## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (62-36) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (50-48) July 21, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - GAME \#99/HOME \#49 RHP TYLER PHILLIPS (1-0, 4.50 ERA) vs. LHP MARCO GONZALES (1-0, 2.45 ERA)

THE PIRATES:...improved to 10-5 this month with last night's win...Are tied with Arizona for the best record in the National League while also being tied for the second-best record in all of MLB this month (Detroit has a league-best 11-4 record in July)...Are two games over . 500 for the first time since being 13-11 on 4/23... Have won 11 games in their last at-bat (the most since winning 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone 37-3 (.925 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have drawn at least one walk in 63 straight games, which is the longest active streak in MLB (the longest streak for the season is 75 straight games by the Phillies from $4 / 15$ to $7 / 9$ )...Have played in 32 one-run games, which are the second-most among National League teams behind the Cubs (34)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (46) in MLB behind the Mariners ( 60 ), Phillies (53) and Royals (50)...Have the fourth-best ERA (3.56) among all starting rotations in MLB behind the Phillies (3.26), Mariners (3.34) and Royals (3.48)...Rank fourth in all of MLB in stolen base percentage ( 82.5 percent) behind the Brewers ( 84.4 percent), Reds ( 82.6 percent) and Mets ( 82.6 percent)...Have gone $11-2$ on the 13 occasions the team has stolen multiple bases in a game this year...Have won nine straight and 12 of their last 13 games when scoring at least four runs...Have gone 16-2 since the beginning of June when scoring first in a game.

FULL HOUSE: The Pirates have been sold out each of the first two games of this weekend series against the Phillies...The last time the Pirates sold out three consecutive games was from August 20-22, 2015, doing so in each of the first three games of a four-game series against the Giants...The last time the Pirates sold out each game of a three-game series came against the Dodgers from August 7-9, 2015...The PNC Park attendance record for a three-game series is 118,324, which came against Boston from June 24-26, 2011...A total of 78,644 fans have attended the first two games of this series.

CHECKING THE BROOM CLOSET: The Pirates will look to sweep their second straight series and third series of this season this afternoon...Pittsburgh closed out the first half of the season with a three-game sweep of the White Sox last weekend in Chicago...The Pirates also swept Miami in four games on the road to begin the 2024 campaign...Pittsburgh's last three-game sweep against the Phillies at PNC Park was from June 12-14, 2015... Pittsburgh's last sweep at PNC Park came from June 27-29 of last season against the Padres.

THE CALL TO THE HALL: Former long-time Pirates manager Jim Leyland will be inducted today into the National Baseball Hall of Fame today...Leyland, who was elected to the Hall of Fame by the Contemporary Era Committee, managed 11 of his 22 years as a member of the Pirates...He will be the 44th former player, manager or executive in the Hall of Fame who spent some of their professional careers with the Pirates.

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz has knocked in nine runs in his last four games, which marks the
first time he has recorded an RBI in four straight games since July 24-28, 2022...Cruz' 14 RBI this month are tied for the seventhmost among National League players (Bryan Reynolds is tied for fifth in the NL with 15 RBI this month)...Cruz' 50 RBI this season are tied for the fourth-most in MLB among shortstops behind Willy Adames (67), Bobby Witt Jr. (66) and Gunnar Henderson (63).

REYNOLDS ROLLING: Bryan Reynolds comes into today leading all of MLB with 23 hits this month... Since the beginning of last month, he ranks fourth in all of MLB with a .347 average... The only three players to hit for a higher average since the beginning of last month are Carlos Correa (.360), Bobby Witt Jr. (.358) and Aaron Judge (.353).

GOING STREAKING: The Pirates have won a season-high six straight games...The Bucs have outscored their opponents 32-15 during their current six-game streak, which is the longest since also winning six in a row from May 30 to June 5 of last season.... A win today would give the Bucs their first seven-game winning streak since April 17-23 of last season.

CUTCH'S HOMERS: Andrew McCutchen connected for his 13th home run of the season with his 431 -foot shot Saturday night (his third-longest homer of the year)...McCutchen's 13 home runs are now tied with Willie Stargell in 1977 for the third-most by a Pirate in a season among players 37 or older...The only Pirate to hit more homers in his age 37 season or older is Willie Stargell ( 32 in 1979 and 28 in 1978).


## ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 21, 2007: The Pirates retired Hall of Famer Paul Waner's No. 11 jersey in a pregame ceremony prior to facing the Astros. Waner became the ninth person in Pirates history to have his number retired. Following the ceremony, the Bucs beat the Astros 7-3. Paul Maholm started and picked up the win while Jason Bay and Adam LaRoche knocked in two runs apiece.

HOW ACQUIRED: From the Braves in exchange for cash considerations on 12/5/23

STARTING OFF: The 32 -year-old lefthander is in his first season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Braves for cash considerations on December 5, 2023... Gonzales is in his 10th Major League season, having played for the Cardinals (2014-17), Mariners (2017-2023) and Pirates (2024)...He was originally selected in the first round (19th overall) of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft out of Gonzaga University by the St. Louis Cardinals.

BACK IN ACTION: Gonzales was reinstated from the 60 -day injured list prior to his last start on July 12 at Chicago-AL while recovering form a left forearm muscle strain.

- Made two rehab starts with Triple-A Indianapolis on July 1 at Louisville and July 6 vs. Louisville, combining to allow five runs on seven hits with six strikeouts in 7.1 innings of work.

LAST TIME OUT: Gonzales made his first start since April 29 on July 12 at Chicago-AL, earning his first win as a Pirate after allowing just one run on seven hits with four strikeouts and no walks in 5.0 innings of work.

AGAINST THE PHILLIES: Gonzales will be making his third career start and appearance against the Phillies, against whom he's 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER in 11.0 IP).

- He made the start against Philadelphia earlier this season on April 13 at Citizens Bank Park but did not factor in the decision after he allowed two runs on six hits with five strikeouts against three walks in 6.0 innings pitched....He was placed on the injured list the next morning with a left forearm muscle strain.

A RAY OF SUNSHINE: Today will be Gonzales' fourth start of the season during a day game, with his only nighttime outing coming in his last start on July 12 at Chicago-AL.. He has posted a 2.65 ERA ( 5 ER in 17.0 IP) and 234 opponents average in his day game starts this season.

A FAIRLY NEW FACE: Gonzales is making just his third career start and appearance at PNC Park, where he's gone 1-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 ER in 13.0 IP) with eight strikeouts against no walks with a .234 opponents batting average.

- He's made just one start at home as a member of the Pirates - April 7 vs. Baltimore (ND; 2 ER in 6.0 IP).

LIMITING LEFTIES: Gonzales has held left-handed hitters to a . 167 average (3-for-18) with just one extra-base hit (a home run).

- He has not faced a left-handed hitter since April 13 at Philadelphia (2-for-8 that day) as he didn't face a lefty vs. Chicago-AL in his last outing.
