BACK TO THE STATES—The Rays lost 7-6 to the Red Sox on Sunday...the Rays went 0-2 in their weekend series in the Dominican Republic...five different Rays recorded multiple hits in the defeat...RF Richie Palacios (2-for-4, HR, 2RBI) launched his second home run of spring...2B Curtis Mead (2-for-5, HR) homered for the first time this spring.

RHP Aaron Civale (3.1IP, 3H, ER, BB, SO) tossed 3.1 innings of one-run ball in his second start of pring.

second start of spring.

1B Jonathan Aranda (1-for-4, 2B, RBI, BB) collected his fourth double of spring...

he is batting .375 (9-for-24) with four doubles in nine Grapefruit League games.

RAYS AND JAYS—The Rays went 7-6 against the Blue Jays in 2023, including 2-2-0 in series play...the Rays have an active winning streak of six consecutive season series (60-39 overall) against the Blue Jays dating back to 2018.

Today's matchup marks the second and final meeting between the two clubs this spring...the Rays lost, 3-2, in Dunedin on Feb. 8.

The Rays host the Blue Jays at Tropicana Field for a four-game series to begin the regular season from March 28-March.

<u>RECENT TRANSACTIONS</u>—On Thursday afternoon, the Rays announced the following players were reassigned to minor league camp: INF Evan Edwards, C Dominic Keegan, LHP Mason Montgomery, C Kenny Piper, RHP Nathan Wiles and RHP Logan Workman.

PROSPECT WATCH—On March 4, MLB.com released its Top 30 Rays Prospect list...INF Junior Caminero leads the group, followed by INF Carson Williams, INF Curtis Mead, INF Xavier Isaac and INF Brayden Taylor...the largest jump in the system was made by C Dominic Keegan, who vaulted from No. 25 in 2023 to No. 6 in 2024.

On the 20-80 scouting scale, Caminero and Mead received a 60 for their hit tool, while Caminero received a 70 for Power...OF Chandler Simpson, rated Tampa Bay's No. 12 prospect, received an 80 for Speed following his 94 SB performance in 2023...added to the 40-man roster this offseason, RHP Yoniel Curet earned a 70 grade for his Fasthall 70 grade for his Fastball.

SPRING BREAKOUT—On March 16, Rays top prospects will battle their Twins counterparts in Fort Myers as part of MLB's inaugural Spring Breakout event...rosters will primarily be constructed through MLB.com's Top 30 Prospects list...the seven-inning

contest will take place following the conclusion of the regularly scheduled Grapefruit League game between the two clubs.

The Rays Spring Breakout roster features two Top 100 MLB.com prospects, including Williams (No. 20) and 1B Xavier Isaac (No. 58)...INF Brayden Taylor and INF Adrian Santana, the No. 19 and No. 31 overall picks respectively in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, are also slated to play for the Rays.

SPRING FEVER—The Rays are scheduled for 30 spring games in 32 days, including split-squad games on March 23 and off days on March 8 and 20...of the Rays 15 home games, 13 will be played at Charlotte Sports Park...they were the home team on March 9 vs. Boston in the Dominican Republic and will host the Tigers at Tropicana Field in their spring finale on March 26.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN—The Rays have 71 players in major league camp, including 29 non-roster invites...of those 71 players, 18 (25.4%) are homegrown, meaning they were drafted or signed as an amateur free agent and developed by the Rays player development system, while 20 (28.2%) are new to the organization since the conclusion of the 2023 season...the Rays have 36 pitchers (14 NRI), six catchers (5 NRI), 17 infielders (5 NRI) and 12 outfielders (5 NRI) in major league camp.

Nine players have been added to the Rays 40-man roster since the conclusion of last season: LHP Tyler Alexander, INF José Caballero, RHP Yoniel Curet, OF Jonny DeLuca, RHP Phil Maton, OF Richie Palacios, RHP Ryan Pepiot, RHP Manuel Rodríguez, INF Amed Rosario and INF Austin Shenton.

AT THE HELM—Entering his 10th season, Rays manager Kevin Cash is the longest-tenured skipper in the majors with his current club...Cash is set to surpass his predecessor, Joe Maddon (2006-14), as the longest-tenured manager in Rays history on Opening Day (March 28 vs. TOR)...he sits 16 victories shy of overtaking Maddon (754) as the Rays all-time leader in managerial wins...despite being the seventh-youngest active manager in the majors, he ranks among his peers in career winning pct. (4th, .545) and wins (8th, 739).

He has been named a BBWAA AL Manager of the Year finalist five times in the last six seasons (since 2018), winning the award twice (2020-21) and receiving votes in all six campaigns.

In 2023, Cash became the youngest manager in MLB history to reach the

In 2023, Cash became the youngest manager in MLB history to reach the postseason in five consecutive seasons (45), ahead of LAD **Dave Roberts**, who was 48 years old when he clinched his fifth straight postseason berth in 2020 (Elias). On Feb. 8, the Rays announced that Cash and President, Baseball Operations **Erik Neander** have been signed to long-term contract extensions.

COACHING STAFF—The Rays have announced their 2024 major league coaching staff under manager Kevin Cash...Michael Johns joins the club as first base coach following 16 seasons in the Rays minor league system, including nine as a manager...Bobby Kinne (pitching strategist) has been added to the uniformed coaching staff after spending six years in the Rays organization, most recently as coordinator, major league operations over the last two seasons (2022-23)...returning coaches include Tomas Francisco (field coord.), Rick Knapp (asst. pitching/rehab), Rodney Linares (bench), Jorge Moncada (bullpen), Chad Mottola (hitting), Brady North (asst. hitting), Kyle Snyder (pitching) and Brady Williams (third base).

ON THE AIRWAVES—All weekend games this spring will air on WDAE 95.3 FM/620 AM, with Andy Freed and Neil Solondz on the call...Freed begins his 20th season with the Rays while Solondz embarks on his 13th, including his second as part of the primary broadcast duo...all weekday home games will be available on MLB.com, with Chris Adams-Wall, entering his first full season with the Rays, providing play-by-play.

Bally Sports Sun will televise 10 of the Rays 13 games at Charlotte Sports Park... Dewayne Staats, the Rays play-by-play voice since their inaugural 1998 season, enters his 27th season with the Rays and 49th broadcasting major league games... Brian Anderson begins his 15th season as full-time color analyst and 17th on the broadcast team...in-game reporter and host Tricia Whitaker enters her sixth season on the telecast.

Took the loss in his debut on Feb. 29 vs. ATL, allowing four runs on four hits and one walk with three strikeouts across 1.2 innings.

2023 IN REVIEW

- Made a team-leading and career-high 31 starts in his first season with the Rays, setting career bests in wins (16), IP (177.2) and strikeouts (186) while posting the lowest ERA (3.50) and WHIP (1.02) of his career.
- Ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (2nd), opp. OBP (2nd, .259), SO/BB ratio (2nd, 7.75), opp. OPS (4th, .642), opp. SLG (5th, .379), home runs per 9.0 IP (6th, 0.96), ERA (8th), strikeouts (T10th) and bWAR (T10th, 3.5).
- The Rays went 23-8 (.742) in his starts, tied with **David Price's** 2014 season (23-8) for the best team winning pct. in a *qualified* pitcher's starts in club history...his 177.2 IP were the most by a Ray since **Charlie Morton** (194.2) in 2019...he joined **Corey Kluber** (31GS) in 2022 as the only Rays pitchers to make 30+ starts in a season since 2020.
