PITTSBURGH PIRATES (69-90) vs. ATLANTA BRAVES (75-84)

September 26, 2025 - Truist Park - Atlanta, GA - 7:15 EDT - Game #160/Road #79

RHP Mitch Keller (6-15, 4.22 ERA) vs. LHP Joey Wentz (5-6, 5.46 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won two of the first three games on this season-ending, six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta...Have won four of their last five games (since September 20 vs. the Athletics) after dropping 12 of 13 games from September 5-19...Are 57-64 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have at least one extra-base hit in 58 straight games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in all of Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 76 games, rank first) and their longest single-season streak since a 64-game streak from June 1-August 14, 2019...Have played in a Major League-high 60 one-run games (they are 25-35 in those games), their most in a season since 2014 (also 60).

SOUTHPAW SIGHTING: Pittsburgh will be opposed by Atlanta southpaw Joey Wentz, who made 27 total appearances with the Pirates from 2024-25, tonight at Truist Park (they also faced Cincinnati lefthander Nick Lodolo on Thursday afternoon)...It will mark the fifth time this season that Pittsburgh faces left-handed starters in back-to-back games, the first since being opposed by Detroit's Tarik Skubal and Tyler Holton in the June 19 doubleheader at Comerica Park...The Pirates' 35 games against a left-handed starter are the fewest in the National League...Tommy Pham is 2-for-5 with a solo homer, which came on May 3 (G1), 2023 for New York (NL) at Detroit, off Wentz in his career.

THE CONSISTENCY OF KELLER: Mitch Keller will make his 32nd start of the season in tonight's series opener at Atlanta...He will finish the season tied with Paul Skenes for the team lead in starts...Keller's 123 starts since the beginning of 2022 are the fourth-most in the National League and the ninth-most in all of Major League Baseball (San Francisco's Logan Webb, 131 starts, ranks first).

THAT'S SO BRAVE: Bryan Reynolds is 45-for-143 (.315) with six doubles, five homers and 18 RBI in 37 career games vs. Atlanta...He has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games here at Truist Park, going 27-for-60 (.450) with a 1.252 OPS.

UNDER NEW MANAGEMENT: Don Kelly defeated Atlanta, 3-2, in his managerial debut on May 9 at PNC Park...Since he took over as the team's manager, Pittsburgh ranks fourth in MLB in ERA (3.63) and seventh in fielding percentage (.988)...The Pirates' 49 errors are the seventh-fewest in that span.

THE BIG EAST: The Pirates have gone 16-13 against the National League East, including taking two of three games vs. the Braves from May 9-11 at PNC Park...Pittsburgh has won nine of its last 12 games against the division (since June 6 vs. Philadelphia), including sweeps of Philadelphia (June 6-8) and New York (June 27-29)...The Pirates' pitching staff has posted a 2.29 ERA (106.0ip/27er) in those 12 games.

BUFORD'S BEST: Joey Bart, who graduated from Buford High School in 2015 and played collegiately at Georgia Tech from 2016-18, is batting .321 (9-for-28) with two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and a 1.048 OPS in September...Bart, who posted his first career four-hit game on May 10 vs. Atlanta, is 8-for-19 (.421) with three RBI over six career games vs. the Braves.

THE LAST STOP: Pittsburgh is finishing a regular season in Atlanta for the first time since the Braves moved from Milwaukee in 1966...The Pirates last took a season series from Atlanta in 2017, when they went 5-2...Their last series win here came from June 5-7, 2015 at Turner Field (won two of three games).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

September 26, 1925: Pitcher Bobby Shantz, who would go on to win a National League Gold Glove Award with the Pirates in 1961, was born in Pottstown, Pennsylvania. Shantz, who is the oldest-living Pirate, is celebrating his 100th birthday today. Shantz, who pitched in 16 Major League seasons from 1949-64, was 6-3 with a 3.32 ERA in 43 games during his only season with Pittsburgh.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2014 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Keller allowed four runs on four hits (two home runs) and one walk while striking out four batters over 5.0 innings on September 19 vs. the Athletics, losing a 4-3 decision...He entered the fourth inning with a 3-0 lead before allowing a solo shot to Nick Kurtz in the fourth and a three-run shot to Lawrence Butler in the fifth.

AGAINST THE BRAVES: Keller is 1-3 with a 7.94 ERA (28.1ip/25er) and 25 strikeouts (he has allowed just five walks) over his seven career starts against Atlanta...In his last start against the Braves, which came on May 25, 2024 at PNC Park, he allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work, winning a 4-1 decision against Reynaldo López...Keller is 0-2 with a 13.15 ERA (13.0ip/19er) in three career starts here at Truist Park...In his last start here, which came on September 8, 2023, he allowed eight runs on a career-high 12 hits and a hit by pitch over 5.0 innings of work, losing an 8-2 decision against Bryce Elder.

WHERE HE RANKS: Keller's 704.0 innings pitched since the start of 2022 rank 10th in Major League Baseball, behind San Francisco's Logan Webb (814.2), Houston's Framber Valdez (767.2), Toronto's Kevin Gausman (730.0), Arizona's Zac Gallen (729.2), St. Louis' Miles Mikolas (726.2), Toronto's Chris Bassitt (723.0), Toronto's José Berríos (720.0), San Diego's Dylan Cease (718.1) and Seattle's Logan Gilbert (711.0)...Keller has tossed 150.0 innings in four straight seasons (since 2022)...The only other Pirate in the 21st century to achieve that was Paul Maholm (six straight from 2006-11).

DON'T WALK HERE: Keller has issued three or fewer walks in 29 consecutive starts (since April 9 vs. St. Louis)...The last Pirates to do that in a single season were Jameson Taillon (32 starts) and Iván Nova (29 starts), who both did that in every start in 2018...Keller has issued 46 walks in 172.2 innings pitched this season, making him one of eight National League pitchers with at least 170.0 innings pitched and 50 or fewer walks issued (teammate Paul Skenes has issued 42 walks in his 187.2 innings of work).

CONSISTENT KELLER: Keller has 17 quality starts, his third straight season with at least 15 quality starts (had 18 in 2023 and 15 in 2024)...Before him, the last Pirate to do that in three straight seasons was Paul Maholm from 2008-10 (A.J. Burnett did it with Pittsburgh from 2012-15, but he pitched for Philadelphia in 2014)...In his start on September 12 at Washington, Keller made his 30th start of the season (it marks his third consecutive season with at least 30 starts)...The only other Pirates pitchers in the 21st century to achieve that were Maholm from 2008-10 and Ian Snell from 2006-08.

CLOSE CALLS: Keller has pitched in 15 one-run games (last on September 19 vs. the A's)...He is 1-5 with a 3.15 ERA (85.2ip/30er) in those starts...The 15 starts are the most in Major League Baseball and are the most by a Pirate since Paul Maholm (16) in 2010.

THE 800 CLUB: Keller's first-inning strikeout of Toronto's Ernie Clement on August 19 at PNC Park was the 800th of his career...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest pitcher in Pirates history to reach the 800-strikeout mark by innings pitched (844.0)...Keller passed Bob Veale, who needed 848.0 innings to reach that milestone.
