# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (39-43) vs. ATLANTA BRAVES (46-35) <br> June 30, 2024 at Truist Park, Atlanta, GA - 11:35 EDT - GAME \#83/ROAD \#44 LHP BAILEY FALIER (3-6, 4.00 ERA) vs. RHP SPENCER SCHWELLENBACH (1-3, 5.40 ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...lost 2-1 in 10 innings yesterday against the Braves (the fifth time this season the team was walked off and first since $5 / 31$ at Toronto)...Are 2-3 heading into the finale of their six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta...Have gone 14-13, including 5-7 on the road, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone $30-3$ (. .909 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have surrendered 20 home runs this month, which are tied for the fewest in MLB along with the Phillies... Have not been shut out in 27 straight games, which is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in MLB (the Cardinals have the longest active streak at 60 games)...Are playing their final road series against the National League East this season (have gone 8-8 against the NL East on the road this season)... Have the fourth-lowest ERA (3.58) among starting rotations in all of MLB this month behind the Mariners (3.18), Phillies (3.35) and Astros (3.40)...Have gone 13-12 this month (have not recorded a winning record in the month of June since going 17-9 in 2015).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting 343 (35-for-102) with seven doubles, two triples, six home runs and 16 RBI during his current career-high 25 -game hitting streak...lt's the longest hitting streak in MLB this season...Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate since Kenny Lofton hit safely in 26 straight games from April 29 to May 30, 2003...Reynolds' 25-game hitting streak is the longest by a Pirates switch hitter since 1901...Reynolds'
 hitting streak also gives him an on-base streak of 25 games (he had the longest on-base streak by a Pirate during the 2023 campaign at 28 games from August 29 to September 30).

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING: Bryan Reynolds' 25 -game hitting streak is tied for the fifth-longest in team history since 1900 according to the Elias Sports Bureau....The only Pirates with longer hitting streaks, which includes spanned seasons, are Charlie Grimm ( 30 games in 1922-23), Danny 0'Connell (26 games in 1953), Kenny Lofton (26 games in 2003) and Dick Groat (26 games in 196162)... Freddie Lindstrom hit safely in 25 games in 1933 while Clyde Barnhart had a 25 -game streak in 1925.

GOOD MORNING: Today the Pirates and Braves will be featured on Roku with first pitch set for 11:35 a.m...Last year the Pirates one 11:35 a.m. first pitch time, which came on June 4 against the Cardinals at PNC Park...Brandon Gaudin, Matt Capps and Wiley Ballard will broadcast today's game on Roku.
HEADING HOME: The Pirates are 2-3 heading into the finale of this six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta...On Tuesday the Pirates will open a three-game series against the Cardinals as part of a seven-game homestand that will include a wraparound series against the Mets from July 5-8... The next series will be the first time the Pirates and Cardinals play on Independence Day since 2016, but the first time Pittsburgh will host St. Louis on July 4 since 1996.

BRYAN AGAINST THE BRAVES: Bryan Reynolds has hit safely in 11 straight games against the Braves dating back to August 8 of last year....Reynolds has gone 17 -for- 47 (.362) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and five RBI against Atlanta during that time...He is also 8 -for-21 (.381) during that time here at Truist Park.

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen is one walk shy of tying Ralph Kiner (795) for fifth place on the Pirates all-time base on balls list...McCutchen is also one extra base hit shy of tying Max Carey (590) for sixth place in that category on the Pirates all-time list.

CATCH THIS: Joey Bart, who was activated from the 10-day injured list today, has hit safely in each of his last six games with the Pirates, going 9-for-23 (.391) with two doubles, a home run and four RBI...Bart went 6-for-17 (.353) with a double and four RBI in six games during his rehab assignment with Triple-A Indianapolis.

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: On Saturday Aroldis Chapman surpassed Billy Wagner for the most strikeouts (1197) by a left-handed relief pitcher in MLB history....Chapman is one save shy of tying Huston Street (324) for 20th place on the MLB all-time saves list since saves became an official stat in 1969.

STARTING OFF: The 27 -year-old lefthander is in his second season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline last season (August 1) in exchange for INF Rodolfo Castro...Falter is in his fourth Major League season...He made 50 appearances ( 24 starts) for the Phillies from 2021-23...He has also made 25 appearances ( 22 starts) with the Pirates from 2023-24 after being selected in the fifth round of the 2015 draft by Philadelphia.

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss in his last outing on June 24 at Cincinnati after allowing five runs (four earned) on five hits with two strikeouts and one walk in 4.0 innings of work...He has now suffered the loss in four consecutive starts dating back to June 6 .

AGAINST THE BRAVES: Falter will be making his fifth start and appearance against the Braves this morning, including his second this season...Has gone 1-1 with a 6.41 ERA (14 ER in 19.2 IP) and 16 strikeouts against five walks in those outings.

Earned his first career win against the Braves earlier this year on May 24 at PNC Park, allowing three runs on six hits with four strikeouts in 7.1 innings of work. Today will be his second career start and appearance at Truist Park...Did not factor into the decision on Sept. 18, 2022, allowing one run on four hits with three strikeouts in 4.2 innings of work.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Falter enters play among the NL leaders in several categories, including ranking first in pitches per batter faced (3.53) and pitches per inning (14.1), 20th in opponents OPS (.688) and 21st in opponents batting average (.239).

ON THE ROAD: Falter has gone $1-4$ with a 4.65 ERA ( 21 ER in 40.2 IP) in eight starts this season on the road... He has been better in his last four outings away from PNC Park since May 18 at Chicago, going 0-2 with a 2.91 ERA (7 ER in 21.2 IP) in that time.

IF YOU TAKE AWAY ONE INNING...: Since allowing five runs in his first inning of the season on March 31 at Miami, Falter has pitched to a 3.49 ERA (32 ER in 82.1IP).

- Has posted a 7.20 ERA (12 ER in 15.0 IP) in the first inning this year, compared to 3.29 ERA ( 25 ER in 68.1 IP ) through the rest of the game.

GETTING IT DONE: Falter has twice posted outings of 6.0-plus innings pitched and two or fewer hits allowed - April 6 vs. Baltimore (6.0ip/1h) and May 31 at Toronto (6.0ip/2 h)...He is one of five NL lefties to have multiple such outings this season, joining PHI Ranger Suarez (2), ATL Chris Sale (2), LAD James Paxton (2) and ATL Max Fried (2).

IT'S GOING TO BE MAY: In five starts in the month of May, Falter went 1-0 with a 2.23 ERA (32.1ip/8er) and a 193 opponents average ( 22 -for-114)... He ranked in the top 10 in the NL in each of those categories, including tied for seventh in opponents average, ninth in innings pitched and 10th in ERA.

- Among NL left-handed pitchers last month, he was tied for third in opponents average, fourth in innings pitched and fifth in ERA.

THAT'S QUALITY: Falter turned in four consecutive quality starts from May 12-31, which matched the longest such streak of his career (also: July 29-August 31, 2022)... It was the longest quality start streak by a Pirates lefty since Jonathan Niese also had a four-game streak from May 9-27, 2016.

JUST LIKE SANDY: Growing up in Chino Hills, California, Falter's father, Darwin, taught him to idolize fellow left-handed pitcher Sandy Koufax...Bailey would do reports on Koufax at school and even had a framed picture of the Dodgers southpaw hanging above his childhood bed...To this day, his delivery on the mound mimics that of Koufax.
