# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (39-42) vs. ATLANTA BRAVES (45-35) <br> June 29, 2024 at Truist Park, Atlanta, GA - 4:10 EDT - GAME \#82/ROAD \#43 RHP PAUL SKENES (4-0, 2.14 ERA) vs. LHP MAX FRIED (7-3, 3.00 ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...lost 6-1 in the opener of their weekend series against the Braves...Are 2-2 on their seven-day, six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta.... Have gone 14-12, including 5-6 on the road, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone 30-3 (.909 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have gone 10-6 this month in games when the team does not make an error...Have surrendered 19 home runs this month, which are tied for the fewest in MLB along with the Phillies...Have not been shut out in 26 straight games, which is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in MLB (the Cardinals have the longest active streak at 59 games)...Are playing their final road series against the National League East this season (have gone 8-7 against the NL East on the road this season).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting . 351 (34-for-97) with seven doubles, a triple, six home runs and 16 RBI during his current career-high 24-game hitting streak...It's the longest hitting streak in MLB this season...Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate since Kenny Lofton hit safely in 26 straight games from April 29 to May 30, 2003...Reynolds' 24-game hitting streak is also tied with Maury Wills' 24-game streak for the longest
 by a Pirates switch hitter since 1901...Reynolds' hitting streak also gives him an on-base streak of 24 games (he had the longest on-base streak by a Pirate during the 2023 campaign at 28 games from August 29 to September 30).

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING: Bryan Reynolds' 24-game hitting streak is tied for the sixthlongest in team history since 1900 according to the Elias Sports Bureau...The only Pirates with longer hitting streaks, which includes spanned seasons, are Charlie Grimm ( 30 games in 1922-23), Danny 0'Connell (26 games in 1953), Kenny Lofton (26 games in 2003), Dick Groat (26 games in 1961-62), Freddie Lindstrom (25 games in 1933) and Clyde Barnhart (25 games in 1925).

BRYAN AGAINST THE BRAVES: Bryan Reynolds has hit safely in 10 straight games against the Braves dating back to August 8 of last year...Reynolds has gone 16-for-42 (.381) with two doubles, two home runs and five RBI against Atlanta during that time... He is also 7 -for-16 (.438) during that time here at Truist Park.

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Paul Skenes gets the start this afternoon after tossing 7.0 innings for the first time in his big league career in his last start Sunday vs. Tampa Bay...Skenes (61 strikeouts, 8 walks this season) is the only National League pitcher since 1901 to record 60 -plus strikeouts and fewer than 10 walks through his first eight career appearances...The only other Major League pitcher to accomplish that feat was Masahiro Tanaka of the Yankees in 2014 (66 strikeouts, seven walks)...Special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau.

AGAINST LEFTIES: Today is the 27th time this season the Pirates will be opposed by a starting lefthander (the Pirates are 13-13 in those games)...Ke'Bryan Hayes is hitting at a 352 clip against southpaws this year, which ranks seventh in all of MLB behind Adley Rutschman (.416), Steven Kwan (.403), Andy Ibanez (.385), Willi Castro (.377), Taylor Ward (.368) and Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (.356).

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen is two walks shy of tying Ralph Kiner (795) for fifth place on the Pirates all-time base on balls list...McCutchen is also one extrabase hit shy of tying Max Carey (590) for sixth place in that category on the Pirates all-time list.
HITTIN' ON THE ROAD: Nick Gonzales has hit safely in 19 of his 21 games on the road since being promoted from Triple-A on May 10 ...Gonzales' . 322 average on the road since May 10 ranks ninth among all players in the National League.
FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman comes into today one strikeout shy of tying Billy Wagner for the most punchouts (1196) by a left-handed relief pitcher in MLB history...The 36-yearold Chapman is tied for sixth in strikeouts (47) among all NL relief pitchers this season...Chapman is also one save shy of tying Huston Street (324) for 20th place on the MLB all-time saves list since saves became an official stat in 1969.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY
June 29, 2014: Josh Harrison hit his first career leadoff home run and Francisco Liriano allowed one run in 7.0 innings while striking out 11
as the Bucs beat the Giants 3-1 at AT\&T Park. Harrison gave the Bucs the early lead with his leadoff homer, which was his third straight
game to go deep in while Travis Snider finished off Pittsburgh's scoring with a two-run blast in the second inning that was also his third
straight game with a bomb.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...Began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he made seven starts, posting an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) with 45 strikeouts against just eight walks before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of Louisiana State University.

PROSPECT SZN: Skenes entered the 2024 season rated as the No. Pirates 1 prospect by Baseball America, as well as the top pitching prospect in baseball and the No. 3 overall prospect in the sport by MLB.com...Entering the 2023 draft, he was rated by MLB.com as the No. 1 prospect in the 2023 class, as well as having the "Best Fastball", "Best Breaking Ball", third "Best Control" and fifth "Best Changeup" in the 2023 college class.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision on June 23 vs. Tampa Bay, allowing just one run (a home run leading off the game) on six hits with eight strikeouts against one walk in a career-high 7.0 innings pitched.

AGAINST THE BRAVES: Skenes will be making his first career start against the Braves today.

BODY OF WORK: Is making his ninth career start and appearance today...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his eight career outings, including two or fewer six times and one or fewer five times (two scoreless outings).

- Skenes is the second pitcher in Pirates history to win at least four of his first eight career starts with 60 or more strikeouts, joining Jose DeLeon (1983).
His 61 strikeouts through eight outings are the second-most by a Pirates pitcher to start their career, trailing only DeLeon's 73 in 1983.

HE'S A WINNER: Since being drafted first overall in the 2023 MLB Draft, Skenes has not lost a game as a professional (Major or Minor Leagues)... His last loss came on May 25,2023 at Arkansas while pitching at LSU.

Skenes is the first Pirates starting pitcher since Whitey Glazner in 1921 to not have a loss in their record through eight Major League starts.

GOING LOW: Skenes enters today with a 2.14 ERA, the sixth lowest ERA by a Pirates pitcher through his first eight career starts, trailing only Cy Blanton in 1934-35 (1.16), Burleigh Grimes from 1916-17 (1.83), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (2.08), Randy Tomlin in 1990 (2.13) and Zach Duke in 2005 (2.13).

LEAGUE LEADERS: Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 7.63), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (2nd, 11.85), WHIP (5th, 0.99), strikeouts (5th, 61), ERA (7th, 2.14) and opponents batting average (12th, . 222 ).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH?: Skenes has posted a $2-0$ record with a 1.85 ERA ( 5 ER in 24.1 IP), 31 strikeouts and three walks in four starts this month...He ranks among the NL leaders this month in wins (T1st), ERA (4th), strikeouts (10th) and WHIP (11th).

BRINGING THE HEAT: Skenes has thrown 70 pitches of $100.0+$ mph this season, the most of any Major Leaque starter in 2024...To date, Skenes has thrown two of the top10 hardest thrown pitches by Major League starters this season and eight of the top 20...Prior to Angels flamethrower Ben Joyce making his first career start on June 16 and throwing nine pitches of $101.0+$ mph, Skenes had previously thrown seven of the top-10 hardest thrown pitches by Major League starters this season.

Skenes has thrown 10 pitches of $101.0+\mathrm{mph}$, including the hardest thrown pitch by a Pirates starter since data started being tracked in 2008 ( 101.9 on May 11 vs. Chicago-NL)...His 10 pitches at that velocity are tops in the Majors among starters in that category, ahead of LAA Ben Joyce (9) (Jared Jones has three, Tarik Skubal has one).
His 70 pitches of 100.0 -plus mph are already the most ever by a Pirates starter since 2008, topping Gerrit Cole's 33 he had during his five years with the Bucs.
