TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue the homestand with the 3rd and final game against the San Francisco Giants (1-1)...tomorrow, the Mariners will open a 3-game set against the Cincinnati Reds to wrap up the homestand...today's game will be televised live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** as field analyst...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners beat the Giants by a 4-3 score in 10 innings last night to even the series... Seattle is 41-24 (.631) when they homer and 34-14 (.708) when they score 4+ runs...the Mariners are 32-22 (.593) when their starter goes 6.0+ innings and 12-5 (.709) when their starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

- **Seas the Day** - Seattle is 13-5 (.722) in day games at home this season, the 2nd-best record in the Majors behind only the Brewers (17-5/.773)...overall this season, the Mariners are 20-16 (.556) in day games, ranking 7th in MLB.
- **Ounch!** - **Randy Arozarena** drew a pair of hit-by-pitches in last night's game...his 54 career HBP with Seattle passed Jay Buhner (53 HBP) for the 5th-most in franchise history...since his MLB debut in 2019, his 114 career HBP rank 4th in the Majors.
- **Raleigh Close to Cruz** - With his next home run, **Cal Raleigh** (currently at 162 career HR) would tie Nelson Cruz (163 HR with Seattle) for 6th on the franchise's all-time home runs list.
- **Rehab Update** - INF/OF **Brendan Donovan** continued his rehab assignment with Triple-A Tacoma on Friday, serving as the DH...he made his first rehab appearance on Wednesday with the ACL Mariners... Donovan has been on the IL since May 16 with left groin muscle strain.

MARINERS REINSTATE JULIOOOOOO...yesterday the Mariners reinstated center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** from the 7-day Injured List (concussion)...he gave Seattle the win on a sacrifice fly in the 10th inning, his 2nd career walk-off plate appearance...over the course of his career, Julio has been an excellent second-half hitter...including last night's game, he is batting .296 (269x910) with 156 runs, 48 doubles, 3 triples, 59 homers, 156 RBI and 38 stolen bases with a .549 slugging percentage and .898 OPS in 221 career games after the All-Star Break (2022-c)...his OPS is nearly 160 points higher in the second half than the first half (career .739 in first half), while his slugging percentage is 130 points higher than the first half (career .419 in first half)...in a corresponding move for his reinstatement, infielder/outfielder **Miles Mastrobuoni** was designated for assignment.

WALTER'S WORLD...in 19 starts this season, today's starter **Logan Gilbert** has posted a 3.32 ERA (42 ERA, 114.0 IP) with 119 strikeouts and just 24 walks for a 0.991 WHIP...among Major League starters this season, he ranks 5th in WHIP, 5th in walks-per-9 innings (1.89), 8th in strikeout-to-walk rate (4.96) and T-5th in lowest walk rate (5.3%)...over his last 4 starts at T-Mobile Park (6/2-c), Gilbert is 4-0 with an impressive 1.73 ERA (5 ER, 26.0 IP), 33 strikeouts and 4 walks.

WELL DONE, YOUNG...second baseman **Cole Young** last night went 2-for-4 with a game-tying, 3-run home run with 2 outs in the 7th inning...Young leads the Majors in game-tying or go-ahead RBI in the 7th inning-or-later this season with 8 such RBI...over his last 30 games (6/11-c), Young has posted a .827 OPS with 4 doubles and 8 home runs for a .523 slugging percentage over 115 plate appearances...Young leads AL second basemen and ranks T-3rd among MLB second basemen with 3.1 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) this season...he is on pace to join Ken Griffey Jr. (4x), Alex Rodriguez (3x), **Julio Rodríguez** (2x) and Ruppert Jones as Mariners to post a 3.0+ bWAR season at age-22 or younger.

OUTSTANDING ARMS...the Mariners pitching staff has excelled in 2026, ranking 1st in MLB in SO/BB (3.43), 1st in fewest BB/9 (2.54), 1st in fewest HR/9 (0.97), 4th in FanGraphs Wins Above Replacement (13.4), T-3rd in WHIP (1.18), 7th in ERA (3.62) and 10th in strikeouts (846).

EL FUEGO DE LOS MOCHIS...closer **Andrés Muñoz** has been flawless in his last 11 appearances (6/16-c), not allowing a run with 16 strikeouts and 4 walks, limiting opponents to a .135 batting average (5x37) with a 0.82 WHIP...during that span, Muñoz's 39.0% strikeout rate ranks T-9th among MLB relievers (min. 10.0 IP) along with Mason Miller-SD.

RANDY THE ALL-STAR...in 91 games this season, left fielder **Randy Arozarena** is batting .281 (93x331) with 60 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, 37 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .377 clip, slugging .450 with an .827 OPS this season...Randy is coming off his third All-Star selection (2023, '25-'26) and second with Seattle after being named an All-Star in back-to-back seasons...he became the 15th player in Mariners history to make multiple All-Star teams with the club...Randy went 1-for-2 for the American League as Seattle's sole representative in the 2026 MLB All-Star Game.

IN THE 'ZONE...over his last 36 games (5/30-c), **Dominic Canzone** is batting .291 (34x117) with 17 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 19 RBI and 11 walks, getting on base at a .357 clip, slugging .598 with a .955 OPS...overall this season, Canzone has set a career-high games played (85) and is batting .261 (61x234) with 33 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 15 home runs, 40 RBI, a .332 OBP and slugging .517 for an .849 OPS and 140 OPS+...his 15 home runs lead the Mariners, ranking ahead of **Luke Raley** and **Julio Rodríguez** with 14 apiece.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...remaining highlights on the Mariners current against the Giants and Reds homestand include **00's Pin Day** today to wrap up 00's Weekend, **Mariners Crossbody Bag Night** on Monday and a **Mariners Value Game** on Tuesday.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** last night gave the Mariners the win on a walk-off sacrifice fly in the 10th inning, his 2nd career walk-off plate appearance and first since his walk-off single on May 30, 2024 vs. Boston...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...the Mariners have recorded 7 walk-off plate appearances this season, ranking T-2nd in the Majors along with the White Sox and trailing only the Cubs (10 PA), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...since 2024, Seattle leads the Major Leagues in walk-off plate appearances with 28?...they rank ahead of the next closest Mets and Cubs (24 PA)...**J.P. Crawford** and **Randy Arozarena** both rank among the leaders in walk-off PAs during that span with 4 each, ranking T-6th in MLB.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JULY 19

- **1994** - Four Kingdome ceiling tiles fall prior to game vs. Baltimore, causing the first game postponement in Kingdome history.
- **1998** - Alex Rodriguez hits home run #30 on the year and becomes the third shortstop in history to have two or more seasons with at least 30 home runs.
- **2014** - Félix Hernández tied an American League record with his 12th consecutive start of at least 7.0 innings allowing 2 or fewer earned runs in a no-decision vs. the Angels. Felix tied the AL record held by Chief Bender from June-August 1907.
- **2016** - Edwin Díaz records his 39th strikeout, the most in Major League history (since 1913) in a reliever's first 20.0 career innings or fewer. Díaz had thrown 39 strikeouts over 19.2 innings pitched in his first 19 career appearances.
- **2025** - **Cole Young** singled in the 11th inning scoring **Dominic Canzone** for the walk-off 7-6 win over the Astros...it marked his 2nd walk-off plate appearance, and is the first Mariners player age 21-or-younger with a walk-off hit since Alex Rodriguez in 1996.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT ...

- Gilbert, 29, is making his 20th start of the season and the 166th start of his career...also marks his 1st start against the Giants this season and just the 2nd of his career.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummaw on June 16, 2018.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for June 15-21, marking the second time he has won the award (also: July 3-9, 2023).

LAST TIME OUT...L#6 on July 11 at Tampa Bay...threw 6.2 innings and allowed 4 runs (4 ER) on 9 hits and 2 walks with 5 strikeouts...has reached the 7th inning in 7 starts this season, including each of his last 5 consecutive starts (6/16-c)...has struck out 5+ batters in each of his last 11 consecutive starts, the 7th-longest such streak in 2026 and 4th-longest active streak.

1000 AND COUNTING...recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in hist last start on July 11 vs. TB (2nd inning, Jonny DeLuca)...became the fifth pitcher in Mariners history to record 1,000+ strikeouts with Seattle, joining Félix Hernández (2,524 strikeouts), Randy Johnson (2,162), Jamie Moyer (1,239) and Mark Langston (1,039)...Gilbert joined King Félix as the only right-handers to tally 1,000+ strikeouts in a Mariners uniform...per *Elias Sports*, Logan became the fastest Mariner (944.0 IP) to notch his 1,000th career strikeout, compared to Johnson (957.1 IP), Langston (1101.2), Hernández (1107.2) and Moyer (1642.1).

HOME SWEET HOME...is 4-0 with a 1.73 ERA (5 ER, 26.0 IP) and 33 strikeouts across his last 4 starts at home (6/2-c)...his 33 strikeouts at home since June 2 rank 2nd-most in MLB, trailing only Zack Wheeler-PHI (34 SO)...has historically pitched well at home across his career: among qualifying pitchers at home since 2021, he ranks 2nd in BB/9 (1.62), 2nd in K/BB (6.31), 3rd in WHIP (0.98), 6th in strikeout rate (28.1%), 7th in strikeouts (524), and 10th in K/9 (9.98).

LATEST STRETCH...is 5-2 with a 2.20 ERA (14 ER, 57.1 IP) and 62 strikeouts to 12 walks allowed across his last 9 starts (5/22-c) with the Mariners going 7-2 in his last 9 starts...his 57.1 innings pitched since May 22 are 2nd-most in MLB across that span (trails Sandy Alcantara-MIA, 61.0 IP)...among pitchers with min. 50.0 innings pitched since May 22, he ranks 2nd in baserunners allowed (51), trailing only Drew Rasmussen-TB (50 BR), and 3rd in ERA (2.20), trailing only Foster Grif-fin-WSH (1.49) and Jesús Luzardo-PHI (2.14).

PLENTY OF PUNCHIES...has thrown 7+ strikeouts in 5 of his last 7 starts since June 2, tied for the 5th-most such starts in MLB across that span...his 68 career starts of 7+ strikeouts are 9th-most in MLB since 2021 (when Gilbert debuted).

SO WE MEET AGAIN...is making just his 2nd career start against the Giants, last throwing a complete game shutout across 9.0 innings at San Francisco on July 4, 2023...in that start, he threw 105 pitches, allowed just 5 baserunners (5 H, 0 BB) with 7 strikeouts and threw a three-pitch 2nd inning, just the 3rd in franchise history...he became Seattle's first pitcher to throw a shutout since Yusei Kikuchi in Toronto on Aug. 18, 2019.

IN HIS SUNDAY BEST...is 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (2 ER, 19.1 IP) and 24 strikeouts to 3 walks across 3 Sunday starts this season...also owns a 0.57 WHIP while limiting batters to a .129 average (8x62) in those 3 starts...across 28 career starts on Sunday, he is 14-6 with a 2.96 ERA (54 ER, 164.0 IP), 186 strikeouts to 32 walks, 0.21 SO/9, and a 0.91 WHIP while limiting batters to a .196 average (118x602).

STAY OFF MY BASEPATHS...has allowed 1-or-fewer baserunners over 6.0+ innings in 2 games this season (5/10 at CWS and 7/4 vs. TOR) and is 1 of just 3 pitchers with multiple such games this season (also: Reid Detmers-LAA and Drew Rasmussen-TB)...Gilbert has allowed 5-or-fewer baserunners over 6.0+ innings in 5 starts this season (last: 7/4 vs. TOR) and in 47 games across his career, 2nd-most in MLB since 2021 trailing only Zack Wheeler-PHI (57 G)...is averaging 9.32 baserunners-per-nine innings in 2026 which ranks 5th in MLB (min. 100 IP)...his 9.74 BR/9 across his career ranks 5th in MLB since 2021 (min. 600 IP).

ONE-HIT WONDERS...has tossed 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (4/3 at LAA and 5/6 vs. ATL) and in 4 career starts...Gilbert, **Bryan Woo**, and **Emerson Hancock** are 3 of 14 pitchers with multiple games of 6.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer hits allowed this season...the Mariners pitching staff has combined for 7 such games this year (Woo 2x, Hancock 2x, Gilbert 2x, Miller), which are most in MLB this season and are most in a single season in franchise history.

WHERE HE RANKS...among qualified pitchers in the AL this season, he ranks 3rd in innings pitched (114.0), 3rd in WHIP (0.99), 4th in BB/9 (1.89), 6th in K/BB (4.96), 8th in strikeouts (119), and 9th in strikeout rate (26.5%)...among qualified starting pitchers in the AL since 2021, he ranks 1st in starts (165) and strikeouts (1003), 2nd in innings pitched (949.1 IP), 4th in quality starts (78), T-6th in wins (54), T-6th in WHIP (1.05), 9th in K/BB (4.89), and 10th in BB/9 (1.94)...his 90 career starts of 6.0+ innings pitched are 3rd-most in the AL since 2021.

GET A WHIFF OF THIS...has recorded 15+ swings and misses in each of his last 7 consecutive starts since June 2, including a season-high 21 whiffs on June 9 vs. NYM which is tied for 4th-most in a single start in his career...his 122 total swings and misses since June 2 are tied for 2nd-most in MLB across that span, alongside Cristopher Sánchez-PHI and trailing Zack Wheeler-PHI (135)...his 272 swings and misses this season are 7th-most in MLB and are 4th-most in the American League, trailing only Jacob DeGrom-TEX (287), Dylan Cease-TOR (284) and Jose Soriano-LAA (275)...his 2,181 career swings and misses are 5th-most in MLB since 2021...is the only American League pitcher with 2,000+ whiffs since 2021 (2,166), ranking ahead of next closest: Tarik Skubal-DET (1,967).

WALTER'S WORLD...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer runs allowed in 7 starts this season including 5 of his last 8 starts (5/27-c)...his 7 such starts lead the Mariners' rotation and are tied for 5th-most among AL pitchers this season...his 46 such starts across his career are 5th-most among American League pitchers since 2021...among that list, **George Kirby** ranks 8th (42 G) and **Luis Castillo** ranks 10th (38 G).

HENRY'S DAD SHOVES...was named AL Player of the Week for June 15-21 after tossing a combined 13.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 5 hits (1 HR) with 3 walks and 18 strikeouts...across the 2 starts, he held opponents to a .116 average (5x43) with only 1 XBH allowed and a .401 OPS.
