SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won, 7-4, last night @ Brewers.

- ◆ Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (2-for-3, HR, RBI, BB), in his first game back in 19 days, collected 2 hits, including his 18th homer...is 2 homers shy of his fourth 20-homer season, and would become the fifth primary left fielder to reach 4+ 20-homer seasons since 2018 (also: Teoscar Hernández/LAD-6, Yordan Alvarez/HOU-5, Randy Arozarena/SEA-4 and Bryan Reynolds/
- ◆ Ketel Marte (3-for-4, 2B, HR, 2 RBI, BB) hit his career-best 33rd home run (previous: 32 in 2019, when he finished fourth in NL MVP voting)...it was also his second 3-hit performance in his last 9 games (also: Sept. 11 vs. Rangers).
- ◆ Zac Gallen (W; 4 ER in 5.0 IP, 5 K) recorded his 13th win...has 3 straight seasons of 12+ wins (2022-24)...is 1 of 4 starting pitchers to record 3 consecutive seasons of 12+ wins since 2022 (also: Kevin Gausman/TOR), Zack Wheeler/PHI and Framber Valdez/HOU).

IN THE STANDINGS: The D-backs are in third place in the NL West, trailing the Dodgers by 6.0 games and the Padres by 2.0 games...currently hold the second spot in the NL Wild Card, 2.0 games behind the Padres (1st WC), and 1.0 game up on the Mets (3rd in WC) [own tiebreaker] and 3.0 games over the Braves (4th in WC).

86 WINS & COUNTING: The D-backs' 86 wins surpass their total from last year (84-78) with 8 games to go...the D-backs have reached 86+ wins in a season for the first time since 2017 (93 wins) and seventh occurrence all-time.

STARTERS GOING 5.0+: The D-backs' 71 wins when starting pitchers toss 5.0+ innings are fourth most in the NL, behind the Phillies (83), Mets (75) and Braves (75).

DINGER SEASON: The D-back' reached 200+ homers in a season for the first time since 2019 (220)...they are fifth most in a single season in franchise history, behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR), 1999 (216 HR) and 2001 (208 HR)...their 200 homers this season are fifth most in the Majors, behind the Orioles (224), Yankees (223), Dodgers (220) and Braves (201).

20+-HOMER SEASONS: The D-backs' 5 players (Corbin Carroll, Ketel Marte, Joc Pederson, Eugenio Suárez, Christian Walker) with 20+ RBI this season are the most in MLB and tied for the most in franchise history (also: 2005 - Tony Clark, Troy Glaus, Luis Gonzalez, Shawn Green, Chad

70+ RBI SEASONS: The D-backs' 5 players (Corbin Carroll, Lourdes Gurriel Jr., Ketel Marte, Eugenio Suárez, Christian Walker) with 70+ RBI this season are tied for the most in MLB (also: Dodgers - Mookie Betts, Freddie Freeman, Teoscar Hernández, Shohei Ohtani, Will Smith) and tied for the most in franchise history with:

2006 - Eric Byrnes, Johnny Estrada, Luis Gonzalez, Conor Jackson, Chad Tracy 2005 - Tony Clark, Troy Glaus, Luis Gonzalez, Shawn Green, Chad Tracy

DOUBLE-DIGIT SEPTEMBER OFFENSE: The D-backs' 11 occurrences with 10+ hits in September (8-3 in those games) are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Cubs (10, 7-3), Mariners (9, 8-1) and Astros (8, 6-2).

PAVIN THE WAY: Since Sept. 8, Pavin Smith's .914 SLG and 1.403 OPS lead the Majors while his 10 extra-base hits and 15 RBI are second and third, respectively.

♦ Smith is riding a 7-game hitting streak at a .417 clip (10-for-24)/1.267 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 homer, 5 RBI and 5 walks...his 7-game streak is tied for his career second longest (also: June 21-28, 2021).

CORBIN 1 SHY OF 20+ HR / 30+ SB: Corbin Carroll is 1 stolen base shy of becoming the first D-back ever to record consecutive seasons with 20+ homers and 30+ stolen bases...since 2012, only 2 players since 2012 have accomplished consecutive seasons of the feat in their age 23 season or younger (Bobby Witt Jr./2022-23 and Mike Trout/2012-13).

MARTE SECOND TO NONE: Ketel Marte leads all second basemen [min. 100 G] in OPS (.922), OBP (.368), SLG (.554), homers (33), RBI (90), XBH (57) and bWAR (6.1).

STRIKEOUT & WALK RATE: The D-backs' 20.1 pct. strikeout rate is fourth lowest in the Majors [behind the Padres (17.5), Royals (19.0) and Astros (19.3)], while their 9.0 pct. walk rate is fifth highest [behind the Yankees (10.6), Brewers (9.7), Dodgers (9.5) and Mariners (9.5)].

HUCKIN' PUK: Since Aug. 3, A.J. Puk is 1 of 2 relievers to go scoreless [min. 20.0 IP]...owns a current career-best 22 straight scoreless games (20.2 IP) with 8 hits and 3 walks allowed and 34 strikeouts.

◆ Puk is 1 of 4 D-back relievers all-time to reach 22+ consecutive scoreless appearances...the franchise record for consecutive scoreless appearances by a reliever is 26 by Yoshihisa Hirano (May 6-July 3, 2018, 22.2 IP)...the franchise record for consecutive scoreless innings pitched by a reliever is 25.0 IP by Brandon Lyon (April 9-June 12, 2008, 24 appearances).

MLB'S BEST SINCE JULY 1: Since July 1, Arizona leads MLB with an .848 OPS, .356 OBP .492 SLG, 453 runs and 6.47 R/G.

♦ The D-backs' 45 wins (45-25, .643; 20-12 home, 25-13 road) are tied for the most in MLB with the Mets (45), ahead of the Astros (42), Tigers (42) and Padres (42).

RUNS PER GAME: The D-backs' 5.50 runs per game lead the Majors, ahead of the Dodgers (5.16) and Yankees (4.97), and rank second in club history (5.60 R/G in 1999) [the last Arizona team to have 5.00+ R/G was in 2019 (5.02)].

- ♦ Since Aug. 1, the D-backs' 30 games with 5+ runs (24-6 record) are the most in MLB, ahead of the Dodgers (26, 23-3) and Cubs (26, 22-4).
- ♦ The D-backs 847 runs this season are second in franchise history, behind 1999 (908 runs) - a difference of 61 runs.

NEXT STARTER: LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (8-7, 6.23)

- ♦In 5 career starts vs. Brewers (2 quality), is 2-2 with a 2.93 ERA (9 ER in 27.2 IP), 6 walks and 34 strikeouts.
- ♦Won his last start @ Brewers on April 8, 2023 while with the Cardinals (W; 0 ER in 7.0 IP, 3 H, 9 K).

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Sixth season with the D-backs...is currently the longest | FIRST PITCH STRIKES: His 62.3 pct. first-pitch strike rate is currently the tenured D-backs starting pitcher on the staff.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is making his eighth start since being reinstated from the 60-day injured list (strained right shoulder) on Aug. 11 and fifth on the road.

- Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 12 of his last 17 starts (5 of last 8 on the road) dating back to Sept. 4, 2023, going 6-2 with a 3.71 ERA (41 ER in 99.1 IP), opponent .227 AVG (83-for-365) and 89 strikeouts.
- 8 of his 11 starts this season have ended in 2-or-fewer run margins, including his last 5 of his last 6 (2-6 team record in those starts).
- Over his last 3 starts, has exited the game either tied or in the lead (team is 1-2 in those bids).
- Has allowed 6 or fewer hits in 8 of his 11 starts.

LAST START: Allowed a season-low 2 hits on Sept. 16 @ Rockies (ND: 1 ER in 6.0 IP, 5 K)...was his fourth consecutive decisionless start.

VS. BREWERS: In his last 5 starts (all quality), is 3-1 with a 1.64 ERA (6 ER in 33.0 IP), opponent .157 AVG (17-for-108, 1 HR), 0.76 WHIP, 8 walks and 33 strikeouts...the D-backs are 4-1 over those 5 starts.

- Earned the win in his last start @ Brewers on June 19, 2023 (1 ER in 7.0 IP, 3 H, 1 BB, 7 K) in the D-backs 9-1 victory.
- Has tossed 6.0+ innings with 3 or fewer runs allowed in 6 of his 8 career starts.

5.0+-INNING STREAK: His 38 consecutive starts of 5.0+ innings from April 6-Sept. 5 marked the second longest streak in the Majors since 2022, behind only Mitch Keller (49 straight starts from April 5, 2023-July 8,

VS. NL CENTRAL: In his last 7 starts vs. NL Central opponents, has tossed 4 quality bids, going 3-0 with a 1.51 ERA (7 ER in 41.2 IP) with 42 strikeouts.

• In each start, has tossed 5.0+ innings with 2 or fewer runs allowed and 5 or fewer hits.

MILESTONE TRACKER: His 730 career strikeouts rank seventh on the franchise's all-time strikeouts list, behind Randy Johnson (2,077), Brandon Webb (1,065), Robbie Ray (998), Patrick Corbin (897), Curt Schilling (875) and Zac Gallen (824).

· His 52 wins are tied for sixth place with lan Kennedy on the franchise's wins list, behind Johnson (118), Webb (87), Schilling (58), Corbin (56) and Zack Greinke (55).

JUST LOOKING: Since Aug. 11, his 9.63 strikes looking above average (SLAA) is third among NL starters, behind Blake Snell/SF (20.32) and Sean Manaea/NYM (11.09), while his 110.5 pct. strikes looking rate vs. Average (SL+) is second, behind Snell (121.2%).

RISPY BUSINESS: Has held opponents to 2 or fewer runs with runners in scoring position in 8 of his 11 starts (.204 AVG; 10-for-49/.627 OPS).

LIMITING LEFTIES: Is limiting lefties to a .218 AVG (26-for-119) with 19 strikeouts...has held lefties to 5 or fewer hits in 10 of his 11 starts.

HARD HITS & FREE PASSES: His opponent 40.4 hard hit pct. is the lowest

since 2022 (36.5%) while his 7.0 walk pct. is the lowest since 2021 (6.1 pct).

2023 RECAP: Went 12-8 with a 3.29 ERA (65 ER in 177.2 IP) in his fifth season with Arizona.

- Set a career high with 187 strikeouts (previous: 177 in 2022).
- Recorded his 500th career strikeout on April 6 vs. Dodgers.
- Made his 100th career start with the D-backs on April 11 and finished the season with 127 starts, the sixth-most starts in franchise history.
- Tied a career high in strikeouts with 12 on Sept. 4 vs. Rockies (2x; last: 8/24/23 vs. CIN)...marked the second time in 2023 striking out 11+ batters vs. Rockies (also: 11 on Aug. 14 @ Coors Field).

2023 ROAD RECAP: In 15 road starts in 2023, went 7-3 with a 4.07 ERA (38 ER in 84.0 IP), 81 strikeouts and 33 walks.

• In his first 7 road starts last season, went 6-0 with a 1.98 ERA (9 ER in 41.0 IP), 1.02 WHIP, opponent .211 AVG (31-for-147)/.269 OBP and 37 strikeouts.

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: In Game 2 of the World Series @ Rangers, became the fourth D-backs pitcher (5 times overall) to allow 1 run or fewer over 7.0+ innings in a World Series start (also: Randy Johnson, Curt Schilling [2x] and Miguel Batista...additionally, his 9 strikeouts tied Schilling for second-most strikeouts in a World Series game by a D-backs starter behind Johnson's 11 strikeouts.

 Also in Game 2 of the World Series, retired the first 11 batters faced, surpassing the record for most consecutive batters retired by a D-backs pitcher to start a World Series game (previous: 10 by Randy Johnson on Oct. 28, 2001 in Game 2 vs. Yankees) [source: Elias Sports Bureaul.

USA! USA!: Selected to pitch for Team USA in the 2023 World Baseball Classic, marking the first time participating with a national team at anv level.

- Went 0-1 with an 8.31 ERA (4 ER in 4.1 IP) over 2 games.
- Started the fourth game vs. Colombia and championship vs. Japan.

ARIZONA NATIVE: Grew up in Scottsdale, Ariz., and attended Desert Mountain High School, Yavapai College and Arizona State University...attended Arizona State University (2010) and helped the Sun Devils reach the College World Series in 2010...went to Yavapai College in Prescott, Ariz. (2008-09) and went 15-1 in 2 seasons.

INTERNATIONAL STINT: Played 4 seasons (2015-18) with the SK Wyverns in the KBO League.

- ♦ Recalled from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 12 (second stint with Arizona).
- ♦ Had his first relief game on Sept. 14 vs. Brewers (2 ER in 4.0 IP, 2 K).
- ♦In 4 career starts (2 quality), is 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (9 ER in 20.0 IP), 4 walks and 7 strikeouts.
- ♦ At age 23-324, became the fifth youngest D-back starting pitcher to toss 6.0+ innings in their debut, behind Tyler Skaggs (21-040, 2012), Archie Bradley (22-244, 2015), Bryan Augenstein (22-306, 2009) and Enrique González (23-318, 2006).
- ♦Became the 10th D-back starting pitcher all-time to record a quality start in his MLB debut (last: Drey Jameson, Sept. 15, 2022 vs. Padres...his 83 pitches marked the fewest thrown among D-back starters all-time who threw at most 6.0 innings in a debut (previous low: John Patterson, 85 on July 20, 2002 @ Padres).
- ♦Limiting lefties to a .231 AVG (9-for-39) with 8 strikeouts.
- ◆Earned his first Major League win in his second career start on July 13 vs. Blue Jays (1 ER in 6.0 IP).
- ♦At the age of 17, he drew interest from Major League teams after converting from a position player to a pitcher...but at age 18, he was unable to sign due to a wrist injury from basketball, so he quit baseball...he moved out of Venezuela looking for a better life, going to to Ecuador, Colombia and Peru where he sold energy drinks and strawberries with whipped cream at traffic lights and cleaned windshields.
- ♦ Was a try out player in the Dominican Republic in 2020...in March 2020, the country and the airports closed and was 1 of 14 Venezuelan players who could not return to their country...12 were already signed but Yilber and one more remained at try-outs.
- ♦Spent 8 months training, focused on gaining weight, eating well with a focus to be signed...in October 2020, Venezuela finally opened the border and he returned home.
- ♦On February 5, 2021, at 20 years old, he signed his contract.
