METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets earned their second straight victory with a 6-5, 10-inning win over the Guardians last night...The Mets have won back-to-back games after dropping three straight...New York improved to 3-57 when trailing after eight innings this season...New York is now 9-7 in extra-inning games this year...The Mets earned their 13th series victory of the season and their fifth on the road...The Mets are in the midst of a nine-game road trip (2-0) against the Guardians (2-0), Pirates (three games) and Braves (three games).

HOW SWEEP IT WOULD BE: The Mets are seeking their third sweep of the season...The Mets swept the Tigers (May 12-14) and the Marlins (May 29-31)...New York is seeking their first sweep on the road this year...The Mets last swept the Guardians from May 19-21 (doubleheader on the 21st), 2023... They last swept the Guardians in Cleveland from June 15-17, 2010.

ROLLIN' NOLAN: Nolan McLean has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last eight starts...He is the first Met with as many consecutive starts since Sean Manaea made eight straight starts of at least 6.0 innings from August 16-September 21, 2024.... Over his last 11 starts, dating back to May 31, he has pitched to a 2.24 ERA (16 ER/64.1 IP) with 73 strikeouts...Ranks fourth in the NL in ERA and strikeouts during that span (min. 50.0 IP).

RECORD BOOKS: Through 30 career starts, McLean is 12-8 with a 2.95 ERA (57 ER/173.2 IP) and 205 strikeouts...His 205 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 30 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 267, Matt Harvey's 227, Noah Syndergaard's 215 and Kodai Senga's 211...Per *Elias*...He is one of six pitchers in Major League history to strike out 205+ batters and allow 57 or fewer earned runs through their first 30 appearances (also: Matt Harvey, Jacob Misorowski, Paul Skenes, Stephen Strasburg and Kodai Senga).

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.74 ERA (200 ER/480.2 IP) with 174 walks and 475 strikeouts...Their 3.74 ERA is seventh in the majors and fourth in the National League...Their 475 strikeouts are the fourth-most in the majors.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Yesterday, LHP Jefry Yan made his major league debut...He became the seventh player to make their debut this year joining OF Carson Benge, OF A.J. Ewing, LHP Nate Lavender, OF Nick Morabito, and RHP Matt Seelinger, LHP Zac Thornton...The Mets had nine players make their Major League debut in 2025.

HIGH FIVE: The Mets defeated the Guardians, 6-5, yesterday in Cleveland... New York has posted a 34-5 record when scoring five or more runs in a game...Their .872 winning percentage is the fifth-best mark in the majors and the third-best in the NL...Their 39 games scoring five or more runs are the fewest in MLB.

GUARDIANS-METS NOTES: On Tuesday, the Mets snapped a six-game losing streak against Cleveland...The streak dated back to May 20, 2024...This comes after they won seven straight against the Guardians from April 17, 2016-May 21, 2023.

DOWN ON THE FARM: R.J. Gordon recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts over 6.0 innings to lead the Binghamton Rumble Ponies (13-22) to their third consecutive victory, as they defeated the Hartford Yard Goats (15-20), 3-1, on Wednesday night at Mirabito Stadium...Gordon struck out 10 batters over 6.0 innings and surrendered just one run across three hits...He has struck out 24 batters over his last three starts that have spanned 16.1 innings...He was selected in the 13th round of the First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets are 15-14 against the American League this year, posting a 3.80 ERA, while batting .231/.299/.392...All-time, the Mets are 317-314 in Interleague Play.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are in the midst of a nine-game road trip... They are 24-32 away from Citi Field this season...They have posted a 4.04 ERA, while batting .232/.297/.386 on the road this year.

BLAME IT ON THE BENGE: Carson Benge socked his 13th home run of the season in the sixth inning last night to put the Mets ahead, 4-3...It was the second time in his career he's homered in consecutive games (also: 6/20-21/26)...Was his fourth career go-ahead home run (last: 7/6 at ATL)... He is batting .284 (29-102) with 14 runs, five doubles, four homers, 11 RBI, 10 walks, six steals with a .351 OBP, a .451 SLG and an .802 OPS in 27 games since July 1...His 109 hits are tied for the third-most by a rookie this year and are tied for the second-most in the National League.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets swept a doubleheader against the Cubs at Wrigley Field...The team was in the midst of five straight games against the Cubs...The Mets won 7-6 in 12-innings in game one and then 7-6 in regulation in game two...The Mets were held to five hits including two from Kevin Mitchell...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title today.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 14-19 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 6.1 innings and allowed two runs while striking out six on July 30 vs. Miami (6.1 IP, 6 H, 2 ER, 2 BB, 6 K, 2 HR)...Has completed six innings and allowed two or fewer earned runs in each of his last six games...It is the longest streak of his career and is the longest such streak by a Met since Kodai Senga had six straight such starts from August 19-September 20, 2023.

ROLLIN' NOLAN: Has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last eight starts...He is the first Met with as many consecutive starts since Sean Manaea made eight straight starts of at least 6.0 innings from August 16-September 21, 2024.... Over his last 11 starts, dating back to May 31, he has pitched to a 2.24 ERA (16 ER/64.1 IP) with 73 strikeouts...Ranks fourth in the NL in ERA and strikeouts during that span (min. 50.0 IP).

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, he is 7-7 with a 3.29 ERA (46 ER/125.2 IP) with 148 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .209 batting average (96-459)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he ranks fourth in opposing batting average, fifth in strikeouts and 10th in WHIP (1.12)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in strikeouts, third in batting average against and in innings pitched, fifth in WHIP, and sixth in ERA.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 30 career starts, McLean is 12-8 with a 2.95 ERA (57 ER/173.2 IP) and 205 strikeouts...His 205 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 30 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 267, Matt Harvey's 227, Noah Syndergaard's 215 and Kodai Senga's 211...Per *Elias*....He is one of six pitchers in Major League history to strike out 205+ batters and allow 57 or fewer earned runs through their first 30 appearances (also: Matt Harvey, Jacob Misorowski, Paul Skenes, Stephen Strasburg and Kodai Senga).

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 14.5% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,358 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 40.4% whiff rate on his curveball, which is the sixth-highest mark on a qualified curveball this season...Batters are hitting just .113 (9-80) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors among qualifiers...Over his first 30 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .103 (11-107) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 45.2% whiff rate on the pitch.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 32.8% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 21-run value, which is the third-highest run value on any pitch in the majors this season and is the highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .176 (33-188) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

KEEPIN IT 200: Recorded his 200th career strikeout with a punchout of Heriberto Hernández to end the first on July 30 vs. Miami...Joins Dwight Gooden, Matt Harvey, Noah Syndergaard and Kodai Senga as the only pitchers in franchise history to reach the 200-career strikeout mark in 30 games or fewer.

AL WHO?: Is set to make his first career start against Cleveland and his ninth career Interleague start...In his first eight career starts against the American League, he is 4-1 with a 2.11 ERA (11 ER/47.0 IP) and 59 strikeouts...He has a K/9 of 11.30 against AL opponents.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...*Per Elias*...When he was perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.
