**PITTSBURGH PIRATES (43-42) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (47-38)**  
**June 30, 2026 - Citizens Bank Park - Philadelphia, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #86/Road #41**  
**RHP Bubba Chandler (3-7, 4.42 ERA) vs. LHP Cristopher Sánchez (9-3, 2.13 ERA)**

**THE PIRATES:** opened their seven-game road trip (their final road trip before the All-Star break) to Philadelphia (Monday-Thursday) and Washington (July 3-5) with an 11-7 win on Monday here at Citizens Bank Park...Won three of six games on their recent homestand vs. Seattle (2-1, June 23-25) and Cincinnati (1-2, Friday-Sunday)...Are in the eighth game of a stretch of 35 straight games played in the Eastern Time Zone (their next game outside of the Eastern Time Zone will be on August 3 at Milwaukee)...Have scored the third-most runs (440) in Major League Baseball, behind Los Angeles-NL (452) and Washington (452)...Have struck out the third-most batters (781) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (811) and Milwaukee (810)...Have won 20 of their first 40 road games this season (they went 27-54 away from home in the 2025 season).

**GOT THE RUNS:** Pittsburgh has not been shut out in 38 straight games (streak began on May 19 at St. Louis), its longest such streak (within a single season) since another 38-game streak from August 21-October 1, 2023...The Pirates' last longer such streak (within a single season) was a 48-game streak from May 4-June 27, 2021...Pittsburgh has scored at least five runs in 20 of its 38 games during the current streak...The Pirates were last shut out in back-to-back games from May 16-17 vs. Philadelphia...Their 11 runs on Monday were their most in a game against the Phillies since a 15-2 win on Sept. 15, 2016 at Citizens Bank Park.

**TIMES THREE:** Esmerlyn Valdez (fourth inning), Jared Triolo (fifth inning) and Endy Rodríguez (ninth inning) all homered for the Pirates on Monday at Philadelphia...Pittsburgh has hit at least three home runs in back-to-back games for the first time since last year from August 2-3 at Colorado...The Pirates have homered at least three times in three straight games three times in the Modern Era (since 1901), coming from June 7-9 (G1), 1928, August 17-20, 2003 and July 28-30, 2019...Pittsburgh has also hit multiple home runs in five straight games (since June 25 vs. Seattle) for the second time this season (also May 29-June 3)...The Pirates have hit multiple home runs in at least six straight games (within a single season) just two times in the Modern Era, coming from July 1-4 (G2), 1966 (six games) and May 23-31, 2006 (eight games)...Pittsburgh's 35 multi-homer games this year are tied with Philadelphia for the second-most in MLB, trailing only Chicago-AL (36).

**THE MAGICIAN:** Esmerlyn Valdez reached base safely four times in five plate appearances after posting a double, a two-run home run and two walks on Monday at Philadelphia...He has homered in four straight games (since Friday vs. Cincinnati), making him the first Pirate to do that since Corey Dickerson (July 15-22, 2018)...Valdez has also become the third Pirates rookie during the Modern Era (since 1901) to homer in four straight games, joining Dick Stuart (August 16-20 [G1], 1958) and Garrett Jones (July 10-17, 2009)...Ten of his first 13 Major League hits have been extra-base hits (four doubles and six home runs)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he is only the second Pirate in the Modern Era to have at least 10 of his first 13 hits with the team be extra-base hits, along with Yoshi Tsutsugo in 2021 (10 of his first 11 hits were XBH).

**HIGH FIVE:** Pittsburgh erased a five-run deficit (5-0) en route to an 11-7 win on Monday at Philadelphia...It was the largest deficit the Pirates overcame in a win against the Phillies since erasing a five-run deficit (5-0) in an 11-7 win on September 4, 1990 at Three Rivers Stadium...It was the largest deficit that they overcame in a win against the Phillies in Philadelphia since overcoming a five-run deficit (5-0) en route to a 9-6 win on August 9 (G2), 1982 at Veterans Stadium...Monday night's win also marked the first time that Pittsburgh won a game by at least four runs after trailing by at least five runs since erasing multiple deficits (5-0 and 7-1) in an 11-7 win on August 26, 2021 vs. St. Louis...It was the first time the Pirates did that in a road game since erasing a five-run deficit (5-0) in a 10-6 win on July 30, 1977 at Atlanta.

**ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY**

June 30, 2012: Pedro Álvarez connected for the second grand slam of his Major League career (off Lance Lynn) in the first inning of Pittsburgh's 7-3 win over St. Louis at Busch Stadium. It was his second straight game with four RBI, making him the first Pirate to do that since Jason Bay from May 26-27, 2006. Jared Hughes secured his first Major League save after pitching 1.1 perfect innings of relief.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the third round of the 2021 Draft.

**AS OF LATE:** Chandler won a 5-1 decision after allowing one run over 5.1 innings on June 25 vs. Seattle...He has a 2.82 ERA (22.1ip/7er) and a .188 batting average against (15-for-80) in his last four appearances (three starts), dating back to June 7 at Atlanta.

**RIGHT ON:** Chandler has limited right-handed hitters to a .205 batting average against (30-for-146) and a .608 OPS this season...The only righthanders to take him deep were Chicago (NL)'s Dansby Swanson (April 12) and San Francisco's Heliot Ramos (May 10).

**AGAINST THE PHILLIES:** Chandler lost a 6-0 decision after allowing five runs (four earned) over 3.0 innings of work in his only career appearance/start against Philadelphia, which came on May 16 at PNC Park...He has a 3.51 ERA (25.2ip/10er) and 28 strikeouts in five career appearances (four starts) against the National League East.

**WHAT A RELIEF:** Chandler allowed just one hit and struck out seven batters over 5.1 innings out of the bullpen on June 7 at Atlanta...He became only the second Pirates reliever in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 5.0 innings, strike out at least seven batters and allow one or zero hits in an appearance...Chandler joined Bill Swift, who did that over his 7.1 innings out of the bullpen on July 28 (G2), 1935 vs. St. Louis.

**GIMME FIVE:** Chandler struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.0 innings on May 22 at Toronto...He joined Erik Bedard (May 3, 2012 at St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings...Chandler also became one of 11 Major Leaguers (since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero earned runs in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings (he was only the fourth rookie to accomplish that).

**FINISHING STRONG:** Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three consecutive starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona's Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (three starts) last season as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make at least three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one/zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts.

**A BIT OF BOTH:** Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances in 2025...Nine of the 11 runs he allowed as a starting pitcher came during his first career start (Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee).

**RELIABLE ROOKIES:** Chandler (starter) and Braxton Ashcraft (reliever) each struck out six batters while issuing zero walks in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics...They were the first pair of Pirates teammates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to each strike out six batters without issuing a walk in the same game... They were the ninth pair of Pirates since 1901 to both have six strikeouts in a game, the first since Chad Kuhl (eight)/Richard Rodríguez (six) on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.
