TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Chris Ware's Phillies and the first game of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game weekend series vs Mil.
- Thu's off day will be the club's first since 7/24...will have played 20 consecutive days without a rest...were scheduled off on 8/3 but instead finished the suspended Speedway Classic vs Atl in Bristol, TN.
- Following Sun's game vs Mil, will hit the road for a 9-game trip at LAA (8/18-8/20), AZ (8/22-8/24) and LAD (8/25-8/27)...it will be their first of 2 consecutive trips out west (at Padres, A's, and Cardinals next month).
- The Reds are coming off a 4-3 road trip at Chc (2-1) and Pit (2-2).

SNOOP DOGG POSTGAME: Approximately 30 minutes after the conclusion of tonight's tilt, **Snoop Dogg** will perform a full-length postgame concert at **Great American Ball Park**.

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have not been swept in any of their first 38 series of 2025, including the recently-completed 4-game set at **Pit** (2-2).

- This 38-series, in-season streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the <u>1970</u> National League championship team, which opened its season with <u>32</u> straight series without getting swept.
- <u>Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.</u>
- On 6 occasions avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a set (4/23 at Mia, 5/15 vs CWS, 6/22 at StL, 7/2 at Bos, 7/23 at Wsh, 7/30 vs LAD).
- Cin hasn't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at Cle (2g), a span of 39 straight series...per Elias, that ranks T4th for longest streaks of sweepless series in team history (see below).

- NYM has the 11th-toughest remaining schedule (.507) while Chc (.479) and SD (.473) have the third- and second-easiest remaining schedules in the league, respectively.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and **Phillies** are facing off for second and final time this season...**Phi** won 2 of 3 at **Citizens Bank Park** 7/4-7/6...that series included a complete-game 1-hitter by **Zack Wheeler** on 7/6 (3-1 **Phi** win).

- Cin is 31-31 vs the Phillies since 2015 and 9-15 since 2022...the Reds have lost 3 of the last 4 meetings and are 1-2-2 over the last 5 series.
- The 7-0 Phillies win on 4/22/24 took 2 hours and 2 minutes...it was the quickest 9-inning game at Great American Ball Park since 9/5/06, when the Reds blanked the Giants, 3-0, also in 2 hours and 2 minutes..

DEADLINE DEALS: Cin made 3 trades leading up to the 7/31 deadline:

- 7/31: Acquired from the Athletics INF/OF Miguel Andujar (ahn-DOOhar) in exchange for RHP Kenya Huggins.
- 7/30: Acquired from the Pirates 3B Ke'Bryan Hayes (key-Bryan, #3) in exchange for LHP Taylor Rogers, SS Sammy Stafura, and cash considerations.
- 7/30: Acquired from the Rays RHP Zack Littell (lih-TELL, #52) in exchange for LHP Adam Serwinowski and RHP Brian Van Belle.

TRIPLE DOUBLE: In Sat's 2-1 win at **Pit**, **RF Noelvi Marte** went 3-for-4 with a career-high 3 doubles...at 23 years, 297 days, he became the second-youngest Red to collect 3 doubles in a game (courtesy Elias).

CHASING HISTORY: In Fri's 3-2 loss at PIT, RHP Chase Burns produced his fourth 10-strikeout game of his young career to become the first Major League pitcher since 1893 with at least 10 strikeouts in 4 of his first 8 apps.

- Is also just the third Major League pitcher since 1893 with double-digit strikeouts in 4 of his first 8 career <u>starts</u>, joining Fernando Valenzuela (1981) and Bob Feller (1936)...courtesy Elias.
- Is the first Reds pitcher to begin his career with at least 57 strikeouts over his first 8 games since Gary Nolan (60k, 1967).

MAN OF STEAL: SS Elly De La Cruz stole his 30th base of the season in the 8/2 MLB Speedway Classic, becoming the ninth Major Leaguer in the live-ball era (since 1920) with at least 30 steals in each of his first 3 career seasons, the first since KC's Bobby Witt Jr. (2022-24).

 His 133 career stolen bases are fifth-most by any Major Leaguer through their first 3 career seasons in the live-ball era (since 1920), behind only Vince Coleman (326, 1985-87), Rickey Henderson (189, 1979-81), Delino DeShields (144, 1990-92), and Kenny Lofton (138, 1991-93).

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the 6-1 loss on 8/6 at Chc (6.2ip, 7h, 4r/4er, 2bb, 3k, 2hr, 100TP).

- Was his first career loss to the Cubs (3-1) and the first time the Reds lost to Chicago when he pitched (5-1).
- Was the first time since 6/17 vs Min that he allowed multiple home runs in a game.
- Retired 9 straight until Seiya Suzuki led off the 6th inning with a home run.
- Allowed a leadoff homer in the 7th inning to Dansby Swanson, followed by a strikeout, flyout, and a double to the last batter he faced, Justin Turner...Luis Mey relieved Abbott and allowed Turner to score.

JULY 31: Did not factor in the decision in the 10-inning, 12-11 loss on 7/31 vs Atl (5.1ip, 5h, 3r/2er, 5bb, 1k, 96TP).

- Was just the third time in his career that he struck out as a few as 1 batter in a start (7/21/24 at Wsh & 9/27/23 at Cle).
- Matched his season high with 5 walks (4/25 at Col).
- Was replaced by Graham Ashcraft in the top of the 6th inning after a leadoff walk, single, walk, and a foul popout...2 of his runners scored in the inning after he left the game (E5).

JULY 26: Did not factor in the decision in the 6-2 win on 7/26 vs TB (6.0ip, 2h, 1r/1er, 3bb, 7k, 95TP).

- · Was his third consecutive quality start.
- Was in line for a 2-1 victory but fell victim to RHP Graham Ashcraft's blown save in the 7th inning.
- Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 5th inning...was the fifth time this season he fanned all 3 batters he faced in an inning (last: 5/13 vs CWS, 3rd inning).

JULY 20: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-2 loss on 7/20 at NYM (6.0ip, 6h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 5k, 95TP).

- Was his seventh quality start of the season and the 25th of his career.
- Was in line for a 2-1 loss when he exited the game after the 6th inning...the Reds tied the game in the 8th.

ALL-STAR APPEARANCE: Was selected to the 2025 National League All-Star team for the first time in his career.

 Pitched a perfect 6th inning in the NL's 7-6 victory (Jazz Chisholm Jr. lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena groundout; 13 total pitches).

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team as a replacement for LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto...was his first career All-Star selection.

 Pitched a perfect 6th inning in the NL's 7-6 victory (Jazz Chisholm Jr. lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena groundout; 13 total pitches).

2.34 ERA: His 2.34 ERA (115.1ip, 36r/30er) through his first 20 starts of the season is the lowest since Johnny Cueto posted a 2.13 ERA over his first 20 starts in 2014.

- His 2.34 ERA is the second-best mark among Major League left-handers (min. 100ip) and fourth-best among all pitchers with at least 100 innings.
- Is the seventh-best ERA by a Reds left-handed pitcher through his first 20 starts of a season since earned runs became an official stat in the National League in 1912.

HE EARNED IT: His 3.33 ERA through his first 65 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.17, 1977-82).

IN HIS MAY ERA: His 0.55 ERA in May was the lowest among qualified Major League pitchers...is his lowest ERA in a month since pitching to a 1.21 mark in June 2023 (5gs, 4gs, 29.2ip, 4er, 16h, 12bb, 30k, 3hr).

- Was the first Reds pitcher to post a 0.55 ERA over a 6-start, single-season span (min. 30ip) since RHP Hunter Greene's 0.48 ERA last year from 6/30-8/3.
- Was the first Reds starting pitcher to open a season with a 1.55 ERA or lower over his 9 starts since RHP Johnny Cueto pitched to a 1.25 ERA over his first 9 starts in 2014.
