**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have lost back-to-back games and would need a win tonight to avoid their longest losing streak since July 25-28 (3)...the Rays are 1-4 in their last 5 games and 5-7 in their last 12 games, their worst 5-game stretch since June 29–July 4 (1-4) and worst 12-game stretch since June 20–July 4 (5-7)...the Rays have more losses this month (7) than they did in all of August but have led in the 7th inning (or later) in five of the 7 losses this month...the Rays are an AL-best 36-18 since the All-Star break.

- + With their next win, the Rays would reach 90 wins for the eighth time in franchise history, all in the last 14 seasons...only three other clubs have a chance to reach 90+ wins for the eighth time since 2008: Dodgers (9. includes this season). Yankees (7) and Red Sox (7).
- + The Rays are attempting to become the first AL club to 90 wins this season after being the first previously to 80, 70, 40 and 30 wins.
- + The Rays have held sole possession of the AL's best record for 62 days this season, including 40 straight since the end of play on Aug 6...the Rays have led the AL East since the end of play on July 31, a run of 46 consecutive days since then...mathemetically the Rays are guaranteed to set a franchise record for consecutive days alone in first place, passing 52 straight (2x-last April 22-June 12, 2010).
- + The Rays have an 8-game lead in the division and a 9-game cushion for the postseason and can clinch a playoff spot as early as Sep 18.
- + With 18 games remaining, the Rays are on pace to go 100-62, which would set a franchise record for wins in a single season over 2008 (97-65)...they would need to go 11-7 or better to reach 100 wins.
- + The Rays have trailed in 48.3 pct. (43 of 89) of their wins this season and their 43 come-from-behind wins lead the majors (Boston, 41).
- + The Rays are 46-22 (.676) against AL East foes, including 12-4 since Aug 12, 20-5 since July 29 and 40-14 since May 13 after a 6-8 start.
- + RH Shawn Armstrong and RH David Hess both cleared waivers and both accepted an outright assignment to Triple-A Durham.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE—The Rays have used 59 players and 36 pitchers (excluding position players) this season, both of which are club records... their previous highs were 57 players used and 31 pitchers used in 2019.

- + The Rays have nine players with 10+ HR, most among AL clubs and tied with the Cubs for 2nd in the majors behind the Giants (10)... they have 14 players with at least 5 HR, tied for 4th in the majors.
- + The Rays have used 24 pitchers for 15+ IP, T-1st in MLB, and don't have a pitcher with the qualifying innings for ERA leaderboards.
- + The Rays have 13 pitchers with a save, breaking a tie with the 2020 Rays and 1973 Rangers for a major league record...the Rays had 11 pitchers with a save in 2019, 12 in 2020 and 13 in 2021, the first team to have 10+ pitchers with one in three straight seasons...since the All-Star break, 10 Rays pitchers have combined for 14 saves.

**KING OF THE ROAD**—The Rays are 44-29 on the road, best in the AL and 3rd in the majors behind the Brewers (49-24) and Giants (48-27)...the Rays are 20-9 since July 4 after a 10-game losing streak from June 15–July 3.

- + The Rays have scored a majors-most 423 runs on the road (Giants, 383) and are averaging 5.79 runs per game, best in the majors...the Rays have hit 112 HR on the road, 3rd in MLB and 2nd in the AL.
- + Since the July 23 debut of **Nelson Cruz**, the Rays have totaled 164 runs in 24 road games...the 6.83 runs per game since then lead MLB over the Blue Jays (5.85) and is an increase from 5.29 before that.
- + Rays pitching ranks 17th in the majors with a 4.62 ERA on the road, while their 2.99 ERA at home ranks 2nd behind the Dodgers (2.90).
- + The Rays have lost in walk-off fashion 10 times, most in the AL and tied with the Mets and Nationals for 2nd in the majors behind the Marlins (11)...they had eight walk-off losses in their first 36 road games but have just two in the last 33 road games since July 29.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays lead the majors with 776 runs scored over Toronto (765) and lead the majors at 5.39 runs per game...the Rays took over the major league lead in runs scored through games of Aug 29, the latest in a season by games or date they have led the majors...the Rays have the highest-scoring offense in club history, passing their 4.96 runs per game in 2009...since the July 23 debut of **Nelson Cruz**, the Rays have scored 302 runs in 47 games, leading the majors over the Blue Jays (288) and Brewers (248)...the Rays are averaging a ML-most 6.43 runs per game since his debut, nearly a run higher than 2nd-place Toronto (5.54)...that mark hasn't been reached in a full season since the 1950 Red Sox (6.67).

+ The Rays have increased their major league rank in runs scored in five straight years, from 25th in 2017 to 16th, T-15th, 12th and 1st.

- + The Rays have scored 7+ runs in 55.3 pct. (26 of 47) of games since Nelson Cruz debuted for them, compared to 30.9 pct. before that.
- + The Rays rank 6th in the majors with 199 HR and 5th with 517 BB, and rank 6th in the AL with a .319 OBP, 6th in avg. with RISP/2 out (.241) and 8th with a .241 avg. overall...the Rays rank 2nd in the majors with 1,389 SO and rank 9th in the AL in avg. with RISP (.253)...their strikeout rate reached 28.2 pct. in May but has dropped to 25.1 in June, 24.4 in July, 22.5 in August and 21.2 in September.
- + The Rays have a club-record nine grand slams, most in the AL and tied with the Dodgers for 3rd in MLB behind the Rockies (11) and Braves (10)...the Rays are batting .398/.463/.743 (45-for-113) with the bases loaded, leading the majors in avg., on-base pct. and slugging.
- + Since the All-Star break, the Rays have hit 89 HR, which ranks 3rd in the majors since then behind the Blue Jays (102) and Braves (91).
- + This season the Rays are batting .297 (239-for-804) with RISP in the 89 wins, compared to .165 (67-for-407) with RISP in the 55 losses.

**FASHIONABLY LATE**—The Rays have scored a franchise-record and majors-most 289 runs in the 7th inning or later (Dodgers, 247), including a majors-most 104 runs in the 8th (Phillies, 94) and majors-most 76 runs in the 9th (Padres, 61)...the Rays are on pace for 325 runs in the 7th inning or later, which would be the most for a club since the 2009 Yankees (336)... the Rays have outscored their opponents, 289-185, in these frames, and the 185 runs allowed are the 4th-fewest in the majors behind the Padres (165), Mets (170) and Indians (175)...their +104 differential in the 7th inning or later leads the majors ahead of the Padres (+61) and Giants (+49).

**HERE'S THE PITCH**—The Rays have pitched to a 3.81 ERA this season, 8th in the majors and 4th in the AL, and their 73 games of allowing 3 runs (or fewer) are tied with the Astros for most in the AL...the Rays are attempting to finish among the majors' top ten in ERA for a fifth straight season.

- + Since June 15—the day after **Tyler Glasnow** left his start with injury—Rays starters are 20-14 with a 4.92 ERA (354.2-IP, 194-ER) in 77 games, the 9th-highest ERA in the majors…before that, Rays starters ranked 8th in the majors and 2nd in the AL with a 3.49 ERA.
- + The Rays led the AL in ERA as late as the end of play on Aug 10 but since then have a 4.60 ERA (278-IP, 142-ER) in the last 31 games.
- + Last night the Rays allowed 17 hits, their 3rd-most of the season behind June 30 at WSH (18) and Aug 11 at BOS (19)...the Rays have yielded 29 hits and 16 runs (13 ER) in their last 2 games, with back-to-back games of 8 runs (or more) for the third time this season.
- + The Rays bullpen has pitched to a 3.33 ERA this season, best in the AL over the Yankees (3.64) and 3rd in the majors behind the Giants (3.02) and Dodgers (3.10)...the bullpen leads the majors with 52 wins and 618.2 IP and leads the AL with a 1.17 WHIP and .297 OBP...the bullpen has a 5.77 ERA (68.2-IP, 44-ER) in 15 games since Aug 29.

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—The Rays are 8-6 against the Blue Jays this season (3-3 at home, 5-3 on the road) but 3-4 since July 2 after a 5-2 start...this series is the first time the Rays are facing the Blue Jays in Toronto since Sep 27-29, 2019, when the Rays won the opener to clinch a spot in the Wild Card Game...between visits, the Rays played them in road series in Buffalo (Aug 14-16, 2020), Dunedin (May 21-24, 2021) and Buffalo (July 2-4, 2021)...the Rays faced them 13 times before the All-Star break and this series began a stretch of 6 games in 10 days against them from Sep 13-22.

- + The Rays and Blue Jays rank 1st and 2nd in MLB in runs scored.
- + This season the Rays have scored 37 runs in 52.2 innings against the Blue Jays bullpen and 26 runs in 75.1 innings against their starters—and 5 runs against their starters came off opener **Trent Thornton**.
- + The Rays are batting .500/.692/1.250 (4-for-8) with 2 HR, 17 RBI, 4 BB and 1 HBP in 13 PA against them with the bases loaded this season.
- + Since the start of last season, the Rays have trailed in 17 of 24 regular season games but have overcome a deficit in 11 of 14 wins.

SHORTS—The Rays are 18-21 in 1-run games this season and 6-12 in extrainning games after going 14-5 and 4-3, respectively, during the shortened season...Austin Meadows has a career-high 99 RBI, tied for 6th in the majors...he is 1 RBI shy of becoming the sixth player (11th time) in club history with 100 RBI in a single season and first since Evan Longoria (104) in 2010...Mike Zunino has a career-high 29 HR and is attempting to become the third AL catcher this century (since 2001) to reach 30 HR (while playing the position)...he would join MIN Mitch Garver (30) in 2019 and NYY Jorge Posada (30) in 2003 as the only AL catchers since then with 30 HR.

LAST START-On Sep 7 at BOS, recorded his second win of the season after allowing 1 run in 5 IP, tying his career high from Aug 24 at PHI...a leadoff single in the 2nd came around to score on a RBI groundout, his only run allowed...worked around baserunners in his last 3 IP, including stranding a leadoff double in the 5th with a flyout and two groundouts... has not allowed a walk in his last 13 IP, beginning with the 2nd inning on Aug 24 at PHI...his line: W. 5 IP. 6 H. 1 R/ER. 0 BB. 2 SO. 71 pitches. 43 str.

- Allowed 3 runs in 13 IP over 3 starts this season against Boston.
- Has allowed 1 run (or fewer) in his last 12 apps (6 starts), including all 11 apps (6 starts) since the All-Star break...has a 2.04 ERA (35.1-IP, 8-ER) since the All-Star break, which ranks 7th in the majors and 2nd in the AL (min. 30 IP) behind CLE Cal Quantrill (1.97).

BRINGING THE HEAT-Has used his 4-seam fastball on 66.4 pct. of his total pitches this season, the 4th-highest rate in the majors (min. 1,000 total pitches)...since his Rays debut, his avg. 4-seam fastball velocity is 97.2 mph, tied for 3rd-fastest in the majors and tied for 2nd in the AL (min. 400  $\,$ fastballs)...has thrown 24 4-seam fastballs at 99 mph (or faster) over that stretch, tied for 9th-most in the AL...opponents are batting just .230 (35for-152) against his fastball, and he has recorded 43 SO in at-bats ending with the pitch...since joining the Rays, 23 of his 40 SO have been recorded with the fastball...has posted a 27.0 pct. whiff rate with his fastball this season, including recording a career-high 13 whiffs on Sep 1 vs. BOS

vs. BLUE JAYS—Will be making his second career app and his first start against the Blue Jays, previously facing them on July 11 at Tropicana Field when he pitched two scoreless innings of relief...entered the game in the 8th inning and retired six of his 7 BF, issuing a single in the 9th.

+ Is 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (28.1-IP, 5-ER) in 10 apps (4 starts) against AL East opponents this season, yielding 1 run (or fewer) in all 10 apps.

START ME UP-Has made all seven career starts with the Rays, including his first career start on June 30 at WSH, and has recorded a 2.33 ERA (27-IP, 7-ER) across those outings...since joining the starting rotation full-time on Aug 12 at BOS, has pitched to a 1.64 ERA (22-IP, 4-ER) in 5 starts with

- a .190 opp avg. (15-for-79), 3.75 SO/BB ratio (15 SO, 4-BB) and 0.86 WHIP. + Has allowed 1 run (or fewer) in his last 6 starts since July 24.
  - Went 1-1 with a 3.97 ERA (34-IP, 15-ER) in 25 relief apps this season, including a 3.71 ERA (17-IP, 7-ER) in 10 relief apps with the Rays.

**HOW HE GOT HERE**—Made the Brewers Opening Day roster this season, the first of his career, and went 0-1 with a 4.24 ERA (17-IP, 8-ER) and 25 SO in 15 apps with Milwaukee, all in relief...acquired by the Rays along with RH J.P. Feyereisen on May 21 in the Willy Adames trade and optioned to Triple-A Durham...recalled on June 18 and made his Rays debut the next night at SEA, pitching 1.2 scoreless innings...optioned on June 21 but was recalled again on June 24 and has remained on the active roster since.

- Made 12 apps with the Brewers in 2020, going 1-0 with a 5.87 ERA (15.1-IP 10-ER), 2.33 SO/BB ratio (21-SO, 9-BB) and 1.70 WHIP.
- Recorded his first career win on Sep 18, 2020 vs. KC (with MIL), entering in the 5th inning and pitching a scoreless inning of relief in a 9-5 win...allowed 1 hit and 1 BB but recorded 2 SO in the frame.

MINOR MATTERS—Is 3-3 with a 2.73 ERA (85.2-IP, 26-ER) in 35 career minor league apps (24 starts)...went 2-0 and did not allow a run in 8 apps (1 start) spanning 11.1 IP with the Bulls...held opponents to a .132 avg. (5-for-38) and struck out 23 of 42 BF (54.8 pct.)...marked his first minors appearance since his first professional season in 2019, when he went 1-3 with a 3.15 ERA (74.1-IP, 26-ER) over 27 apps (23 starts) between Class-A Wisconsin, High-A Carolina and Double-A Biloxi in the Brewers organization... struck out 31.7 pct. (96 of 303) of batters faced across those three levels.

AMATEUR CAREER-Selected by the Diamondbacks out of Mount Spokane (Wash.) High School in 2014 but opted to attend college at Oregon State, where he pitched the first perfect game in school history...selected 31st overall by the Rays in the 2017 Amateur Draft but did not sign and underwent a second Tommy John surgery in September 2017, which forced him to miss the 2018 season...signed with the Brewers as a sixthround pick in the 2018 Draft and spent the 2019 season in the minors.

- + Has a 12.39 SO/9 IP ratio (20.1-IP, 28-SO) over his last 4 starts...the 28

SO are his most for a 4-start span since July 6-28, 2017 (with STL).

vs. BLUE JAYS—Has a 2.25 ERA (8-IP. 2-ER) in two career starts against the Blue Jays, including his start on May 23 at TD Ballpark when he did not allow a run in 2 IP...marked his first app after missing 18 games due to right hamstring tightness...retired six of his 7 BF, and his only baserunner allowed was a 2-out single by Lourdes Gurriel Jr. in the 2nd inning.

- + Is 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA (45-IP, 18-ER) vs. AL East foes this season.
- + Will be making his first career start at Rogers Centre.
