GAMING FOR GOOD—Blake Snell, playing as the Rays in the *MLB The Show* Players League, went 24-5 in the round-robin style regular season and earned the No. 1 seed for the postseason, which begins tonight...he will face LAD **Gavin Lux** (19-10) in the best-of-three quarterfinals, which will air on FOX Sports 1 beginning at 10 p.m. ...best-of-three semifinals are scheduled for tomorrow on ESPN2 (3 p.m.) and FS1 (8 p.m.), while the best-of-five championship series will air Sunday at 2:30 p.m. on ESPN.

+ MLB, the MLBPA and Sony will donate a total of \$175,000 to the Boys & Girls Clubs through this effort, with \$5,000 donated on behalf of each player to a Boys & Girls Club affiliate in their community, and an extra \$25,000 going to the local affiliate of the championship player.

COMFORTS OF HOME—FOX Sports Sun has unveiled its Rays Classics and Rays Rewinds schedule for May...Classic replays will be televised statewide on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, while 2019 Rewinds will air on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays...in advance of tonight's reair of Game 4 of the 2008 ALDS, FOX Sports Sun reporter Tricia Whitaker interviewed Carlos Peña to reminisce on the win that sent the Rays to the ALCS...on Monday and Wednesday at noon, 7 p.m. and midnight, FOX Sports Sun will air Games 2 and 3 of the 2008 ALCS, respectively.

- + On Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday at both 12 p.m. and midnight, FSS will air the wins from last June 6 at DET and June 7-8 at BOS.
- + Starting next week, WDAE 95.3 FM and 620 AM will rewind to

- 2008...this begins Wednesday with a re-air of the club's first post-season clinch from Sep 20, 2008, followed by all postseason wins.

- + All-time classic games continue to run on MLB Network...the Rays are included on the MLB Network schedule twice through Mother's Day, albeit on the wrong side of two perfect games: Tuesday at 11 a.m. (Félix Hernández) and May 10 at 5:30 p.m. (Dallas Braden).

THE SIMS—The Rays have claimed an AL East division lead in the Strato-Matic simulation of the 2020 season (strat-o-matic.com), finishing April with a 21-12 (.636) record, best mark in the AL and a half-game ahead of the Yankees...Blake Snell was named April Pitcher of the Month after going 5-0 with a 0.59 ERA...the Rays also lead the AL East in The Athletic's simulation—which uses Out of the Park Baseball—going 36-22 (.621) through May 28, 2 games ahead of New York...in that simulation, the Rays and Rangers completed a March 25 blockbuster sending INF Wander Franco, RH Brent Honeywell Jr. and 1B Nate Lowe to Texas for RH Corey Kluber, RH José Leclerc and OF Joey Gallo...in that season, Snell is 8-0 with a 1.46 ERA.

BELATED OPENERS—If and when baseball returns this season, it would mark the latest Opening Day in modern major league history (since 1901)... the latest date any season has opened was in 1995, when the players' strike delayed the start of the season...that year, the first game (Dodgers at Marlins) was played on April 25, while the last teams to open (Mariners, Indians) both played their lid-lifter on April 27.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY—OF **Austin Meadows** turns 25 on Sunday...last season, Meadows was named co-winner of the Don Zimmer Award as the club's Most Valuable Player...he became the 10th player in franchise history with a 30-HR season, and the 2nd-youngest to do it behind 23-year-old **Evan Longoria** (33) in 2009...his 33 HR were the 2nd-most in the AL by a player age-24 or younger, behind NYY **Gleyber Torres** (38).
