**ROSTER MOVES:** Prior to tonight's game, the Mets placed INF Eduardo Núñez on the IL with a left knee contusion...INF Brian Dozier has been selected from the team's Alternate Training Site...LHP Daniel Zamora has been recalled from the team's Alternate Training Site...RHP Hunter Strickland has been designated for assignment...Dozier, who will wear #15, is a career .245/.346/.442 hitter with 192 home runs and 561 RBI... He has recorded six consecutive 20+ home run seasons...In addition, catcher Bruce Maxwell has been signed to a minor-league contract and assigned to the Alternate Training Site.

**METSSELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Red Sox, 6-5, last night...The team has won two of their last three and move to .500 on the season... New York finishes a two-game series against Boston tonight before beginning their second road trip of the year, a six-game road trip against Atlanta (four games) and Washington (two games).

**JUST THE HITS:** The Mets rank second in the majors with 57 hits and a .270 batting average...They trail only the Red Sox who lead the major leagues with 59 hits and a .278 batting average.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** The Mets collected 15 hits despite the loss last night...Over the last three games, the team is batting .319 (36-113). has scored 20 runs...New York scored a total of five runs in its first three games of the season, its fewest through three team games since 1981 (also five runs).

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in all six games this season...He is batting .286 (6-21) with two runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI and three walks...He owns a .400 OBP and a .924 OPS...Nimmo has reached base safely in each of his last 21 games dating back to last season...The 21-game on-base streak is the second-longest in his career...Nimmo safely reached base in 28 straight games from August 11-September 21, 2018...In his final 26 games of the 2019 season, Nimmo hit .261/.430/.565 with 14 runs, a triple, five home runs, 20 walks and two steals.

**THE NEW KID:** Andrés Giménez made his first career start last night... The 21-year-old went 2-4 with a triple and an RBI... Giménez entered the season as the third-best Mets prospect and the No. 84 overall prospect in the majors, per MLB Pipeline...After spending the 2019 season with Binghamton (AA), the Venezuelan shortstop led the Arizona Fall League with a .371 (26-70) average and .999 OPS...His next hit will be his first career major league hit.

**FIRST ROUND'S ON ME:** With David Peterson's addition to the roster, the Mets now have four of their first-round selections on their active roster...Peterson (20th overall pick in 2017) joins Michael Conforto (10th overall, 2014), Dominic Smith (11th overall, 2013) and Brandon Nimmo (13th overall, 2011) as Mets first-rounders on the active roster...The last pitcher whom the Mets drafted in the first round to make his major league debut with the club was Matt Harvey (2010 seventh overall pick, debuted in 2012).

**ROSIE OUTLOOK:** Amed Rosario has safely hit in four of the first five games...He is 6-21 with two runs, a triple and three RBI...In the last quarter of the 2019 season (final 42 games), Rosario batted .318, while making just three errors in the field...His 55 hits from August 14 through the end of the season were two off the NL lead while his .318 average was the league's eighth-best mark.

**ESQUIRE DAVIS:** J.D. Davis is 5-12 with three runs, a home run, a walk and three RBI over his last four games...This comes after starting the season 0-3 in his first two games...J.D. Davis ranked 10th in the NL with a 136 wRC+ (weighted runs created plus) and was 17th in the NL with a .373 wOBA (weighted on-base average) last season.

**METS-RED SOX NOTES:** The Mets and Red Sox face each other in a four game home-and-home series...This marks the first time the two teams have played each other since 2018...The Mets defeated the Red Sox in the 1986 World Series in seven games.

**FIRST IS NOT THE WORST:** Jeff McNeil is 4-8 with two doubles when putting the first pitch in play (or homering on the first pitch) this season... He's tied with Freddie Freeman (Braves) and Luis Robert (White Sox) for the most first-pitch hits in 2020...His 1.371 OPS on the first pitch in 2019 was the highest since 2007 (Matt Holliday, 1.453)...Thanks to Elias.

**THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE:** The Mets own the best Interleague winning percentage in NL history...Their .517 winning percentage (209-195) is the best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

**SWEET PETE:** Pete Alonso collected his first multi-hit game of the season last night, going 4-4...It was his first four-hit effort since August 15 last season at Atlanta (five hits)...Overall, Alonso reached safely in all five of his plate appearances...In 2019, the first baseman set the Mets single-season record for homers (53), total bases (348) and extra base-hits (85)...In addition, Alonso set the franchise single season rookie records for RBI (120), SLG (.583), OBP (.358), HBP (21), OPS (.941), games (161), at-bats (597) runs (103) and hits (155)...He also tied the club rookie record with 72 walks and tied for fourth among all Mets rookies with 30 doubles.

**SIXTY-GAME SPRINT:** Over the final 60 games of the 2019 season, the Mets' 39-21 mark tied for the second-best in the majors and co- led the NL...Only one team, the Astros (42-18), had a better record in the season's last 60 games...The Rays, Twins, Dodgers and A's all also ended last year on a 39-21 run...See the chart below for the Mets' best 60-game starts to a season:

**CONFORTOBLY NUMB:** Michael Conforto has safely reached base in all six games of the season...He is 7-121 with two runs, a double, a home run, two RBI two walks and was hit by a pitch...His .333 batting average is tied for eighth in the National League.

**I LIKE MIKE:** Conforto has hit 110 home runs in his career which is 12th on the Mets all-time list...Ed Kranepool is 11th with 118 followed by Edgardo Alfonzo who is 10th with 120...Conforto belted 33 homers last season, setting a career-high...Conforto previously set it with 28 in 2018... Conforto is one of five players in team history with 30 or more home runs, 90 or more RBI and 80 or more walks in a single season...Also David Wright (2008, 2007), Carlos Beltrán (2006), Darryl Strawberry (1988, 1987) and Howard Johnson (1987).

**IN THE CITY:** Conforto has belted 56 home runs at Citi Field...That places him second on the team's all-time list...Lucas Duda owns the record with 56 blasts at Citi Field.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Matz tonight will make his second start of the 2020 season... In his last start on July 25, Matz threw 6.0 innings against the Braves at Citi Field in his season debut...Took the no-decision the Mets' 5-3 extra-inning loss to Atlanta...Gave up just two hits and a home run...Struck out seven batters and walked just one.

**HOME COOKING:** Has thrown 12 quality starts in his last 15 home outings, posting a 2.41 ERA (24 ER/89.2 IP) in that span...In 15 home starts in 2019, Matz went 8-2, held a 2.31 ERA and maintained a 9.23 K/9...His 2.31 home ERA was the third-best mark in the majors...The Mets went 11-4 in his 15 Citi Field starts, the best of any Mets starter in 2019...His eight wins at home were a career high and were tied for eighth in the NL.

**VS. BOSTON:** Today will be Matz' first career start against the Red Sox.

**REMATZTERED:** Matz carried a 4.95 ERA into July in 2019...After the All-Star break, he posted a 3.52 ERA (31 earned runs/79.1 innings) in 14 second-half starts...His peripherals also changed dramatically for the better...See the below chart for his statistics as a starter in the first half and second half:

**SETTLING IN:** Dating back to the start of last season, twenty of Matz' 76 earned runs allowed came in the first inning...Did not allow a first-inning run in 14 of his last 15 starts after the All-Star break and into the 2020 season...Owns a 6.00 ERA (20 earned runs/30.0 innings) in the first inning...Owned a 3.69 ERA (56 earned runs/136.1 innings) in all following innings.

**HITS ARE SCARCE:** Matz has allowed six hits or fewer in 24 of his 31 starts dating back to the start of last season, but gave up a career-high 10 hits twice last year (May 23, 2019 vs. Washington and June 23, 2019 at Philadelphia)... Since the start of 2018, Matz has held his opponent to three hits or fewer in 21 starts, tied for the sixth-most in the majors.

**SPRING TRAINING:** Matz went 0-0 with a 1.50 ERA (one earned run/6.0 innings pitched) in three Spring Training starts this year...Gave up two hits and a home run across all three starts...Stuck out five batters and walked none in the shortened spring.

**MATZDUX:** Matz tossed the best start of his career just under one year ago, when he needed just 99 pitches to shut out the Pirates on July 27 at Citi Field last season...The last Met to throw a shutout with fewer than 100 pitches was Johan Santana on May 26, 2012 vs. San Diego...Noah Syndergaard was the last Met to throw a complete game without issuing a walk (September 30 last year vs. Miami).

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP RICK PORCELLO (0-1, 27.00 ERA)

**LAST START:** Allowed seven runs, six earned, on seven hits in just 2.0 innings on July 26 vs. Atlanta...Was his shortest start since June 29, 2019 (0.1 innings vs. Yankees)...Was the ninth time he's allowed at least six runs in a start since the beginning of last season.

**150 ON THE HORIZON:** Porcello seeks to become the 10th active pitcher to reach the 150-win milestone and would move into a tie for ninth among active players in career wins (also, David Price).

- Won the 2019 Jackie Robinson NL Rookie of the Year Award...Hit a rookie-record 53 home runs...Was the first Mets player and first rookie to lead MLB in homers.
- During the shutdown, honored those who went "above and beyond their call of duty" through his newly-launched Homers for Heroes foundation...The foundation will honor a hero after each of the Mets' 60 games this season...The hero will receive a care package, which will include game-used memorabilia from Alonso.

- He homered in three consecutive games (Opening Day, July 20, 2018 at the Yankees and May 13, 2018 at Philadelphia)...It's the fifth time in his career he has gone deep in three-straight games...ESPN Stats & Info notes his streak spans 804 days, the longest duration of a three-game homer streak since Calvin Pickering had a 1,053-day three-game streak from 2001-2004.
- Had surgeries on both heels and suffered a fractured right ankle that kept him out for the entire 2019 season.
