METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Pirates, 8-0, last night in Pittsburgh...New York is 7-8 in rubber games this year...The Mets are looking for their 15th series victory of the season and seventh on the road...New York is 5-5 in their last 10 games...The Mets are in the midst of a nine-game road trip (4-1) against the Guardians (3-0), Pirates (1-1) and Braves (three games).

MANAEA ON A MISSION: Sean Manaea is set to take the bump for the Mets today...He has tossed a quality start in each of his last three outings and four of his last five...Since moving back to the rotation full time, Manaea is 2-4 with a 3.79 ERA (23 ER/54.2 IP), 18 walks and 50 strikeouts...This compared to his first 14 appearances of the season where he went 1-1 with a 5.02 ERA (24 ER/43.0 IP), 17 walks and 45 punchouts...Today will mark his third start at PNC Park...He owns a 2.13 ERA (3 ER/12.2 IP) with six walks and 12 strikeouts in his previous two starts at the yard.

LINSANITY: In 21 games following the All-Star break, Francisco Lindor is batting .268/355/512 with nine runs, three doubles, one triple, five homers, 11 walks, 17 RBI and an .867 OPS...This compares to a .216/.298/.373 with 22 runs, three doubles, three triples, five homers, 12 RBI, 16 walks and a .671 OPS in 40 games in the first half of the season.

A.J. GET DOWN HERE!: Over the last 12 games, A.J. Ewing is batting .283 (13-46) with seven runs, four doubles, three RBI, four walks, four steals, a .340 OBP and a .370 SLG...Over his last 28 games, the outfielder is slashing .276/.323/.422 with 11 extra-base hits, nine RBI, seven steals and a .745 OPS...He is 6-19 on the trip with two runs, three doubles, one walk, one steal and an .855 OPS.

ON THE MARCUS: Over the last 13 games, Marcus Semien is batting .282 (11-39) with 10 runs, one double, four homers, 10 RBI, five walks, two steals, a .356 OBP, a .615 SLG and a .971 OPS...He is one home run from matching his 2025 total, which he accomplished in 127 games.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: The Mets have had seven players make their Major League debut this year - OF Carson Benge, OF A.J. Ewing, LHP Nate Lavender, OF Nick Morabito, and RHP Matt Seelinger, LHP Zac Thornton and LHP Jefry Yan...The Mets had nine players make their Major League debut in 2025.

MAKE IT A DOZEN: Carson Benge has safely reached base in 12 straight games since July 25...He is batting 16-45 (.356) in that span with nine runs, two doubles, one triple, two homers, six RBI, three walks, two steals, a .408 OBP, a .578 SLG and a .986 OPS in that span.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets snapped a four game losing streak at PNC Park...The Mets are 35-44 all-time at PNC Park.

BLAME IT ON THE BENGE: Carson Benge is batting .309 (34-110) with 17 runs, five doubles, four homers, 14 RBI, 10 walks, seven steals with a .369 OBP, a .482 SLG and an .851 OPS in 29 games since July 1...His 114 hits are the third-most by a rookie this year and are the second-most in the National League...His 18 steals are the fifth-most by a Mets rookie in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry (1983) is next with 19...Mookie Wilson (1981) owns the franchise record with 24.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies (16-22) won their sixth consecutive game, their longest winning streak of the season, as Jefferson Rojas tallied three hits in a 6-4 victory over the Hartford Yard Goats (15-23) on Saturday night at Mirabito Stadium... Mitch Voit has scored 19 runs in his first 10 Double-A games with six stolen bases...He is batting .568 (21-37) with 19 runs, seven doubles, one triple, one homer, nine RBI with a .644 OBP and an .892 SLG at Double-A.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are in the midst of a nine-game road trip...They are 26-33 away from Citi Field this season...They have posted a 4.17 ERA, while batting .235/.300/.390 on the road this year.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets defeated the Expos, 10-8, in Montreal... Ron Darling tossed 6.1 innings and allowed six runs (three earned) on seven hits with two walks and four strikeouts...The Mets were down 6-1 heading into the eighth...New York scored seven in the eighth and two in the ninth to earn the win...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title today.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70... The Mets are 16-20 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his third win of the season on August 4 at Cleveland...Allowed two runs over 6.0 innings, issued five walks and struck out seven...His five walks matched a career high (last: 8/10/24) and his seven strikeouts tied a season high (also: 4/24 vs. Colorado, 7/18 at Philadelphia)...Has posted a quality start in four of his last five outings.

RIGHTING THE SHIP: Overall, this season, Manaea is 3-5 with a 4.33 ERA (47 ER/97.2 IP) and has 95 strikeouts over 24 appearances (10 starts)...Over his last 16 appearances dating back to May 10, he has pitched to a 3.58 ERA (30 ER/75.1 IP) with 71 strikeouts...He has held opponents to a .250 (71-284) average while posting an 8.48 K/9 IP over that span...Comparatively, he pitched to a 6.85 ERA (17 ER/22.1 IP), and batters were hitting .312 (29-93) off him during his first eight appearances of the season.

VS. PITTSBURGH: Today, Manaea will make his seventh career appearance and fourth career start against Pittsburgh...Manaea last faced the Pirates on March 29 at Citi Field and tossed 1.1 scoreless innings in relief...Through his first six games against the Pirates, Manaea has pitched to a 2.81 ERA (8 ER/25.2 IP)...All three of his starts against Pittsburgh have been quality starts...In three career appearances (2 starts) at PNC Park, he has pitched to a 3.38 ERA (5 ER/13.1 IP)...He last pitched at PNC Park on July 7, 2024 and threw 6.0 scoreless innings.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: This season, he has thrown his sweeper 30.5% of the time...He is one of 17 qualified pitchers who have thrown their sweeper at least 30.0% of the time...He has generated a 30.9% whiff rate on his sweeper...36 of his 95 strikeouts this season have come via the sweeper.

CAREER: Over the course of 11 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has an 82-71 record, a 4.10 ERA (612 ER/1342.2 IP), and 1279 strikeouts in 267 games and 220 starts...His 1279 career strikeouts are the ninth-most among active left-handers...He re-signed with the Mets on a three-year contract in December 2024....The Valparaiso, Indiana native was originally drafted in the first round by the Kansas City Royals in 2013 out of Indiana State University.

- Fired a scoreless eighth inning on August 7 at Pittsburgh (1.0 IP, H, K)...Has pitched to a 1.17 ERA (2 ER/15.1 IP) over 11 appearances this season...10 of his 11 appearances have been scoreless.
- Earned his second career save and first as a Met on August 5 at Cleveland (1.0 IP, BB) when he tossed a scoreless 10th inning...His only other Major League save came on August 13, 2023, at Pittsburgh while with Cincinnati.
- Recorded two outs in the seventh inning on August 4 at Cleveland (0.2 IP, BB).
- Tossed 2.0 scoreless innings and recorded a career-high-tying three strikeouts (2.0 IP, 3 K).
- Threw 1.1 scoreless innings on July 22 at Milwaukee (1.1 IP, K, BB)...Was his first Major League appearance since June 14 vs. Atlanta.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse prior to their game on July 21...Marks his fourth stint with the team this season.
- In 24 appearances (seven starts) with Syracuse this season he is 3-2 and has pitched to 4.75 ERA (16 ER/30.1 IP) with 30 strikeouts...His last appearance came on July 17 vs. Buffalo where he tossed a scoreless inning and stuck out the side on 15 pitches.
- Tossed 2.1 scoreless innings in his season and Mets debut on May 19 at Washington (2.1 IP, H, K)...Marked his longest Major League appearance.
- Pitched in the WBC for Mexico, and over two appearances, he allowed one run over 2.0 innings.
- Before this season, his last Major League appearance came on April 3rd, 2024, at Milwaukee while with Minnesota...He pitched in two games for the Twins that season.
- Made 31 appearances for the Reds in 2023 and pitched to a 3.69 ERA (13 ER/31.2 IP) with three wins and one save...Over 34 Major League appearances between Cincinnati and Minnesota from 2022-2024, he went 3-0 with one save, a 3.99 ERA (17 ER/38.1 IP) and 28 strikeouts.
- Pitched for Los Mochis in the Mexican Winter League in 2025-2026, and he didn't allow an earned run over 24.0 innings.
