in 3 games.

- + The 5 straight series wins vs. the Blue Jays matches a Royals record, previously done from 1977-78 and 1985-86.
- + Prior to this streak of 5 series wins vs. the Blue Jays, the Royals had lost 8 of the previous 10 dating back to 2018.

SETH LUGO is making his 152nd career start (389th outing) and 29th this season tonight vs. Toronto...he's in his 11th Major League season and third with Kansas City, after spending seven seasons with the Mets (2016-22) and one with the Padres (2023).

- + Originally signed a two-year contract with the Royals in December 2023, but in July 2025, he signed a two-year extension through 2027, with a vesting option for 2028.
- + Missed one turn in the rotation while on the Concussion Injured List from June 12-19.

A START TO FORGET: Seth suffered his 8th loss of the season in last Sunday's road trip finale in Cleveland, where he allowed a career-high 9 earned runs in 3.2 innings of an 11-1 defeat...after allowing just 1 home run over his previous 8 starts combined, he yielded 2 HR to the Guardians, including 2-run homers to **Nathaniel Lowe** in the 1st inning and **José Ramírez** in the 4th...the Royals jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the top of the 1st inning, but the Guardians went on to score 11 unanswered runs on 13 hits, including 9 off Lugo...he retired only 11 of his 22 batters faced, and 2 of the outs he recorded scored runs for Cleveland, with sacrifice flies from Ramírez and Lowe.

AUGUST WASN'T KIND: Lugo is hoping to turn the page as he enters September, after pitching to an 8.31 ERA (28 ER in 30.1 IP) in 6 starts last month, which was nearly double his 4.32 ERA (16 ER in 33.1 IP) in 6 July starts...he yielded at least 5 runs in 4 of his 6 starts in August, despite showing improvements in his walks and HR allowed.

- + Seth has allowed just 3 home runs in his last 9 starts since July 17 (49.1 IP, 0.6 HR/9), after yielding 15 HR over his 1st 19 starts of the season (104.2 IP, 1.3 HR/9).
- + He's walked just 4 batters in his last 5 starts, after walking 45 in his 1st 23 starts.
- + The Royals have scored 28 runs in his last 5 starts since Aug. 8 vs. the Cubs, and have won 4 of those games, despite Lugo's unsightly 8.17 ERA in that stretch.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Lugo's 14 quality starts are tied for the 7th most in the American League this season, 5 behind leader **Michael Wacha**...since joining the Royals in 2024, he's recorded a quality start in 48 of his 87 outings (55.2%)...over that span, 56 different pitchers have started at least 70 games, and his 55.2% rate of quality starts ranks 13th among that group, trailing Philadelphia's **Zack Wheeler** (69.6%).

- + His 48 overall quality starts since 2024 rank 6th in the Majors and 3rd in the AL.
- + Lugo's 30 wins as a Royal are tied for the 8th most in the American League since the start of 2024, trailing leaders **Carlos Rodón** and **Tarik Skubal** (38 each).
- + His 506.0 innings pitched since 2024 are the 4th most in the AL (9th in MLB).

THE BEST OFFENSE IS A GOOD DEFENSE: Seth has benefited from the Royals impressive defense this season, which ranks 7th in the Majors with 16 Outs Above Average (per *Baseball Savant*), including 27 OAA from the infield alone, which leads all American League infield defenses...it's for this reason that he's successfully induced 18 double plays in 27 starts this year, 2 behind **Braxton Ashcraft** for the MLB lead... since joining the Royals in 2024, his 45 double plays induced rank 6th in the Majors.

- + On July 28 in Minnesota, he became the first Royal to induce at least 4 groundball double plays in a game since **Jason Vargas** (4) on June 2, 2017 vs. Cleveland...it was the 22nd such instance in club history, and he's the 17th different pitcher to do so.
- + He's recorded 6 pickoffs since the start of last season, after not having any pickoffs over the first nine years of his career...his 6 pickoffs in this span are tied for the 3rd most in the AL, behind only **Max Fried** (9) and **Gavin Williams** (7).
- + Lugo was named a *Rawlings* Gold Glove Award winner in 2024, becoming the first Royals pitcher to win the award since **Bret Saberhagen** in 1989.

IN FOR A TREAT: Lugo has started some of the craziest and most memorable games of the season, including 5 games that have been decided in extras...his 5 starts in extra-inning games are tied for the 3rd most in the Majors and trail **Freddy Peralta** and **Reid Detmers**, who have each started 7 extra-inning games...Royals Hall of Famer **Mark Gubicza** started a club-record 7 extra-inning games in 1989.

- + The Royals are 14-14 in his 28 starts this year, but have had a lead in 20 of his games.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Seth has gone 4-4 at Kauffman Stadium this year, with a 3.98 ERA (36 ER in 81.1 IP), and the Royals have won 8 of his 14 starts, including each of his last 4 and 5 of his last 6...of the 36 ER he's allowed at home, 7 came in 1 start on April 26 vs. the Angels, and he owns a 3.48 ERA (29 ER in 75.0 IP) otherwise.

- + His home ERA is more than 2 runs lower than his 6.19 road ERA (50 ER in 72.2 IP).
- + Since 2024, he's gone 15-14 in 45 starts at Kauffman Stadium with a 3.62 ERA (107 ER in 265.2 IP) and has held opponents to 2 ER or fewer in 26 of his 45 starts.

VS. BLUE JAYS: Tonight will mark Lugo's 9th career appearance (5th start) vs. Toronto, and his 2nd in his last 3 outings, after facing them on Aug. 25 in Toronto, where he earned his 6th win of the season with 5.0 innings of 1-run ball in a 5-3 victory.

- + Overall, he's 4-1 with a 2.40 ERA (8 ER in 30.0 IP) and 29 strikeouts vs. Toronto.
- + His last start vs. them on Aug. 25 marked his 1st win vs. an American League East team since May 1, 2025 at Tampa Bay...that snapped a run of 8 winless starts vs. the division, during which he went 0-4 despite a 3.86 ERA (19 ER in 44.1 IP).

KANSAS CITY ROYALTY: Since joining the Royals prior to the start of the 2024 season, Lugo has gone 30-24 (.556) with a 3.95 ERA (222 ER in 506.0 IP), which is the 15th-lowest ERA in the American League over this stretch (min. 400.0 IP).

- + In the 58-season history of the Royals, 36 different pitchers have made at least 75 starts with the club, and among that group, Lugo's 3.95 ERA ranks tied for 16th.
- + Had the best season of his career in his first year with Kansas City in 2024, as he finished 2nd in the AL **Cy Young** Award voting after ranking 2nd in the Majors in innings (206.2), T-2nd in the AL in wins (16) and 6th in the AL in ERA (3.00).

ATTACKING THE ZONE: Seth has thrown 1st-pitch strikes at a rate of 64.7% this season which is the 12th-highest rate in the Majors, trailing Baltimore's **Trevor Rogers** (69.3%)...he threw a career-high 27 1st-pitch strikes on April 26 vs. the Angels.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP RANDY DOBNAK (2-3, 2.65)

- + **Randy Dobnak** will make his 10th start of the season and the 31st of his career (51st appearance) in tomorrow's series finale vs. the Blue Jays.

+ In his last start on Tuesday night vs. the Marlins, Dobnak was charged with the loss as the Royals fell, 6-3, after he allowed 6 runs on 7 hits and 2 walks in 6.0 innings, with 6 strikeouts...after a clean 1st inning, he was bit in the 2nd by a single from **Owen Caissie** and a 2-run homer by **Graham Pauley**...scoreless efforts in the 3rd and 4th kept Miami at bay before a 2-out, solo homer in the 5th from **Kyle Stowers** extended the visitors lead...he went 1-2-3 in the 6th and returned for the 7th, but allowed hits to each of the 1st 3 batters, including a 2-run triple from Pauley, and was pulled in favor of **Anthony Gose**, who allowed the inherited runner to score.

+ Since July 8, Randy has pitched to a 2.52 ERA (15 ER in 53.2 IP), the 8th-best mark in the American League in that span (min. 50.0 IP)...his 0.67 HR/9 mark also ranks 4th in the AL during this stretch, trailing Toronto's **José Soriano** (0.36).
- + He has faced the Blue Jays just once in his career, earlier this season on Aug. 26 at Rogers Centre, where he was charged with the loss despite recording a quality start in which he allowed 3 runs on 6 hits and 1 walk in 6.0 innings, with 5 strikeouts as the Royals lost 3-0...a 3-run homer from **Nathan Lukes** was his only blemish.

+ Across 8 games (5 starts) vs. the American League East in his career, Dobnak is 0-5 with a 6.21 ERA (23 ER in 33.1 IP) and 14 strikeouts, as his teams are 1-7...he has surrendered 5 earned runs across 10.0 innings in 2 games vs. the division this year.

+ In 6 games (5 starts) at The K this season, Randy is 1-2 with a 4.45 ERA (14 ER in 28.1 IP) and 20 strikeouts...his last start vs. Miami was his 1st game allowing multiple home runs since June 9, 2021 vs. the Yankees with Minnesota (4 HR).

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- + **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost's** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 287 wins are tied with Royals Hall of Famer **John Wathan** for the 5th most in club history...he's 13 wins shy of becoming the fifth Royals Manager to reach 300 wins (Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317).

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Elias*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.
- + Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Elias, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.

+ Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash's** staff in Tampa Bay and four seasons on **Terry Francona's** staff in Cleveland...during his 12 full seasons on a big league staff, his teams have reached the postseason seven times.

REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

- + **Bill Duplissea** is in his 21st season with the Royals and has served as the Replay Coordinator since Instant Replay was instituted in 2014...during that time, the Royals 65.4% success rate is 1st in the Majors, ahead of the 2nd-place Yankees (64.0%).

+ Duplissea has overturned 22 of 30 challenges this season (73.3%), which is the best rate in the Majors according to the latest update sent from MLB last Friday.

+ In 12 full seasons of Instant Replay, the Royals have finished in the top 5 in success rate eight times and have finished in the top 10 in all 12 seasons.
- + Duper started with the Royals as a Bullpen Catcher in 2006, then added advance scouting duties in 2012...in his current role, he works closely with the coaching staff in scouting upcoming opponents, in addition to his in-game replay role.

+ Prior to joining the Royals, he spent 2004-05 as an Assistant Coach at the College of San Mateo, helping lead the Bulldogs to conference titles in both seasons.

+ Duplissea was a catcher for five seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, reaching Triple-A Albuquerque in 2000.
