METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets earned a 4-3 victory over the Nationals on Thursday to complete a three-game sweep...New York has won six straight, seven of their last eight, 11 of their last 13 and 15 of their last 18...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (3-0) against the Nationals (3-0) and Rays (three games)... Following this series the Mets are off on Monday before hitting the road for a sixgame trip to Atlanta (three games) and Philadelphia (three games).

PRIDE NIGHT: The New York Mets will host their ninth annual Pride Night at Citi Field tonight...The first 15,000 fans in attendance will receive an exclusive Pride tank top...Pride Night at Citi Field is a celebration of the many LGBTQ+ New Yorkers and Mets fans from around the world, as well as allies of the community. The Mets will host a free pre-game Pride Party at the K Korner...In addition, the Mets will honor Billy Bean with a tribute video pregame for his life's dedication of making baseball a more inclusive sport...Jeremiah Brent, will throw out the first pitch, while National Anthem will be performed by actor and singer Alex Newell $\,$

FRIDAY THE 13TH: The Mets are the only team in the majors to have four players with 13 or more home runs this season (Alonso, Nimmo, Lindor, Soto)...It is the first time in franchise history that the club has had four different players record as many home runs through as many games.

I WOULD WALK .500 MILES: The Mets are a season-high 21 games above .500...ln 2024, the team reached a high-water mark of 18 games above .500 on Sunday, September 22...The last time the Mets were 21 or more games above .500 was when they were 101-61 at the end of the 2022 season.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets are on a six-game winning streak...The team is batting .288/.369/.557 in that span while posting a 2.29 ERA...They have outscored their opponents 39-15 in the streak...Their longest winning streak this year is seven games (4/17-4/23)...It is the third time this season the Mets have won six or more straight games.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 27-7 through their first 34 home games this season, which marks their best start at home in franchise history...Is tied for the ninthbest home start of a season in Major League history... It is the best home start to a season in the majors since Tampa Bay went 28-6 at home in 2023...Their 2.51ERA at home is the best in the NL...Their .794 home winning percentage is the best in the majors...The Mets have won six straight at Citi Field and 10 of their last 11.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has safely reached base in 20 straight games... The 20-game on-base streak is now the second-longest streak of his career...His career-best is a 36 games streak (8/2-9/9/19)...He is batting .308 (24-78) in that span with five doubles, eight homers, 26 RBI, six walks, a .389 OBP and a .679 SLG in that span...Alonso has collected 63 RBI in 69 games this season...That is the most in the major leagues...He recorded 88 RBI in 162 contests last year...He is tied with himself (2022) for the most RBI in franchise history through the team's first 69 games.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over his last 15 games dating back to May 26, Brandon Nimmo has a .323/.391/.613 (20-62) slash line with five home runs, three doubles. 10 RBI and 14 runs...In 12 games batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .381 (16-42) with 12 runs, three doubles, four home runs, eight RBI, five walks with a 1.196

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: This year marked the first time in franchise history that the Mets opened their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 11-10 in Interleague Play this season...The team went 24-22 in Interleague Play last year...Overall, New York owns a 289-286 record in Interleague play.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in each of his last 14 games...He is batting .354 (17-48) with 16 runs, four doubles, five homers, 10 RBI, 15 walks with a .516 OBP and a .750 SLG...Soto has recorded a major league leading 56 walks...His 56 walks through the team's first 69 games are tied with John Olerud (199) the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the singleseason franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024)...The lefty is a perfect 8-8 in stolen base attempts this season...Has surpassed his total from last season (157 games).

LUCKY LINDOR: The Mets have won the last 27 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history... Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...Carl Furillo (29, 1951-53) holds the record...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers... Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 86.6 (58-67) stolen base percentage this season which is the best in the majors...Their 58 stolen bases are the most through their first 69 games of a season since 2011 (66)...The Mets are one of seven teams in the majors to have four players with eight or more stolen bases this season (Lindor, Soto, Acuña, Taylor)...Mets catchers have caught 38.3% potential base stealers this year, the second-best mark in the majors.

HAPPY JEFF: Over Jeff McNeil's last 20 games dating back to May 18, he has a .299/.385/.612 (20-67) slash line with five home runs, four doubles, one triple and 15 RBI...He has four home runs in his last five games...Yesterday marked the fifth time in his career with four home runs over a five-game span (last: 7/19-23/24)... He has reached base safely in his last 15 games dating back to May 25, the fourthlongest such streak of his career...In addition, h has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games including each of his last six.

LAST TIME OUT: Picked up his seventh win of the season on June 7 at Colorado...Over 6.0 innings of work, allowed one run on nine hits and struck out six batters...His nine hits allowed were a season and career high...Did not issue a walk for the second straight start.

WHAT UP HOLMES?: Holmes is one of five pitchers in franchise history to win seven or more games and strike out 60 or more batters, while sporting a sub-3.00 ERA in their first 13 games with the franchise...The others are Pedro Astacio, Al Leiter, Pedro Martínez and Steven Matz.

THE GAME OF RISP: This season, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .120 (6-50) average with runners in scoring position, tied for the third-best mark in the majors (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Out of the six hits Holmes has allowed this season with runners in scoring position, only one has gone for extra bases, tied for the third-fewest in the majors (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP).

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 64.9% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 66.7% clip and Andre Pallante's 65.8% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season).

TAKING DOWN TAMPA BAY: In 19 career games against the Tampa Bay Rays, Holmes has pitched to a 0.93 ERA (2 ER/19.1 IP) with 28 strikeouts to only five walks...His 19 career games against the Rays are his fourth most against any opponent for his career trailing only Baltimore (22), Boston (21) and Toronto (21), while his 28 strikeouts against Tampa Bay are his third most against any opponent...Among the 16 opposing teams Holmes has faced 10 or more times in his career, his 0.93 ERA against Tampa Bay is his second-best mark against any team trailing only Atlanta (0.82)...His 13.03 SO/9 rate against Tampa Bay is also his second-best mark against any opponent trailing his 13.15 SO/9 rate against Detroit (min. 10 games).

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last five starts, Holmes has allowed eight home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes has allowed two home runs in three of his last five starts after he never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career game.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established a career-high 73.1 innings pitched...Holmes is also one win shy of matching his career high (8, 2021) and 13 strikeouts from matching his career high (78, 2021)...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 7-5 with a 3.94 ERA (36 ER/82.1 IP) in 16 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

CLAYMATION: Holmes became the seventh Mets pitcher to make their team debut as the club's Opening Day starter...The others are Roger Craig (4/11/62 at STL), Don Cardwell (4/11/67 vs. PIT), Mike Hampton (3/29/00 vs. CHC), Tom Glavine (3/31/03 vs. CHC), Pedro Martínez (4/4/05 at CIN) and Johan Santana (3/31/08 at FLA)...Courtesy of *Elias...*Additionally, Holmes celebrated his 32nd birthday on Opening Day...He became the seventh pitcher in major league history to start Opening Day on their birthday joining Vic Willis (4/12/1906 PIT at STL), Marty Pattin (4/6/1971 MIL at MIN), Bert Blyleven (4/6/73 MIN at OAK and 4/6/79 PIT vs. MTL), Catfish Hunter (4/8/76 NYY at MIL), Jon Lieber (4/2/01 CHC vs. MTL) and Ryan Drese (4/5/05 TEX at LAA)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19,

marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000)

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazeroski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazeroski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
