PITTSBURGH PIRATES (28-41) vs. CHICAGO CUBS (41-27)

June 12, 2025 - Wrigley Field - Chicago, IL - 7:05 CDT - Game #70/Road #32

LHP Andrew Heaney (3-4, 3.24 ERA) vs. RHP Jameson Taillon (6-3, 3.54 ERA)

THE PIRATES: will begin a seven-game trip to Chicago (tonight-Sunday) and Detroit (June 17-19) with this series opener at Wrigley Field...Went 6-3 on their recent homestand against Houston (1-2), Philadelphia (3-0) and Miami (2-1) from June 3-11...Are 16-15 since Don Kelly took over as manager on May 8...Have played in 15 one-run games since Kelly managed his first game on May 9 vs. Atlanta (8-7 in those games)...Are 7-12 against the National League Central this season.

VERY FRIENDLY CONFINES: Pittsburgh will play its first of seven games at Wrigley Field this season in tonight's series opener... The Pirates went 5-2 here last season, their first time winning a season series on the road against the Cubs since 2017 (went 5-4).

TAKING A STAND: Pittsburgh won six of its nine games on its recent homestand, including five of the last six games against Philadelphia (3-0, June 6-8) and Miami (2-1, Monday-Wednesday)...Over the last six games, the Pirates' 2.17 staff ERA (54.0ip/13er) is the lowest in all of Major League Baseball, while their .186 batting average against ranks second (Atlanta, .177).

22 PASSES 21: Andrew McCutchen's three-run home run off Cal Quantrill in the fifth inning of Wednesday's win vs. Miami was his 241st as a member of the Pirates, moving him past Roberto Clemente and into sole possession of third place on the club's all-time home runs list...Only Willie Stargell (475) and Ralph Kiner (301) had more homers with Pittsburgh...McCutchen has hit safely in five consecutive games (since Saturday at Philadelphia), going 8-for-20 (.400) with two doubles, a home run, six RBI and three runs.

LOCK IN, KE': Ke'Bryan Hayes had two hits on Wednesday vs. Miami and is 6-for-15 (.400) with a solo home run and four runs during his four-game hitting streak (since Sunday vs. Philadelphia)...He's hitting .290 (9-for-31) with two RBI in his first nine games of June... Wednesday was also his fifth career game with multiple steals (first since March 27 at Miami).

PLAY RENEGADE: David Bednar converted his ninth consecutive save to begin the season on Wednesday vs. Miami, striking out two of the three batters he faced...ln 23 appearances since being recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis on April 19, Bednar has a 2.49 ERA (21.2ip/6er) with 32 strikeouts (three walks in that stretch)...His 32 strikeouts in that span are tied with Toronto's Brendon Little for third-most among all Major League relievers, trailing Colorado's Jake Bird (38) and Minnesota's Griffin Jax (35)...His three walks during that time are tied with Chicago (AL)'s Tyler Alexander and Miami's Tyler Phillips for third-fewest among MLB relievers with 21.2-plus innings, behind Milwaukee's Nick Mears and San Francisco's Tyler Rogers (two each).

FURGALICIOUS: Caleb Ferguson pitched a scoreless eighth inning on Wednesday vs. Miami and has now made 11 consecutive scoreless appearances (11.1ip), dating back to May 17 at Philadelphia...During the scoreless streak, Ferguson has held opponents to a .158 (6-for-38) batting average against while posting a 0.79 WHIP...He's lowered his ERA from 5.00 to 3.07 during that span.

BUCS ON THE BASES: Pittsburgh swiped three bases in Wednesday's win vs. Miami...Oneil Cruz, who stole one of three bases, ranks second in Major League Baseball with 24 stolen bases (Chicago-NL's Pete Crow-Armstrong, 21, is tied for third)...Pittsburgh's 65 stolen bases are tied with Seattle for the fourthmost in MLB, behind Tampa Bay (96), Milwaukee (86) and Chicago-NL (84).

RELIABLE ROTATION: Bailey Falter allowed just one run over 5.1 innings on Wednesday vs. Miami...Pittsburgh's 23 starts of 5.1-plus innings and one or zero runs allowed this season are tied with Philadelphia and Texas for second-most in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only Detroit (24)...The Pirates' 3.58 ERA from their starting pitchers this season ranks seventh in Major League Baseball, behind New York-NL (2.84), Texas (3.02), Detroit (3.09), Kansas City (3.40), Milwaukee (3.41) and San Francisco (3.56)...Pittsburgh's 32 quality starts are fourth-most in all of MLB (Philadelphia, 36, ranks first on that list).

STARTING OFF: The 33-year-old southpaw is in his 12th Major League season...He signed a one-year contract with Pittsburgh on February 22 after spending each of the previous two years with Texas...Was Los Angeles (AL)'s nominee in both 2018 and 2019 for the distinguished Roberto Clemente Award for his community involvement.

LAST TIME OUT: Heaney allowed one run in 6.0 innings on Saturday vs. Philadelphia... He had a no-decision in the team's 2-1 win...He was relieved in the seventh inning by Isaac Mattson, who stranded a runner at third with nobody out to escape the jam.

AGAINST THE CUBS: Heaney will make his second start of the season against Chicago (NL)...He allowed four runs over 4.2 innings on April 29 at PNC Park, losing a 9-0 decision...His only other career outing against the Cubs came on April 5, 2016 with Los Angeles (AL) at Angel Stadium, when he allowed four runs over 6.0 innings (lost 6-1).

FOR LOVE OF IVY: Heaney will make his first career appearance at Wrigley Field tonight, marking the 33rd different venue he's pitched at least one game in during his big-league career...The only active stadiums besides Wrigley Field that he has not pitched at are Sutter Health Park (Athletics) and George M. Steinbrenner Field (Rays)... His 56 career appearances at Angel Stadium are his most at any big-league stadium.

INNINGS BREAKDOWN: Heaney has a 4.15 ERA (39.0ip/18er) in the first three innings of games this season...From the fourth inning on, Heaney has a 2.16 ERA (33.1ip/8er).

LIMITING THE FREE PASSES: Heaney has not issued a walk in each of his last two starts (combined 11.2 innings)...He's made three starts this season without allowing a walk (April 23 at Los Angeles-AL, June 1 at San Diego, Saturday vs. Philadelphia)... Entering tonight's start, Heaney is averaging 2.99 walks issued per 9.0 innings in 2025.

<u>PUTTING UP ZEROES</u>: Heaney had his career-best streak of 19.1 consecutive scoreless innings come to an end in the fourth inning of his start on April 29 vs. Chicago (NL).

A HALO OF A PERFORMANCE: Heaney allowed one hit over 6.0 innings (struck out nine) while earning the win in the team's 3-0 shutout in Anaheim against the Angels on April 23 (struck out each of the first six batters he faced)...He became the first Pirates lefthander to throw 6.0-plus scoreless innings with nine-plus strikeouts since Francisco Liriano on April 3, 2016 vs. St. Louis (10 strikeouts)...Heaney also became the first Pirates left-handed pitcher to throw 6.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive starts since Jose Quintana from May 9-15, 2022...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Heaney became the first Pirates southpaw in club history to throw 6.0-plus scoreless innings with nine-plus strikeouts while allowing one hit or fewer and issuing zero walks in an outing.

AND THE WHIFF: Heaney struck out each of the first six batters he faced in his start on April 23 in Anaheim against the Angels, becoming the first Pirates left-handed pitcher to strike out six-plus consecutive batters since Francisco Liriano on June 1, 2013 vs. Cincinnati (seven straight)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Heaney and Paul Skenes (May 17, 2024 at Wrigley Field against the Cubs) are the only Pittsburgh pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to strike out six or more straight batters to begin a game.

PESKY LEFTIES: According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Bailey Falter (7.0ip/0r on April 16) and Heaney (7.1ip/0r on April 17) became the first pair of Pirates left-handed teammates to pitch 7.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive team games since John Candelaria (9.0ip) and Larry McWilliams (7.0ip) did so on July 25 and July 27, 1982.
