**RAINOUT RUNDOWN:** For a second straight day, the Tigers game against the Mets was postponed due to inclement weather. The two teams will play a traditional doubleheader today with the first game starting at 12:10 p.m. and the second game starting approximately 30 minutes after the conclusion of the first game.

**LET'S PLAY TWO:** The Tigers will play their first doubleheader of the season today in New York. Detroit played six twin bills last season, which was tied with the Mets for the most in the big leagues. Detroit swept a doubleheader from Cleveland on April 18, split a twin bill with Baltimore on April 29, won both contests against New York (NL) on May 3, lost both games to Atlanta on June 14 and to Los Angeles (AL) on July 27 and split a doubleheader at Cleveland on August 18.

**CARSON CRUSH:** Carson Kelly delivered the big blow in Monday's victory, hitting a three-run shot in the 10th inning to put the Tigers in front 5-0. It marked Kelly's third career extra-inning home run (last, April 22, 2021 at Cincinnati). Kelly has gotten off to a strong start at the plate this season, going 4x9 with a homer and five RBI in three games.

**WHAT A RELIEF:** The Tigers bullpen combined for 4.1 scoreless innings on Monday, allowing two hits with one walk and five strikeouts. Through the first four games this season, Detroit relievers have given up just one run on six hits with 19 strikeouts in 17.0 innings. Entering today's doubleheader, the Tigers bullpen leads the Majors with a 0.53 ERA, 0.65 WHIP and .109 opponent batting average.

**EASY BEING GREENE:** Riley Greene showed his defensive versatility in Monday's game, playing all three outfield defensive positions. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first Tigers player to see time at all three outfield positions in the same game since Andrew Romine played all nine defensive spots on September 30, 2017 at Minnesota.

**NOTES ON THE 4-0 START:** Detroit is 4-0 to start a season for the first time since 2016...The Tigers are the last remaining unbeaten team in the big leagues...The Tigers have opened the season with four consecutive road victories for the first time since 2006.

**TIGERS AND METS:** The Tigers and Mets conclude their only series of the season today with a doubleheader. The two teams met last year at Comerica Park with Detroit sweeping a three-game series. The Tigers have a 17-11 advantage in the all-time series against the Mets, including a 6-4 edge at Citi Field.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** The Tigers continue their interleague schedule today against the

Mets. Detroit went 21-25 against the National League last season. The Tigers have finished with a winning record in interleague play in three of the last four seasons.

**ON DECK:** The Tigers return to Comerica Park for their home opener tomorrow against Oakland. Detroit went 3-4 vs. the Athletics last season, including dropping two-of-three games at Comerica Park. The Tigers have lost the season series to Oakland in each of the last seven seasons in which the two teams have played.

- Fans are encouraged to arrive early with gates opening at 10:30 a.m. The Miller Lite Home Run Happy Hour, located on the Comerica Landing, will take place from 10:30-11:30 a.m. and feature select concession items for just \$5, including 16 oz. beers, fountain drinks, hard seltzers and snacks.

- Grace West, a Canton, MI native who earned a spot in the finale of NBC's "The Voice" in 2023, will perform the National Anthem. West's performance will be followed by a flyover featuring an A-10 Thunderbolt II "Warthog" aircraft from the 107th Fighter Squadron, and part of the 127th Wing at Selfridge Air National Guard Base.

- Detroit Lions offensive tackle Penei Sewell will throw out the ceremonial first pitch.

- The 2024 Tigers Opening Day Tailgate Party, hosted by Miller Lite and Bally Sports Detroit, will be hosted at Grand Circus Park from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Fans can enjoy beer, DJ's, food trucks, photo opportunities, giveaways, baseball-themed games and activities and a live stream of the Tigers game.

- Mize will make his season debut in the first game of today's doubleheader at New York (NL)...will mark his first appearance in a Major League regular season game since April 14, 2022 at Kansas City after missing the entire 2023 season while rehabbing from Tommy John surgery.

- Pitched in six games, including five as a starter, during Spring Training and had a 3-1 record with a 2.21 ERA (20.1IP/5ER) and 20 strikeouts... posted a 1.03 WHIP and limited the opposition to a .169 batting average.

- Will be facing the Mets for the first time in his career tonight.

- Completed his first full Major League season in 2021, starting 30 games and compiling a 7-9 record with a 3.71 ERA (150.1IP/62ER) and 118 strikeouts...his 3.71 ERA was the fifth lowest among Tigers rookies since 1947 and the lowest since Michael Fulmer had a 3.06 ERA (159.0IP/54ER) in 2016.

- Led all rookies with 12 quality starts, while he ranked eighth among American League pitchers (min. 140.0 innings pitched) with a 1.14 WHIP.
