WHOA WE'RE 2/3 OF THE WAY THERE: Fresh off wins in their last two games, the Detroit Tigers tonight continue their three-game series with the Arizona Diamondbacks at Comerica Park, the backend of their two-team, seven-game homestand that began with a four-game set with Toronto (1-3) ... the Tigers have still dropped 12 of their last 15 games as they aim to snap a four-series losing streak with a win tonight or tomorrow.

- With 108 games down and 54 to go, the Tigers have reached the two-thirds mark of their schedule with a 62-46 record, their best showing through 108 games since going 63-45 in 2013 ... overall, the Tigers have now won 62 of their first 108 games only six times in the last 42 seasons (2025, 2013, 2006, 1988, 1987 and 1984).
- This series with the Diamondbacks ends a stretch of 13-games-in-13-days out of the All-Star Break through tomorrow, while this homestand also kicked off a stretch of 13-of-16 games at Comerica Park ... after this series, the Tigers take a brief road trip to Philadelphia for three games this weekend before returning to Detroit for a six-game homestand next week.

IT ONLY HAPPENS THIS TIME OF YEAR: Troy Melton last night tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing only five hits and no walks with five strikeouts, to earn his first major league win and continue a stretch of Tigers scoreless starting pitching efforts that began with Tarik Skubal (6.0 innings on Saturday) and Jack Flaherty (6.0 innings on Sunday).

- This marks only the third time in Tigers history that the club has seen its starting pitcher toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in three-straight games ... the other two occurrences?: July 30-31, 1949, when Virgil Trucks (July 30), Ted Gray (July 31, Game 1 of DH), and Fred Hutchinson (July 31, Game 2 of DH) all pitched complete-game shutouts at Philadelphia; and July 26-29, 1910, when “Wild” Bill Donovan (July 26 at New York), George Mullin (July 28 vs. Chicago) and Ed Summers (July 29 at Chicago) all pitched complete-game shutouts as well ... thanks to Elias.
- Melton last night became the first Tigers pitcher to throw at least seven shutout innings in his first-career home appearance in nearly 23 years since Andy Van Hekken’s complete game shutout on September 3, 2002 vs. Cleveland.

MIZE REALLY LOVES COMPANY: First-time All-Star Casey Mize (9-4) and All-Star teammate Tarik Skubal (10-3) are one of three duos with at least nine wins in the A.L., joining New York's Max Fried (11-4) and Carlos Rodon (11-7); and Houston's Framber Valdez (11-4) and Hunter Brown (9-5).

- Mize tonight takes the ball for his first start at home since the Break and brings a 9-4 record with a 3.40 ERA into his 18th start of the season ... one of only 11 pitchers in the A.L. to reach nine wins this season, Mize this year has matched the nine career wins he had going into the 2025 campaign in his first 61 career appearances (59 starts).

CENTRAL CASTING: Despite recent trends, the Tigers maintain a 9.0-game lead in the American League Central, the largest lead within any of the six divisions in baseball, and they trail only Toronto (by 1.5 games) for the best record in the A.L.

- Now at +9.0 games over Cleveland, the Tigers emerged from the All-Star Break with a slightly larger 11.5-game lead on the second-place Minnesota Twins in the A.L. Central, which was Detroit's largest lead at the Break in its division or league in franchise history since the All-Star Game's inception in 1933 ... Detroit's previous bests: the 1968 Tigers led the A.L. by 9.5 games at the All-Star Break and the 1984 Tigers led the A.L. East by 7.0 games at the All-Star Break.

SPENCER'S GIFTS: Spencer Torkelson has tallied 23 homers and 46 extra-base hits in 102 games this season, tied with Nick Kurtz for the most homers by any player in baseball that primarily plays first base this year, while Torkelson has the most extra-base hits among first basemen in the American League, trailing only Pete Alonso (49) for most in the majors.

THESE THREE = A NICE CROWD: Riley Greene joins New York's Aaron Judge and Chicago's Seiya Suzuki as the only three players in the majors to reach 21 doubles, 25 homers and 81 RBI this season ... Greene has those exact totals through 108 team games, which puts him on pace for 32 doubles, 38 homers and 123 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

DYNAMIC DUO: Riley Greene (25 homers, 81 RBI) and Spencer Torkelson (23 homers, 63 RBI) are the only teammates in the American League to reach 23 homers and 63 RBI this season and are one of only two teammates to do so in all of baseball this year, joining Chicago's Seiya Suzuki (26/81) and Pete Crow-Armstrong (27/76).

THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE: The Tigers have the second-best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +66 overall run differential, the third-best mark in the A.L. (Yankees, +93; Rangers, +72) ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +106 edge on the second-place Guardians (-40), are +88 on the third-place Royals (-22) and are +84 on the fourth-place Twins (-18).

AND FINALLY: Only five American League pitchers have five or more wins with one loss or less at home this season, and two of them are with the Tigers: Casey Mize (5-1), Tarik Skubal (8-1), Chris Bassitt (8-0), Adrian Houser (5-0) and Framber Valdez (5-1).

- Named a 2025 All-Star for the first time in his career on July 11, becoming the sixth Tigers' player to be named to the team.
- Placed on the 15-day IL on May 10 (retro May 9) with a left hamstring strain...was activated and made his first start back against Cleveland on May 24.
- Became the first Tigers pitcher to win four games in April since Jordan Zimmerman won five games in 2016...went 4-1 with a 2.12 ERA (6 ER/24.1 IP) in five starts in April.
- In his first MLB action since 2022, Mize appeared in 22 games (20 starts) and posted a 2-6 record with a 4.49 ERA (51ER/102.1IP) and 78 strikeouts last season.
