**FLIGHT PATTERN:** The St. Louis Cardinals and visiting Philadelphia Phillies play the rubber game of a three-game weekend series today at Busch Stadium ... With a win today, St. Louis will earn their first series win against Philadelphia since 2017 ... St. Louis enters today in 4th place in the National League Central Division, 2.5 games behind Chicago ... St. Louis continues its homestand tomorrow night with a three-game Interleague series with the Houston Astros.

**SUNDAY FUNDAY:** The Cardinals are 61-40 (.604) in Sunday home games since 2017, MLB's 6th-best win pct. over that timespan ... The Dodgers (70-26, .729) lead MLB in Sunday home win pct. since 2017.

**BACKSTOP BRILLIANCE:** St. Louis catchers **Iván Herrera**, **Pedro Pagés**, and **Yohel Pozo** combine to lead all MLB team catching combos in hits (21), home runs (6), doubles (6), extra-base hits (12), total bases (45), batting average (.356), slugging pct. (.763), and OPS (1.160).

**START ME UP:** Since April 8, the Cardinals starting rotation of **Sonny Gray**, **Erick Fedde**, **Andre Pallante** and **Miles Mikolas** have combined to lead Major League Baseball in average against (.108), baserunners/9 (6.26), and WHIP (0.70) while ranking 4th in ERA (1.57) ... LHP **Steven Matz**, who currently leads all Major League relievers in innings pitched (11.2), is scheduled to start Wednesday's matinee against the Astros.

**GETTING DEFENSIVE:** The Cardinals rank among Major League defensive leaders in fielding percentage (.989, 6th), *Baseball Savant's* Outs Above Average (8, T-1st), and *FanGraph's* defensive runs above average (5.9, 1st), and defensive runs saved (8, 6th).

**HATS FOR BIRD BATS:** Despite scoring just four combined runs in the last three games, St. Louis leads Major League Baseball this season on-base pct. (.351) while ranking 2nd in batting average (.278), 3rd in runs/game (5.36), 4th in OPS (.773), and 7th in slugging pct. (.477). - *chart left*

**DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT:** With another hit yesterday, **Brendan Donovan** ranks tied for 4th in Major League Baseball in hits (20) and 10th in batting average (.357).

- The last Cardinal to lead the National League in hits was **Matt Carpenter** (199 in 2013), who shared the MLB lead with Rangers 3B **Adrian Beltré** ... The last two Cardinals to outright lead MLB in hits were 1971 National League MVP **Joe Torre** (230 hits) and 1952 **Stan Musial** (194 hits).

**BIRTHDAY WEEK:** Cardinals celebrating birthdays this week include **Thomas Saggase** (turned 23 on Thursday, April 10), **Rodderly Muñoz** (turns 25 tomorrow, April 14), and **Nolan Arenado** (turns 34 on Wednesday, April 16).

**NOOT NEWS:** **Lars Nootbaar** (13 games) and **Fernando Tatis Jr.** (14 games) are the only two Major League leadoff hitters with active on-base streaks of 13 games or longer to begin this season .... Overall, Nootbaar has reached base safely in his last 19 games at the leadoff position (Sept. 19, 2023-present), longest by a Cardinals leadoff hitter since **Tommy Edman** (26 games from Sept. 25, 2019-April 17, 2021).

**SECRET WEAPON?:** **Pedro Pagés** made his first career appearance at second base Friday night, going 1-for-3 while recording two assists in 4.0 innings ... Pagés is the 6th Cardinal in history to appear defensively at both catcher and second base in the same game, joining **Tony Cruz** (July 17, 2011 at Cincinnati), **Scott Hemond** (June 18, 1995 vs. San Francisco), **José Oquendo** (Sept. 24, 1988 vs. New York Mets), **Roger Bresnahan** (April 24, 1911 vs. Pittsburgh) and **Art Hoelskoetter** (Sept. 13, 1907 at Pittsburgh).

**THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (April 13, 2002):** After striking out **Daryle Ward**, **Jose Vizcaino**, and **Julio Lugo** (all swinging) on nine pitches for an immaculate inning in the top of the 9th, closer **Jason Isringhausen** earns the win when the Cardinals score a run in the bottom of the frame as catcher **Eli Marrero** hits a two-out, bases-loaded, walk-off single for a 2-1 walk-off victory over Houston at Busch Memorial Stadium.

#### PHILADELPHIA CONNECTIONS

**JoJo Romero** pitched parts of three seasons in Philadelphia (2020-22)...originally selected by the Phillies in the 4th round of the 2016 MLB Draft.

**Edmundo Sosa** signed with the Cardinals as an international free agent (July 2, 2012)...played parts of five seasons in St. Louis (2018-22)... traded to Phillies for **JoJo Romero** (July 30, 2022).

**Brant Brown** enjoyed a three-homer game on June 18, 1998 vs. the Phillies at Wrigley Field.

**Michael Siani** was born in and resides in Glenside, Pa...graduated from William Penn Charter School in Philadelphia... same high school as Phillies broadcaster **Ruben Amaro**.

Cardinals Baseball Operations Advisor **Chaim Bloom** was born in Philadelphia...graduated from Jack M. Barrack Hebrew Academy.

**Nolan Arenado** is the last Cardinal to hit for the cycle (2nd career) on July 1, 2022 at Philadelphia...became the 17th in Cardinals history and first since **Mark Grudzielanek** in 2005.

Phillies Amateur Scouting Director **Brian Barber** was a 1st-round (#22) selection in the 1991 MLB draft by St. Louis from Dr. Phillips (Fla.) High School, same school as **Oliver Marmol**...pitched in 10 games for St. Louis (1995-96).

Phillies Bullpen catcher/Asst. Catching Coach **Brad Flanders** played two seasons (2003-04) at the University of Missouri...coached at Saint Louis University for three seasons (2011-13).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Bill White** played three seasons with Philadelphia (1966-68)...traded to the Phillies in 1965 and back to St. Louis in 1969.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Tom Herr** was born in nearby Lancaster, Pa. (April 4, 1956).

Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** was originally selected by the Phillies in the 2nd round of the 1993 MLB draft ... Played parts of seven seasons with Philadelphia (1996-2002)...Traded to St. Louis with **Doug Nickle** & cash for **Placido Polanco**, **Bud Smith**, & **Mike Timlin** (July 29, 2002).

Phillies Visiting Clubhouse Manager **Kevin Steinhour** began his career as a batboy & clubhouse worker for Springfield (A) in the Cardinals organization (1981-87) before serving as Louisville Redbirds (AAA) Equipment Manager (1988-89).

Phillies Senior Advisor, International Scouting **Sal Agostinelli** was selected by St. Louis in the 20th round of the 1983 MLB draft ... played six seasons (1983-88) in the Cardinals minor league system.

- Fanned a season-high 2 batters in scoreless 8th inning on Wed. (4/9) at PIT.
- Took the extra inning loss in Game 1 on Sun. (4/6) at BOS as designated runner scored on one-out RBI single (unearned run).
- 2023 Rule 5 pick from Boston spent his first full season in the Majors and appeared in a professional season high in games (62) and innings pitched (66.2)
- Suffered his first blown save of the season vs. LAA (3/31) allowing a run in the 7th inning on a Kyren Paris RBI triple. Was his first BS at home (previous four on the road).
- His 62 appearances led 2023 Major League Rule 5 Draft Picks and were the most by any Cardinals Rule 5 Draft Pick in the season immediately following his selection.
- His 62 appearances for St. Louis in 2024 were the most by a Cardinals rookie since Giovanny Gallegos (66 in 2016).

- Posted his 2nd save of 2025 (#86 career) in Fri. (4/11) win vs. PHI; Has 49 career saves at Busch Stadium, 2nd all-time behind only Trevor Rosenthal (65).
- Worked scoreless 11th inn. last Wed. (4/9) at PIT and threw 10 pitches after throwing 37 pitches in his prior appearance on 4/6 at BOS.
- Matched career high with 4 walks in 9th inn. in Game 1 last Sun. (4/6) at BOS and suffered his 1st blown save since 9/3/24 at MIL
- Allowed his 1st earned runs in 24 appearances (23.2 IP) last Sun. 4/6) at BOS-Game 1; Had last allowed a run at MIL (9/3) permitting the automatic runner to score in a game he earned the win in 13 innings.
- Made back-to-back appearances 3/31 & 4/1 vs. LAA in games which he did not factor in the decision (win/loss/save); first time since 9/5 & 9/8/23, a span of 76 appearances.
- Recorded his 50th save over a stretch of 64 games on Opening Day 3/27 vs. MIN and tied Jason Isringhausen (2004-05) for the most saves in Cardinals history over a 64 appearance span.
- Is the longest tenured player in the Cardinals organization, drafted in the 5th round in 2015.
- St. Louis has gone 133-23 (.853) since **2022** when Helsley toes the rubber.
- Two-time National League All-Star (2022 and 2024) who joined Hall of Famers **Lee Smith** (1991-93) and **Bruce Sutter** (1981, 1984) as Cardinals closers to make multiple All-Star Teams.
- Voted as one of two relief pitchers to the All-MLB First Team (2024) and Second Team (2022).
- Unanimously selected as the 2024 Trevor Hoffman National League Reliever of the Year.
- Led MLB and established a new Cardinals single-season franchise record in saves (49) in 2024, breaking **Trevor Rosenthal's** record of 48 saves from 2015.
- Joined **Lee Smith** (47 in 1991) and **Bruce Sutter** (36 in 1982 and 45 in 1984) as the 3rd Cardinal (4th instance) to lead MLB in saves since it became an official statistic in 1969.

- Has faced the minimum over his past two outings on Mon. (4/7) at PIT and Sat. (4.12) vs. PHI.
- Allowed four hits 4/4 at BOS, his most in an appearance since 6/3/23 vs. SEA; used 27 pitches in both his 4/4 & 4/6 [2] appearances at BOS.
- Made his third career Opening Day appearance (3/27) vs. MIN and allowed an inherited runner to score, but recorded a Hold (#1) retiring Miranda to end the inning.
- Since his MLB debut season in 2020, ranks 7th among Major League relievers in groundball percentage (62.1%).
- Finished in the 98th percentile in MLB in groundball percentage in 2024 (*Baseball Savant*)
- Recorded a 70.6% first-strike percentage in 2024, 6th-highest among MLB relievers and 7th-highest in Cardinals single-season history (minimum 40 appearances).
