RAY REPORT—The Rays open July with a six-day, six-game road trip against the Royals (3 to play) and Rangers (3 to play) tonight at Kauffman Stadium...have won five of seven, eight of 11, nine of 13, and 11 of their last 18 games...following the road trip, the Rays will conclude their pre-All-Star break schedule by hosting two of the AL's top three teams in the Yankees and Guardians from July 9-14...according to Elias, they have the hardest remaining schedule in the majors with a combined opponent winning pct. of .535, with the next closest being Colorado (.517)...the Rays have not been above .500 since entering play on May 21 (25-24).

- With Sunday's 5-0 win vs. Washington, Tampa Bay returned to .500 for the 17th time this season...the Rays earned their fourth straight series win, securing their longest streak since winning six consecutive sets from Aug. 11-30, 2023.
- Tampa Bay recorded its third shutout victory of the season, including its first since April 29 at Milwaukee (1-0)...the Rays three shutouts are tied with Cincinnati for second fewest in MLB, ahead of only Colorado (1).
- Rays pitching collected a season-high 16 strikeouts, their most since Sept. 27, 2023 at Boston (16SO).
- In Sunday's contest, **Isaac Paredes** (3-for-4, 2B, 3B, HR, RBI) became the fifth player in club history to fall a single shy of the cycle, joining **Steven Souza Jr.** (April 20, 2017 vs. DET), **Sam Fuld** (April 11, 2011 at BOS), **Jason Bartlett** (Aug. 10, 2009 at LAA) and **Eric Hinske** (April 22, 2008 vs. TOR).
- Yandy Diaz** completed the month of June with 37 hits, tied with **Julio Lugo** (2006) for third most in the month in Rays history, trailing **Randy Winn** (42H, 2002) and **Carl Crawford** (40H, 2004).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR—It was announced today that Tampa Bay will have three representatives at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game festivities on July 13 at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas...Bowling Green **INF Xavier Isaac** and Montgomery **OF Chandler Simpson** have been named to the AL Futures Roster, while Bowling Green **INF Tre Morgan** will participate in the inaugural MLB Futures Skills Showcase.

- Isaac, 20, is rated by MLB.com as the No. 32 overall prospect in baseball and No. 2 in the Rays system behind **INF Junior Caminer** (No. 3 overall)...he ranks among the South Atlantic League in RBI (1st, 53), OPS (2nd, .932), SLG (2nd, .550), OBP (5th, .382), AVG (5th, .297) and HR (T6th, 12).
- Simpson, 23, is rated the Rays No. 10 prospect by MLB.com...he leads all of MiLB with 56 steals while his 95 hits are third most in the minors...his current 18-game hitting streak is the second-longest active run in MiLB.
- Morgan, 21, is rated Tampa Bay's No. 13 prospect by MLB.com...in 50 games between Class-A Charleston (26G) and Bowling Green (24G), he is batting .340 (65-for-191) with 15 2B, 2 3B, 4 HR, 34 RBI, 26 BB, 23 SO and 13 SB.

RANDY'S RUN—**Randy Arozarena** has reached base safely in 14 straight games since June 14, batting .319/.441/.574 (15-for-47) with 3 2B, 3 HR, 8 RBI, 7 BB, 3 SB and 4 HBP...it marks his longest on-base streak since a career-high 20-game run from April 17-May 9, 2023.

- Over 25 games in June, Arozarena hit .291/.424/.468 (23-for-79) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 9 RBI, 13 BB, 3 SB and 6 HBP...his .424 OBP during June ranked seventh in the AL...this, following a stretch of 56 games from March-May in which his .158 AVG was the lowest among all qualified MLB hitters, while his .258 OBP was third lowest.
- He has reached base safely in 13 straight road games dating to June 1, batting .350/.534/.600 (14-for-40) with 4 2B, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 11 BB and 10 SO.

SIRI'S ACCOLADES—**Jose Siri** was named the AL Defensive Player of the Month for June by Sports Info Solutions...per SIS, his 6 Defensive Runs Saved led all MLB center fielders...showcasing his blend of speed, range and arm strength throughout the month, his most impactful play came on June 20 at MIN...with Tampa Bay holding a 7-6 lead in the bottom of the 10th inning, Siri ranged to his left to catch **Carlos Correa's** leadoff fly ball, then fired a 90.9-mpg throw to third to cut down **Royce Lewis**...prior to his stellar June performance, SIS credited Siri with -2 DRS through May.

RETURN OF THE HOMER—The Rays have homered in 11 of their last 14 games since June 16...their 22 HR during that stretch are tied for fourth most in MLB behind Baltimore/New York-NL (both 29HR) and Minnesota (23HR)...from June 1-15, Tampa Bay hit 8 HR (13G), fifth fewest in the majors.

- During the 14-game stretch since June 16, Tampa Bay has five games with 3 HR, third most in the majors during that period behind BAL/NYM (both 6)...the Rays had two 3+ HR games in 71 contests to open the season (April 14 vs. SF & May 30 vs. OAK), tied with Miami for the fewest in the majors during that timeframe.

ROAD TRIPPIN'—The Rays are 12-7 over their last 19 road games after a 7-10 start...their .632 road winning pct. in that span (since May 15) is tied with the Red Sox (also 12-7) for the best in the majors...the Rays have played 36 road games, tied with the Mets for the fewest in MLB.

- Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely in a career-high-tying 19 straight road games since May 15, batting .313/.378/.475 (25-for-80) with 5 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 14 RBI, 9 BB and 10 SO...he also reached base safely in 19 straight road games from July 27-Sept. 13-G1, 2022...his current 19-game road on-base streak is tied with NYY **Juan Soto** for the fourth-longest active run in the majors.
- Isaac Paredes** has reached base safely in 22 of 23 road games since April 28, batting .326/.396/.488 (28-for-86) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 11 RBI and 9 BB during that stretch.

SOME BREATHING ROOM—In nine games since June 21, a stretch in which the Rays are 6-3, three of their wins have come by 5+ runs (June 30 vs. WSH, June 25 vs. SEA, June 21 at PIT)...entering that stretch, Tampa Bay had four such victories in their first 75 games of the season...overall, the seven such victories are third fewest in the AL ahead of Oakland (5) and Chicago (6).

START YOUR ENGINES—Since posting a 10.13 ERA (16.0IP, 18ER) over four games from June 14-18, the Rays rotation has permitted 2 ER or fewer in seven straight and in 10 of the last 11 games, posting a 2.58 ERA (59.1IP, 17ER) in that span, third in MLB behind the Royals (2.33) and Astros (2.52)...the seven-game streak is their longest since June 3-9, 2023 (8G).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays own the majors' best record in one-run games (16-77/696) and games decided by two runs or fewer (29-127/707)...among AL clubs, only the Athletics (43G) and Mariners (42G) have played in more games decided by two runs or fewer than the Rays (41G)...since April 29, they are 20-6 in such contests and 9-20 in games with a margin of 3+ runs...this includes a 12-4 record in one-run games over that timeframe...seven of their last 10 wins have come by two runs or fewer.

- The Rays 22 comeback wins are tied with six other clubs (BAL, CLE, KC, NYM, NYY, WSH) for second in the majors, trailing the Brewers (25)...Tampa Bay has come from behind in six of 11 and 12 of its last 18 victories.

KANSAS CITY CLASH—The Rays and Royals continue their six-game season series tonight at Kauffman Stadium...Kansas City took two of three from Tampa Bay during their May 24-26 trip to St. Petersburg...**Yandy Diaz** is batting .424 (14-for-33) with 4 2B, 2 HR, 5 RBI, 3 BB, 8 R and 2 SO in 10 games vs. KC since July 24, 2022...in 10 career games at Kauffman Stadium, **Randy Arozarena** is batting .342 (13-for-38) with 2 2B, 1 3B and 4 RBI.

CONNECTIONS

- Royals starter **RHP Brady Singer** pitched at the University of Florida (2016-18) and is a graduate of Eustis High School, located approximately 40 miles northeast of Orlando.
- Rays Pitching Coach **Kyle Snyder** spent parts of three MLB seasons with the Royals (2003, 2005-06), appearing in 29 games (19 starts)...he was a 1st-round selection by Kansas City in the 1999 First-Year Player Draft.
- Kansas City has two other Sunshine State natives on its active roster: **OF MJ Melendez** (Daytona Beach) and **LHP Cole Ragans** (Crawfordville).
- Royals Manager **Matt Quatraro** spent five years on the Rays coaching staff, serving as bench coach (2018) and third base coach (2018-22)...he began his coaching career with 10 seasons in the Rays organization from 2006-13...he is one of three former members of Kevin Cash's coaching staff currently managing in the big leagues, joining **MIN Rocco Baldelli** and **PIT Derek Shelton**.
- Royals reliever **RHP Nick Anderson** pitched for the Rays for three seasons (2019-21)...**OF Hunter Renfroe** appeared in 42 games for the Rays in 2020...both players were members of Tampa Bay's 2020 World Series squad.
- Tampa Bay **RHP Jason Adam** was drafted by the Royals in 2015 and made his major league debut with them in 2018 before being traded to the Blue Jays the following spring...he was originally committed to the University of Missouri before signing with the Royals...he still resides in the Kansas City area during the offseason.
- Rays **RHP Pete Fairbanks** attended the University of Missouri (2013-15) and resides in St. Louis during the offseason.
- Bally Sports Sun announcer **Brian Anderson** (2003-05) and pre/post-game analyst **Doug Waechter** (2009) both pitched for the Royals to conclude their respective major league careers.

Tampa Bay's starting rotation has produced a 2.58 ERA (59.1IP, 17ER) since June 19, the third-lowest mark among any MLB starting rotation during that time.

TONIGHT'S START—The right-hander will take the mound for his 17th start of the season, including his eighth on the road...marks his first career start at Kauffman Stadium (5th app)...has a 3.60 ERA (10.0IP, 4ER) in his last two outings since allowing a season-high 6 ER on June 14 at ATL...has thrown 5.0+ IP in 14 of 16 starts...is looking to snap a career-high three-decision losing streak, seeking his first victory since May 11 vs. NYY.

LAST TIME OUT—Limited the Mariners to a pair of runs across 5.0 innings in an 11-3 win on June 25 at Tropicana Field (ND, 5.0IP, 4H, 2ER, BB, 6SO)...held Seattle scoreless through four frames, collecting 6 SO, including two of **Julio Rodriguez**...yielded a leadoff single in the 5th followed by a game-tying two-run homer by **Ty France**...completed the frame and exited the contest after throwing only 72 pitches (48 strikes)...the Rays plated nine runs over the next three innings following his departure to secure the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP RYAN PEPIOT (4-4, 4.40)

LAST START—He limited the Mariners to one run, which came around to score following his departure, but took a no-decision in a 5-2 home loss on June 26 (5.1IP, 1H, ER, 2BB, 8SO)...the only hit he allowed in the outing was a two-out double by **J.P. Crawford** in the 3rd frame.

vs. ROYALS—Pepiot will be making his first career start against the Royals...he has turned in a 3.10 ERA (20.1IP, 7ER) in four career appearances (2GS) against AL Central opponents, most recently holding the Tigers to one run over 6.0 frames on April 23 at Tropicana Field (ND, 6.0IP, 3H, ER, 2BB, 4SO).

ROYAL RUMBLE—Littell has pitched to a 3.71 ERA (17.0IP, 7ER) and 0.94 WHIP in 11 career relief appearances against the Royals...one of those 11 games came last season, when he yielded only an **Edward Olivares** solo homer in 2.2 innings of work (2.2IP, 2H, ER, 2SO)...that contest came before he officially joined the Rays rotation in mid-July...he has not pitched at Kauffman Stadium since Aug. 21, 2020.

★ Current members of the Royals active roster are a combined 1-for-13 (.077) with 3 SO lifetime vs. Littell.

★ He is 6-4 with a 3.98 ERA (81.1IP, 36ER) in 36 career appearances (8GS) against AL Central opponents...Littell has gone 0-2 with a 4.76 ERA (17.0IP, 9ER) in three starts this season, including a 3.72 ERA (11.0IP, 4ER) in two road outings.

ROAD WOES—Over his last four road starts, Littell is 0-1 with a 7.50 ERA (18.0IP, 15ER) and 2.00 WHIP, allowing opposing hitters to slash .365/.407/.635 (31-for-85) with 5 HR (2.50 HR/9.0IP)...during the same span, Littell has a 3.80 ERA (23.2IP, 10ER) in four home starts...on the season, he has recorded the highest road WHIP (1.74) and opp. average (.338) among qualified major league pitchers while posting the second-highest opp. OPS (.903) behind **CLE Logan Allen** (.905).

A LITTELL HELP?—He has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 16 starts, including seven straight...his 2.70 run support average during the streak (since May 21) is fifth lowest in the AL (min. 30.0IP)...he has exited a start in line for the win just twice in his last 13 outings, earning a win on May 11 vs. NYY and settling for a no-decision on May 16 at BOS.

SUMMERTIME BLUES—Littell went 0-2 with a 6.00 ERA (24.0IP, 16ER) across five starts in June, allowing opponents to hit .333/.369/.590 (35-for-105) with 6 HR...min. 20.0 IP, it marked the second-highest opp. slugging pct. among AL pitchers behind **BAL Cole Irvin** and the seventh-highest ERA...min. 10.0 IP, his 6.00 ERA and 2.25 HR 9.0 IP were both the second-highest marks of any calendar month in his career, trailing May 2022 in both categories (8.49 ERA; 3.86 HR/9.0IP).

TROUBLING TRENDS—Littell has allowed a homer in career-high eight straight starts, the longest active streak in the majors...it marks the longest single-season streak by a Ray since **Jake Odorizzi** (15GS) in 2017...prior to Littell's streak, he had held opponents homerless in six of his first eight starts, ranking seventh in the AL over that span (thru May 11, min. 40.0IP) with 0.60 HR/9.0 IP.

★ He has also issued a walk in a career-high nine straight outings since May 11, but has still managed a 5.3 pct. walk rate in that span.

STRETCH TIME—Littell has been at his best with runners on base, recording a .242 (38-for-157) opp. average, including 2-for-13 (.154) in his last two starts...this, compared to .323 (63-for-195) with the bases empty, the second-highest mark in the majors behind **CLE Logan Allen** (.368).

PINPOINT PRECISION—Littell's 4.3 pct. walk rate ranks 6th in the AL/7th in the majors...among AL pitchers, only **Zach Eflin** (1.9%), **SEA George Kirby** (2.3%), **MIN Joe Ryan** (3.7%), **DET Jack Flaherty** (4.0%) and **BOS Tanner Houck** (4.3%, by pct. points) have lower walk rates...according to Elias, his free pass to **NY Yankees** **Anthony Rizzo** on May 11 snapped a 123 BF streak without a walk, 4th longest in Rays history behind **Zach Eflin** (165BF, 2024), **Corey Kluber** (150BF, 2022) and **David Price** (124BF, 2013) from April 17-May 4, Littell recorded 6+ SO without issuing a walk in a club-record 4 straight starts.
