METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Braves, 6-4...New York has lost four straight games, which is tied for the longest of the season...The last time the Mets lost more than four games was when they dropped five in a row from September 21-26, 2021...The Mets continue their six-game road trip (0-1) to Atlanta (0-1) and Pittsburgh (three games).

22 (PETE'S VERSION): Last night, Pete Alonso cracked his major league-leading 22nd home run in just his 61st game of the season...Dave Kingman (1976) is the only other Met to hit 22 home runs in the team's first 61 games of a season...Last season, Alonso reached 22 home runs on June 25 in his 72nd game (team's 73rd)...In 2021, his 22nd homer came on July 25 in game No. 87 (team game No. 97)...Alonso remains ahead of his record-setting pace from the 2019 season, when he hit his 22nd long ball on June 11 in the 66th game (Mets' 67th game) of his rookie campaign.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso's 22 home runs this year, leads the majors leagues...His 49 RBI are fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 429 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in all 58 of the Mets games this year.

TURNED A CORNER: The Mets have received eight quality starts from their staff in the last 15 games...New York had eight quality starts through the first 46 games of the season...Over the last 15 games, Mets starters have posted a 3.31 ERA (31 ER/84.1 IP) with 30 walks and 80 strikeouts.

MAD MAX: Max Scherzer is set to make his 10th start of the season tonight...The righty is 5-2 with a 3.21 ERA (17 ER/47.2 IP) with 14 walks and 48 strikeouts...Over his last four starts, Scherzer is 3-0 with a 1.08 ERA (3 ER/25.0 IP) with four walks and 28 strikeouts...Tonight will mark his 32nd game (30th) start against the Braves...He is 13-10 with a 3.77 ERA (77 ER/182.3 IP) with 54 walks and 217 punchouts against Atlanta.

COME AT THE KING, BEST NOT MISS: Omar Narváez made his return from the Injured List yesterday...He went 1-2 with one run...He has reached base safely in all six games this season, batting .313 (5-16) with two runs, two RBI and two walks.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: New York is 22-31 all-time at Truist Park...Mark Canha has hit .303 (10-33) with three runs, four doubles, two home runs, four RBI, three walks with a .378 OBP and a .606 SLG...Tommy Pham has batted .268 (11-41) with nine runs, one double, four home runs, eight RBI, 10 walks with a .415 OBP and a .585 SLG...Starling Marte has hit seven home runs in 26 career games at the yard.

HOTLANTA: Jeff McNeil has hit .382 (34-89) with 13 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, five walks with a .421 OBP and a .551 SLG...In seven games at the ballpark in 2022, McNeil recorded a hit in six of those games, batting .517 (15-29) with five runs, three doubles, one home run, two RBI with a 1.241 OPS.

A STARLING IS BORN: Over his last 26 games, Starling Marte is batting .284 (25-88) with 12 runs, one double, one triple, two home runs, nine RBI, three walks with a .330 OBP...He has safely reached base in seven of his last nine games.

PHAM-TASTIC: Over his last 11 games, Tommy Pham is batting .346 (9-26) with four runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs, seven RBI, four walks with a .433 OBP, a .731 SLG and a 1.164 OPS.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 12-9 against the division this year...The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022...Their .658 winning percentage against the East was the best mark in club history.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost five straight and seven of their last eight at Truist Park...New York is 22-31 all-time at the ballpark.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Over the last 17 games, Mark Canha is 14-45 (.311) with seven runs, two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, seven walks with a .426 OBP, .489 SLG and a .915 OPS...He has safely reached base in each of his last 12 games with a plate appearance, batting .313 (10-32) with five runs, two home runs, six RBI, seven walks with a .950 OPS in that span.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 21 errors in 61 games this year, tied with the Diamondbacks for the fewest errors in the majors...New York owns a .990 fielding percentage...Their .990 fielding percentage, second in the major leagues.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 46-13 in the first inning this year.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York has played 34 games on the road this year, tied for the third-most in the majors...New York is 15-19 with a 4.91 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 283 strikeouts on the road are the third-most in the majors.

ROAD WARRIOR: Brandon Nimmo is batting .346 (46-133) with 18 runs, eight doubles, three triples, two home runs, 17 RBI, 16 walks with a .419 OBP and .496 SLG in 35 games on the road this season...His .346 road average ranks fourth in the majors...Nimmo owns a career .399 OBP on the road...That is the fourth-highest mark in the majors since the Wyoming native entered the league in 2016.

BROOKS WAS HERE: Brooks Raley allowed four earned runs in one inning of work on April 4 in Milwaukee...Since then he has pitched to a 1.04 ERA (2 ER/17.1 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...Since returning from the IL, the southpaw has not allowed a run in any of his last 10 games, striking out 11 over those 8.1 innings.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 16-1 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are still 6-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 27-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 122 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Francisco Alvarez has hit eight home runs this season...That puts him tied for the fifth-most by a rookie in the majors and tied for third in the National League...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's nine career homers (one last year) before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets lead the major leagues with an 87.5% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 17 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 331 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals...Pete Alonso has stolen 12 bases in 13 tries in his career.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets are hitting .237 (108-456) with runners in scoring position, ranking 11th in the NL and 23rd in the majors this year...Last season, New York batted .269 (371-1,378), good for third in the NL and fourth in the majors.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 7.0 innings against Philadelphia at Citi Field on June 1...Allowed two runs, one earned, on five hits and one walk...Fanned nine Phillies hitters in a 4-2 Mets victory, picking up his fifth win of the year.

HOME OF THE BRAVE(S): Scherzer has faced Atlanta 31 times throughout his career, including 29 starts...In those appearances, he has pitched to a 13-10 record with a 3.77 ERA (77 ER/183.2 IP)...When facing the Braves on the road, Scherzer has pitched to a 3.18 ERA (36 ER/102.0 IP) in 18 appearances, including 16 starts, with an 8-6 record...His last win against the Braves came on August 17, 2022 at Truist Park, during which he threw 6.1 innings, allowing four earned runs on three hits and three walks while striking out eight...Scherzer has tallied 217 strikeouts against Braves batters in his career, the second-most of any team he has faced, behind the Phillies (239).

TURNING THINGS AROUND: After pitching to a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) in his first five starts this season, Scherzer has picked up three straight wins in his last four starts (since May 14 at the Nationals) with a 1.08 ERA (3 ER/25.0 IP)...In that time frame, he has tallied 28 strikeouts compared to four walks, holding opponents to a .182 average and pitching to a 0.80 WHIP.

FINE NINE: Scherzer whiffed nine batters for the first time this season in his last start...The last time he struck out nine or more batters was September 19, 2022...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his first eight starts of the season and dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 12 punchouts separating the two...With 130 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field...Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)...Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

ALWAYS IMPROVING: Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JUSTIN VERLANDER (2-3, 4.25)

'TILL I COLLAPSE: In his last start, June 2 vs. Toronto, Verlander threw 117 pitches, the most by a starting pitcher this season...It was the highest pitch count Verlander reached since throwing 120 pitches in his third career no-hitter on September 1, 2019 at Toronto.

ADD ANOTHER ONE TO THE LIST: Verlander will make his first career start at Truist Park, marking the 34th venue Verlander has started in...Verlander joins Zack Greinke, Johnny Cueto, Rich Hill, Gerrit Cole, Charlie Morton, Jordan Lyles and Robbie Ray as the only other active pitchers to have made at least one start in 34 or more ballparks...Verlander's first three career starts against the Braves all came at Turner Field...Courtesy of Elias.
