OCTOBER BASEBALL: The Yankees lead the Kansas City Royals, two-games-to-one, in the 2024 ALDS.

- Marks their 24th appearance in the ALDS...have advanced in 14 of their previous 23 ALDS.
- *With a win tonight*, would advance to their 19th ALCS (most all-time)...would mark their fourth trip to the ALCS in the last eight seasons (since 2017; went to ALCS in '17, '19 and '22).
- **Marks their 59th playoff appearance in franchise history** (122 seasons, 48.4%)...their 59 postseason appearances are the most by any franchise in Major League history, 21 more than the Dodgers who have the second-most postseason appearances (38) and 30 more than the second-highest American League team (Athletics - 29).
- Marks the Yankees' seventh postseason appearance in the last eight seasons (since 2017) and their 25th trip to the postseason in the last 30 years (since 1995)...their 25 trips to the postseason since 1995 are the most in the Majors in that span, four more than the next highest team (Atlanta-21) and 11 more than the next highest AL team (Boston & Cleveland: 14).
- Are one of just four teams to make the playoffs in at least seven of the last eight years (since 2017), joining the Dodgers (eight: 2017-24), Astros (eight: 2017-24) and Braves (seven: 2018-24).

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton recorded three hits and drove in two of the Yankees' three runs in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City, hitting a go-ahead RBI double in the fourth inning and a go-ahead solo HR in the eighth inning...**was the first Yankee to hit a go-ahead home run in the eighth inning-or-later since Raúl Ibañez hit a "walk-off" HR in the 12th inning in 2012 ALDS Game 3 vs. Baltimore.**

- His HR on Wednesday marked his 12th career postseason home run...**is just the third player in Major League history to hit at least 12HR in his first 30 career postseason games**, joining Carlos Beltrán (14HR) and Nelson Cruz (13HR).
- **His HR on Wednesday tied Yogi Berra and Reggie Jackson for the sixth-most postseason home runs in franchise history**, trailing only Bernie Williams (22HR), Derek Jeter (20HR), Mickey Mantle (18HR), Babe Ruth (15HR) and Aaron Judge (13HR).
- **His career 9.08 AB/HR (12HR/109AB) ratio in the postseason is the second-best in Major League history** (min. 100PA), trailing only Babe Ruth (8.60).
- **Has recorded 27RBI in 30 career postseason games, including 26RBI in his last 24 playoff games** (since 2019 ALDS Game 2 vs. Minnesota).
- Recorded his second career stolen base in the postseason in the sixth inning on Wednesday...was his first stolen base (regular season and postseason) since 8/3/20 vs. Philadelphia.
- Including the postseason, the Yankees are 24-4 when he has homered this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Royals, 3-2, in ALDS Game 3 on Wednesday at Kauffman Stadium...**RHP Clarke Schmidt** (ND, 4.2IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 4K, 0HR, 1HP) made his first career postseason start and allowed just 2R/ER in 4.2IP...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (3-for-5, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1SB) recorded a postseason career-high-tying 3H and drove in two of the Yankees' three runs, hitting a go-ahead RBI double in the fourth inning and a go-ahead solo HR in the eighth inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-2, 1R, 2BB) reached base three times...**1B Oswaldo Cabrera** (0-for-1, 3BB) and **RF Juan Soto** (0-for-2, 1R, 1RBI, 2BB, 1SF) each reached base multiple times...**RHP Clay Holmes** (1.1IP, 1BB), **RHP Tommy Kahnle** (W, 1.1IP, 1K) and **RHP Luke Weaver** (SV, 1.2IP, 2H) combined to toss 4.1 scoreless innings of relief.

COLE TRAIN: RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 19th career postseason start and ninth with the Yankees...will mark his sixth career start in a potential postseason series clinching game...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in four of those five starts and 2R-or-fewer in three of those starts.

WALK IT OUT: Yankees batters walked nine times in ALDS Game 3 on Wednesday...matched their second-most walks in a playoff game in the last 23 years (since 2002), trailing only their 12BB in 2020 ALWCWS Game 2 at Cleveland (also recorded 9BB in 2009 ALCS Game 6 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

- Have walked 22 times over their first three postseason games...their 22BB are the second-most by any team this postseason, trailing only the Mets' 28BB in seven games.
- The Yankees' 22BB are their most walks through their first three games of a postseason in franchise history...also matched their third-most walks in a three-game span in the postseason, trailing only their 23BB in three-game spans from 2020 ALWCWS Game 2 to 2020 ALDS Game 2 and 2000 ALCS Game 5 to 2000 World Series Game 1.
- The Yankees' Major League-leading 672BB this year were their most in a single season in the last 21 years (since 2004) and most since their 684BB in 2003...marked just the fourth time in the last 74 years (since 1951) that the Yankees have recorded as many walks in a season (718BB in 1999, 684BB in 2003 and 676BB in 1997).

THE SKIPPER, TOO: Manager Aaron Boone is the second manager in Major League history to reach the postseason in six of his first seven seasons as manager (credit: *Elias* - min. 2G), joining Dave Roberts (first nine seasons with the Dodgers)...is the third manager to make the playoffs in six of his first seven seasons with the Yankees, joining Casey Stengel (also first six of first seven) and Joe Torre (each of first 12).

ADVANCED PLACEMENT: *With a win tonight*, the Yankees would advance to their 19th ALCS (most all-time)...would mark their fourth trip to the ALCS in the last eight seasons (since 2017; went to ALCS in '17, '19 and '22)...are 4-2 in their last six potential postseason series clinching games (since 2018) and 6-4 in their last 10 (since 2017).

- When entering ALDS Game 3 tied 1-1, the Yankees have gone 7-7 (including Wednesday's win)...in those 13 completed ALDS, the team that won Game 3 has won 11-of-13 series (the Yankees won 2022 ALDS vs. Cleveland after losing Game 3 and lost 1997 ALDS vs. Cleveland after winning Game 3).

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are facing the Royals in the postseason for the fifth time: also the 1980 ALCS (0-3), 1978 ALCS (3-1), 1977 ALCS (3-2) and 1976 ALCS (3-2).

- Including the postseason, are 7-3 vs. Kansas City this year...also including the postseason, are 18-6 in their last 24 games vs. Kansas City (since 8/11/21), 21-7 in their last 28 games vs. the Royals (since 6/23/21) and 26-9 in their last 35 games against Kansas City (since 4/19/19).
- **Have won 17 of their last 18 completed series vs. the Royals since 5/25/15, going 42-15 in those games.**
- **Including the postseason, are 26-8 vs. the AL Central this season and 94-42 since 2021.**

ROAD WARRIORS: Including the postseason, the Yankees are a Major League-best 51-31 (.622) on the road this year...are 18-9 in their last 27 road games (since 7/27).

- Their 50 road wins during the regular season were their most in a single season in the last 21 years (since 2004) and their most since their 51 wins in 2003...their 50 road wins were tied for their eighth-most in a single season in franchise history.

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers tossed 4.1 scoreless innings in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City...**have not allowed an earned run over 13.2 innings this postseason...have held the Royals to a .167/.231/.167 (8-for-48) slash line during the ALDS.**

- RHP Clay Holmes tossed 1.1 scoreless innings in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City...has tossed 4.0 scoreless innings of relief this postseason...**has not allowed a run over 12.0 innings in nine career postseason relief appearances**...including the postseason, has gone 2-0 with one save, a 1.50 ERA (12.0IP, 2ER) and 10K in his last 13 relief appearances (since 9/8).
- RHP Luke Weaver recorded a five-out save in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City...**has not allowed an ER over his last 11 appearances (including the postseason), striking out 27-of-52BF and holding opponents to a .122/.173/.143 (6-for-49) slash line over that stretch**...over his last 20 games (including the postseason since 8/16), has gone 3-0 with six saves and a 0.78 ERA (23.0IP, 2ER) and 36K.
- RHP Tommy Kahnle earned his second career postseason win in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City after tossing 1.1 scoreless innings...has tossed 3.0 scoreless innings this postseason...including the postseason, has not allowed an ER in 11 of his last 12 appearances (since 9/3), going 1-1 with one save, a 1.69 ERA (10.2IP, 2ER) and 12K...has not allowed a run in 17 of 21 career postseason appearances, going 2-0 with one save, a 2.96 ERA (24.1IP, 8ER) and 25K.

THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto has reached base in 6-of-14PA this postseason, batting .300/.429/.400 (3-for-10) with 1R, 1 double, 1RBI and 3BB.

HIGH VOLTAGE: INF Anthony Volpe reached base three times in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City...has reached base in 6-of-12PA this postseason.

'PEN NOTES

#61 JAKE COUSINS—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the second time in his career (also 2021 with Milwaukee).
- Tossed 0.1IP in ALDS Game 2 vs. Kansas City (1BB).
- Went 2-1 with one save and a 2.37 ERA (38.0IP, 20H, 14R/10ER, 20BB, 53K, 5HR) in 37 relief appearances over two stints with the Yankees (4/1-8 and 6/27-end of season)...did not allow an earned run in 29 of his 37 appearances...set career highs in games pitched, innings pitched and strikeouts...opponents batted .154 (20-for-130, 5HR); LH .132/.313/.184 (5-for-38, 0HR); RH .163/.280/.337 (15-for-92, 5HR).
- Among Major League relievers this season, ranked sixth in opponents' BA (.154, third in AL) and seventh in H/9.0IP (4.74, fourth in AL)...also ranked sixth among AL relievers in K/9.0IP (12.55).
- Recorded multiple strikeouts in 16 of his relief appearances.
- Has allowed just 5H to 64BF over his last 17 appearances since 8/13 (including the postseason) from 8/13-10/7, holding opponents to a .102 BA (5-for-49) during that stretch...also has not allowed a hit to each of his last 25BF (since 9/3).

#81 LUIS GIL—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the first time in his career.
- Made his first Opening Day roster and went 15-7 with a 3.50 ERA (151.2IP, 104H, 60R/59ER, 77BB, 171K, 18HR) in 29 starts for the Yankees...opponents batted .189/.297/.345 (104-for-550, 18HR); LH .210/.314/.393 (55-for-262, 10HR); RH .170/.282/.302 (49-for-288, 8HR).
- Among Major League pitchers this season (min. 150.0IP), ranked second in opponents' BA (.189, first in AL), third in H/9.0IP (6.17, second in AL) and tied for seventh in wins (15, tied for fifth in AL)...among AL pitchers this season (min. 150.0IP), ranked fourth in K/9.0IP (10.15), sixth in opponents' SLG (.345) and 10th in opponents' OPS (.643).
- Among rookie pitchers this season, was tied for first in wins (15, first in AL), tied for second in strikeouts (171, tied for first in AL) and tied for eighth in WAR among pitchers (2.2 - FanGraphs, third in AL)...among rookie pitchers this season with at least 100.0IP, ranked first in opponents' BA (.189) and H/9.0IP (6.17), second in opponents' SLG (.345, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.643, first in AL), third in K/9.0IP (10.15, second in AL) and HR/9.0IP (1.07, first in AL), fifth in ERA (3.50, first in AL) and sixth in WHIP (1.19, first in AL) and opponents' OBP (.297, first in AL).
- His 171K this season were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's 209K in 1910.
- Allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of his 29 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 18 of his starts and one-or-zero runs in 17 of his starts (six were scoreless)...according to *Elias*, his six scoreless starts were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's eight such starts in 1910.
- His 17 starts of one-or-zero runs allowed this season were tied with Detroit's Tarik Skubal and Chicago-AL's Garrett Crochet for the most such starts in the Majors...his 17 such starts were the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Jack Chesbro (18 starts in 1904), Whitey Ford (18 starts in 1964) and Ron Guidry (18 starts in 1978)...*Elias* notes his 17 such starts were the second-most in Major League history by any rookie pitcher in a single season (since 1893 when current mound distance was set, excluding openers), trailing only Philadelphia-NL's George McQuillan's 21 starts in 1908.
- Was named both the AL "Pitcher of the Month" and AL "Rookie of the Month" for May after going 6-0 with a 0.70 ERA (38.2IP, 14H, 3R/ER, 12BB, 44K, 2HR) in six starts.
- Has pitched over parts of three Major League seasons with the Yankees (2021-22, '24)...has recorded 214K in 36 career games, the third-most by a Yankees pitcher in their first 36 career games, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (233K) and Al Downing (221K).

#71 IAN HAMILTON—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the first time in his career...made his postseason debut in ALDS Game 2 vs. Kansas City, striking out three of his four batters faced (1.1IP, 1H)...also allowed an inherited runner to score in the fourth inning.
- Made his first Opening Day roster and went 0-1 with one save and a 3.82 ERA (37.2IP, 37H, 17R/16ER, 14BB, 41K, 2HR) in 35 appearances...opponents batted .261/.331/.373 (37-for-142, 2HR); LH .269/.361/.404 (14-for-52, 1HR); RH .256/.314/.356 (23-for-90, 1HR)...did not allow a run in 25 of his 35 appearances.
- Allowed just 2HR to 163BF, posting a 0.48 HR/9.0IP ratio.
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 9/7 (including the postseason), has retired 26 of his 31 batters faced (5H, 14K)...over that span, has posted a 0.96 ERA (9.1IP, 1ER) and has held opponents to a .161/.161/.290 (5-for-31) slash line.

#54 TIM HILL—LHP

- Has made the postseason for the third time in his career (also 2020 and '22 with the San Diego Padres)...has not allowed an earned run in eight career postseason appearances (1W, 6.0IP, 3H, 2R/0ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HP).
- Induced an inning-ending double play in the sixth inning in ALDS Game 2 vs. Kansas City (0.2IP)...also stranded two inherited runners.
- Allowed 1R/0ER over 0.1IP in ALDS Game 1 vs. Kansas City...also allowed an inherited runner to score in the sixth inning.
- Went 3-0 with a 2.05 ERA (44.0IP, 36H, 13R/10ER, 9BB, 18K, 2HR) in 35 relief appearances with the Yankees...did not allow an earned run in 27 of his games with the Yankees...began the season with Chicago-AL, going 1-0 with a 5.87 ERA (23.0IP, 41H, 19R/15ER, 10BB, 13K, 0HR) in 27 appearances.
- His 69.5 groundball percentage was the second-highest among Major League relievers this season (second in AL), trailing only Toronto's Brendon Little (70.9%).
- Among left-handed relievers, ranked third in HR/9.0IP (0.27, second in AL) and ninth in innings pitched (67.0IP, fourth in AL) this season.
- Recorded four-or-more outs in 15 of his 35 regular season relief appearances with the Yankees after only recording four such appearances in 27 games with the White Sox.
- Did not allow a home run in his final 24 games of the regular season from 7/26-9/28...marks the fourth-longest streak of his career, trailing only his 55-game streak from 9/24/21-9/22/22, 33-game streak from 7/26/18-4/8/19 and 28-game streak from 9/10/23-6/11/24.
- Over his last 25 appearances since 7/27 (including the postseason), has gone 1-0 with a 1.24 ERA (29.0IP, 4ER)...has not allow a run in 20 of those games.
- Has allowed just 3R/2ER over his last 19 appearances since 8/14 (including the postseason), posting a 0.86 ERA during that stretch (21.0IP).

#35 CLAY HOLMES—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the third time in his career (also 2021-22 with the Yankees)...has not allowed a run in each of his nine career postseason appearances (1W, 12.0IP, 6H, 3BB, 10K, 1HP)...his 12.0 postseason scoreless inning streak is tied for the seventh-longest such streak by a reliever in franchise history and the longest since Mariano Rivera's 14.0 scoreless inning streak from 2009 ALCS Game 6 vs. Los Angeles-AL to 2011 ALDS Game 5 vs. Detroit.
- Tossed 1.1 scoreless innings and stranded an inherited runner in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City (1BB).
- Tossed a scoreless seventh inning in ALDS Game 2 vs. Kansas City (2H, 2K).
- Earned his first postseason win in ALDS Game 1 vs. Kansas City after tossing 1.2 scoreless innings (1H)...also stranded an inherited runner in the sixth inning.
- Went 3-5 with a career-high 30 saves and a 3.14 ERA (63.0IP, 60H, 29R/22ER, 22BB, 68K, 4HR) in 67 relief appearances...opponents hit .248/.315/.347 (60-for-242, 4HR); LH .258/.328/.333 (31-for-120, 2HR); RH .238/.301/.361 (29-for-122, 2HR)...was named to his second career All-Star team (also 2022).
- His 30 saves this season were the eighth-most in the Majors (fourth in AL)...his 64.4 groundball percentage was the third-highest among Major League relievers (third in AL).
- Recorded a career-high 30 saves in 2024, becoming just the 11th pitcher in franchise history to record 30 saves in a season (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Mariano Rivera (15x: 1997-2001, '03-11 and '13), Dave Righetti (4x: 1984, '86-87 and '90), Aroldis Chapman (3x: 2018-19, '21), John Wetteland (2x: 1995-96), Rich Gossage (2x: 1980, '82), Andrew Miller (2015), David Robertson (2014), Rafael Soriano (2012), Steve Farr (1992) and Sparky Lyle (1972).
- Over his final 22 appearances of the regular season from 8/3-9/29, held opponents to a .188 BA (12-for-64).
- Including the postseason, has gone 2-0 with one save, a 1.50 ERA (12.0IP, 2ER) and 10K in his last 13 relief appearances (since 9/8).

#41 TOMMY KAHNLE—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the fourth time in his career (also 2017, '19 with the Yankees and '22 with Los Angeles-NL)...did not make the Yankees' 2018 and 2022 ALDS roster...in 21 career postseason relief appearances (18 appearances with the Yankees, three appearances with the Los Angeles Dodgers), has gone 1-0 with one save and a 2.96 ERA (24.1IP, 12H, 8ER, 8BB, 25K, 2HR)...has not allowed a run in 17 of those 21 games.
- Has not allowed a hit in all three of his postseason appearances this season (11BF).
- Earned his first win of the postseason (second of his career) after retiring all four of his batters faced in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City (1.1IP, 1K).
- Tossed a scoreless eighth inning in ALDS Game 2 vs. Kansas City, retiring three of his four batters faced (1BB, 2K).
- Tossed 0.2IP in ALDS Game 1 vs. Kansas City (1BB).
- In 50 relief appearances, went 0-2 with one save and a 2.11 ERA (42.2IP, 30H, 16R/10ER, 19BB, 46K, 5HR)...opponents batted .190/.285/.342 (30-for-158, 5HR); LH .169/.274/.301 (14-for-83, 2HR); RH .213/.298/.387 (16-for-75, 3HR)...his 50 appearances were his most since 2019 (72 appearances).
- His 2.11 ERA ranked 10th among American League relievers (min. 40.0IP).
- Did not allow an earned run in 44 of his 50 appearances, including 39 of his final 43 games from 6/12-9/27, posting a 1.47 ERA (36.2IP, 6ER) and 40K over that 43-game stretch.
- Has not allowed an ER in 29 of his last 31 appearances since 7/19 (including the postseason), going 1-1 with one save and a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP, 4ER) over that stretch.

#58 TIM MAYZA—LHP

- Has made the postseason for the third time in his career (2022-23 with Toronto).
- Made his 2024 postseason debut in ALDS Game 2 vs. Kansas City, tossing 0.2IP in the ninth inning (1H, 1K).
- Combined with the Toronto Blue Jays and Yankees to go 0-2 with a 6.33 ERA (42.2IP, 54H, 34R/30ER, 15BB, 28K, 5HR) in 50 appearances...opponents batted .309/.359/.486 (54-for-175, 5HR); LH .244/.298/.314 (21-for-86, 1HR); RH .371/.416/.652 (33-for-89, 4HR).
- Recorded at least 1K in each of his final seven appearances of the season from 9/4-29...matched the third-longest streak of his career, trailing only his 10 straight games with at least 1K from 9/20/17-5/4/18 and eight straight games from 9/12/23-3/30/24 (also seven straight games from 8/15-27/17).

#30 LUKE WEAVER—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the first time in his career.
- Earned his second career postseason save after tossing 1.2 scoreless innings in ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City (2H)...is the third player in franchise history (since saves became an official stat in 1969) to record a five-out save in one of their first three career postseason appearances, joining Tommy Kahnle's six-out save (ALDS Game 4 vs. Cleveland in 2017) and Ken Clay's 11-out save (ALCS Game 1 at Kansas City in 1978).
- Stranded an inherited runner and retired his only batter faced in ALDS Game 2 vs. Kansas City.
- Made his postseason debut in ALDS G1 vs. Kansas City, earning his first postseason save after retiring each of his four batters faced (1.1IP, 3K).
- In 62 relief appearances for the Yankees, went 7-3 with four saves and a 2.89 ERA (84.0IP, 52H, 28R/27ER, 26BB, 103K)...opponents batted .176/.248/.334 (52-for-296, 10HR); LH .162/.253/.261 (23-for-142, 3HR); RH .188/.244/.403 (29-for-154, 7HR)...set a career high in appearances and tied his career high in wins (also 2017 and '18 with St. Louis).
- His 103K were the most by a Yankees reliever in a single season since Dellin Betances (115K in 2018)...were also tied with Jay Howell (103K in 1984) and Rich Gossage (103K in 1980) for the eighth-most by a Yankees reliever in a single season, trailing only Betances (135K in 2014, 131K in 2015, 126K in 2016 and 115K in 2018), Mariano Rivera (130K in 1996), Gossage (122K in 1978) and Joe Page (114K in 1947).
- Among Major League relievers this season, ranked third in innings pitched (84.0IP, first in AL) and tied for third in strikeouts (103, tied for third in AL).
- Recorded four-or-more outs in 31 of his 62 outings this season, the fourth-most among Major League relievers, trailing Michael Tonkin (35), Ryan Yarbrough (34) and Pedro Avila (33)...20 of those 31 appearances were scoreless, tied for the fourth-most such games in the Majors among relievers, trailing only Tyler Holton (25), Derek Law (22) and Pedro Avila (21).
- Recorded five-or-more outs in 23 games this season, the fifth-most such games in the Majors among relievers...15 of those appearances were scoreless, the fifth-most such games in the Majors among relievers.
- Did not allow a run in 18 of his final 21 games from 8/3-9/29, including 15 of his final 17 appearances (8/16-9/29)...over his final 17 appearances, went 3-0 with four saves and a 0.92 ERA (19.2IP, 2ER) and 33K...posted a 15.10 K/9.0IP ratio during that stretch and held opponents to a .147/.227/.206 (10-for-68) slash line over that span.
- Recorded multiple strikeouts in nine appearances (including the postseason) from 9/6-10/5, striking out 27-of-44BF and posting a 19.70 K/9.0IP ratio (27K/12.1IP) over that span...did not allow a run in that stretch going 3-0 with five saves and a .098 opponents' BA (4-for-41) in those games.
- Has not allowed an ER over his last 11 appearances (including the postseason), striking out 27-of-52BF and holding opponents to a .122/.173/.143 (6-for-49) slash line over that stretch.
