Rookie **Aristides Aquino** homered in each of his **last 4 apps (6hr, 9rbi)**, 1 game shy of the franchise record for consecutive apps with at least 1 HR...only **8 players** in Reds history, since 1900, homered in a club-record **5 straight apps**:

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 4 (2-1)** of a 4-game series vs **Brian Butterfield's** first-place **Cubs** and **Game 6 (4-1)** of a 6-game homestand that included a **2-0 series sweep win vs the Angels**...is **Game 6 (4-1)** of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play **13 of 16 games at Great American Ball Park** (2-0 vs LAA, 2-1 vs Cubs, 3g at Wsh, 4g vs StL, 3g vs SD).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the **1869 Red Stockings**...this season, the team will wear **15 uniforms** from various periods throughout the team's history...**this afternoon** are wearing replica uniforms from **1969**...the Reds are **3-7** wearing **throwback uniforms**...already wore uniforms from **1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961 and 1967**...as part of the season-long celebration, the **Reds Hall of Fame and Museum** underwent a comprehensive modification, while the **1869 Pavilion** at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on **May 4**, the **150th anniversary** of the **Red Stockings'** 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game...more than **20 anniversary park benches**, featuring Reds mascots wearing the **15 throwback uniforms**, are on display at locations across **Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky**.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds won the **first 3 series** of a season vs the Cubs for the first time since they won the **first 5 series** of **2013**, then suffered a **2-1 series loss** in their most recent meeting (7/15-7/17 at Wrigley Field)...over the **previous 4 seasons (2015-2018)**, the Cubs' **.671 winning percentage** vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent...over the **last 4 seasons** the Cubs are **19-18** at **Great American Ball Park**, tied with the **Brewers** for the fourth-best winning percentage (.514) of any team with at least 10 games here (Wsh .769, LAD .615, StL .576)...**Joey Votto** ranks third among all active players with **35 HR** and **115 RBI** against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only **Albert Pujols (57-146)** and **Ryan Braun (39-136)**.

NATIONALS UP NEXT: Over the **last 3 seasons**, including 2019, the Redlegs have lost **14** of their **last 17 games vs Wsh**...the Redlegs haven't won a **season series** vs the **Nationals** since **2015 (5-1)**...in 4 seasons since then the Reds are **6-18 vs Wsh**, including **3-4 in 2016, 1-6 in 2017, 1-6 in 2018 and 1-2** this season.

THE PUNISHER: Rookie **Aristides Aquino** last night became the **29th player** in Reds history to hit **3 HR** in a game:

- Became the **second player** in modern Major League history with **7 HR** in his **first 10 career apps (Col's Trevor Story, 2016)**.
- Became the **second player** in modern Major League history with a **3-homer game** within his **first 10 career games (Bobby Estalella, 10th game, 9/4/1997)**.
- Became the **first Major League rookie** and **first Reds player** to homer in **3 consecutive innings (2nd-4th)**, tying the **Major League record** for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the **13th player** to do it, the second this season (**Chi's Kris Bryant, 5/17 at Wsh, 7th-9th**).
- Became the **second Reds rookie** to homer in **4 consecutive games (Eric Davis, 9/3-9/6, 1984)**.
- Became the **second Reds rookie** with **3 HR in a game (Joey Votto, 2008)**.
- Became the **second Reds batter** this season with **3 HR in a game (Derek Dietrich, 5/28 vs Pit)**...was the **29th Reds player** with at least **3 homers in a game**, accomplished for the **37th time**.
- Has homered in **4 consecutive apps**, 1 shy of the franchise record for consecutive apps with at least 1 HR.
- Since his promotion on 8/1 leads the Major Leagues in **slugging percentage (1.250)**, is tied for the Major League lead in **HR (7)** and ranks among the National League leaders in **batting average (.464, 2nd)**, **RBI (13, T2nd)**, **on-base percentage (.500, 3rd)** and **extra-base hits (8, T3rd)**.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored (98)**, **HR (34)**, **RBI (94)**, **batting average (.312)**, **on-base percentage (.371)** and **slugging percentage (.598)**...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **98-61**, and are **29-7 (.806)** when leading after the first inning...**6 times** this season scored **at least 4 runs** in the first...**3B Eugenio Suárez** leads the Major Leagues with **11 HR** in the first frame while ranking T2nd in the majors with **21 RBI**...**SS José Iglesias** leads the National League in first-inning **batting average (.455)** and ranks second in the NL in **slugging (.864)**...**1B Joey Votto** is among National League first-inning leaders in **extra-base hits (15, T1st)**, **doubles (9, T1st)**, **hits (32, 3rd)**, **slugging percentage (.604, 11th)** and **batting average (.333, T11th)**.

REHABBING: **C Curt Casali**, on the injured list since 7/18 with a **sprained medial collateral ligament** in his **right knee**, on Friday began a rehabilitation assignment with Class AAA **Louisville**, started behind the plate and caught 5 innings of the 3-1 win at Rochester (0-3)...in last night's 6-5 loss in 10 innings, he served as the Bats' designated hitter (0-2).

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used **5 catchers** this season, including **Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol** and **Ryan Lavarnway**...the **3 catchers** on the club's **Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) & Farmer (concussion)** - simultaneously were unable to play for **8 days (7/18-7/25)** until **Barnhart** came off the injured list prior to the game on **7/26**...**Barnhart** and **Farmer** have returned to the active roster...on **7/26**, **Barnhart** filled the roster spot vacated by **Graterol**, who went on the **7-day concussion list**...**Farmer** was reinstated from the 7-day concussion list on **7/28**...he replaced **Lavarnway**, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used **6 catchers** in a season just **7 times** in their history, most recently in **1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)**...also used **6 catchers** in **1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895**...the **1909 Reds** used a club-record **8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pautxis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth)**.

Today's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his third **Major League season** at just **26 years old**, was the Reds' **Opening Day** starter and is a **2019 National League All-Star**...per *Baseball America*, his **changeup** was voted by managers, scouts and executives the **best in the National League**...in his **last 28 apps** beginning **9/1/18** is **14-5** and in that span leads all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of **2.33**...this season ranks among the National League leaders in **wins** (T3rd), **ERA** (4th), **strikeouts** (7th) and **strikeouts per 9 innings** (4th, 10.77)...in his career has allowed **13 HR** in the **first inning**, his highest total in any inning and including **3 HR** in the **first frame** this year...in Mon's 7-4 win vs LAA, his career-high **13 strikeouts** are the most by a Reds pitcher since **Raisel Iglesias** had 13 strikeouts on **8/23/15 vs Ari**...also threw a career-high **119 pitches** (80 strikes)...allowed only solo HR to **Luis Rengifo** in the third inning and to **Mike Trout** in the sixth...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month** for **March/April** (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...since his **Major League debut** in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including **wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts**.

- Made 100 apps for the Bats (.277, 27 2b, 1 3b, 27hr, 70rbi, 16sb)...when promoted was just 1 of just 3 players in professional baseball with at least 27 doubles and 27 HR (Pit's Josh Bell, 34 2b, 27hr & Min's Max Kepler, 27 2b, 30hr).

- For Louisville played 1B (62g, 59gs), 3B (3gs), LF (9gs) and CF (30g, 25gs).
- Was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month for May.
- Wore uniform #82 in Major League spring training camp, his first.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, inf 2nd Half: 21-67 (.313), 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 12rbi

- Has a 5-game hitting streak (7-20, .350, 2 2b, 2rbi)...in 53 apps beginning 5/31 is hitting .294 (40-136, 8 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 20rbi, 1sb), raising his season BA from .199.
- Leads the team with 42 starts at 2B (last, Thu vs Cubs)...made 17 starts at SS (last, Fri & Sat vs Cubs), second-most on the team (José Iglesias, 98gs).
- Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- On 7/30 vs Pit made the first pitching appearance of his career after Amir Garrett and 5 other players were ejected with 2 outs in the top of the ninth inning...threw 4 pitches and induced Jacob Stallings to F8.
- After Eugenio Suárez was ejected by HP umpire Carlos Torres between the first and second innings on 7/19 vs StL, made his first Major League appearance at 3B...made his second appearance at that position on 7/23 at Mil.
- Because of Scooter Gennett injury in spring training, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the starting SS.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf 2nd Half: 28-87 (.322), 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 9rbi, 1sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- Since the All-Star break is hitting .322, raising his season BA from .263.
- His .285 batting average through the game of 8/2 is a season high.
- In the eighth inning of Thu's 12-5 loss vs Cubs, as a part of a double switch made his first Major League appearance at 2B.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf 2nd Half: 28-98 (.286), 12hr, 20rbi

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Since the All-Star break leads the National League lead in HR (12) while ranking among the NL's second-half leaders in slugging percentage (.694, 2nd), RBI (20, T12th) and on-base percentage (.379, 17th).
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 11 HR while ranking T2nd in the majors with 21 RBI...is hitting .330 in the first frame, 14th-best in the National League.
- In his last 12 apps beginning 7/29 is hitting .302 (13-43, 1 2b, 4hr, 5rbi).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 14 of his last 35 apps (16hr, 29rbi), including a pair of 2-homer games (7/1 vs Mil, 7/22 at Mil).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in franchise history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons.
- Received votes for National League Player of the Month for July after leading the NL in HR (12), slugging percentage (.733) and total bases (66, T1st)...also finished among the July leaders in RBI (23, 3rd), OPS (1.086, 3rd) and extra-base hits (15, 5th)...his 12 HR in July were the most by a Reds batter in that month since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008...no Reds batter has hit more than Dunn's 12 HR in July since Frank Robinson hit 13 HR in July 1961.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 18-54 (.333), 5 2b, 4hr, 8rbi

- Has made 21 apps and 12 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day (7/18).
- Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2-for-14 (1rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, .375obp)...in his third stint, from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double in 2 apps (PH, PH-LF-2B-1B-LF).
- Has made 19 starts (12gs in LF, 4gs at 2B, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at DH)...also made 2 apps at 1B and 1 appearance in RF (7/22 at Mil).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is 1 of 4 Reds players to homer in at least 3 straight games (Derek Dietrich 3g, Eugenio Suárez 3g twice, Aristides Aquino 4g).
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b 2nd Half: 25-111 (.225), 6 2b, 4hr, 15rbi

- For the fifth straight season, per *Baseball America* was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
- Last night's first-inning double off Kyle Hendricks was his 865th career hit at Great American Ball Park, the most by any player at GABP (Brandon Phillips, 864).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season...his current on-base streak is at 7 games (.344obp).
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 73 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, including Fri night's off Yu Darvish.

33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 24-74 (.324), 4 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 11rbi

- Among National League leaders since the All-Star break ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.432) and eighth in batting average (.324).
- Hit safely in 8 of his last 12 apps (12-32, .375, 1 2b, 1hr, 4rbi).
- In his last 22 apps beginning 7/18 is hitting .344 (21-61, 4 2b, 2hr, 8rbi).
- Has 3 career leadoff HR, including 2 this season (6/18 vs Hou off Justin Verlander, 7/31 vs Pit off Dario Agrazal).
- Has 15 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 84 starts, including a team-high 57 starts in LF (15gs in CF, 11gs in RF).
