## **ORIOLES NOTES**

- Fell to the Marlins by a score of 7-3 tonight at Oriole Park, dropping to 34-65 overall this season and 16-31 at home...Their loss tonight snapped a season-high-tying three-game win streak...Have lost five-straight games against the Marlins at Oriole Park dating back to last season; are 3-11 against Miami at home dating back to 2006...Have hit multiple home runs in five-straight games for the first time since doing so in 10-straight from 7/17-27/19...Orioles pitchers allowed three-or-more home runs for the 18th time this year and the first since 7/11; are 2-16 in such games...Baltimore gave up 15 hits for the 11th time this season; are 0-11 in such games.
- RHP Spenser Watkins suffered his first-career loss, throwing a season-low 4.0 innings and allowing a career-high four runs on nine hits and one walk, while striking out one... Entering tonight, Watkins had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his past three starts...Gave up the second home run of his career to C Sandy León in the second inning to give the Marlins a 3-0 lead; entering tonight he had allowed just one run in the first three innings of a start...Threw 87 pitches, 56 strikes.
- RHP Conner Greene became the 12th Oriole, 10th pitcher, to make his Major League debut for the O's this season when he entered in relief in the eighth inning...Struck out LF Magneuris Sierra, the first batter he faced, for his first-career strikeout.
- LF Austin Hays hit his 10th home run of the year to put the O's on the board in the fourth inning...The ball traveled 409 feet and left the bat at 108.7 MPH, the second hardest-hit ball of his career, trailing a 5/14 home run (110.3 MPH)...Has recorded an extra-base hit in a career-high four-straight games in which he has an at-bat.
- CF Cedric Mullins hit his 17<sup>th</sup> home run of the year in the sixth inning; has now hit safely in 10-straight home games...It was his first home run since 7/6, snapping a streak of 12 games and 52 at-bats without a long ball...Mullins has hit safely in 14 of his 17 games in July in which he has an at-bat.
- DH Trey Mancini doubled in the fifth and eighth innings, extending his hitting streak to a season-high nine games; is the ninth time in his career he's doubled twice in a game and the second time this season (also: 5/21)...Mancini has recorded an extrabase hit in a career-high-tying five games (also: 8/25-29/18); entering today his four-straight games with an extra-base hit were tied for the longest such streak in MLB...His nine-game hit streak is tied for the fourth-longest of his career, and his longest since hitting in 11-straight from 9/13-24/19.

## **MARLINS NOTES**

- Beat the Orioles by a score of 7-3 tonight at Oriole Park, improving to 44-57 overall this season and 20-34 on the road...With their win tonight, the Marlins improved to 28-9 against the Orioles all-time; their highest winning percentage against any team...Tonight marked their fifth-straight win at Oriole Park since last season; they have won 10 of their past 12 games in Baltimore dating back to 2016... After splitting a two-game series in Miami (4/20-21) the Marlins must win tomorrow to clinch their eighth-straight season series win dating back to 2001...Marlins batters hit three-or-more home runs for the 10<sup>th</sup> time this season, and the second time in as many games; recorded 15 hits for the fifth time this year, are 5-0 when recording 15-or-more hits...Seven Marlins recorded two-or-more hits, one shy of their franchise record; is the first time at least seven different players recorded multiple hits in a game since 7/26/17 (8).
- RHP Sandy Alcántara earned the win in his first career start against the O's, improving to 3-5 in 13-career starts against the American League...Threw 6.0-plus innings, allowing three runs on six hits and one walk, while striking out five in his first start since 7/16 after being reinstated from the bereavement list on 7/25...Of his 21 starts this season, 16 have gone at least 6.0 innings...Allowed two home runs for the second time this year (also: 7/16 [G1])...Threw 86 pitches, 62 strikes.
- C Sandy León hit his third home run of the season, and 30th of his career, in the second inning to give the Marlins a 3-0 lead; the home run came on the eighth pitch of the at-bat...It was his first homer since 7/4 snapping a 12-game, 32 at-bat homerless streak...The ball traveled 403 feet, tied for the fifth farthest of his career...It is the fourth Eutaw Street home run, and second by an opponent, this season, and the 110th all-time, 60th by an opponent, and first by a Marlin...Singled in the fourth inning for his sixth multi-hit game of the year, and first since 7/4.
- 1B Lewin Diaz recorded his first-career multi-hit game, going 2-for-4 tonight with a single and home run...Each of his three home runs have come in his past eight games...Recalled prior to tonight's game, marking his third stint on the big league roster.
- **3B Brian Anderson** went 3-for-4 tonight, his third three-hit game of the season (last: 5/22)...Hit his fifth home run of the year in the seventh inning; has homered in back-to-back games for the seventh time in his career and the first time this season (last: 8/11-12/20)...Extended his hit streak to a career-high 10 games dating back to 5/16.
- CF Starling Marte went 2-for-4 tonight with two singles and an RBI...Marte is batting .468 (19-for-41) in 11 games since the All-Star break...Recorded his 22<sup>nd</sup> stolen base in the eighth inning; entering tonight his 21 stolen bases were tied for the third-most in MLB...Has recorded multiple hits and a stolen base in 12 games this year; entering tonight his 11 games with multiple hits and at least one stolen base were tied for the most in MLB (Whit Merrifield).
