### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Sept. 27, 1938:** An ailing Lou Gehrig hits his 493rd and final major league home run, a solo shot off Senators' right-hander Dutch Leonard. On the same date exactly 15 years earlier (9/27/1923), the Yankees first baseman homered off Bill Piercy at Fenway Park for his first career home run.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Sept. 28, 2022:** Aaron Judge hits his 61st HR of the season at Toronto, tying Roger Maris (61HR in 1961) for the most home runs in a single season in American League history. The HR was hit in the seventh inning off Tim Lincecum.

**Sept. 28, 2008:** On the season's last day in Game 1 of a doubleheader at Fenway Park, Mike Mussina records his 20th win, becoming the oldest pitcher in MLB history to win 20 games for the first time.

**Sept. 28, 1968:** Mickey Mantle plays his final career game, starting for the Yankees at Boston's Fenway Park. Hitting third, he bats in the top of the first and pops out to Red Sox shortstop Rico Petrocelli before being replaced in the field at 1B by Andy Kosco.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their final road trip of the season with the second game of a three-game set at Toronto (1-0 thus far)...will also play a three-game set at Kansas City this weekend (Fri.-Sun.)...went 3-3 on their final homestand after going 1-2 vs. Toronto and 2-1 vs. Arizona.

- ▶ Are 10-5 in their last 15 games (since 9/10).
- ▶ With an 80-77 record, the Yankees need one win to clinch their 31st consecutive non-losing season (since 1993).
- ▶ **Have posted a Major League-best 18-9 (.667) record since 8/28**...are 20-12 in their last 32 games (since 8/23).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated the Blue Jays, 2-0, in their series opener on Tuesday at Toronto...**RHP Michael King** (6.0IP, 1H, OR, 5BB, 5K) started and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision...**C Austin Wells** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his third career HR with a go-ahead two-run shot in the ninth inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-3, 1R, 1BB) and **DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-3, 1 double, 1BB) each reached base twice...**RHP Jhonny Brito** (2.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K) tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief to earn his ninth win of the year...**RHP Clay Holmes** (1.0IP, 1H) tossed a scoreless ninth to earn his career-high 23rd save of the season.

**AUSTIN POWERS:** **C Austin Wells** broke a scoreless tie in the ninth inning on Tuesday with a two-run HR...**is just the seventh Yankee (eighth time) in the last 42 years (since 1982) to break a scoreless tie with a HR in the ninth inning-or-later**, joining Aaron Judge (twice: ninth inning on 7/28/22 vs. Kansas City and 13th inning on 6/16/18 at Toronto), Gary Sánchez (ninth inning on 5/1/18 at Houston), Chris Young (11th inning on 9/12/14-G1 at Baltimore), Alex Rodriguez (15th inning on 8/7/09 vs. Boston), Ruben Sierra (ninth inning on 7/22/04 vs. Toronto) and Cecil Fielder (10th inning on 8/2/96 at Kansas City).

- ▶ **Has homered in back-to-back games and has hit 3HR in his last five games (since 9/20).**
- ▶ Seven of his 11 Major League hits have gone for extra bases (4 doubles, 3HR).
- ▶ Is hitting .276/300/690 (8-for-29) with 5R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 6RBI and 1BB in his last eight games (since 9/16).

**FOR STARTERS:** **Yankees starters** have posted a 2.89 ERA (183.2IP, 59ER) in their last 34 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 31 of those 34 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 25 of those starts.

- ▶ Have posted a 1.72 ERA (36.2IP, 7ER) and 37K in their last six games (since 9/20).

**GLEYBER DAY:** INF **Gleyber Torres** reached base twice on Tuesday...has reached base multiple times in eight of his last 13 games (since 9/12-G2).

- ▶ Is batting .310/401/533 (57-for-184) with 31R, 14 doubles, 9HR, 22RBI, 26BB, 2HP and 5SB in 49 games since 8/1...has hit safely in 35 of those games and has reached base safely in 41 of those contests...**his .934 OPS since 8/1 is the seventh-highest in the AL (min. 150PA).**
- ▶ Since 7/6, is hitting .305/375/508 (80-for-262) with 41R, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 30RBI, 29BB, 2HP, 3SF and 6SB in 68 games in that span.
- ▶ Has recorded a career-high 65BB this season.
- ▶ Has hit .337/367/506 (28-for-83) with 12R, 5 doubles, 3HR, 17RBI, 4BB, 2SF and 1HP in his last 21 games against Toronto (since 5/11/22)...in his last 32 games vs. the Blue Jays (since 9/28/21), has hit .320/346/525 (39-for-122) with 17R, 7 doubles, 6HR, 23RBI, 5BB, 1HP and 2SF.

**KING OF THE HILL:** RHP **Michael King** started on Tuesday and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings (1H, 5BB, 5K)...**as a starter this season, has gone 1-3 with a 1.49 ERA (36.1IP, 6ER) and 50K in eight starts...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of his last seven starts (since 8/24), posting a 1.05 ERA (34.1IP, 4ER) in that span**...over that same stretch, leads the AL and ranks second in the Majors in ERA.

- ▶ **Has recorded 35K over his last four starts (22.2IP).**
- ▶ Since 7/21, has gone 2-3 with a 1.64 ERA (49.1IP, 9ER) and 69K in 17 games (eight starts).

**RARE OCCURRENCE:** The Yankees were eliminated from postseason play on Sunday for the first time since 2016...the Yankees were just one of three teams to make the postseason in each of the past six seasons (2017-22, also Houston and Los Angeles-NL)...over that span, 26 teams missed the playoffs at least twice, 22 teams missed the postseason at least three times, 18 teams missed the playoffs at least four times and 13 teams missed the postseason at least five times during that six-season stretch.

**GO WITH THE FLO:** OF **Estevan Florial** has reached base in 11 of his last 12 games (since 9/12-G2).

**COLE TRAIN:** **RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 33rd start of the season and the 300th start of his career tonight**...is 14-4 with one complete game, a 2.75 ERA (200.0IP, 61ER) and 217K in 32 starts this season...**his 2.75 ERA is the lowest in the American League and the second-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.25).

- ▶ **Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 25 of his 32 starts this season, tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most such starts in the Majors**...no other pitcher in the AL has more than 20 such starts...**is one of just three pitchers in franchise history to record at least 25 starts of 2R-or-fewer in a single season**, joining Jack Chesbro (28 in 1904) and Ron Guidry (26 in 1978).
- ▶ Leads the Majors in WHIP (1.02), ranks second in ERA (2.75, first in AL), quality starts (23, first in AL) and opponents' OBP (.266, second in AL), third in innings pitched (200.0, first in AL), winning percentage (.778, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.597, first in AL), tied for fourth in starts (32, tied for first in AL), fifth in strikeouts (217, third in AL), opponents' BA (.212, first in AL) and opponents' SLG (.331, second in AL), tied for eighth in WAR (4.8, tied for third in AL - FanGraphs) and wins (14, tied for fourth in AL) and 10th in BB/9.0IP (2.16, fourth in AL) and K/BB (4.52, fifth in AL) ...also ranks fourth in the AL in HR/9.0IP (0.90) and seventh in K/9.0IP (9.77).
- ▶ **Has gone 4-0 with a 1.59 ERA (39.2IP, 7ER) and 47K over his last six starts** (since 8/25)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those six starts...has walked just five of his 149BF over that span...**the Yankees are 6-0 in those games**.
- ▶ **According to Elias, his 2.75 ERA is the lowest by a Yankees starter through his first 32 starts of a season in the last 45 years (since 1979)**...the last Yankee to record as low of an ERA through 32 starts was Ron Guidry in 1978 (1.80)...**the last time a qualified Yankee finished a non-strike season with as low of an ERA was 1980 when Rudy May recorded a 2.46 ERA in 41 games/17 starts** (Tommy John had a 2.63 ERA in 20 starts in 1981).
- ▶ *If he were to finish the season with the lowest ERA in the AL*, he would be the 10th Yankee (14th time) to win an AL ERA title...would join Rudy May (1980), Ron Guidry (twice: 1978 and '79), Whitey Ford (twice: 1956 and '58), Bobby Shantz (1957), Ed Lopat (1953), Allie Reynolds (1952), Spud Chandler (twice: 1943 and '47), Lefty Gomez (twice: 1934 and '37) and Wilcy Moore (1927).
- ▶ Has allowed more than 3R just five times this season, allowing 27 of his 64R in those five starts...**in his other 27 starts, has allowed just 37 runs, averaging just 1.37 runs per game in those starts**.
- ▶ **The Yankees are 22-10 in his starts this season**...the 'Yankees' 22 wins in Cole's starts are the fourth-most by any team in the Majors in a pitcher's starts (third-most in AL), trailing only Atlanta's 25 wins in Spencer Strider's starts, Baltimore's 23 wins in Dean Kremer's starts and Tampa Bay's 23 wins in Zach Eflin's starts.
- ▶ **Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 25 of his 32 starts, the most such starts in the AL and second-most in the Majors**, trailing only San Francisco's Logan Webb (27)...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 13 of his last 15 starts (since 7/2) and in 18 of his last 21 starts (since 5/28).
- ▶ Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in six of his last 11 starts (since 7/28), seven of his last 14 starts (since 7/8) and eight of his last 17 starts (since 6/20)...his 10 starts of at least 7.0IP are tied for the third-most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors.
- ▶ Has left just five of his 32GS this season with the Yankees trailing.
- ▶ **Is 1-0 with a 0.46 ERA (19.2IP, 1ER) and 19K in three starts vs. the Blue Jays this year**.
- ▶ Will make his 300th career start tonight...will be just the 12th active pitcher with at least 300 starts, joining Zack Greinke (540), Justin Verlander (508), Max Scherzer (448), Clayton Kershaw (421), Adam Wainwright (411), Johnny Cueto (362), Madison Bumgarner (355), Charlie Morton (352), Lance Lynn (316), Wade Miley (307) and José Quintana (301)...has 2,147 career strikeouts through 299 career games...only Randy Johnson (2,373) and Clayton Kershaw (2,173) have recorded more strikeouts through 300 career games.
- ▶ His 217K this season are tied with Al Downing (217K in 1964) for the 10th-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, trailing his own 257K in 2022, Ron Guidry's 248K in 1978, his own 243K in 2021, Jack Chesbro's 239K in 1904, CC Sabathia's 230K in 2011, Luis Severino's 230K in 2017, David Cone's 222K in 1997, Luis Severino's 220K in 2018 and Melido Perez's 218K in 1992.

**BATTERS' EYE:** **Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.37 PA/BB ratio and a 4.05 pitches per plate appearance ratio**...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

**HPH Gerrit Cole** will make his 33rd start of the season and the 300th start of his career tonight at Toronto...the 33-year-old will start on extended five days' rest...earned his 50th win as a Yankee on Thursday vs. Toronto after allowing just 1ER in 8.0IP (2H, 0BB, 9K)...**Is 14-4 with a 2.75 ERA (200.0IP, 61ER) and 217K in 32 starts this season...owns the lowest ERA in the American League...**...**and the second-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.25)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 25 of his 32 starts this season, tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most...****such starts in the Majors...**...started for the American League in the 93rd Midsummer Classic on 7/11 and retired all 3BF, becoming the 12th pitcher in franchise history (20/23 time) to start an All-Star Game...was named to his sixth career All-Star team via the player ballot...reached 10 years of Major League service on 5/29...recorded his 2,000th career strikeout on 5/23 vs. Baltimore (Jorge Mateo swinging), becoming the third-fastest pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone (in terms of games and innings pitched)...his Major League-leading 257K last season were the most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, surpassing Ron Guidry's previous record of 248K in 1978...the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting five times (second in 2021, fourth in 2020, second in 2019, fifth in 2018, fourth in 2015)...his career 10.44 K/9.0IP ratio (2,147K/1,850.0IP) is the eighth-highest in Major League history (min. 1,000.0IP)...in 107 starts with the Yankees, is 50-23 with a 3.12 ERA (655.0IP 227ER) and 811K...since 2018, leads the Majors in wins (85), strikeouts (1,103), innings pitched (1,067.2) and WAR (4.9) among pitchers (28.1 - FanGraphs), ranks second in K/9.0IP (11.91), third in winning percentage (.720, min. 60 decisions), fourth in opponents' BA (.205), WHIP (1.40) and K/BB (5.27), and sixth in ERA (2.95)...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (28th overall) of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play at UCLA for three seasons (2009-11)...was the first overall pick of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft, the 15th pitcher (and 11th right-hander) to be chosen first...is the fifth player selected first overall to play for the Yankees, joining Alex Rodriguez, Darryl Strawberry, Tim Lincecum and Ron Blomberg...signed a nine-year contract extending through the 2028 season with a player opt-out following the 2024 season on 12/18/19.

**300: Will make his 300th career start tonight, will be just the 12th active pitcher with at least 300 starts**, joining Zack Greinke (540), Justin Verlander (508), Max Scherzer (448), Clayton Kershaw (421), Adam Wainwright (411), Johnny Cueto (362), Madison Bumgarner (355), Charlie Morton (352), Lance Lynn (316), Wade Miley (307) and José Quintana (301).

➔ Has 2,147 career strikeouts through 299 career games...only Randy Johnson (2,373) and Clayton Kershaw (2,173) have recorded more strikeouts through 300 career games.

**KEEPIN' IT 200:** Has tossed at least 200.0 innings for a second straight season and for the sixth time in his career (also 2015, '17-19, '22)...has reached the 200.0IP mark for the fifth time in his last six 162-game seasons...**is the only pitcher to throw at least 200.0 innings in five different seasons since 2017** (no other pitcher has recorded more than three such seasons in that span)...**is also the only Major League pitcher to record six such seasons since 2015** (no other pitcher has more than four in that span)...is the only Yankee in the last 10 years (since 2014) to throw at least 200.0IP in a season and is the first to do so in back-to-back seasons since CC Sabathia (five straight from 2009-13) and Hiroki Kuroda (2012-13)...**is the only AL pitcher and one of just three pitchers in the Majors to reach the mark this season.**

✦ Has recorded at least 8K in 14 starts this season and has notched five double-digit strikeout games this year...his five such games are the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the seventh-most in the Majors this season.

- ✦ Has recorded double-digit strikeouts in 47 games since the start of 2019, marking the most in the Majors over the span (next: Max Scherzer-31)...his 55 games with at least 10K since the beginning of 2018 are also the most in the Majors over that stretch (next: Max Scherzer-49).
