FROM A-TO-Z: The Detroit Tigers tonight continue their two-team, seven-game homestand with the first of three games vs. the Arizona Diamondbacks as they square off against an N.L. West opponent for the first time since May ... the Tigers yesterday snapped their season-high-tying six-game losing streak with a 10-4 win vs. the Toronto Blue Jays to salvage the final game of that four-game series ... the Tigers have lost 12 of their last 14 games dating to July 9.

- The Tigers are in their first 2-12 stretch since May 30-June 14, 2023 ... overall, the Tigers have endured a 2-12 stretch like this within only nine of their past 20 seasons.
- The Tigers this week aim to snap a four-series losing skid, their longest drought of the season, and their first such four-series stretch since June 7-19, 2024.
- This series with the Diamondbacks ends a stretch of 13-games-in-13-days out of the All-Star Break through Wednesday, while this homestand also kicked off a stretch of 13-of-16 games at Comerica Park ... after this series, the Tigers take a brief road trip to Philadelphia for three games this weekend before returning to Detroit for a six-game homestand next week.

GRAND CENTRAL: Despite the recent aforementioned trends, the Tigers maintain an 8.0-game lead in the American League Central, the largest lead within any of the six divisions in baseball, and they trail only Toronto (by 2.5 games) for the best record in the A.L.

- Now at +8.0 games over Cleveland, the Tigers emerged from the All-Star Break with a slightly larger 11.5-game lead on the second-place Minnesota Twins in the A.L. Central, which was Detroit's largest lead at the Break in its division or league in franchise history since the All-Star Game's inception in 1933 ... Detroit's previous bests: the 1968 Tigers led the A.L. by 9.5 games at the All-Star Break and the 1984 Tigers led the A.L. East by 7.0 games at the All-Star Break.
- The Tigers have their best start through 107 games since 2013, when they began 62-45 ... 2025 marks the seventh time in the last 41 years the Tigers have won 61 of their first 107 games.
- The Tigers are 100-72 since last year's All-Star Break, good for a 13.5-game lead on the next best A.L. Central clubs in that span, the Cleveland Guardians and Kansas City Royals, who both check in with 86-85 records since last year's Break.

WHEN LEFT IS RIGHT: The Tigers tonight face familiar face in Arizona southpaw Eduardo Rodriguez ... Detroit boasts a 19-10 (.655) record vs. lefty starters this year, the second-best winning percentage against lefties by a club in the majors behind only Milwaukee (20-10, .667).

- Collectively, the Tigers have a .756 OPS vs. left-handed pitching this season, the fifth-highest mark in all of baseball.
- Individually, the Tigers could have six players in the lineup tonight with an OPS greater than .800 vs. left-handed pitchers: Wenceel Pérez (1.026), Spencer Torkelson (1.011), Zach McKinstry (.913), Jahmai Jones (.888), Gleyber Torres (.884) and Dillon Dingler (.806), plus Javier Báez and his .799 OPS vs. southpaws could make it seven excellent OPS' against southpaws.
- The left-handed hitting Zach McKinstry is batting .329 (27-for-82) vs. left-handed pitching this season, the second-best average by a left-handed hitter vs. southpaws in the majors.
- Spencer Torkelson ranks sixth in the A.L. with a 1.011 OPS vs. southpaws (among qualifiers).

CUT THE CHASE: Gleyber Torres boasts just a 16.7 percent chase rate this season, second-lowest in all of baseball behind only Juan Soto (14.5 percent) ... only one Tigers player in the last five seasons has finished a campaign with a lower chase rate: Robbie Grossman at 15.8 percent in 2021.

THIS IS SOME HIGH-END TORK: Spencer Torkelson has tallied 23 homers and 46 extra-base hits in 101 games this season, tied with Nick Kurtz for the most homers by any player in baseball that primarily plays first base this year, while Torkelson has the most extra-base hits among first basemen in the American League, trailing only Pete Alonso (49) for most in the majors.

THREE'S COMPANY: Riley Greene joins New York's Aaron Judge and Chicago's Seiya Suzuki as the only three players in the majors to reach 21 doubles, 25 homers and 81 RBI this season ... Greene has those totals through 107 team games, which puts him on pace for 32 doubles, 38 homers and 123 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

A PAIR OF TWOS: Riley Greene (25 homers, 81 RBI) and Spencer Torkelson (23 homers, 62 RBI) are the only teammates in the American League to reach 23 homers and 62 RBI this season and are one of only two teammates to do so in all of baseball this year, joining Chicago's Seiya Suzuki (26/81) and Pete Crow-Armstrong (27/76).

THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE: The Tigers have the second-best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +62 overall run differential, the third-best mark in the A.L. (Yankees, +95; Rangers, +74) ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +100 edge on the second-place Guardians (-38), are +81 on the third-place Royals (-19) and are +81 on the fourth-place Twins (-19).

AND FINALLY: Despite having lost four series openers in a row, the Tigers still maintain the best series-opener record in all of baseball with a 24-10 mark in such games.

- Had eight saves and a 1.77 ERA as of June 30, limiting opponents to a .154 batting average against him in 34 games.
