RAY REPORT —The Rays continue their post-All-Star-break schedule with a seven-game
road trip against the Yankees (0-1, 3 to play) and Blue Jays (3 to play) this afternoon at
Yankee StadiumTampa Bay closed the first half of the season winning seven of its last
eight series for the first time in franchise historythe Rays 14-10 (.583) mark since June
19 is third best in the AL, trailing the Astros (18-6/.750) and Red Sox (14-8/.636)they are

Last night, Zach Eflin issued a career-high-tying four walks, his most since walking four on Sept. 23, 2019 at Washington...Eflin had issued two walks or fewer in each of his previous 51 starts dating to June 14, 2022, including a franchise-record 48 consecutive starts since joining the Rays...the 51-start stretch is tied with SEA George Kirby (active) for the seventh-longest streak by a starter since at least 1901. The Rays committed a season-high three errors in last night's loss, their most since Sept. 29, 2023 at Toronto (also 3)...Randy Arozarena committed his first error since Sept. 23, 2022 vs. TOR.

Tampa Bay batters are on a collective 0-for-32 skid with runners in scoring position, marking the second-longest streak in club history behind an 0-for-34 run from May-June 2014 (Elias).

Juan Soto became the first Yankee to secure 4+ hits against the Rays in a 9-inning game since Giancarlo Stanton (also 4H) on July 23, 2018...the last Yankee to do so in any game was Gio Urshela on April 11, 2021 (10 inn.)

In the first half of the season, Tampa Bay was at the 500 mark 21 times, the most before the All-Star break in franchise history...with a win today, the Rays would match the 2017 club for the most times at .500 in a full season in team history.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Prior to today's game, the Rays placed **INF Yandy Díaz** on the restricted list and recalled **INF Curtis Mead** from Triple-A Durham...over his last 23 games with the Bulls dating to June 8, Mead has slashed .295/.351/.538 (39-for-132) with 6 2B, 4 3B, 6 HR, 19 RBI and 7 BB...Mead hit .218 (19-for-87) over 26 games in his first major league stint of the season from Opening Day–May 3.

BEST OF THE BEST—In seven starts since June 8, Taj Bradley is 3-1 with a 1.07 ERA (42.0IP, 5ER), 187 opp. average (28-for-150) and 1.02 WHIP...it signals the lowest ERA in the majors during that stretch, outpacing PIT Paul Skenes (1.14) and HOU Hunter Brown (1.84)...min. 30.0 IP, it marks the lowest ERA by a Tampa Bay starter over a seven-start period since Shane McClanahan (0.98) from May 11–June 15, 2022.

Bradley has experienced success despite issuing 2+ walks in six straight starts, the longest run by a Ray since Tyler Glasnow (also 6GS) from Sept. 27, 2019–Aug. 19, 2022...the last Tampa Bay starter with a longer streak was Jake Faria (12GS) from July 6, 2017–April 13, 2018.

DAWGS GOTTA EAT—Brandon Lowe registered his 115th career homer yesterday, surpassing Ben Zobrist for fifth on the Rays all-time list...B.J. Upton sits in fourth with 118 HR...Lowe has hit safely in six straight games and in nine of 11 since July 4, slashing .359/.419/.641 (14-for-39) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 4 RBI and 4 BB...he ranks among AL leaders during that stretch in AVG (6th) and OPS (8th, 1.060).

He has hit safely in 10 of 12 games against the Yankees since May 13, 2023, slashing .390/.435/.634 (16-for-41) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 12 RBI and 4 BB.

LEFT SIDE. STRONG SIDE—The Rays are 16-8 (.667) against left-handed starts this season, the third-best clip in the majors behind the Guardians (20-6/.769) and Dodgers (25-10/.714).

Amed Rosario is batting .366 (15-for-41) with 6 2B off southpaws since May 30, the third-highest mark in the AL (min. 40AB) behind CLE José Ramírez (.422) and CLE Steven Kwan (.388).

Isaac Paredes is slashing .364/.462/.697 (12-for-33) with 3 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 11 RBI and 6 BB vs. left-handers since June 4.

Including the postseason, Rosario is 6-for-15 (.400) with 1 2B, 2 HR and 3 BB vs. Nestor Cortes, while Paredes is 6-for-19 (.316) with 1 2B, 2 HR and 2 BB.

Over his last 26 games, Jose Siri is 8-for-22 (.364) vs. LHP compared to 13-for-68 (.191) against right-handers.

RUNNIN' RAYS—The Rays stole an AL-best 95 bags before the All-Star break, besting the Red Sox (88SB)...Tampa Bay paced the AL in steals at the break for the second straight season, accomplishing the feat for the second time in franchise history, joining 2008-09... according to Elias, the Rays are the first AL club to have the most steals before the break in consecutive seasons since the Astros in 2015-16.

Since July 1, the Rays are 15-for-18 (83.3%) on stolen base attempts, the most steals in the AL during that stretch...they have recorded at least 1 SB in 12 of 13 games in July.

Josh Lowes 7 SB since June 23 are second most in the AL beind CWS Luis Robert Ir (8SB). Randy Argarena has 7 SB in 23 games since Lune 19 after having none

Jr. (8SB)...Randy Arozarena has 7 SB in 23 games since June 19 after having none in his previous 31 contests.

Despite going a career-high 16 games since his last stolen base, José Caballero still leads the AL with 24 SB, besting BOS David Hamilton (23SB)...Caballero joined Carl Crawford (2009, 2004) as the only Rays to lead the AL in steals at the All-Star break

RISP, BUT NO REWARD—Since July 5, the Rays are batting an MLB-worst .093 (8-for-86) with runners in scoring position...on the season, Tampa Bay's .221 RISP AVG is second lowest in the majors, ahead of only Chicago-AL (.210).

Tampa Bay's .221 RISP AVG would signal the lowest single-season mark in franchise history, surpassing the mark held by the 2011 Rays (.224).

José Caballero is on an 0-for-17 skid with RISP...Josh Lowe is 3-for-22 (.136) with RISP in his last 24 games and Jose Siri is 1-for-28 (.036) in his last 29.

TWO-OUT TROUBLES—Rays pitching has allowed opponents to hit .256 with two outs, the second-highest mark in the majors, ahead of only Colorado (.280).

New York went 4-for-11 (.364) with two outs last night, scoring five of their six runs...in 10 matchups this season, New York is batting .245 (27-for-110) with two outs, while the Rays are at .141 (13-for-92).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays own MLB's best record in games decided by two runs or fewer at 34-16 (.680)...their 17-9 (.654) mark in one-run games ranks second behind the Red Sox (12-5/.706).

Tampa Bay is also an MLB-best 18-10 (.643) in games decided by two runs or fewer on the road, including wins in 11 of its last 15 such contests.

CONCRETE JUNGLE CLASH—The Rays and Yankees continue their 13-game season series this afternoon in the Bronx, with New York holding a 6-4 advantage thus far...the Yankees claimed series victories from April 19-21 and May 10-12 before the Rays took two of three at Tropicana Field from July 9-11...Tampa Bay needs a win today to avoid just their second season series loss to New York since 2020 (11-8 in 2022)...min. 15 games, the Rays 36-31 (.537) mark against the Yankees since Aug. 18, 2020 is second best in MLB behind the Mets (13-9/.591)...this includes a 20-16 (.556) mark at Yankee Stadium.

Amed Rosario has hit safely in each of his last six games at Yankee Stadium since May 1, 2023, batting .360 (9-for-25) with 1 2B, 2 RBI, 4 R and 5 SB...in 21 career games at the venue, he is 23-for-75 (.307) with 3 2B, 3 HR and 10 RBI.

TODAY'S START—The right-hander will toe the rubber for his 13th start, including his fifth on the road...leads the majors with a 1.07 ERA (42.0IP, 5ER) since June 8...has a 0.48 ERA (18.2IP, 1ER) in his last three outlings...is on a 10.0 scoreless inning streak...the Rays have won five of his last six starts despite plating three runs or fewer in four of those outlings (3.21 RSA)...is on a career-high three-decision winning streak...opened the season on the 15-day IL (right pectoral strain) before his May 10 reinstatement.

LAST TIME OUT—He matched a career-high with 7.0 IP in a 2-0 home shutout win over the Guardians on July 12 (W, 7.0IP, 5H, 0R, 2BB, 8SO)... retried 10 straight batters following a leadoff single in the 2nd frame... held Cleveland hitless (0-for-10) with runners on base...marked the longest scoreless start of his career and longest by a Ray since **Zach Eftin** (7.0IP) on July 21, 2023 vs. Baltimore...Bradley has produced a 0.51 ERA (35.0IP, 2ER) in his last six home starts.

PINSTRIPE PROFILE—Bradley will be making his first career start at Yankee Stadium and second against New York, joining his May 10 season debut (L, 6.0IP, 4H, 1ER, 2BB, 7SO)...in that start, he topped out at 99.2 mph on his four-seam fastball on a 1st-inning strikeout of Alex Verdugo—it remains the hardest pitch he has thrown this season...Bradley is 1-4 with a 6.15 ERA (26.1IP, 18ER) in five starts against AL East opponents and 3-1 with a 0.86 ERA (42.0IP, 4ER) in seven starts against all other clubs.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN—Bradley has pitched to a 2.25 ERA (12.0IP, 3ER) over his last two road starts, both of which were quality...he looks to join Ryan Pepiot (April 7–June 4) as the only Rays to throw three consecutive quality starts on the road this season...for his career, Bradley has pitched to a 5.67 ERA (73.0IP, 46ER) in 17 road starts vs. a 3.69 ERA (100.0IP, 41ER) over 18 starts at Tropicana Field.

TAJ TIME—Over his last seven starts since June 8, Bradley is 3-1 with a majors'-best 1.07 ERA (42.0IP, 5ER), ranking among AL leaders over that span in opp. SLG (1st., 260), strikeouts (2nd, 53), opp. OPS (2nd, 521), opp. average (4th, 187), opp. OBP (9th, 261) and WHIP (9th, 1.02)...opposing hitters are 3-for-21 (.143) against him with RISP and 8-for-52 (.154) with runners on base over that stretch...excluding openers, it marks the ninth-lowest ERA by any Ray over a seven-start span in franchise history, including the lowest since Shane McClanahan (0.98) from May 11-June 15, 2022.

He has allowed 2 ER or fewer in all seven outings, becoming the first Rays starter to work 5.0+ IP and allow 2 ER or fewer in seven straight starts since Shane McClanahan (8GS) from March 30-May 8, 2023 (excl. multi-season streaks)...Bradley is tied with ATL Chris Sale and AZ Merrill Kelly for the longest active streak in the majors.

Excluding his outings on May 20 vs. Boston (5ER) and June 1 at Baltimore (9ER), Bradley has pitched to a 1.24 ERA (58.0IP, 8ER) across his other 10 starts.

RIGHT ON—Over his last four starts, Bradley has limited right-handed hitters to a 4-for-37 (108) clip with two walks, 12 SO and no extra-base hits...lefties are 11-for-48 (229) in that span...min. 100 AB, his .171 (19-for-111) opp. average against righties on the season is second in the AL/fifth in the majors, trailing NYY Luis Gil (.147), MIA Tanner Scott (.149), PHI Zack Wheeler (.152) and MIL Bryan Hudson (.153).

Bradley has limited righties to a .191 (9-for-47) average on his four-seam fastball compared to a .339 (21-for-62) mark vs. lefties.

STRIKEOUT ARTIST—Bradley's 213 SO as a starter are the most in club history through a pitcher's first 33 career starts, outpacing Shane McClanahan (206SO)...since 2021, only ATL Spencer Strider (286), CIN Nick Lodolo (224) and CIN Hunter Greene (223) have more punchouts through their first 33 starts in all of MLB...it also marks the fourth most strikeouts in any pitcher's first 33 starts with the Rays, behind Charlie Morton (240, 2019), Tyler Glasnow (223, 2018-20) and Drew Smyly (215, 2014-16).

His 30.5 pct. strikeout rate is fourth highest among AL starters (min. (10GS), trailing CWS Garrett Crochet (35.2%), DET Jack Flaherty (32.4%) and DET Tarik Skubal (30.8%).

His 85 SO since his May 10 debut are fourth most in the AL behind Crochet (97), Skubal and KC Cole Ragans (both 87).

SECONDARY STUFF—Over his last seven starts, Bradley has held opponents to a combined .150 (12-for-80) average with a 34.6 pct. whiff rate and 36 of his 53 SO on his cutter and split-finger...his secondary pitches (cutter, split-finger, curveball)...have been impressive as of late, as he has limited opponents to 6-for-48 (.125) with a 37.9 pct. whiff rate against them over his last four starts since June 24—entering that span, those numbers stood at .171 (14-for-82) and 31.3 pct. for the season.
