WASHINGTON NATIONALS (6-9) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (5-11)

April 14, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #17/Home #7

RHP Brad Lord (0-0, 1.80 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (1-1, 3.44 ERA)

THE PIRATES: fell to the Reds, 4-0, on Sunday and were swept by Cincinnati in a brief, three-game road trip over the weekend...Are returning to Pittsburgh to begin a seven-game homestand against Washington (Monday-Thursday) and Cleveland (Friday-Sunday)...Will also resume their stretch of 13 out of 16 games being played at PNC Park...Went 3-3 on their first homestand of the season, going 1-2 against New York (AL) from April 4-6 and 2-1 against St. Louis from April 7-9.

TIGER KINGS: Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes and Washington's Dylan Crews could face each other for the first time as professionals tonight...Skenes and Crews, who were teammates at LSU during the Tigers' run to the College World Series title in 2023, were drafted No. 1 and No. 2 overall, respectively, in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...Both players made their MLB debut last season.

CAN'T CATCH ME: With his steal on Sunday, Oneil Cruz extended his streak of successful steal attempts to 28, a streak that began on April 28, 2024 at San Francisco...With the steal, he matched Nate McLouth (May 2, 2008-May 26, 2009) for the second-longest streak by a Pirates baserunner without being caught since 1976, per the Elias Sports Bureau...Tony Womack stole 32 straight bases without being caught from April 6-July 4, 1997...Cruz has not been caught trying to steal a base since April 22, 2024 vs. Milwaukee.

NATS? NO PROBLEM: Since the beginning of 2022, Pittsburgh is 13-8 against Washington (8-4 here at PNC Park)...The 13 wins against the Nationals since the start of 2022 are tied with Miami for Pittsburgh's most wins against a non-divisional opponent in that stretch.

SUPERB SKENES: With 10 more strikeouts, Paul Skenes will reach 200 strikeouts in his Major League career...His first Major League strikeout was Chicago (NL)'s Mike Tauchman on May 11, 2024...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, if Skenes were to reach the 200-strikeout mark tonight, he'd become the fastest Pirates pitcher by games (27) to reach the mark with Pittsburgh, surpassing Oliver Pérez (2003-04), who took 28 games.

BULLPEN BOOST: Pittsburgh relievers didn't give up a run in 8.2 innings of work last weekend in Cincinnati...The Pirates' 3.45 bullpen ERA (60.0ip/23er) is the sixth-lowest in the National League (11th in MLB)...Over its last five games (since April 8), Pittsburgh's bullpen has a 0.52 ERA (17.1ip/2r/1er), the best mark among MLB bullpens in that span.

LEAN ON THE LEFTIES: Last weekend in Cincinnati, 17.0 of Pittsburgh's 24.0 total innings pitched came from left-handed pitchers...Pittsburgh's 64.1 innings pitched and 58 strikeouts in 2025 rank second and tied for fifth, respectively, in Major League Baseball.

KEEP IT IN THE YARD: Paul Skenes has pitched 55.1 consecutive innings without allowing a home run (last allowed a homer to Seattle's Luke Raley on August 16, 2024), the second-longest active streak in MLB behind Tampa Bay's Drew Rasmussen (56.1ip)...Dennis Santana (33.2ip, since last August 3) and Joey Wentz (32.0ip, since last August 2) also have homerless streaks of 30.0-plus innings.

FERGALICIOUS: Caleb Ferguson pitched a perfect eighth inning on Sunday at Cincinnati and has made eight straight scoreless appearances (8.0ip) to begin the season...He's one of only nine Major League relievers to have pitched 8.0-plus innings without allowing a run, and he's the only southpaw in that group.

YOUNG BUCS: Bubba Chandler and Thomas Harrington combined to strike out nine batters in 6.0 innings for Triple-A Indianapolis on Sunday at Louisville...Chandler, a top-100 prospect in baseball (No. 6 by Baseball America / No. 14 by MLB Pipeline), has 18 strikeouts through three starts (10.2ip), most among Pirates minor leaguers and tied for seventh-most in the International League.

GUIDING THE SHIP: With Pittsburgh's next win, skipper Derek Shelton will earn his 300th managerial victory...Shelton would become one of only 12 managers in franchise history to win at least 300 games as the team's skipper.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 14, 2024: Andrew McCutchen hit the 300th home run of his career in the ninth inning as the Pirates beat the Phillies, 9-2, at Citizens Bank Park. Jack Suwinski connected for the second grand slam of his career as part of a five-run sixth inning, while Mitch Keller allowed two runs over 7.0 innings to earn the win. McCutchen, Suwinski and Ke'Bryan Hayes each had two hits in the win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander will make his fourth start of the season tonight and second at PNC Park in 2025...Took home BBWAA National League Rookie of the Year honors last season after making his Major League debut on May 11 vs. the Cubs...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of Louisiana State University.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed five runs and struck out seven batters over 6.0 innings while suffering his first loss of the season on April 8 vs. St. Louis...The five runs were the most Skenes has allowed in a Major League game or a game at any professional level...He's lost only four games in 26 starts in the majors, and three of those losses have come against the Cardinals.

VS. WASHINGTON: The Nationals are one of only five National League teams that Skenes has not yet faced in his career, along with Colorado, Philadelphia, San Diego and San Francisco.

OUR ACE: Through the first 25 starts of his Major League career, Skenes had a 1.92 ERA (145.1ip/31er) with 183 strikeouts...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Major League pitcher since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in the N.L./1913 in the A.L.) to post a sub-2.00 ERA and have 175-plus strikeouts over his first 25 Major League appearances...His 190 strikeouts since making his Major League debut on May 11, 2024 are fifth-most in all of MLB, behind Cole Ragans (203), Logan Gilbert (198), Chris Sale (197) and Tarik Skubal (191).

OPENING DAY HONORS: Skenes allowed two runs in 5.1 innings but had a no-decision on Opening Day (March 27) in Miami against the Marlins...At 22 years and 302 days old, Skenes was the youngest Opening Day starter in club history dating back to 1893 (Frank Killen, 22 years and 148 days)...He was also the youngest Major League pitcher to make an Opening Day start since José Fernández, who did so in Miami for the Marlins on March 31, 2014, when he was 21 years and 243 days old...Skenes, who was the top pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, also became the fastest No. 1 overall selection to make an Opening Day start...According to Major League Baseball, the previous quickest to do so were Mike Moore (top pick in 1981 and Opening Day starter in 1984) and Stephen Strasburg (top pick in 2009 and Opening Day starter in 2012).

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR HONORS: Last year, Skenes became the second player in Pirates history to take home BBWAA Rookie of the Year honors, along with Jason Bay in 2004...He became the first rookie pitcher to make at least 23 starts and post a sub-2.00 ERA in a single season since Scott Perry with the Philadelphia Athletics in 1918...He also became the 24th pitcher to win the N.L. Rookie of the Year Award and the first to do so since Devin Williams with Milwaukee in 2020.

IN A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN: Skenes recorded a 1.96 earned run average in 23 starts during his rookie season in 2024...His 1.96 ERA from the time of his big-league debut on May 11 through the end of the season was the lowest in all of MLB...His .198 batting average against was also the lowest by a Pirates starting pitcher in team history (minimum 16 starts)...His 1.96 ERA was the lowest by a Major League rookie pitcher (minimum 18 starts) in the Live-Ball era (since 1920).

ALL-STAR HONORS: Skenes entered the 2024 All-Star break with a 6-0 record, 1.90 ERA, 0.92 WHIP, 89 strikeouts and 13 walks in 11 starts...The strikeout total was the fifth-most in Major League history (since 1901) through 11 starts...When he started for the National League on July 16 in Arlington, he became one of five rookie pitchers to start the All-Star Game, joining Hideo Nomo (1995), Fernando Valenzuela (1981), Mark Fidrych (1976) and Dave Stenhouse (1962).

AND THE WHIFF: Skenes struck out a club rookie-record 170 batters last season...He became the first pitcher in the Modern Era with 150 strikeouts and an ERA under 2.00 over his first 22 games...The previous club record since 1900 was 142, which was held by Cy Blanton in 1935.

MILITARY MAN: Spent his first two years of college at the Air Force Academy, where he earned the 2022 John Olerud Award as the nation's best two-way player (pitched and caught)...He majored in military strategic studies while at Air Force and was a member of Cadet Squadron 9.
