ROSTER MOVE—The Rays have optioned INF **Kevin Padlo** to the alternate training site and recalled LH **Josh Fleming** from the taxi squad... Fleming will become the 34th player and 19th pitcher used by the Rays this season, both most in the majors...he will be the seventh starting pitcher used by the Rays, tied with the Blue Jays, D-backs and Mariners for most in the majors, and the most in club history through 12 games.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost six of their last 9 games following a 2-0 start to the season; however, they have won three of their last 5 games since a 4-game losing streak...four of the five teams in the AL East are 5-6 and behind the first-place Red Sox (7-3), who have won seven straight.

- + The Rays have held a lead in 10 of their 11 games and blown a lead in five of their 6 losses, including last night when the Rays led 2-1 through 3 innings...the five blown leads (games eventually lost after having the lead) are most in the majors, ahead of the Braves (4), Twins (4) and White Sox (4)...in comparison, last season the Rays trailed in 40 of their 60 games but had 20 come-from-behind wins, most in the AL and 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (22).
- The Rays are 4-2 this season against teams that made the expanded postseason in 2020, and 1-4 against teams missing the playoffs.
- + The Rays are 13-2-4 in regular-season series since Aug 4, 2020.
- This series the Rays continue stretches of games on 13 consecutive days (April 9-21) and 30 games in 31 days (April 9-May 9).

NOT THE RAYS WAY.—The Rays rank 22nd in the majors and 11th in the AL with a 4.88 ERA (99.2-IP, 54-ER)...they have allowed 63 runs this season, their most in the first 11 games since 2012 (64)...the Rays lead the AL and are tied with the Dodgers and Padres for the major league lead with three shutouts, but have allowed 4 runs (or more) in the other 8 games.

- + The Rays have allowed 8 runs (or more) five times, tied with the Athletics for most in the majors...they have allowed 6 runs (or more) six times, tied for 3rd in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (8) and Mariners (7)...they have allowed 5 runs (or more) seven times, tied for 3rd behind the Athletics (9) and D-backs (8).
- + This season marks the fourth in franchise history the Rays have allowed 8 runs (or more) five times in the first 11 games...the previous three all occurred as the Devil Rays: 2007 (5), 2006 (5), 2000 (5).
- + Last season the Rays ranked 3rd in the majors with a 3.56 ERA behind the Dodgers (3.02) and Indians (3.29)...it was the second consecutive season the Rays finished among the majors' top three in ERA, and fourth straight season they finished among the top ten.

START ME UP—Rays starters rank 15th in the majors and 7th in the AL with a 4.04 ERA (55.2-IP, 25-ER)...RH **Tyler Glasnow** ranks 2nd in the AL with a 0.46 ERA (19.2-IP, 1-ER) but the rest of the rotation has combined for a 6.00 ERA (36-IP, 24-ER)...excluding openers and injury-shortened starts, Rays starters have allowed 4 runs (or more) in five of 9 games...in comparison, Rays starters yielded 4+ runs in 20 pct. (12 of 60) of games last season, when the Rays ranked 7th in the majors in starter ERA.

- + LH Josh Fleming will become the seventh starting pitcher used by the Rays this season, the most in club history through 12 games.
- + Fleming went 5-0 with a 2.78 ERA (32.1-IP, 10-ER) in 7 apps (5 starts) last season, his first major league action...he was selected from the alternate site on Aug 23 and remained on the active roster for the rest of the season...from Aug 23 through season's end, his 5 wins tied **Tyler Glasnow** and SEA **Marco Gonzales** for 1st in the majors.
- From the date of his major league debut through the end of the season, he ranked among major league rookie leaders in wins (1st), innings (32.1, tied for 5th), ERA (2.78, 2nd) and opp avg. (.230, 4th).

RELIEF VALVE—The bullpen has a 5.93 ERA (44-IP, 29-ER), 29th in the majors and ahead of only the Tigers (6.86)...its .306 opp avg. (53-for-173) is the worst in the majors; 29th place is the Mets at .293...last season the Rays ranked 3rd in the majors in bullpen ERA (3.37) behind the Athletics (2.72) and Dodgers (2.74)...the bullpen has a 3.24 ERA (25-IP, 9-ER) in the last 6 games since April 7, compared to a 9.47 ERA in the first 5 games.

- + Rays relievers have allowed six of the club's 9 HR...this includes 4 HR allowed in the 8th inning and 1 HR allowed in the 9th inning.
- The Rays are 3-2 this season when leading after 7 innings...combining regular season and postseason, they entered this season having won 63 consecutive games when leading after 7 innings.

THROWING BLANKS—Three of the club's 5 wins this season have been of the shutout variety, including the wins on Sat vs. NYY (4-0) and Mon

vs. TEX (1-0)...the Rays are one shy of matching their shutout total from the shortened 2020 season (4)...this season marked the second time in franchise history the Rays pitched three shutouts within the first 10 games of a season, joining 2013 (3)...for the record, the Rays have never pitched four shutouts in the first 12 games, and the last teams in the majors to achieve that were the 2015 Athletics (5) and the 2015 Tigers (4).

+ The Rays have won a pair of 1-0 games this season (Opening Day at MIA, Mon at TEX)...they became the eighth team in AL history to win multiple 1-0 games within the first 10 games of a season.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays have been held to 4 runs this series and 12 runs in the last 4 games...this season their .221 avg. ranks 22nd in the majors and 12th in the AL, and their 11 HR are tied for 21st in the majors and tied for 11th in the AL...this comes on the heels of the 2020 postseason, when the Rays hit 34 HR—the most in a single postseason in major league history...35.6 pct. (16 of 45) of the Rays runs this season have come on home runs, compared to 67.1 pct. (53 of 79) in the 2020 playoffs.

- + The Rays are batting .219 (21-for-96) with RISP, 24th in the majors.
- + This homestand the Rays have scored 19 runs in innings 1-thru-4, compared to 3 runs from the 5th inning on...to compare, on the first road trip they scored 5 runs in innings 1-thru-4 and 18 runs after.
- + Since 2020, the Rays are 26-11 (.703) in games decided by 2 runs (or fewer) and 16-6 (.727) in 1-run games, both the best in the majors... this includes a 15-4 (.789) record in 1-run games since Aug 7.

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays are 12-0-4 in their last 16 home series since Aug 30, 2019...since the start of 2020, the Rays are 23-11 (.676) at home, 3rd in the majors...they are 38-13 (.745) in their last 51 home games since Aug 21, 2019, best in the majors over that stretch...in 2020, the Rays won in walk-off fashion four times, tied for 2nd in the majors...the Rays haven't lost back-to-back home games since Aug 19-20, 2019 vs. SEA.

RAYS vs. RANGERS—Tonight is the third of 7 games between the two clubs this season, with a 3-game series from June 4-6 in Arlington...this is the first series between the clubs since Sep 10-12, 2019 at TEX and first at Tropicana Field since June 28-30, 2019...the Rays are 88-99 (.471) all-time against them, going 49-43 at home (46-43 at Tropicana Field, 3-0 at Disney Wide World of Sports) and 39-56 on the road...the Rays are 15-11 (.577) against them since 2016, including 6-2-0 in series play over that stretch.

- + RH Pete Fairbanks (injured list) and LH Jeffrey Springs were both selected by the Rangers in the 2015 Amateur Draft...Fairbanks, who was acquired for INF Nick Solak, had 3 saves last postseason including Game 7 of the ALCS...1B Nate Lowe, who ranks 2nd in the AL with 14 RBI, was traded to the Rangers in the offseason.
- + Since 2010, the Rays have made five trips to the postseason (2010, 2011, 2013, 2019, 2020)...strangely, during that stretch the Rays have won 6 games in Arlington and 5 games at Tropicana Field.

THE GREAT RANDINO—Rookie Randy Arozarena has been named the Play of the Week Award winner for April 5-11, becoming the Rays player to accomplish the feat since the award was introduced in 2019... with 2-on, 0-out in the 4th inning on April 5 at BOS, Arozarena ranged to deep right-center field before making a fully-extended diving catch to take away an extra-base hit from former teammate Hunter Renfroe.

BANNER YEAR—Last season the Rays won the American League pennant for the second time in franchise history (2008), but lost the World Series to the Dodgers...the Rays won the AL East for the third time (2008, 2010)...after a shortened 60-game regular season, they set a major league record by playing 20 postseason games, thanks in part to the expanded playoff format...the Rays were the ninth team in major league history to play a "winner take all" game in the Division Series (won 2-1 over the Yankees) and League Championship Series (won 4-2 over the Astros) but only the third to win both, joining the 2012 Giants and 1981 Dodgers.

JACKIE ROBINSON DAY—Tomorrow the Rays will commemorate the 74th anniversary of Jackie Robinson breaking baseball's color barrier in 1947 with all players and coaches wearing Robinson's iconic uniform "No. 42" on their jerseys...the game-worn No. 42 jerseys and caps will be available for auction at raysbaseball.com/auctions, with proceeds benefiting the Jackie Robinson Foundation...special batting practice T-shirts, which have been designed by The Players Alliance and provided by Nike, will be worn by players prior to games...the Rays will also be recognizing their 2020 Racial Equity Grant recipients prior to tomorrow's game.

2020 RECAP—Went 5-0 with a 2.78 ERA (32.1-IP, 10-ER) in 7 apps (5 starts) for the Rays last season, his first career action...his 5-game winning streak is the longest for a Rays pitcher to begin his major league career, breaking a tie with **Adam Kolarek** (2017-19), **Jake Faria** (2017), **Jeremy Hellickson** (2010), **Tim Corcoran** (2006) and **James Shields** (2006)...became the second Rays rookie to finish a season with 5 wins (or more) and no losses, joining **Jalen Beeks** (5-0) in 2018...became the third Rays pitcher to start and win each of his first three major league apps, joining Faria and Hellickson.

- + Selected from the alternate training site on Aug 23 and remained on the active roster for the rest of the season...from Aug 23 through season's end, his 5 wins tied **Tyler Glasnow** and SEA **Marco Gonzales** for the major league lead...from the date of his debut through the end of the season, ranked among ML rookie leaders in wins (1st), innings (tied for 5th), ERA (2nd) and opp avg. (.230, 4th).
- + Went 4-0 with a 3.16 ERA (25.2-IP, 9-ER) in 5 starts and 1-0 with a 1.35 ERA (6.2-IP, 1-ER) in two relief apps...two of his five starts last season were scoreless and one of his two relief apps was scoreless.
- + Min. 20 IP, his groundball rate of 64.6 pct. led the AL and ranked 3rd in the majors...yielded 7 BB in 32.1 IP for a 1.96 BB/9 IP ratio.
- + Ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 24 prospect in the Rays system following the season...the publication also tabbed him as having the Best Changeup in the organization.

SPRING RECAP—Did not allow a run in four official Grapefruit League apps (1 start) this spring, going 2-0 and allowing just 3 hits and 1 BB in 8.2 IP (0.46 WHIP)...recorded the win in his spring debut on March 3 vs. PIT, pitching a scoreless 2nd inning in relief...made his lone start on March 9 vs. BOS, recording the win after allowing 1 hit and throwing 18 of his 22 pitches for strikes in 2 IP...combined for 5.2 IP over his last 2 apps, including 3.2 IP with 5 SO in relief in his spring finale on March 26 vs. BOS.

POSTSEASON—Pitched to a 6.35 ERA (5.2-IP, 4-ER) in 2 apps in the post-season...made his postseason debut in Game 5 of the ALCS at HOU, entering with 1 out in the 2nd inning behind opener **John Curtiss** and allowing 2 runs in 3 IP...yielded 2 runs in 2.2 IP of relief in Game 1 of the World Series at LAD...was not on the roster for the Wild Card Series or ALDS.

IN CONTROL—Had a 3.57 SO/BB ratio (25-SO, 7-BB) last season, 5th-best among major league rookies (min. 30 IP)...threw 14.5 pitches per inning and 3.62 pitches/BF, both the 2nd-best marks among rookie pitchers (min. 30 IP)...went to 3-ball counts to only 16.2 pct. (21 of 130) of batters faced.

+ Last season, became the third Rays pitcher all-time to go 5 IP (or more) and not allow a walk in two of his first three career apps, joining Brendan McKay in 2019 and Andy Sonnanstine in 2007.

RAYS REINFORCEMENTS—Will be the 34th player and 19th pitcher used by the Rays this season, both most in the majors...breaks a tie with the Nationals (33) for players used, and extends a lead over the A's (17), Blue Jays (17) and Cubs (17) for pitchers used...will be the seventh starting pitcher used by the Rays, tied with the Blue Jays, D-backs and Mariners for most in the majors, and the most in club history through 12 games.

AMATUER CAREER—Selected in the fifth round of the 2017 June Draft out of Webster University, becoming the first drafted player in program history... became the first player in school and league (SLIAC) history to play in the majors...went 8-1 with a 0.68 ERA (92.2-IP, 7-ER) in 13 starts as a junior, leading Division III in ERA and WHIP (0.71)...missed most of his sophomore season with a sprained UCL in his left elbow.
