METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Pirates, 5-1, on Saturday...Today, the Mets finish their six-game road trip (1-4) to Atlanta (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-1)...The Mets are 3-3 in rubber games...New York is seeking their ninth series victory of the season and their fourth on the road...Following this series, the Mets are off on Monday before the start of a six-day, five-game homestand against the Yankees (two games) and Cardinals (three games).

AW SNAP: New York snapped their season-long losing streak at seven games yesterday...It was their longest losing streak since they dropped seven straight was in 2019, from June 23-29.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets stole two bases yesterday...As a team, the Mets have stole 20 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with an 88.5% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 18 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 332 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco is set to make his eighth start of the season today...He is 2-2 with a 5.94 ERA (24 ER/36.1 IP)...Over his last three starts, Carrasco is 2-0 with a 3.06 ERA (6 ER/17.2 IP) with five walks and 12 strikeouts...Today will mark his fifth career start against Pirates...In his previous four starts, Carrasco is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (7 ER/22.2 IP) with nine walks and 28 punchouts.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with a 1.91 ERA (6 ER/28.1 IP) in 25 appearances this season... He has walked seven, while striking out 37...He ranks tied for 10th in the NL in ERA among relievers and is tied for 12th with 37 punchouts.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham is on a four-game hitting streak, batting .333 (5-15) with four runs, three doubles, one home run, one walk, six RBI with a .353 OBP, a .733 SLG and a 1.086 OPS in that span...Over his last 15 games, Pham is batting .341 (14-41) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 13 RBI with a .404 OBP and a .732 SLG.

TAKE IT TO THE BANK: The Mets play at PNC Park for the first time this year...New York went 2-1 at the yard in 2022... Eduardo Escobar has hit .500 (23-46) with 11 runs, five doubles, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI and four walks in 13 career games a the ballpark...He has safely hit in 10 of his 13 games in Pittsburgh...Omar Narváez has hit .351 (26-74) with 14 runs, four doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI with 11 walks and a .435 OBP and a.527 SLG in 24 games in Pittsburgh.

A STARLING IS BORN: Over his last 30 games, Starling Marte is batting .305 (32-105) with 15 runs, one double, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, three walks with a .342 OBP...He has safely reached base in 11 of his last 13 games...He has safely hit in seven of his last eight games...Marte has played 479 career games at the ballpark and is a .290/.348/.445 career hitter with 46 home runs and 204 RBI.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 32-37 in the history of PNC Park...The Mets took the series in Pittsburgh, 2-1, from September 6-7, 2022.

HIP, HIP, HOME RUN: The Mets have homered in six straight games, blasting 13 home runs in that...The Mets have homered in 21 of their last 23 games, socking 37 bombs in that span... The Mets rank fifth in the National League with 78 blasts this season.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo is batting .336 (50-149) with 21 runs, eight doubles, three triples, three home runs, 22 RBI, 21 walks with a .417 OBP and .490 SLG in 38 games on the road this season...His .336 road average ranks fifth in the majors...Nimmo owns a career .399 OBP on the road...That is the fourth-highest mark in the majors since the Wyoming native entered the league in 2016.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York has played 38 games on the road this year, the most in the majors...New York is 16-22 with a 5.22 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 313 strikeouts on the road are the second-most in the majors.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Francisco Alvarez as hit 12 home runs this season...That is the third-most by a rookie in the majors and the second-most in the National League...10 of his home runs have come as a catcher...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season... Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's 13 career homers (one last year) before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

COME AT THE KING, BEST NOT MISS: Omar Narváez has reached base safely in seven of his eighth games this season, batting .273 (6-22) with three runs, two RBI and two walks.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 49-14 in the first inning this year.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 18-6 (.750) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-28 (.317) when their opponent scores first.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 17-1 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are still 7-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets are hitting .245 (122-497) with runners in scoring position, ranking 11th in the NL and 21st in the majors this year...Last season, New York batted .269 (371-1,378), good for third in the NL and fourth in the majors.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: With the expected large crowd at Citi Field for the Subway Series, the Mets encourage fans to take the train to the game.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 5.0+ innings against the Braves at Truist Park...Allowed four earned runs on six hits and two walks...Fanned four batters in a 6-4 Mets

ON A TREASURE HUNT: Carrasco will face Pittsburgh for the fifth time in his career and for just the second time at PNC Park...In his last start against the Pirates on September 15, 2022, he earned the win after allowing one earned run in 6.0 innings on four hits and two walks while striking out 11 batters at Citi Field... Throughout his career against the Pirates, Carrasco has pitched to a 2.78 ERA (7 ER/22.2 IP) and holds a 2-0 record, with both wins coming when pitching at home...Has a 1.96 ERA (4 ER/18.1 IP) when facing Pittsburgh at home compared to a $6.23\ ERA\ (3\ ER/4.1\ IP)$ at PNC Park....Has held Pittsburgh batters to a .193average throughout his career.

COOKIE'S COMEBACK: In his starts on May 25 and May 31 against Chicago-NL and Philadelphia, respectively, Carrasco allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) in his first full season with the Mets...Ended the season ranked tied fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 11th in win percentage with .628...According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Locked it down in July with a 0.90 ERA (3 ER/30.0 IP) in five starts that month, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts...The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

MILESTONES & MORE: At this point in the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1484.1...ls also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 290 and 243, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelanborn pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.
