RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals have opened their 135th season of play in the National League by winning the first two games of the regular season against the Tampa Bay Rays at Busch Stadium ... The New York Mets make their annual visit to St. Louis tomorrow for a three-game series ... St. Louis enters today tied with Milwaukee (2-0) for first place in the National League Central Division.

SWEEPSTAKES: The Cardinals have won the opening home series of the season for five consecutive years (2022-present), and with a win today, will have started 3-0 for the second consecutive year and only the 18th time in 135 seasons.

- St. Louis has won seven of its last 10 overall vs. Tampa Bay (Aug. 9, 2023-present) and is looking for only its 2nd series sweep of the Rays all-time (also June 17-19, 2005 at Tropicana Field).
- The franchise record for longest season-opening winning streak belongs to the **1962** Cardinals who started 7-0 against the Mets, Cubs, and Phillies.
- The Cardinals join the Yankees (3-0), Dodgers (3-0), Brewers (2-0), Marlins (2-0), Mets (2-0), Braves (2-0), and Blue Jays (2-0) as the eight undefeated MLB teams this season.

TAKE A BOW, KID: According to OptaStats, **JJ Wetherholt** yesterday became the first player in MLB history to homer in his first career Major League game and then provide a walkoff hit in his second.

- Wetherholt joined **Curt Ford** (June 22, 1985 vs. Chicago Cubs) as the second Cardinal in the Divisional Era (1969-present) with a walk-off hit in his first or second MLB game. - Sarah Langs
- Wetherholt is the 3rd Cardinal with multiple RBI in each of their first two career games, joining **Joe Cunningham** (1954) and **Tom Nieto** (1984) ... No player in MLB history has ever began their career with 2+ RBI in each of his first three career games. - Elias

MAY DAY: **Dustin May** takes the mound for the first time as a Cardinal today while also making his Busch Stadium III debut ... The 28-year-old May is the 27th Cardinal to wear uniform No. 3, but the first pitcher to have worn the number; notable former Cardinals to wear #3 include **Édgar Rentería**, **Brian Jordan**, **Carlos Beltrán**, and most recently **Dylan Carlson**.

SILVER AND GOLD: In a pregame ceremony at Busch Stadium today, Louisville Slugger will present **Alec Burleson** with his 2025 NL Silver Slugger Utility Award, while Rawlings recognizes shortstop **Masyn Winn** with his 2025 NL Gold Glove Award.

MARCH MADNESS: St. Louis is 10-10 all-time in March games during the regular season (5-3 at Busch Stadium III) ... 20 different Cardinals have homered in the month of March, led by five bombs by **Paul Goldschmidt** ... The five active Cardinals with March home runs are **Nolan Gorman** (1), **Victor Scott II** (1), **Pedro Pages** (1), **JJ Wetherholt**, and **Alec Burleson** (1).

KEEP SMILING: Happy 27th birthday to Cardinals utility player **José Fermín** ... Other notables born on this date include former Cardinals **Brian Jordan** (age 59), **Gerónimo Peña** (age 59), **Mike Ramsey** (age 72) and **Cy Young** (1867-1955), Braves first baseman **Matt Olson** (32), former All-Star pitchers **Danny Kolb** (51) and **Denny McLain** (82), tennis champion **Jennifer Capriati** (50), supermodel **Elle MacPherson** (62), MLB executive **Billy Beane** (64), basketball Hall of Famer **Walt "Clyde" Frazier** (81), and former President **John Tyler** (1790-1862).

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (March 29, 2019): In only his second game as a Cardinal, **Paul Goldschmidt** hits three home runs to power St. Louis to a 9-5 win over Milwaukee at Miller Park ... Goldschmidt joined **Stan Musial**, **Mark Whiten**, **Albert Pujols**, and **Matt Carpenter** (and later **Paul DeJong** on July 24, 2019 at Pittsburgh) as the only Cardinals to finish a game with 4+ hits, 3+ homers and 5+ RBI; became the first player in MLB history to have a three-homer performance in one of his first two games with a club; and became the first player with a multi-homer game in his first two games as a Cardinal since **Buddy Bradford** (1975 at Philadelphia).

FIGHTING ILLINI: Congrats to the University of Illinois Fighting Illini Men's Basketball team that reached the NCAA Final Four for the first time since 2005 when 20-year-old **Carson Shipley** served as Student Manager for **Bruce Weber** and the NCAA Tournament Runner-Up Illini squad ... The Cardinals, Blues, Battlehawks, and Illinois all won yesterday.

TAMPA & ST. PETERSBURG CONNECTIONS

Matthew Liberatore was originally selected by Tampa Bay in the 1st round (16th overall) in the 2018 MLB Draft, making him the highest drafted high school player in Rays franchise history... pitched two seasons (2018-19) in the Rays minor league organization...traded to St. Louis with **Edgardo Rodríguez** and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP **Tink Hence**) for **José Martínez**, **Randy Arozarena** and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF **Alika Williams**), Jan. 9, 2020.

MLB's Fastest Friends **Victor Scott II** and **Chandler Simpson** are both Atlanta natives...were teammates on the 2021 Fond du Lac Dock Spiders... Co-led Minor League Baseball in 2023 with 94 stolen bases...Scott II aka "Argo" recently released a rap music album that featured Simpson.

Ryne Stanek pitched parts of his first three seasons with the Rays (2017-19)...was selected by Tampa Bay in the 1st round (29th overall) in the 2013 MLB Draft.

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **Chaim Bloom** worked 15 years in the Rays baseball operations department, including the final three as Senior Vice President, Baseball Operations.

Oliver Marmol attended Dr. Phillips High School in nearby Orlando.

Steven Matz pitched parts of four seasons in St. Louis (2022-25)...traded to Boston for INF **Blaze Jordan** (July 31, 2025).

Richie Palacios played in 32 games for St. Louis in 2023...Traded to Tampa Bay for RHP **Andrew Kittredge** (Jan. 5, 2024).

Brandon Allen played in seven games for Tampa Bay in 2021.

Ryan Vilade played in seven games for St. Louis in 2025. Rays Comm. Director. **Elvis Martínez** spent 2017 in the Cards organization as a Baseball Operations Fellow & GCL Cardinals Coordinator in Jupiter, Fla.

Hall of Fame Manager **Tony La Russa** is a Tampa native...raised in Ybor City and graduated from Jefferson High School in Tampa...earned undergraduate degree from the Univ. of South Florida.

The Rays selected C **Mike DiFelice** in the first round (#10 overall) and OF **Kerry Robinson** in the second round (#22 overall) from the Cardinals in the 1997 MLB Expansion Draft.

Cards Baseball Info. & Media Services Mgr. **Chris Tunno** graduated from Stetson Univ...worked in Sports Info at Stetson & Univ. of Central Florida.

Rays Communications Specialist/Spanish Interpreter **Kevin Vera** graduated from nearby Lafayette High School...worked at Saint Louis University as an Athletic Media Relations Assistant.

Rays broadcaster **Dewayne Staats** is a graduate of SIU-Edwardsville, where he began his sports career with WSIE Radio...won an Emmy Award as the sports director at KPLR TV in St. Louis.

TODAY'S GAME:

- The 28-year-old **Dustin May** makes his 1st career appearance with the Cardinals after signing a free-agent deal (2026 with mutual option for 2027) in December.
- St. Louis becomes his 3rd team, having previously pitched for the Dodgers (2019-25) & Red Sox (2025).
- Is making his 1st career appearance at Busch Stadium.**
- His next win will be the 20th of his career and needs three strikeouts for 300 career.
- In regular season play is facing Tampa Bay for the 2nd time in his career and for the first time since 9/18/19 when he gained a Hold with 2.0 scoreless IP in relief at Dodger Stadium. Worked 3.0 IP over two relief appearances vs. Tampa Bay during the 2020 World Series.
- Dustin made his 2nd career MLB start against the Cardinals on 8/7/19 at Dodger Stadium in a 2-1 Los Angeles win.
- Is the 27th Cardinal to wear uniform No. 3, but the first Cardinals pitcher to have worn the number:** notable former Cardinals to wear #3 are **Édgar Rentería, Brian Jordan, Carlos Beltrán** and most recently **Dylan Carlson**.
- Went 0-1 with a 1.54 ERA in three Grapefruit League starts and he also started Exhibition game at Springfield (AA) on Monday, March 23.

LAST TIME OUT (Monday, March 23 at Springfield (AA): ND, W, 3-2; 4.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 0 BB, 4 SO, 61 pitches.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

CHANGES IN LATITUDES: Began the season with the Dodgers before a trade at the deadline sent him to Boston for the remainder of the season.

THE WAITING IS THE HARDEST PART: When he made his season debut on April 1 vs. Atlanta, was his first action in a Major League game in 685 days dating back to May 17, 2023.

CAREER MAN: Posted career-highs with 23 starts and 25 appearances. His 132.1 innings were his most since 2018 when he pitched 132.2 innings in the minor leagues.

START ME UP: Made 18 starts as a member of the Dodgers before he was traded, 3rd-most on the squad behind only Yoshinobu Yamamoto (30) and Clayton Kershaw (22).

STARTING HOT: Began the season with 14 straight starts of 5.0 innings pitched or more, T-10th longest streak with José Berríos (TOR) and trailing Paul Skenes (16, PIT) and Jake Irvin (16, WSH) for 8th. Streak was broken at KC (6/27) with a 4.0-inning start in which he allowed four runs over the first two innings in a no-decision the Dodgers won 5-4.

SEVEN HEAVEN: Pitched a season-high 7.0 innings vs. CWS (7/3), with a season-high nine strikeouts.

SHO-STOPPER: Made two relief appearances vs. MIN (7/21) and vs. CLE (9/3). Pitched 4.2 scoreless innings in relief of Shohei Ohtani and earned the win, his final win as a member of the Dodgers.

FINAL CHAPTER: Went on the 15-day Injured List following the Cleveland appearance with right elbow neuritis and finished the season on the I.L.

HELP WANTED: Received two runs of support or less in 12 starts including five with zero run support.

NOT THE IDEAL ENDING: Lost his final three starts of the season with the Red Sox, tying his longest career losing streak. Received two runs once and zero runs of support twice.

CAREER:

- Carries three World Championship rings as a member of the Los Angeles Dodgers. Played in the 2020 World Series at the neutral site at Globe Life Field, home of the Texas Rangers. Was on the Injured List during the 2024 World Series. Was traded before the Dodgers won the World Series in 2025.
- Became the first Dodgers rookie to make an Opening Day start when he took the mound on July 24, 2020 in place of injured Clayton Kershaw. The last Dodgers rookie to make an Opening Day start was Fernando Valenzuela in 1981.
- Missed the entire 2024 season recovering from Tommy John surgery repairing a torn flexor tendon in his right arm from July 2023 and an esophageal tear in July.
- Required Tommy John surgery performed by Dr. Neal ElAttrache, May 11, 2021 following a start at Milwaukee 10 days earlier on May 1 in which he tore his ulnar collateral ligament (UCL).
- Pitched for the National League in the 2019 Sirius XM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field in Cleveland. Pitched a scoreless 3rd inning in the game. Was teammates with current Cardinals infielder Nolan Gorman.
- Led all Major League pitchers averaging 99.1 MPH on his fastball during the 2020 season (min. 250 pitches).

MAY VS. TAMPA BAY:

- In regular season play is facing Tampa Bay for the 2nd time in his career and for the first time since 9/18/19 when he gained a Hold with 2.0 scoreless IP in relief at Dodger Stadium. Worked 3.0 IP over two relief appearances vs. Tampa Bay during the 2020 World Series.
- Is 6-4 with a 3.98 ERA in 17 career games (13 starts) in Interleague play with 84 strikeouts in 74.2 IP.
- Owens an 0-3 career mark vs. AL East teams in 5 games (3 starts).

NEWS TO KNOW: Made Cardinals debut on Thu. (3/26)...delivered scoreless outings in 5 of last 6 Grapefruit League apps. (1.50 ERA) ... Tied for team lead with 8 Grapefruit League apps. ... Makes his 2nd career Opening Day roster and 1st since 2022 with the Dodgers.

GIVE ME A FIFTH: Former non-drafted free agent looking to appear in games with 5th Major League club, previously appearing in 94 total games with LAD (65), TOR (15), COL (7) and PIT (7) ... Signed as a free agent with the Reds in 2024, but did not pitch in an MLB game.

BANNER YEAR: Pitched in 15 games in relief for AL Champion Toronto, as well a 0.1 IP relief outing in Game 2 of the 2025 ALDS vs. NYY.

WHIRLWIND OFFSEASON: Acquired by Cleveland from Toronto in exchange for cash considerations on 12/17/25, and acquired by St. Louis from Cleveland in exchange for cash considerations on 1/6/26.

vs. AL: Delivered scoreless outings in 7 of his 11 appearances against AL teams in 2025. **vs. RAYS:** Has not allowed a run in 3 of his 4 career appearances against TB, including his final regular-season outing of 2025, tossing 1.0 perfect frame with 2 K's.

NOTABLE:

- Pitched a scoreless 5th inning with 1 strikeout in the exhibition game Monday at Double-A Springfield.
- Has held LHBs to a .224 AVG (36-161) and .580 OPS in his career.
- Posted a 3.66 xERA in 2025 w/ TOR, and his +1.61 difference between his actual ERA (5.27) and xERA was the 2nd-largest difference on the team (min. 25 balls in play).
