RAYS WIN-The Rays edged the Twins, 4-3, on Wednesday afternoon...2B Brandon Lowe (1-for-3, HR) hit his first homer of the spring in the opening frame...1B Jonathan Aranda (2-for-2, HR, 2RBI) notched his fourth multi-hit game this spring and is batting .414 (12-for-29) with 4 2B, 1 HR and 6 RBI in 11 games.

LHP Jacob Lopez (W, 3.0IP, H, BB, 5SO) earned his second victory of the spring...LHP Garrett Cleavinger (S, 1.0IP, H, SO) earned his first save.

THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM-Tampa Bay will play Atlanta for the third time in Grapefruit League action...the Rays went 1-2 against the Braves last season during a three-game set at Tropicana Field that signaled both clubs' final series before the All-Star break (July 7-9)...both teams plated 12 runs in the series, due in part to a 10-4 Rays win in the finale...the Rays are 16-26 (.381) against the Braves all-time, their second-worst winning pct. against a single opponent, ahead of only the Reds (7-14, .333)...the 42 meetings are their second most against any NL club behind Miami (137).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Yesterday afternoon, Tampa Bay announced the following players were reassigned to minor league camp: RHP Trevor Brigden, RHP Carlos Garcia, RHP Zac Houston and RHP Justin Sterner...Tuesday afternoon, Tampa Bay optioned RHP Colby White to Triple-A Durham...on Monday afternoon, the Rays announced the following players were reassigned to minor league camp: OF Ruben Cardenas, C Logan Driscoll, OF Niko Hulsizer, LHP Antonio Jimenez, RHP Enmanuel Mejia, OF Kameron Misner, INF Tanner Murray, OF Tristan Peters and INF Carson Williams...Tampa Bay also announced the following players were optioned to minor league camp: INF Junior Caminero, RHP Yoniel Curet, INF/OF Greg Jones and INF Austin Shenton.

PROSPECT WATCH—On March 4, MLB.com released its Top 30 Rays Prospect list...INF Junior Caminero leads the group, followed by INF Carson Williams, INF Curtis Mead, INF Xavier Isaac and INF Brayden Taylor...the largest jump in the system was made by C Dominic Keegan, who vaulted from No. 25 in 2023 to No. 6 in 2024.

On the 20-80 scouting scale, Caminero and Mead received a 60 for their hit tool, while Caminero received a 70 for Power...OF Chandler Simpson, rated Tampa Bay's No. 12 prospect, received an 80 for Speed following his 94 SB performance in 2023...added to the 40-man roster this offseason, RHP Yoniel Curet earned a 70 grade for his Fastball.

SPRING BREAKOUT—On March 16, Rays top prospects will battle their Twins counterparts in Fort Myers as part of MLB's inaugural Spring Breakout event...rosters will primarily be constructed through MLB.com's Top 30 Prospects list...the seven-inning contest will take place following the conclusion of the regularly scheduled Grapefruit League game between the two clubs.

The Rays Spring Breakout roster features two Top 100 MLB.com prospects, including Williams (No. 20) and **1B Xavier Isaac** (No. 58)...**INF Brayden Taylo**r and **INF Adrian Santana**, the No. 19 and No. 31 overall picks respectively in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, are also slated to play for the Rays.

**SPRING FEVER**—The Rays are scheduled for 30 spring games in 32 days, including split-squad games on March 23 and off days on March 8 and 20...of the Rays 15 home games, 13 will be played at Charlotte Sports Park...they were the home team on March 9 vs. Boston in the Dominican Republic and will host the Tigers at Tropicana Field in their spring finale on

**ROSTER BREAKDOWN**—The Rays have 53 players in major league camp, including 16 non-roster invites...the Rays have 28 pitchers (8 NRI), five catchers (4 NRI), 13 infielders (3 NRI) and 7 outfielders (1 NRI).

Nine players have been added to the Rays 40-man roster since the conclusion of last season: LHP Tyler Alexander, INF José Caballero, RHP Yoniel Curet, OF Jonny DeLuca, RHP Phil Maton, OF Richie Palacios, RHP Ryan Pepiot, RHP Manuel Rodríguez, INF Amed Rosario and INF Austin Shenton.

**AT THE HELM**—Entering his 10th season, Rays manager **Kevin Cash** is the longest-tenured skipper in the majors with his current club...Cash is set to surpass his predecessor, **Joe Maddon** (2006-14), as the longest-tenured manager in Rays history on Opening Day (March 28 vs. TOR)...he sits 16 victories shy of overtaking Maddon (754) as the Rays all-time leader in managerial wins...despite being the seventh-youngest active manager in the majors, he ranks among his peers in career winning pct. (4th, .545) and wins (8th, 739).

He has been named a BBWAA AL Manager of the Year finalist five times in the last six seasons (since 2018), winning the award twice (2020-21) and receiving votes in all

In 2023, Cash became the youngest manager in MLB history to reach the postseason in five consecutive seasons (45), ahead of LAD **Dave Roberts**, who was 48 years old when he clinched his fifth straight postseason berth in 2020 (Elias).

On Feb. 8, the Rays announced that Cash and President, Baseball Operations **Erik** 

Neander have been signed to long-term contract extensions

**COACHING STAFF**—The Rays have announced their 2024 major league coaching staff under manager **Kevin Cash...Michael Johns** joins the club as first base coach following 16 seasons in the Rays minor league system, including nine as a manager...Bobby Kinne (pitching strategist) has been added to the uniformed coaching staff after spending six years in the Rays organization, most recently as coordinator, major league operations over the last two seasons (2022-23)...returning coaches include Tomas Francisco (field coord.), Rick Knapp (asst. pitching/rehab), Rodney Linares (bench), Jorge Moncada (bullpen), Chad Mottola (hitting), Brady North (asst. hitting), Kyle Snyder (pitching) and Brady Williams (third base).

ON THE AIRWAVES—All weekend games this spring will air on WDAE 95.3 FM/620 AM, with Andy Freed and Neil Solondz on the call...Freed begins his 20th season with the Rays while Solondz embarks on his 13th, including his second as part of the primary broadcast duo...all weekday home games will be available on MLB.com, with Chris Adams-Wall,

entering his first full season with the Rays, providing play-by-play.

Bally Sports Sun will televise 10 of the Rays 13 games at Charlotte Sports Park...

Dewayne Staats, the Rays play-by-play voice since their inaugural 1998 season, enters his 27th season with the Rays and 49th broadcasting major league games...

Brian Anderson begins his 15th season as full-time color analyst and 17th on the broadcast team...in-game reporter and host Tricia Whitaker enters her sixth season on the telegraph

Over two starts, has thrown 5.0 scoreless innings, allowing five hits and one walk with four strikeouts.

#### 2023 IN REVIEW

- Made 28 appearances (14GS) between the Red Sox and Rays...claimed by the Rays off waivers from Boston on May 12 and transitioned to a full-time starting role on July 19...became the first pitcher to be claimed off waivers mid-season and go on to make 10+ starts for a team that made the postseason since BOS Doug Fister in 2017.
- Set career highs in starts (14), innings pitched (90.0) and strikeouts (74)... lowered his walk rate from 6.8 pct. in 2022 to a career-low 3.2 pct., the sixthlowest mark in the majors (min. 150BF).
- Over 14 starts, went 3-5 with a 3.41 ERA (71.1IP, 27ER) and 1.05 WHIP...in his 14 relief appearances, posted an 0-1 mark with a 6.75 ERA (18.2IP, 14ER) and 1.66 WHIP.
