METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets lost to the Dodgers for the second straight game, falling 10-2, at Citi Field...The Mets are down 3-1 to the Dodgers in the NLCS...New York defeated the Phillies, three-games-to-one in the NLDS...The Mets defeated the Brewers, two-games-to-one in the National League Wild

**CHASING THE PENNANT:** The Mets are playing in the NLCS for the ninth time in franchise history and the first time since 2015...The Mets are 27-20 (.574) alltime in the National League Championship Series.

**EIGHT IS GREAT:** According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to reach the League Championship Series after being 11+ games under .500, joining: 2019 Nationals, 2013 Dodgers, 2005 Astros, 1989 Blue Jays, 1984 Royals, 1974 Pirates and the 1973 Mets.

LA LA LAND: The Mets are facing the Dodgers for the fourth time in Postseason history...They faced off in the 2015 NLDS (3-2), the 2006 NLDS (3-2) and the 1988 ALDS (3-4)...Overall, the Mets are 10-9 against the Dodgers in the Postseason.

HIGH FIVE: The Mets are 7-5 all-time in Game 5 of a Postseason series...This includes a 6-3 mark in New York and an 0-1 record in Citi Field.

DO OR DIE: The Mets are 10-8 in potential elimination games...This includes a 1-O record this year, a 7-5 record in Flushing and a 1-3 record at Citi Field.

The Mets own the fifth-best ERA in Postseason history with 3.23 ERA.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Mark Vientos is the third-youngest player (24 years, 300 days) with 10+ total bases in a playoff game, doing so in Game 2 of the NLDS...He was only older than Carlos Correa (21y, 20d) in Game 4of the 2015 ALDS and Manny Ramírez (23y, 134d) in Game 2 of the 1995 ALCS... Vientos is now the third Met's player with three extra-base hits in a playoff game, joining Lucas Duda in Game 4 of the 2015 NLCS and Gary Carter in Game 4 of the 1986 World Series.

**DODGERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 4-5 all-time in the Postseason against the Dodgers in Flushing.

ON THE MARK: Through his first 11 career Postseason games, Mark Vientos is batting .370 (17-46) with four homers, 12 RBI, two doubles, two walks, seven runs, a .396 OBP and a 1.070 OPS...His seven multi-hit games are tied with Edgardo  $\,$ Alfonzo and Cleon Jones, for the most ever in a single Postseason in Mets' history...John Olerud (1999) and Todd Zeile (2000) each had six multi-hit games in the Postseason...Marty Barrett (1986), Troy Glaus (2002) and Marquis Grissom (1996) hold the single-Postseason record with nine multi-hit games each.

AINT IT GRAND: Mark Vientos connected for his first career grand slam in Game 2 of the NLCS at Dodgers Stadium...He is the first player since Bryson Stott (2023 WC, G2) to hit a Postseason grand slam for his first career grand slam...Per Elias, he is one of 13 players to accomplish the feat including Jordan Luplow (10/8/2021); Ronald Acuña Jr. (10/7/2018); Paul Goldschmidt (10/4/2011); Shane Victorino (10/2/2008); Kazuo Matsui (10/4/2007); Mark Lewis (10/6/1995); Ron Gant (10/7/1992); José Canseco (10/15/1988); Mike Cuellar (10/3/1970); Chuck Hiller (10/8/1962); and Bobby Richardson (10/8/1960)...Francisco Lindor connected for his second carer Postseason grand slam in Game 4 of the NLDS... He also cleared the bases on October 6, 2017 with Cleveland vs. New York-AL... His two Postseason grand slams are tied with Shane Victorino and Jim Thome for the most in MLB history.

SAVE ME: In Game 3 of the NL Wild Card Series, David Peterson became the first pitcher in franchise history to record his first career save in the Postseason...He became the 19th pitcher to have earned their first career save in the playoffs... Courtesy of Elias.

THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM: Game 2 of the NLCS marked the third time in Postseason history that a club hit a leadoff home run and a grand slam in the same game...Courtesy of Sarah Lands...New York is the first club to accomplish the feat since the Orioles in Game 1 of the 1996 ALDS...The first club to ever accomplish the feat is the Yankees, who did so in Game 5 of the 1953 World Series, also against the Dodgers.

EVERYBODY HITS: In Game 2 of the NLCS, each player in the Mets starting lineup safely reached base, marking the second time this Postseason that every batter in New York's starting lineup reached base...They also did so in Game 2 of the Wild Card Series against Milwaukee... Overall it is the sixth time in Mets Postseason history that each batter in the starting lineup reached base safely after they also accomplished the feat on October 30, 2015 (G3 WS); October 15 2006 (G4 NLCS); October 11, 2000 (G1 NLCS); and October 17, 1973 (G4 WS).

ADDICTED TO THE PLAYOFFS: J.D. Martinez has appeared in 41 Postseason games, batting .285 (39-137) with 16 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 34 RBI, 24 walks, a .390 OBP and a .540 SLG.

CLOSING TIME: In Game 2 of the NLCS. Edwin Díaz became the sixth pitcher (10th occurrence) in Mets Postseason history to record a save of more than three outs...It was the first since Jeurys Familia did so in Game 1 of the 2015 NLCS (1.1 IP)...Familia also did it in Game 5 of the 2015 NLDS (2.0 IP) and Game 1 of the 2015 NLDS (1.1 IP)...There have been 13 players in franchise history to record a save in the Postseason...Jeurys Familia owns the franchise record with five Postseason saves...Armando Benitez, Tug McGraw and Billy Wagner are tied for second with three saves each...Díaz has recorded two Postseason saves with the Mets, tied for the fifth-most.

**TO RYNE OWNSELF BE TRUE:** Ryne Stanek has appeared in 28 Postseason games...He is 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (7 ER/25.2 IP) with eight walks and 25 strikeouts in the playoffs.

**BACK-TO-BACK:** The Mets have hit back-to-back home runs twice in the Postseason...On October 21, 2015 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Lucas Duda and Travis d'Arnaudhit back-to-back home runs in the first inning...On October 9, 1988 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds went back-to-back in the fourth inning.

**HAPPY TRAILS:** According to Sarah Langs, the Mets entered this year 6-27 when trailing entering the eighth inning in franchise history in the postseason... After the Game 1 win in the NLDS, they are now 2-0 in such games this Postseason...The only teams with more such wins in a single Postseason are the 1996 Yankees (5 wins), the 1980 Phillies (4 wins), the 2015 Royals (3 wins) and the 1986 Mets (3 wins)...The Mets won Game 3 of the NLWCS and Game 1 of the NLDS after trailing entering the eighth inning...According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to win back-to-back Postseason games when trailing in the eighth inning or later in each, joining: the 2015 Royals, 2004 Red Sox, 2001 Yankees, 1999 Mets, 1996 Yankees, 1992 Blue Jays and the 1980 Phillies.

**NOTHING EXTRA:** The Mets scored six runs without recording an extra-base hit in their NLDS Game 1 win against the Phillies...lt marks the second time in franchise history that the team scored six runs without an extra-base hit in a Postseason game...The only other coinsurance was Game 6 of the 1986 World Series...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** In game three of the NL Wild Card Series, Pete Alonso hit the 10th go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later in a winner-take-all game in Postseason history...It was the first ever with a team trailing.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets are 4-3 on the road during the 2024 Postseason...All-time, they are 25-24 on the road in the Postseason...New York finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road this year...They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

**ON THE RECORD:** New York won 20 of their last 29 on the regular season...The Mets finished the year going 89-73...In 2023, the team finished at 75-87...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets went 65-38...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets played 107 games, going 67-40 in that span...Their .626 winning percentage was the best in the majors in that span...They outscored their opponents 541-433 during those 107 games.

**POSTSEASON BOUND:** The Mets are in the Postseason for the first time since 2022 and for the 11th time in franchise history...This marks the fifth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000, 2016 and 2022.

**FIRST IS THE BEST:** The Mets are the first team in MLB history to clinch a postseason spot in a win and win a playoff series BOTH via games in which they faced a deficit in the ninth inning or later...Courtesy of Sarah Langs and Elias.

**WILD OUT:** The Mets previously made the Postseason as the Wild Card team in 1999, 2000, 2016 and in 2022...ln 1999, New York defeated the Diamondbacks, 3-1, in National League Division Series and fell to the Atlanta Braves 4-2, in the League Championship Series...The 2000 Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1 in the NLDS and the Cardinals, 4-1 in the NLCS...The team fell to the Yankees 4-1 in the World Series...The 2016 Mets fell to the Giants, 1-0, in the one-game Wild Card Game...The Mets lost a best-of-three-game series to the San Diego Padres, dropping two games to one in 2022 at Citi Field.

**DIVISION BELL:** The Mets appeared in the Division Series for the first time since 2015...They defeated the Phillies, three-games-to-one...Overall, it was their ninth appearance in the series...The Mets are 15-5 all-time in the series...Their .750 winning percentage in the series is the best in the National League...That is tied with the Blue Jays (.750) for the best mark in the majors...This includes a 9-1 record at home in the Division Series.

**IN A CLINCH:** The Mets are 13-9 in clinching games, including 2-0 this year... New York has clinched a spot in the NLCS for the first time since 2015...The Mets clinched their first Postseason series at Citi Field after defeating the Phillies, 4-1, in Game 4 of the NLDS.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** Peterson tossed 2.1 innings in relief on October 13 in Los Angeles...He allowed three runs (two earned) on four hits with one walk and struck out two over 2.1 innings...He is 1-0 with a one save and a 2.08 ERA (2 ER/8.2 IP) with four walks and five strikeouts in four appearances this Postseason.

**SAVE ME:** In Game 3 of the NL Wild Card Series, David Peterson became the first pitcher in franchise history to record his first career save in the Postseason...He became the 19th pitcher to have earned their first career save in the playoffs...Courtesy of Elias.

**SEASON'S GREETINGS:** Peterson finished the season going 10-3 with a 2.90 ERA (39 ER/121.0 IP) with 46 walks and 101 strikeouts in 21 starts...He recorded a career-high 10 wins and struck out 100+ batters for the third time in his career.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY, THERE IS SUCH THING:** Peterson celebrated his 29th birthday on September 3 vs. Boston...Became the 24th pitcher in major league history to record 10 or more strikeouts on their birthday and is the first pitcher since Gerrit Cole (15 Ks, 9/8/19) with a double-digit strikeout performance on their birthday...Is the first Met to win on his birthday since Justin Wilson (8/18/20) and the first Mets starter to earn the win on his birthday since Dillon Gee (4/28/12)...He was the 11th different Mets pitcher to earn a win on their birthday.

**FIVE IS ALIVE:** Peterson owned a career-best five-game winning streak from May 29 - June 22...In those nine games, he has posted a 3.14 ERA (17 ER/48.2 IP) recording five wins and four no decisions with 23 walks and 36 strikeouts.

**RETURN OF THE PETE:** Made his season debut on May 29 vs. Los Angeles-NL... Allowed three runs (two earned) on seven hits with one walk and struck out three over 5.0 innings of work...Was his first start of the season...The southpaw has started the season on the 60-Day IL after undergoing left hip surgery in the off-season.

**STARTER/RELIEF:** Last year, Peterson madae a career-high 21 starts and went 2-8 with a 5.24 ERA (60 ER/103.0 IP) in those starts...ln six relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (2 ER/8.0 IP).

**HIGHEST HIGHS:** Peterson set career-highs in innings pitched (111.0), starts (21), and strikeouts (128) in 2023...Kodai Senga was the only other Mets starter with at least 111.0 innings pitched, 21 starts and 128 strikeouts last season.

**MAKIN' IT MAJOR:** Upon returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson pitched to a 2-2 record with a 3.38 ERA (27 ER/72.0 IP) in 19 games, 13 of which were starts...Peterson pitched to a 2-7 record before the All-Star Break, owning a 6.46 ERA (39 ER/54.1 IP) in 11 starts during that time...Post-Break, Peterson pitched to a 1-1 record and a 3.65 ERA (23 ER/56.2 IP) in 16 games (10 starts).

**NEW YORK, NEW YORK:** Peterson pitched to a 2.79 ERA (18 ER/58.0 IP) in 14 home outings (10 starts)...Over 13 road outings (11 starts) last season, the southpaw has pitched to a 7.47 ERA (44 ER/53.0 IP)...Peterson's 4.58 home/road ERA differential was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more starts both at home and on the road...Courtesy of Elias.
