AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final road trip of the season with the second game of a three-game set at Toronto (1-0 thus far)...will also play a three-game set at Kansas City this weekend (Fri.-Sun.)...went 3-3 on their final homestand after going 1-2 vs. Toronto and 2-1 vs. Arizona.

- Are 10-5 in their last 15 games (since 9/10).
 With an 80-77 record, the Yankees need one win to clinch their 31st consecutive non-losing season (since 1993).
- Have posted a Major League-best 18-9 (.667) record since 8/28...are 20-12 in their last 32 games (since 8/23).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Blue Jays, 2-0, in their series opener on Tuesday at Toronto...RHP Michael King (6.0IP, 1H, 0R, 5BB, 5K) started and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in (6.0IP, 1H, 0R, 5BB, 5K) started and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision... C Austin Wells (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his third career HR with a go-ahead two-run shot in the ninth inning... 2B Gleyber Torres (1-for-3, 1R, 1BB) and DH Giancarlo Stanton (1-for-3, 1 double, 1BB) each reached base twice... RHP Jhony Brito (2.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K) tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief to earn his ninth win of the year... RHP Clay Holmes (1.0IP, 1H) tossed a scoreless ninth to earn his career-high 23rd save of the season.

AUSTIN POWERS: C Austin Wells broke a scoreless tie in the ninth inning on Tuesday with a two-run HR...is just the seventh Yankee (eighth time) in the last 42 years (since 1982) to break a scoreless tie with a HR in the ninth inning-or-later, joining a scoreless tie with a HR in the ninth inning-or-later, joining Aaron Judge (twice: ninth inning on 7/28/22 vs. Kansas City and 13th inning on 6/16/18 at Toronto), Gary Sánchez (ninth inning on 5/1/18 at Houston), Chris Young (11th inning on 9/12/14-G1 at Baltimore), Alex Rodriguez (15th inning on 8/7/09 vs. Boston), Ruben Sierra (ninth inning on 7/22/04 vs. Toronto) and Cecil Fielder (10th inning on 8/2/96 at Kansas City).

Has homered in back-to-back games and has hit 3HR in his last five games (since 9/20).

Seven of his 11 Major League hits have gone for extra bases (4 doubles, 3HR).

Is hitting .276/.300/.690 (8-for-29) with 5R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 6RBI and 1BB in his last eight games (since 9/16).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 2.89 ERA (183.2IP, 59ER) in their last 34 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 31 of those 34 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 25 of those starts.

KING OF THE HILL: RHP Michael King started on Tuesday and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings (1H, 5BB, 5K)...as a starter this season, has gone 1-3 with a 1.49 ERA (36.1IP, 6ER) and 50K in eight starts...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of his last seven starts (since 8/24), posting a 1.05 ERA (34.1IP, 4ER) in that span...over that same stretch, leads the AL and ranks second in the Majors in ERA.

COLE TRAIN: RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 33rd start of the season and the 300th start of his career tonight...is 14-4 with one complete game, a 2.75 ERA (200.0IP, 61ER) and 217K in 32 starts this season...his 2.75 ERA is the lowest in the American League and the second-lowest in the Majors,

- trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.25).

BATTERS' EYE: Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.37 PA/BB ratio and a 4.05 pitches per plate appearance ratio...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 28, 2022: Aaron Judge hits his 61st HR of the season at Toronto, tying Roger Maris (61HR in 1961) for the most home runs in a single season in American League history. The HR was hit in the seventh inning off Tim Mayza.

Sept. 28, 2008: On the season's last day in Game 1 of a doubleheader at Fenway Park, Mike Mussina records his 20th win, becoming the oldest pitcher in MLB history to win 20 games for the first time.

Sept. 28, 1968: Mickey Mantle plays his final career game, starting for the Yankees at Boston's Fenway Park. Hitting third, he bats in the top of the first and pops out to Red Sox shortstop Rico Petrocelli before being replaced in the field at 1B by Andy Kosco.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP GERRIT COLE (14-4, 2.75 ERA)

RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 33rd start of the season and the 300th start of his career tonight at Toronto...the 33-year-old will start on extended five days' rest...earned his 50th win as a Yankee on Thursday vs. Toronto after allowing just 1ER in 8.0IP (2H, 0BB, 9K)...js 14-4 with a 2.75 ERA (200.0IP, 61ER) and 217K in 32 starts this season...owns the lowest ERA in the American League and the second-lowest in the Majors, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.25)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 25 of his 32 starts this season, tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most such starts in the Majors...started for the American League in the 93rd Midsummer Classic on 7/11 and retired all 3BF, becoming the 12th pitcher in franchise history (20th time) to start an All-Star Game...was named to his sixth career All-Star team via the player ballot...reached 10 years of Major League service on 5/29...recorded his 2,000th career strikeout on 5/23 vs. Baltimore (Jorga Mateo swinging), becoming the third-fastest pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone (in terms of games and innings pitched)...his Major League-leading 257K last season were the most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, surpassing Ron Guidry's previous record of 248K in 1978...the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting five times (second in 2021, fourth in 2020, second in 2019, fifth in 2018, fourth in 2015)...his career 10.44 K/9.0IP ratio (2,147K/1,850.0IP) is the eighth-highest in Major League history (min. 1,000.0IP)...in 107 starts with the Yankees, is 50-23 with a 3.12 ERA (655.0IP, 227ER) and 811K...since 2018, leads the Majors in wins (85), strikeouts (1,413), innings pitched (1,067.2) and Ward among pitchers (28.1 - FanGraphs), ranks second in K/9.0IP (1.191), third in winning percentage (720, min. 60 decisions), fourth in opponents' BA (205), WHIP (1.00) and K/BB (5.27), and sixth in ERA (2.95)...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round

LAST START: Earned his 14th win of the year and his 50th as a Yankee after allowing just 1R/ER over 8.0IP on Thursday vs. Toronto (2H, 0BB, 9K, 0HR, 1WP)... retired his first 16BF, 21 of his first 22BF and 24 of his 26BF... his 2H allowed matched his season low and his 8.0IP marked his second-longest start of the season... marked his fifth start this season where he tossed at least 7.0 innings and allowed three-or-fewer baserunners (via H/BB/HP), marking the most such starts by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history...surpassed Mike Mussina's four such starts in 2001.
