RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand before the All-Star break today, a seven-game stretch against the Yankees (2-2) and Mariners (1-0, two to play)...are 12-4 in their last 16 contests (June 24–pres.), the second-best record in the majors over that span (1st - BOS, 12-3/.800)...had a season-high nine-game winning streak from June 24–July 3 (T4th-longest in TB history), the longest by an AL club this season...prior to the streak, went an MLB-best 22-4 from April 22–May 22 and an MLB-worst 9-18 from May 24–June 23...lead the AL with a 55-37 record, third in the majors and tied for their third-best start (also 2008) behind 2023 (57-35), and 2010 (56-36)...own the majors' best home record (34-14), best by any AL team through 48 home games since the 2023 Rays (also 34-14)...are 21 games through a period of 23 games in 24 days leading into the All-Star break (June 19–July 12), going 14-7 thus far...have spent 55 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 13 consecutive days in first...hold a 4.0-game lead in the division.

- ★ The Rays claimed the series opener against the Mariners on Friday night, 7-2...it marked their 10th win in their last 13 series openers at Tropicana Field (April 24–pres.).
- ★ The team launched a season-high-tying four home runs (3x, last: June 25 vs. KC)...they have homered in 12 of their last 15 games (June 25–pres.), tallying multiple home runs in 10 of those contests (see "Get Out Ball" note below for more).
- ★ Jonathan Aranda, Victor Mesa Jr., and Chandler Simpson each recorded three-hit games last night, the second time the Rays have had three players or more register three hits or more in the same game in 2026 (also: March 26 at STL - Yandy Diaz, Nick Fortes, Ben Williamson)...it was the 99th time in franchise history a Rays trio has accomplished the feat.
- ★ Today the Rays continue Longo's Legacy Weekend and will induct Evan Longoria to the Rays Hall of Fame...tomorrow, his No. 3 will become the fourth number retired by the Rays along with No. 12 (Wade Boggs), No. 42 (Jackie Robinson), and No. 66 (Don Zimmer)...for more information visit www.raysbaseball.com/longo.

WHAT'S AT STAKE

With a win today, the Rays would:

- ★ Win their fifth straight home series against the Mariners (2022–pres.), including wins in five straight and 10 of the last 11 meetings at Tropicana Field and five straight contests (Sept. 1, 2025–pres.).
- ★ Claim their 11th series in their last 14 sets (11-1-2) at Tropicana Field (April 24–pres.) and remain undefeated in their last six home sets (4-0-2).
- ★ Earn their 56th win of the season, the second most in franchise history before the Midsummer Classic, behind only the 2023 Rays (58-35).
- ★ Return to a season-best 19-games above .500 for the third time (last: 52-33 on July 3).

FOR3VER A RAY—Today, Evan Longoria will be inducted into the Rays Hall of Fame in a pregame ceremony beginning at 4 p.m....during his stint in Tampa Bay, Longoria was tabbed for three All-Star selections and three Gold Glove awards while earning three top-10 finishes and six top-20 finishes in AL MVP voting...he was named AL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and was tabbed as the 2009 AL Silver Slugger recipient at third base...Longoria delivered some of the most memorable moments in franchise history, highlighted by his walk-off home run in Game 162 vs. NYY in 2011, which made him the second player to send his team to the postseason by hitting a walk-off home run in the final game of the regular season along with NYG Bobby Thomson's "Shot Heard 'Round the World" in 1951 vs. Brooklyn.

- ★ He is one of eight players leading one of the 30 current major league franchises in games (1,453), doubles (338), home runs (261), extra-base hits (618), and RBI (892), joining Hank Aaron (Braves), George Brett (Royals), Todd Helton (Rockies), Stan Musial (Cardinals), Luis Gonzalez (Diamondbacks), Cal Ripken Jr. (Orioles), and Ryan Zimmerman (Nationals)...he is also the Rays franchise leader in bWAR (51.7), runs (780), total bases (2,630), and walk-off PA (8).
- ★ Since Longoria's rookie season in 2008, the Rays have the third-best winning pct. in the majors (.543), trailing the Dodgers (.588) and Yankees (.570)...this comes after the Devil Rays amassed the worst record in MLB over the franchise's first 10 years of existence from 1998–2007 (.399).
- ★ Longoria will become the sixth inductee since the Rays Hall of Fame was established in 2023, joining first baseman Fred McGriff (2024), broadcaster Dave Wills (2024, infielder Wade Boggs (2023), outfielder Carl Crawford (2023), and senior adviser Don Zimmer (2023).
- ★ Tomorrow, the Rays will retire Longoria's No. 3 in a pregame ceremony, the fourth number retired by the club along with No. 12 (Boggs), No. 42 (Jackie Robinson), and No. 66 (Zimmer).

GET OUT BALL—The Rays have homered in 12 of their last 15 games (June 25–pres.), tallying multiple home runs in 10 of those contests...their 29 home runs over that span lead the majors and are the most by the Rays in any 15-game span since April 29–May 14, 2023 (also 29)...they are 21-4 (.840) when they hit multiple home runs this season, the third-best record in the majors...they have won 12 of their last 13 contests (June 14–pres.) when registering two long balls or more.

- ★ Junior Caminero has launched 13 HR in his last 17 games since June 23, pacing the majors in homers, extra-base hits (14), total bases (60) over that timeframe while leading the AL in RBI (25), slugging pct. (.896), OPS (1.269), runs (16)...at 23 years, five days old, he is the youngest player and the 26th player overall to accomplish the feat in the modern era (since 1900)...he had 2 HR in his previous 29 games entering this stretch (May 19–June 22).
- ★ Since the power surge began on June 25, 11 of the 13 position players the Rays have used during that span have homered, with Caminero (12), Cedric Mullins (5), Victor Mesa Jr. (3), and Richie Palacios (2) all recording multiple long balls.

GENERATION NEXT—The 2026 First-Year Player Draft will begin today at 1:00 p.m. ET with picks 1-10 on NBC/Peacock, picks 11-40 on MLB Network, and picks 41-135 on MLB.com...the Rays hold five picks on day one: No. 2 (round one), No. 33 (Competitive Balance Round A), No. 49 (second round), No. 85 (third round), No. 113 (fourth round)...the Rays No. 2 overall selection is their highest since holding the No. 1 pick in 2008...the Rays have taken a position player with their first selection in six straight and 10 of the last 12 seasons...last year, they selected INF Daniel Pierce out of Mill Creek High School (Ga.), who is rated as the club's No. 6 prospect (MLB.com).

- ★ The draft will resume tomorrow, Sunday, July 12, at 11:30 a.m. for rounds 5-20.
- ★ According to MLB.com, four of the top eight and 12 of the Rays top 30 prospects have been drafted by the organization, including No. 1 prospect OF Theo Gillen (MLB No. 9) and No. 2 prospect C Nathan Flewelling (MLB No. 72).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR—With yesterday's addition of RHP Nick Martinez to the AL All-Star roster as a replacement for BOS Ranger Suarez, the Rays will be represented by five players at the 2026 All-Star Game this Tues., July 14 at Philadelphia's Citizens Bank Park (also: RHP Bryan Baker, 3B Junior Caminero, DH Yandy Diaz, RHP Drew Rasmussen)...the Rays five All-Stars are tied for the most in franchise history, joining the 2009 Rays (Jason Bartlett, Carl Crawford, Evan Longoria, Carlos Peña, Ben Zobrist)...this is the first time in franchise history the Rays have had three pitchers named All-Stars after having had two hurlers on four previous occasions (2010-12, 2015)...the Rays are the first AL club with three All-Star pitchers since the 2022 Yankees (Gerrit Cole, Nestor Cortes, Clay Holmes)...they are tied with the Braves, Dodgers, and Phillies for the most total All-Stars in the majors.

ON DIFFERENT LEVELS—After earning saves in each of the Rays last four victories, Bryan Baker has converted 14 straight save opportunities, MLB's third-longest active streak behind SD Mason Miller (23) and TOR Louis Varland (18) and the longest by a Ray since Pete Fairbanks (15) from May 19–Aug. 30, 2023...with three games to play, Baker (25) is one save shy of tying Roberto Hernandez (26) in 1999 for the most before the All-Star break in team history...as it stands, his 25 saves rank second in the majors to CLE Cade Smith (28) and are tied with Alex Colomé (25) in 2017 and Fernando Rodney (25) in 2012 for second most by a Rays pitcher before the All-Star break...he paces MLB with six saves of 10 pitches or fewer and has the second-most saves of 15 pitches or fewer (16) behind STL Riley O'Brien (17).

- ★ Baker has retired 17 of 19 and 32 of his last 36 BF, and opponents are 6-for-57 (.105) against him over his last 17 outings (May 19–pres.)...min. 15.0 IP, he leads the AL in WHIP (.053) over that span and ranks third in opp. average to HOU Josh Hader (.061) and NYY David Bednar (.102).

AHOY, MARINER—The Rays and Mariners continue their first series against each other this season at Tropicana Field today...the clubs will meet again in Seattle between Aug. 7-9...both clubs earned sweeps at their home ballparks last year, with the Mariners taking all three games of the series at T-Mobile Park from Aug. 8-10, 2025 and the Rays taking all three contests between Sept. 1-3, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field...the Rays have won nine of their last 10 home games vs. SEA dating back to Sept. 8, 2023 and have won four straight home series (2022-25) against Seattle.

- ★ In 10 career games opposite the Mariners, Junior Caminero has hit .425 (17-for-40) with 4 2B, 1 3B, 4 HR, 14 RBI, a .875 SLG, and a 1.314 OPS.

TODAY'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber today for his 14th start and 25th appearance of the year, including his seventh start and 15th outing at Tropicana Field...marks his 14th straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 30th start of his major league career...acquired from the Twins for **RHP Taj Bradley** on July 31, 2025.

- ✦ Jax has not allowed an extra-base hit in six of his starts this year, trailing rotation-mate **Shane McClanahan** (8), LAA **José Soriano** (8), and TOR **Dylan Cease** (7) for the most such starts in the AL.
- ✦ Has fashioned a 2.32 ERA (26.OIP, 5ER) across his last six starts since June 7, the seventh-lowest mark in the AL (min. 30.OIP) during that span...in 20 appearances (13 starts) since April 5, Jax has a 3.10 ERA (61.OIP, 21ER).
- ✦ Boasts a 2.89 ERA (56.OIP, 18ER) with 58 strikeouts in 13 starts compared to an 8.00 ERA (9.OIP, 8ER) with 10 strikeouts in 11 relief appearances this year.
- ✦ Jax has walked seven batters across his last eight starts since May 26, tied for the third fewest among AL starters during that span (min. 35.OIP) behind BOS **Jake Bennett** (4BB) and SEA **Bryan Woo** (6).
- ✦ Will be making his third start with four days of rest or fewer this year...in two such starts, he has posted a 2.00 ERA (9.OIP, 2ER) with 10 strikeouts, with opposing hitters slashing .243/.317/.297 (9-for-37) with a .614 OPS.

LAST TIME OUT—Allowed three runs over 5.0 innings despite allowing one hit, a three-run homer to **José Caballero** in the 5th inning, in a 5-1 loss on July 6 vs. NYY (L, 5.OIP, H, 3R, 2BB, 10SO, HR)...struck out a career-high-tying 10 batters, last turning the trick on Aug. 10, 2021 vs. CWS (w/ MIN)...joined **Drew Rasmussen** (13SO, June 10 vs. BOS) and **Ian Seymour** (12SO, July 7 vs. NYY) as the only Rays with 10 strikeouts or more in a game this year...retired his first 13 batters faced before a one-out walk to **Jasson Domínguez**, striking out eight of those first 13 hitters, marking the longest streak of batters retired to begin a game in his career.

- ✦ Jax has struck out four batters or more in seven consecutive outings (June 1–pres.), the longest streak of his career.
- ✦ Eleven of his 13 earned runs allowed since the start of June came off homers.
- ✦ Combined with Seymour's 12 strikeouts on July 7, it marked the 11th time the Rays have had starters register double-digit strikeouts in back-to-back games and first since May 25-26, 2021 vs. KC (**Rich Hill**, 13SO - **Tyler Glasnow**, 11SO).

NEVER SEA ME AGAIN—Jax has appeared in 15 games opposite the Mariners in his career, all in relief...he holds a 2-2 record with a 7.56 ERA (16.2IP, 14ER) , his highest ERA against any opponent in his career, and 23 strikeouts in those outings, and his teams are 9-6 in those contests.

- ✦ Jax has a 6-5 record with a 3.24 ERA (66.2IP, 24ER) across 59 outings (two starts) against AL West foes in his career...as a starter, he is 1-1 with a 0.87 ERA (10.1IP, 1ER) and five strikeouts...his teams are 40-19 lifetime in his appearances against Seattle.
- ✦ Will mark his second appearance against an AL West club in 2026, joining a start on June 13 at LAA, when he was dealt the loss despite throwing 5.0 innings without allowing an earned run (L, 5.OIP, 5H, 1R-0ER, 5SO).

GOTTA LOVE THE DOME—At Tropicana Field this season, Jax holds a 3.98 ERA (31.2IP, 14ER) in 10 games (seven starts) with 43 strikeouts to 10 walks and a .200 (23-for-115) opp. average...11 of his 14 earned runs at home came in three of his last four outings since June 1...in his career, he holds a 4.41 ERA (214.1IP, 105ER) in home games compared to a 3.52 ERA (207.1IP, 81ER) on the road.

- ✦ Jax owns a 3.97 ERA (22.2IP, 10ER) across seven games (five starts) at Tropicana Field against AL foes this season.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for **Ian Seymour** on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frame...for his career, he is 6-9 with a 4.59 ERA (127.1IP, 65ER) in 29 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

- ✦ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

HOW SWEEP IT IS—Jax throws his sweeper 25.8 pct. of the time, the seventh-highest mark among AL pitchers (min. 750 pitches)...despite this, his usage rate has dropped 18.2 pct. on the pitch from 2025 (44.0 pct.)...in 2026, he has limited opponents to a .156 (7-for-45) average on the pitch, fourth lowest in the AL (min. 40AB)...under the same parameters, his 42.7 pct. whiff rate on sweepers ranks third in the AL and fifth in the majors.

- ✦ According to Baseball Savant, Mariners hitters are batting below league average (.206) on sweepers (.205/42-for-205) this season...Seattle has a 32.9 pct. whiff rate on sweepers, sixth highest in the AL.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

- ✦ He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: LHP IAN SEYMOUR [6-1, 4.11]

LAST TIME OUT—Improved to 6-1 after striking out a career-high 12 batters on July 7 vs. NYY (W, 5.1IP, 5H, 3R, 12SO, HR), besting a previous career-high eight strikeouts (3x, last: July 2, 2026 at KC)...has fanned 27 batters over his last three outings, joining **Drew Rasmussen** (29SO, June 5-16) as the only Rays to do so in 2026.
