WATCH OUT FOR HIGH WATER: Gleyber Torres hit two homers, Riley Greene homered and stroked a three-run double and Javier Báez added a blast of his own as the Detroit Tigers last night picked up an 11-5 win in the series opener of this three-game set vs. Cincinnati Reds at Comerica Park ... the clubs do it again today as the Tigers aim to remain unbeaten for a sixth-straight series.

- The Tigers have reached 21 games above .500 for the first time this season and the first time overall since the end of the 2013 season when they won the A.L. Central with a 93-69 mark.
- At 46-25, the Tigers have the best record in the majors, half a game ahead of the New York Mets ... the Tigers are off to their best start through 71 games in 19 years when they began 47-24 in 2006 ... the Tigers are now 28-13 in their last 41 games starting April 30 ... the Tigers last night improved to 19-4 in series openers, tops in all of baseball.
- The Tigers have posted a 46-22 record, a .676 winning percentage, in their last 68 games starting March 31 since enduring a three-game sweep to start the season at Dodger Stadium ... their 46-22 record, which is a 110-win pace over 162 games, starting March 31 is the best in all of baseball in that span and 5.5-games up on the Yankees, the next closest A.L. team.
- This homestand with Cincinnati and Pittsburgh concludes a stretch of nine out of 12 games in Detroit, a span that will later extend to 15 of 21 games at home to end the month of June.

HOME WRECKERS: Detroit's 24-9 record in its first 33 home games is the club's best start in 54 years since going 25-8 in 1971 ... in fact, only two times in franchise history have the Tigers started off better at home than in 2025: 1911 and 1971, which were both 25-8 starts ... thanks to Elias.

- Additionally, the Tigers are 8-2 in their first 10 home series this season ... the Tigers have won eight of their first 10 home series for only the third time in the 125-year history of the franchise, joining 1971 (8-1-1) and 1909 (8-0-2) ... thanks to Elias.
- Overall, the Tigers boast the best home record in the A.L. (24-9, .727) and the second-best home mark in all of baseball behind only the New York Mets (27-8, .771).

GREENE WITH ENVY: Riley Greene last night with 2-for-5 with a solo homer and three-run double and now has 201 RBI in his career ... at 24-years-old, Greene is the first Tiger to reach 200 career RBI before the age of 25 since Travis Fryman did so in 1992 at 23 years old ... thanks to Elias.

- Greene has 16 doubles, 14 homers and 48 RBI through 71 team games, which puts him on pace for 37 doubles, 32 homers and 110 RBI in a 162-game season ... last year in his first All-Star campaign, Greene finished up with 27 doubles, 24 homers and 74 RBI.

JACK'S ON FIRE: Tigers starter Jack Flaherty has been on an upswing his last five starts, going 4-1 with a 1.78 ERA (6 ER/30.1 IP) and 0.82 WHIP in those five outings starting May 16 in Toronto.

- Flaherty (5-6) today looks to join teammates Tarik Skubal (7-2) and Casey Mize (6-2) with at least six wins this season ... no team in the A.L. has seen three pitchers win six games this year while only the Mets have done it in all of baseball.

GLEYBER PARTY: Gleyber Torres last night crushed a pair of homers, including his first leadoff blast and multi-homer game as a Tiger, and has now reached base safely in 19 of his last 20 games ... he has turned in a .788 OPS this season, the best OPS by any second baseman in the A.L. and second to only St. Louis' Brendan Donovan (.819) in the majors ... Torres leads all A.L. second basemen with a .373 on-base percentage, and a .271 batting average, and is second in the A.L. with 33 RBI.

CATCHER RISING (ALL?) STAR: Dillon Dingler begins the day with a 2.1 WAR this season, according to Fangraphs ... it leads Tigers position players, is the fourth-highest mark among A.L. catchers and 34th best among all major league position players ... Dingler also ranks second among A.L. catchers with a .283 batting average (53-for-187/min. of 175 plate apps.) and third with a .455 slugging.

PRODUCE SECTION: Spencer Torkelson (16 homers, 47 RBI) and Riley Greene (14 homers, 48 RBI) are the most dynamic duo on offense in the American League, as they are the only set of teammates in the A.L. (and one of two in the majors) to have each reached 14 homers and 48 RBI.

SPENCER'S GIFTS: Spencer Torkelson has 16 homers, 31 extra-base hits and 47 RBI this season, joining Aaron Judge, Cal Raleigh and Taylor Ward as the four players in the A.L. with those totals.

- Torkelson ranks fourth in the A.L. in homers, fifth in RBI and is tied for sixth in extra-base hits ... Torkelson's .346 on-base percentage is currently 51 points higher than last year's .295 mark and his .498 slugging is 124 points higher than last year's .374 mark.

THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE: The Tigers begin the day with the best record in the majors on the strength of a +94 overall run differential this year, trailing only the Yankees (+106) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +85 edge on the second-place Twins (+9), are +113 on the third-place Guardians (-19) and are +117 on the fourth-place Royals (-23).

AND FINALLY: Javier Báez last night reached and surpassed 2,000 career total bases thanks to his singles and home run ... he is one of 36 active players to have reached the mark.

- Enters today's game against Cincinnati having delivered a quality start in each of his last four outings, going 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA (4ER/24.2IP) over that span...came one out shy of a quality start on May 16 against Toronto, allowing two earned runs over 5.2 frames.
- Struck out José Ramírez to end the first inning on May 22 for his 1,000th career strikeout, becoming the 567th player in MLB history to record 1,000 strikeouts.
- Lost a career-high five straight games from April 15 - May 10 this year.
- Flaherty returned to the Tigers this offseason by signing a two-year contract...was with Detroit to start last season before being sent to the Los Angeles Dodgers for catcher Thayron Liranzo and infielder Trey Sweeney on July 30.
- Won the World Series with the Dodgers in 2024...went 1-2 with a 7.36 ERA in five postseason starts and started the final game of the World Series.

- Joins the Tigers on a one-year contract with a club option for the 2026 season.
- Posted a 3.24 ERA (3ER/8.1IP) over eight appearances in spring camp, striking out eight and walking four.
- Spent most of 2024 with the White Sox before joining the Braves for their playoff push on August 31...made five relief appearances for Atlanta in September, posting a 2.70 ERA (2ER/6.2IP) with nine strikeouts and just two walks.
- After missing the entire 2020 season and much of 2021 due to Tommy John surgery, spent 2021-23 with San Francisco and led the NL with 76 relief appearances in 2022...went 6-2 that season, with a 3.18 ERA (24ER/68IP), his lowest ERA since his first big league campaign with St. Louis (2.44 ERA, 50 relief outings).

- Earned a spot on his first career Opening Day roster after a standout spring camp, during which he didn't allow a single earned run over 10.2 innings (nine games) of relief...went 1-0, surrendering seven hits and three walks while striking out nine.
- Appeared in 21 games (three starts) for the Tigers in 2024, posting a 1-1 record with a 1.84 ERA (6ER/29.1IP), six walks and 23 strikeouts...also made 34 appearances with Triple-A Toledo last year, going 1-2 with one save, a 5.17 ERA (27ER/47.0IP) and 53 strikeouts.
- Made his first career Major League start on Aug. 8 at Seattle...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, became the first Tigers pitcher to finish and then start consecutive games since Steve Sparks, who finished the July 26, 2000, game vs. Tampa Bay and started on July 27, 2000, at Texas.

- Was the opener for the first time in 2025 on May 13 against Boston...pitched 1.2 innings, allowing one run on one hit while striking out two.
- Tied for the team lead in strikeouts among relief pitchers with 12 in his 11.2 innings pitched to start the year.
- Spent the entire 2024 season with the Tigers, pitching in 66 games (nine starts) and going 7-2 with eight saves, a 2.19 ERA (23ER/94.1IP) and 77 strikeouts.
