JACKIE ROBINSON DAY TOMORROW: Jackie Robinson Day will be celebrated league-wide and the Diamondbacks special pregame ceremony will salute those in the community who are making a positive impact and carrying on the legacy of Jackie Robinson...Pilgrim Rest Baptist Church Choir will perform the National Anthem as well as the Black National Anthem...the ceremonial first pitch will be thrown by Valley-native Raven Gibson, the founder of Legendary Rootz, a Phoenix business that sells apparel and gift items celebrating the Black community and was one of Target's featured businesses for Black History Month...the team will recognize the Boys & Girls Club Youth of the Year as well as the East Valley United Black Firefighters, who focus on involvement and development in African-American communities, fostering promotion and advancement and promoting overall well-being...fans with the special event ticket package will receive an exclusive hat featuring Robinson's number "42."

SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

A BOND BEYOND BASEBALL: MLB Network's Anthony Castrovince & Paul Solga teamed up on "A Bond Beyond Baseball," a compelling, heartfelt story about the friendship and working relationship of Arizona Diamondbacks' General Manager Mike Hazen & Manager Torey Lovullo. ♦ YouTube "Love, loss, family, and baseball: The story of the D-backs' Mike Hazen and Torey Lovullo." <https://shorturl.at/dLOSV> ♦ Castrovince's story "D-backs GM and his front office share a bond beyond baseball" <https://shorturl.at/dfiq2>

OH MY, LOURDES: Lourdes Gurriel Jr.'s 18 RBI are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Spencer Steer/CIN)...his 18 RBI thru the team's first 15 games of a season also ties for the most by a D-back in the span (also: Mark Trumbo/2014 and Luis Gonzalez/2001). ♦ This season, Gurriel Jr. is batting .524 (11-for-21)/1.470 OPS with runners in scoring position, with 2 doubles, 2 homers and 15 RBI.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 10 games this season with 1+ runs scored in the first inning is the most in the Majors...the D-backs have won every game this season when they scored first. ♦ The D-backs have scored 2+ runs in the first inning in 8 of their first 15 games this season...no other team has more than 5 instances so far this season (Angels). ♦ In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 2 runs 4 times, 3 runs 3 times and 6 times once, tallying 25 runs with a .456 average (36-for-79)/1.335 OPS and 9 doubles, 7 home runs and 8 walks.

3+-RUN INNINGS: The D-backs have recorded 10 occurrences of 3+ runs in an inning this season, tied for seventh most in the Majors (also: Guardians), behind the Brewers (16), Rangers (13), Cubs (13), Royals (13), Padres (12) and Dodgers (12). ♦ Arizona's 3 games with 6+ runs scored in an inning are second most this season, behind the Royals (4).

SNAKES AMONG THE LEAGUE: D-backs' Top-10 Major League leaders include: ♦ **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** - RBI (T-1st, 18) ♦ **Ketel Marte** - Runs Scored (T-3rd, 15) ♦ **Christian Walker** - Walks (T-7th, 10) ♦ **Corbin Carroll** - Stolen Bases (T-11th, 4)

STOPPING THE OPPONENT RUNNING GAME: Through 15 games this season, **Gabriel Moreno** has held opponents to an MLB-low 2 stolen bases in 4 attempts...Moreno's 39.7 caught-stealing pct. (31-for-78) since 2022 is highest among all MLB catchers. ♦ There has been only 4 stolen base attempts against Arizona over 202 stolen base opportunities. ♦ The 4 stolen base attempts vs. Arizona are the fewest among all MLB teams...the second fewest is 6 stolen base attempts vs. Dodgers.

COME ONE, COME ALL: Over the first 9 home games this season @ Chase Field, the D-backs welcomed 308,844...it is the first time since 2004 (301,397) where Chase Field has seen 300,000+ total fans in their first 9 home games.

INNINGS 1-6: In Innings 1-6, the D-backs' .317 AVG, 118 hits and 72 runs lead the Majors: **AVG: D-backs (.317)**, Brewers (.316), Braves (.293), Astros (.286) **H: D-backs (118)**, Dodgers (116), Astros (112), Padres (108) **R: D-backs (72)**, Brewers (69), Dodgers (68), Padres (65)

BARRELING IT UP: **Ketel Marte's** and **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.'s** 28 hard-hit count (number of batted balls with exit velocity of 95 mph+) rank tied for third in the Majors, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (33) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (32). ♦ **Christian Walker's** 18.9 barrel pct. (percentage of batted balls that are classified as barrels) ranks sixth, behind Bobby Witt Jr./KC (23.4), Joey Gallo/WSH (20.0), Tyler O'Neill/BOS (20.0), Edouard Julien/MIN (19.2) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (19.0).

SWINGING ON STARTERS: D-backs hitters, against opposing starting pitchers, are batting .327 (101-for-309)/.894 OPS with 56 runs, 17 doubles, 14 homers and 25 walks. ♦ Among all teams' offenses vs. starting pitchers, the D-backs are first with 101 hits and 160 total bases.

RISP-Y BUSINESS: The D-backs' .319 AVG with runners in scoring position is fourth in the Majors, behind the Brewers (.395), Rangers (.353) and Braves (.331). ♦ Arizona's .319 AVG with RISP in their first 15 games of the season ranks second all-time in franchise history, behind 2017 (.344). ♦ **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** is batting .524 (11-for-21)/1.470 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 homers and 15 RBI with runners in scoring position. ♦ **Eugenio Suárez** is batting .429 (6-for-14)/1.256 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 homer and 11 RBI with runners in scoring position.

ON DECK - CHICAGO CUBS: Since 2022, the D-backs are 10-4 vs. Cubs (4-2 @ home, 6-2 on road) and have outscored them 63-49. ♦ Last season, the D-backs faced off vs. Cubs in September with 7 games in 11 days (4 on road and 3 @ home) and took 6 of the 7 matchups, including a sweep at Chase Field. ♦ In 17 plate appearances last season vs. Cubs while with the Giants, **Joc Pederson** hit .733 (11-for-15) with 2 doubles, 2 homers and 6 RBI.

NEXT STARTER: RHP MERRILL KELLY (2-0, 2.29)

♦ Earned the win in his last start on April 9 @ Rockies (W; 2 ER in 6.0 IP). ♦ Has tossed 5.0+ innings with 2 or fewer runs allowed in 6 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 20, 2023. ♦ Has made 5 career starts vs. Cubs, but only 1 at home... in his lone home start on July 18, 2021, he earned the win after tossing 8.0 innings with 4 runs allowed.

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Sixth season with the D-backs.

- 2023 All-MLB First Team, NL Cy Young finalist and D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA for the third time (2020, '22, '23) after going 17-9 with a 3.47 ERA (81 ER in 210.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts over 34 starts.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: In 2 home starts this season, is 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 ER in 11.0 IP, 9 K).

- Since 2022, his 20 home wins are the most in the Majors, ahead of Michael Wacha/KC (16), Logan Webb/SF (16) and Justin Verlander/HOU (16).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 5 starts (28.1 IP).
- The D-backs have scored a combined 28 runs in his 3 starts this year.

NL RANKINGS: Ranks among NL starters in wins (T-2nd, 2), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (10.69) and ERA (T-10th, 2.25).

LAST START: Went decisionless in his last start on April 8 @ Rockies (ND; 3 ER in 5.0 IP, 10 K).

HOME COOKIN: Ranks among D-backs pitchers all-time at home (min. 50 starts) in ERA (1st, 2.77), WHIP (1st, 1.05), home runs allowed (T-1st, 34), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (3rd, 10.17), walks (4th, 92), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4th, 4.07), wins (6th, 26) and strikeouts (7th, 374).

- In 16 home games in 2023, went 12-3 with a 2.47 ERA (28 ER in 102.0 IP), 120 strikeouts, 1.03 WHIP, .230 opponent average and 7 home runs allowed.
- In 2023, his .081 opponent average with runners in scoring position at home was the best in the Majors, ahead of Justin Verlander/HOU (.164) and teammate Merrill Kelly (.167).

NO APRIL SHOWERS: In 13 career April starts, is 6-0 with a 1.43 ERA (13 R-12 ER in 75.2 IP), 0.79 WHIP and 94 strikeouts.

- In 7 home starts in April, is 4-0 with a 0.44 ERA (2 ER in 41.1 IP), 0.68 WHIP and 60 strikeouts.

VS. CARDINALS: Is making his third career start against the Cardinals and second @ Chase Field.

- Took the loss in his last start on July 26, 2023 against St. Louis (L; 5 ER in 6.1 IP).

VS. NL CENTRAL AT HOME: Is 4-3 with a 1.98 ERA (14 ER in 63.2 IP, 73 K) in 10 starts against NL Central opponents at home.

- Is 4-1 with a 1.57 ERA (6 ER in 34.1 IP, 39 K) in his last 5 home starts against the NL Central dating back to Aug. 8, 2022.

AMONG OTHER STARTERS: Since 2022, his 12 starts of 6.0+ shutout innings, 6+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer hits allowed are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Corbin Burnes/BAL), ahead of Blake Snell/SF (11) Shohei Ohtani/LAD (10).

2023 RECAP: Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins, innings and strikeouts in 2023.

- His combined 243.2 innings in the regular season and postseason combined were 24.0 more innings than any other pitcher.
- Along with Gerrit Cole (209.0 IP, 222 K), were the only pitchers in the Majors in 2023 with 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts.
- In 2023, ranked among qualifying National League leaders in innings pitched (2nd, 210.0), starts (2nd, 34), wins (2nd, 17), strikeouts (3rd, 220), WHIP (6th, 1.12), win percentage (6th, .654), ERA (7th, 3.47) and opponent average (T-9th, .238).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won the series-clincher in Game 2 of the National League Wild Card @ Brewers (2 ER in 6.0 IP) on Oct. 4, 2023.

- Won Game 2 of the NLDS @ Dodgers (2 ER in 5.1 IP) on Oct. 9, 2023.
- In 6 postseason starts, went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA (17 ER in 33.2 IP), .248 opponent average, 14 walks and 24 strikeouts.
- Game 1 starter for NLCS @ Phillies and World Series @ Rangers.

ALL-MLB FIRST TEAM: Named to the 2023 All-MLB First Team, his first honor, along with Gerrit Cole/Yankees, Shohei Ohtani/Angels, Blake Snell/Padres and Spencer Strider/Braves.

CY YOUNG HOPEFUL: Finished third (68 votes) in 2023 NL Cy Young Award voting behind Blake Snell/SD (204) and Logan Webb/SF (86).

- In 2022 voting, finished fifth (45 votes).
- In 2020 voting, finished tied for ninth (2 votes)

ALL-STAR STARTER: Named to his first All-Star Game in 2023 and earned the starting nod...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning with 1 strikeout.

- At 27 years old, became the youngest D-backs pitcher, third overall (fourth time) and first since Curt Schilling (35 in 2002) to start an All-Star Game (also: Randy Johnson; 36 in 2000 and 37 in 2001).
- Was the youngest NL starting pitcher since Matt Harvey/NYM in 2013 (24).

MILKMAN DELIVERED: Tossed his first career 9.0-inning shutout on Sept. 8 @ Cubs with 3 hits allowed and 9 strikeouts.

- Previously had a 7.0-inning, complete-game shutout on April 25 – Game 1 @ Braves (7.0 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Fourth D-backs pitcher (sixth time) to toss 9.0 or more innings, 0 runs, 3 or fewer hits, 1 or fewer walks and 9 or more strikeouts (also: Curt Schilling on April 10, 2001 and May 14, 2003; Randy Johnson on Sept. 14, 2003 and May 18, 2004; Ian Kennedy on April 25, 2011).

HOW HE STARTED: Cardinals' third-round pick in the 2016 draft out of the University of North Carolina.

- Made his Major League debut on June 20, 2019 for the Marlins @ Cardinals (7-6 win, ND, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Acquired by D-backs on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins.
- Made his D-backs debut on August 7, 2019 vs. Phillies (6-1 win, W, 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 6 K).
