PITTSBURGH PIRATES (33-28) vs. HOUSTON ASTROS (27-35) June 3, 2026 - Daikin Park - Houston, TX - 7:10 CDT - Game #62/Road #29 RHP Paul Skenes (6-5, 2.89 ERA) vs. RHP Spencer Arrighetti (7-1, 1.34 ERA)

THE PIRATES: began this six-game road trip to Houston (Tuesday-Thursday) and Atlanta (Friday-Sunday) with a 10-6 win on Tuesday at Daikin Park...Went 5-2 on their recent seven-game homestand vs. Chicago-NL (2-2, May 25-28) and Minnesota (3-0, May 29-31)...Have won four straight games (since May 29 vs. Minnesota) and are seeking their second five-game winning streak of the season (also March 31-April 5)...Have scored the fourth-most runs (311) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (330), Los Angeles-NL (321) and Atlanta (320)...Have scored 311-plus runs through their first 61 games of a campaign for just the third time following World War II, along with 1960 (323 runs) and 1999 (326 runs)...Have not been six games over .500 since they were 11-5 following a 9-2 win on April 14, 2024 at Philadelphia...Have not been six games over .500 this late into a season since they were 67-61 following a 3-1 victory on August 28, 2016 at Milwaukee.

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh has won five straight interleague games (it won on May 24 at Toronto, swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota and won on Tuesday at Houston), its longest such streak (within a season) since July 12-30, 2024, when it swept a three-game series from July 12-14 at Chicago and won two games from July 29-30 at Houston...The Pirates have had three such streaks (within a season) of at least six games (interleague began in 1997)...They won eight straight games from May 28-June 26, 2013, seven straight games from June 15-July 2, 2015 and eight straight games from April 25 (G2)-July 24, 2018.

ASTROWORLD: The Pirates would capture their third straight series win in Houston with a win tonight (they won two of three games here from June 25-27, 2019 and two of three games here from July 29-31, 2024)...Pittsburgh has never won three straight series here at Daikin Park, which opened in 2000...The Pirates also won back-to-back series here from May 2-August 14, 2005, April 2-August 26, 2007 and June 14-July 17, 2011...Their only streaks of at least three straight road series wins in the city of Houston came from Aug. 16, 1965-May 24, 1967 (five), June 14, 1971-July 6, 1972 (four) & June 14, 1976-May 15, 1977 (three).

PRIME NINE: Pittsburgh has scored at least nine runs in three straight games (since Saturday vs. Minnesota)...The Pirates' only such streaks of at least four games in the Modern Era (since 1901) came from July 20-25, 1901 (four), September 4 (G1)-6 (G2), 1901 (six), September 5 (G1)-7 (G2), 1910 (four), August 28-September 1, 1925 (five), August 2-4 (G2), 1928 (four) and August 16-18 (G1), 1928 (four)...The last Major League team to score at least nine runs in four consecutive games was Washington from May 28-31, 2025 (prior to the Nationals, the last team to do that was Tampa Bay, which accomplished it from May 18-21, 2021).

K COLLECTORS: Pittsburgh has struck out at least nine batters in seven straight games (since May 26 vs. Chicago-NL) for the fourth time in the Modern Era (since 1901), along with Sept. 20-27, 2016 (eight), August 7-19, 2020 (seven) and Sept. 17-25, 2022 (eight)...The Pirates' 557 strikeouts rank fifth in MLB (Cleveland 578, New York-NL 568, Milwaukee 566, Philadelphia 563).

WE HAVE LIFTOFF: Endy Rodríguez (two-run), Oneil Cruz (three-run) and Brandon Lowe (three-run) all connected for home runs on Tuesday at Houston...The Pirates have homered in nine straight games (since May 24 at Toronto) for the first time since September 16-26, 2023...Their last longer such streak was a 10-game streak from June 21-30, 2022...Pittsburgh has also homered multiple times in four straight games (since May 29 vs. Minnesota) for the first time since May 11-14, 2024...The Pirates have had only five such streaks (within a single season) of at least five games during the Modern Era (since 1901)...Those streaks came from July 1-4 (G2), 1966 (six), July 14-18, 2000 (five), May 1-5, 2005 (five), May 23-31, 2006 (eight) & August 22-26, 2014 (five).

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe connected for his 15th home run with his three-run blast (off Bryan Abreu) in the eighth inning on Tuesday at Houston...He is the fourth Pirate in the 21st century with at least 15 home runs/40 RBI through his first 55 games of a season, joining Brian Giles (16 HR/54 RBI) in 2000, Jason Bay (17 HR/46 RBI) in 2006 and Josh Bell (18 HR/51 RBI) in 2019...Lowe is the only Pirate (since RBI became official in 1920) with at least 15 home runs/40 RBI through his first 55 games with the team.

WREAK HAVOC: Jake Mangum had a career-high-tying four hits and stole two bases on Tuesday at Houston...He was the second Pirate to have at least four hits and two steals in a game this season, along with Oneil Cruz (four hits/three steals) on April 11 at Chicago (NL)...The last Pirate to do that prior to Cruz and Mangum was Kevin Newman on August 25, 2019 vs. Cincinnati...The last time Pittsburgh had two such games in a season prior to this year came in 2005, when Chris Duffy/Matt Lawton each did it on July 26 at Florida...The only times the Pirates had at least three such games in a season in the Modern Era came in 1907 (four), 1912 (three) and 1925 (three)...Mangum is 13-for-33 (.394) with six RBI and five steals in his last 10 games (since May 20 at St. Louis).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 3, 2011: Jose Tabata delivered his second walkoff RBI of the season with his two-out single that brought home Xavier Paul and gave Pittsburgh a 2-1, 12-inning win over Philadelphia at PNC Park. Tabata also delivered a sixth-inning sacrifice fly. Jeff Karstens started and allowed one run in 7.0 innings. Daniel Moskos earned his first Major League win after throwing eight pitches in his perfect 12th inning.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Skenes lost a 7-2 decision after allowing three runs (one earned) and striking out 10 batters over 5.1 innings of work on May 28 vs. Chicago (NL) at PNC Park...He has lost three straight starts (also May 17 vs. Philadelphia and May 23 at Toronto)...The Pirates have scored a total of one run when Skenes has been in the game in those three losses (it came on a sixth-inning double from Marcell Ozuna on May 23).

AGAINST THE ASTROS: Skenes has a 1.29 ERA (14.0ip/2er) and 14 strikeouts in two career starts against Houston...He had a no-decision after allowing two runs (one earned) and striking out six batters in 6.0 innings on July 29, 2024 at Minute Maid Park (Pittsburgh won, 5-3, after scoring three runs in the ninth inning to break a 2-2 tie)... He also lost a 3-0 decision after allowing one run (seventh-inning homer, Christian Walker) and striking out eight batters over his 8.0 innings on June 3, 2025 at PNC Park.

AGAINST THE AMERICAN LEAGUE: Skenes is 5-4 with a 1.86 ERA (97.0ip/20er) and 110 strikeouts in 17 career interleague starts...His 1.86 interleague ERA since making his first interleague start on May 29 (G2), 2024 at Detroit leads all Major League pitchers (minimum 95.0 innings)...Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (2.21) is second.

CLASSIC SKENES: Skenes is making his first start at Daikin Park since March 9, when he allowed just one hit and one walk while striking out seven batters over 4.0 scoreless innings of work in Team USA's 5-3 win over Team Mexico in the World Baseball Classic.

BEST OF THE BEST: Skenes' 2.12 ERA (386.0ip/91er) through 67 Major League starts ranks second among all Major League pitchers through their first 67 starts during the Live Ball Era (since 1920), behind only New York (NL)'s Dwight Gooden (2.00, 1984-86).

DON'T WALK HERE: Skenes pitched 39.0 consecutive innings without issuing a walk (the streak began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington) before allowing a walk to Adolis García in the fifth inning on May 17 vs. Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest streak without a walk by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)'s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)'s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego's Mat Latos (2010).

NEAR PERFECTION: Skenes pitched 6.2 perfect innings before allowing a single to Jake Bauers on April 24 at Milwaukee (he went on to strike out seven batters and surrender just the one hit over his 7.0 innings)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he tied Nellie Briles (August 22, 1972 at San Francisco), Bert Blyleven (August 16, 1980 vs. Montréal) and Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) for the third-longest perfect game bid by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Ken Brett (8.0ip, May 27, 1974 vs. San Diego) and Jeff Karstens (7.2ip, August 6, 2008 at Arizona)...Skenes was the sixth Pittsburgh pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have a start of at least 7.0 scoreless innings with one or zero hits allowed, zero walks issued and at least seven strikeouts...Skenes joined Bob Friend (September 7, 1955 at Chicago), Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York), A.J. Burnett (April 17, 2013 vs. St. Louis), Kingham (April 29, 2018) & Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado).
