### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 26, 2022:** In the Yankees' 12-8 win vs. Baltimore, Anthony Rizzo records his first career 3HR game, hitting a three-run HR in the third inning, a two-run HR in the fifth and a solo HR in the eighth. He becomes the 24th player in franchise history (33rd time) in franchise history to hit 3HR in a game and the sixth first baseman (ninth time).

**April 26, 2005:** Alex Rodriguez hits three home runs (all off Bartolo Colon) and tallies 10RBI in a 12-4 win vs. the Angels. He becomes just the second Yankee to total 10-or-more RBI in a game, behind current AL-record-holder Tony Lazzari, who had 11RBI on 5/24/36 in a 25-2 win at Philadelphia-AL.

**April 27, 1947:** Babe Ruth Day is celebrated at Yankee Stadium and throughout the Major Leagues. Dressed in a topcoat and hat, Ruth thanks the fans in an on-field ceremony at the Stadium.

### MONDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 28, 1989:** Rickey Henderson hits the 36th leadoff home run of his career in a 3-1 win vs. the White Sox at Yankee Stadium, snapping a tie with Bobby Bonds (35) and giving Henderson sole possession of the all-time record.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game series at Houston (2-0 thus far)...are 5-0 on the road trip after sweeping the Red Sox in a three-game set and winning their first two games against the Astros...will also face the Rangers from Mon.-Wed.

- ▶ **Their 18-9 (.667) record is the best in the American League and tied for the third-best in the Majors**...their 18 wins are the most in the AL and tied for the second-most in the Majors.
- ▶ **Have won a season-high eight straight games (since 4/17), their longest single-season winning streak since their eight-game winning streak from 9/20-28/25**...their last longer winning streak was a nine-game streak from 6/9-18/22...**is tied for the second-longest winning streak in the Majors this season**, trailing only the Cubs' 10-game streak from 4/14-24 (the Padres also had an eight-game streak from 4/8-16).
- ▶ **Have won nine of their last 10 games (since 4/15) and 10 of their last 12 games (since 4/13)**.
- ▶ Including their current series, have won or split seven of their nine series this season (6-2-1), including each of their last four (3-0-1)...have also won four of their five road series this year (including their current series).
- ▶ **The Yankees are 14-3 this season when scoring first**.
- ▶ Are a season-high 9G over .500.
- ▶ Have won 18 of their first 27 games of a season for only the fifth time in the last 23 years since 2004 (also went 19-8 to start the 2010 and '22 seasons and 18-9 to start the '17 and '18 seasons).
- ▶ The Yankees' +50 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees won their season-high eighth straight game with an 8-3 win over the Astros on Saturday at Daikin Park...**LHP Ryan Weathers** (5.1P, 6H, 2R/ER, 0BB, 4K, 1HR, 1PO) started after being reinstated from the paternity list and did not record a decision...**CF Trent Grisham** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 2BB) reached base three times and hit his fourth HR of the year with a game-tying solo shot in the third inning...**SS José Caballero** (3-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1SB) recorded a career-high-tying 3H and homered in his second straight game, hitting a go-ahead solo shot in the fifth inning...**C Austin Wells** (2-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 2BB) reached base a career-high-tying four times, including a go-ahead solo HR in the seventh inning and an RBI single in the ninth inning...**1B Ben Rice** (3-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1RBI, 1SF) recorded a season-high 3H and drove in a run in the eighth inning with a sac fly...**LF Cody Bellinger** (0-for-2, 1R, 1RBI, 3BB) and **2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (0-for-4, 1RBI, 1BB) each drew bases-loaded walks in the seventh inning...**3B Ryan McMahon** (2-for-5, 1R, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the ninth inning...**Yankees relievers** allowed only 1R/ER over 3.2IP (1H, 2BB, 5K, 1HR).

**PITCH PERFECT:** Yankees pitchers have posted a **1.75 ERA (72.0IP, 14ER) over their eight-game winning streak (since 4/17)**...have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of those eight games.

- ▶ Have allowed only 92R this season, marking only the second time in the last 45 years (since 1982) the Yankees have allowed 92R-or-fewer through their first 27 games of a season (also 75R in 2022).
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers lead the Majors in ERA (3.10) and opponents' OPS (.628)**, rank second in opponents' OBP (.285, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.344, first in AL), WHIP (1.12, first in AL), BB/9.0IP (2.62, second in AL) and K/BB (3.41, second in AL), tied for second in pickoffs (six, tied for first in AL), fourth in opponents' BA (.222, first in AL), sixth in HR/9.0IP (0.86, fourth in AL) and eighth in strikeouts (239, sixth in AL).

**WALK IT OUT:** Yankees batters walked 10 times on Saturday at Houston, marking their fourth game this season with double-digit walks (also 11BB on 4/3 vs. Miami and 10BB on 4/4 vs. Miami and 4/19 vs. Kansas City)...marks their most games with double-digit walks in a single season since 2010 when they recorded six...recorded only five such games over the previous three seasons (2023-25)...their 133BB this season are the most in the Majors.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters rank first in the Majors this season in walks (133) and PA/BB (7.74), second in home runs (42, first in AL), tied for third in stolen bases (29, first in AL), fourth in XBH (86, second in AL) and pitches per PA (4.02, third in AL), fifth in SLG (.431, second in AL), OPS (.765, second in AL) and runs per game (5.26, first in AL), sixth in runs scored (142, second in AL) and OBP (.334, second in AL), and ninth in stolen base percentage (80.6%, third in AL).

**FOUR SCORE:** Yankees batters have scored at least 4R in each of their last 10 games (since 4/15) and 13 of their last 14 games (since 4/11)...their 10-game streak with at least 4R matches their second-longest streak in the last seven seasons (since 2020), trailing only a 12-game streak from 6/29-7/11/25 (also 10G from 7/26-8/7(G1)-24)...the Yankees are 16-4 this season when scoring at least 4R.

**FOR STARTERS:** Yankees starters have posted a **Major League-best 2.63 ERA (157.1IP, 46ER) and 159K in 27 starts this season...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in a season-high eight straight starts (since 4/17), posting a 1.17 ERA (54.0IP, 7ER) over that span**...marks just the fourth time in the last seven years (since 2020) the Yankees have recorded as long of a streak in a single season (also a 16-start stretch from 5/12-29/24, a 10-start streak from 4/14-24/22 and an eight-start streak from 5/13-22/25).

- ▶ Yankees starters have allowed only 6R/5ER over 41.0IP over their last six games (since 4/19).
- ▶ Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of their 27 starts, matching their third-most through their first 27 games of a season since ER became an official stat in 1913, trailing only their 26 starts in 2022 and 25 starts in 1919 (also had 24 in 1972).
- ▶ Have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 17 of their 27 starts, tied for their second-most through their first 27 games of a season, trailing only their 22 starts in 2022 (also had 17 in 1958 and 2019).
- ▶ **Lead the Majors in ERA (2.63), opponents' OBP (.256), opponents' OPS (.575), WHIP (0.97) and K/BB (4.30)**, rank second in strikeouts (159, second in AL), opponents' BA (.202, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.319, first in AL), BB/9.0IP (2.12, second in AL) and strikeout rate (25.6%, second in AL), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.80, third in AL) and eighth in K/9.0IP (9.10, fifth in AL).

**AUSTIN POWERS:** C Austin Wells reached base a career-high-tying four times on Saturday at Houston (also 4TOB on 7/24/24 vs. the Mets), including a go-ahead solo HR in the seventh inning and an RBI single in the ninth inning...has reached base in nine of his last 11 games (since 4/11), posting a .405 OBP during that stretch.

**HIP HIP JOSÉ:** INF/OF José Caballero recorded a career-high-tying 3H and hit his third HR of the year with a go-ahead solo shot in the fifth inning on Saturday at Houston...**has homered in back-to-back games for the second time in his career** (also 2G from 5/21-22/23 with Seattle)...**also owns a career-high-tying seven-game hitting streak since 4/18 (also 7G from 4/3-12/24 with Tampa Bay), batting .429/.429/.679 (12-for-28) with 6R, 1 double, 2HR, 3RBI and 1SB over that span**.

- ▶ Has recorded multiple hits in each of his last three games (since 4/23), four of his last seven (since 4/18), five of his last nine (since 4/16) and seven of his last 14 (since 4/11).
- ▶ Is batting .377/.400/.623 (20-for-53) with 9R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 10RBI, 2BB and 5SB over his last 14 games (since 4/11).

**MERRY GRISHMAS:** OF Trent Grisham reached base three times and hit his fourth HR of the year with a game-tying solo shot in the third inning on Saturday at Houston...**as a Yankee, 27 of his 47 home runs have either tied the game (nine) or given the Yankees the lead (18)**.

- ▶ **Has hit 4HR and recorded 12RBI in his last 10 games with a PA (since 4/13)**.

**RICE RICE BABY:** C/INF Ben Rice recorded a season-high 3H and drove in a run in the eighth inning with a sac fly on Saturday at Houston...**has hit .337/.457/.759 (28-for-83) with 25R, 8 doubles, 9HR, 21RBI, 19BB/21BB, 1HP, 2SF and 1SB in 26 games this season...has reached base safely in 20-of-22 starts**.

- ▶ **Has hit 5HR in his last nine games (since 4/16)**.
- ▶ 17 of his 28H this season have gone for extra bases (8 doubles, 9HR).
- ▶ **Leads the Majors in SLG (.759), ranks second in OBP (.457, second in AL) and OPS (1.216, second in AL)**, third in BA (.337, second in AL) and XBH (17, second in AL), tied for third in runs scored (25, tied for first in AL), tied for fourth in HR (nine, tied for third in AL), eighth in PA/BB (5.53, fifth in AL) and tied for ninth in RBI (21, tied for second in AL).

**GET THE BROOMS OUT:** The Yankees will look to complete their third straight series sweep and fourth of the season today (also 3G at San Francisco from 3/25-28, 3G vs. Kansas City from 4/17-19 and 3G at Boston from Tues.-Thurs.)...would mark their first sweep of the Astros since a four-game sweep from 3/28-31/24.  
▶ **Are 11-1 in their last 12 games at Daikin Park (since 9/1/23)**.

**SAVED BY THE BELL:** INF/OF Cody Bellinger walked a career-high-tying three times on Saturday at Houston, including a bases-loaded walk in the seventh inning...is hitting .298/.411/.468 (14-for-47) with 9R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 9RBI, 9BB and 1SB over his last 13G (since 4/11).

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU:** OF Aaron Judge turns 34 years old today (DOB: 4/26/92)...Judge has homered twice on his birthday: hit a two-run HR at Boston on his 25th birthday in 2017 and hit a solo HR vs. Baltimore on his 30th birthday in 2022...in six career games on his birthday, has hit .333/.481/.762 (7-for-21) with 5R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 7RBI and 6BB.

**ALL RISE:** OF Aaron Judge has reached base multiple times in each of his last five games and seven of his last eight games (since 4/17)...has reached base in 20 of his last 21 games (since 4/3).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS GIL (1-1, 4.11 ERA)

**RHP Luis Gil** will make his fourth start of the season in today's series finale at Houston...the 27-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest...made his third start of the season on Tuesday at Boston, earning his first win of the year after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 3BB, 2K, 1HP)...marked his first scoreless start since 9/12/25 at Boston (6.0IP)...matched the longest scoreless start of his career (also 6.1IP on 5/1/24 at Baltimore and 5/23/24 vs. Seattle)...was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 4/10...made one start for the Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders on 4/15 at Rochester, allowing 3R/ER in 4.2IP without recording a decision (4H, 4BB, 6K, 1HR)...in 11 starts with the Yankees in 2025, went 4-1 with a 3.32 ERA (57.0IP, 47H, 23R/21ER, 33BB, 41K, 5HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of his 11 starts...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of his starts...missed the first 111 team games on the 60-day I.L. with a right lat strain (3/24-8/3)...over his final 10 starts last season (8/9-9/28), went 4-0 with a 2.68 ERA (53.2IP, 16ER)...in 50 career Major League starts, has gone 21-10 with a 3.53 ERA (257.1IP, 186H, 105R/101ER, 139BB, 264K, 31HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 38 of his first 50 career starts and one-or-zero runs in 25 of those starts...**his 264 career strikeouts are the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher over their first 50 career games**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (315K), Al Downing (303K) and Orlando Hernández (269K)...**was named the Jackie Robinson American League Rookie of the Year in 2024...became the 10th player and fourth pitcher in franchise history to win the award**, joining Aaron Judge (2017), Derek Jeter (1996), Dave Righetti (1981), Thurman Munson (1970), Stan Bahnsen (1968), Tom Tresh (1962), Tony Kubek (1957), Bob Grim (1954) and Gil McDougald (1951)...was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Made his third start of the season on Tuesday at Boston, earning his first win of the year after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 3BB, 2K, 1HP).  
 ✦ Marked his first scoreless start since 9/12/25 at Boston (6.0IP) and the 11th of his career.  
 ✦ Matched the longest scoreless start of his career (also 6.1IP on 5/1/24 at Baltimore and 5/23/24 vs. Seattle).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** Will be making his third road start of the season tonight.  
 ✦ In two road starts this season, is 1-1 with a 2.61 ERA (10.1IP, 3ER).  
 ✦ Made five road starts in 2025, going 2-1 with a 4.38 ERA (24.2IP, 22H, 13R/12ER, 15BB, 20K, 1HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in three of his starts.  
 ✦ **Over his last 18 road starts (since 5/1/24), is 12-4 with a 3.27 ERA (96.1IP, 69H, 36R/35ER, 48BB, 84K, 7HR)...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts.**

**VS. HOUSTON:** Will be making his third career start vs. Houston today...in two starts vs. the Astros, is 1-0 with a 2.38 ERA (11.1IP, 7H, 3R/ER, 5BB, 12K, 2HR)...today marks his first career start at Daikin Park.  
 ✦ Made his first career start vs. Houston on 5/7/24 at Yankee Stadium, earning the win after allowing just 1R/ER in 6.0IP (1H, 4BB, 5K, 1HR)...his only run came from a first inning home run to Kyle Tucker...did not allow a hit to his final 21 batters faced.  
 ✦ Made his second start against the Astros on 8/9/25 at Yankee Stadium, allowing 2R/ER in 5.1IP without recording a decision (6H, 1BB, 7K, 1HR).

**2025:** In 11 starts with the Yankees, went 4-1 with a 3.32 ERA (57.0IP, 47H, 23R/21ER, 33BB, 41K, 5HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of his 11 starts...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of his starts.  
 ✦ Went 2-0 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1IP, 9ER) in six home starts.  
 ✦ Held opponents to a .217/.279/.267 (13-for-60) slash line with RISP.  
 ✦ Allowed only 5HR to 244BF, posting a 0.79 HR/9.0IP ratio.  
 ✦ Allowed 4H-or-fewer in seven of his 11 starts.  
 ✦ The Yankees went 8-3 in his starts, winning each of his final five starts (9/6-28)...exited only two of his 11 starts with the team trailing.  
 ✦ Missed the first 111 team games on the 60-day I.L. with a right lat strain...was placed on the 60-day I.L. on 3/24...combined to make four rehab starts with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, posting a 5.65 ERA (14.1IP, 11H, 9R/ER, 7BB, 24K, 4HR)...was returned from his rehab assignment and reinstated from the I.L. on 8/3.  
 ✦ Made his season debut on 8/3 at Miami and suffered his only loss after allowing a season-high 5R/ER in 3.1IP (5H, 4BB, 3K, 0HR)...marked his first appearance since 9/28/24 vs. Pittsburgh.  
 ✦ Over his final 10 starts (8/9-9/28), went 4-0 with a 2.68 ERA (53.2IP, 16ER).  
 ✦ Allowed 2R-or-fewer in a career-high-tying seven straight starts from 8/9-9/12 (also had a seven-start streak from 5/1-6/4/24)...went 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA (38.0IP, 8ER) over that span.  
 ✦ Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing 6.0 hitless innings on 9/12 at Boston (4BB, 4K, 2WP, 1BK)...was the second Yankees pitcher in 2025 to toss at least 6.0 hitless innings in a start, joining Clarke Schmidt (7.0IP/0H) on 6/21 vs. Baltimore...marked the eighth time in franchise history a Yankees pitcher tossed at least 6.0 hitless innings in a start and did not record a no-hitter: also Clarke Schmidt's 7.0IP on 6/21/25 vs. Baltimore, Luis Severino's 7.0IP on 10/3/22 at Texas, Domingo Germán's 6.0IP on 5/6/18 vs. Cleveland, Phil Hughes' 6.1IP on 5/1/07 at Texas, David Cone's 7.0IP on 9/2/96 at Oakland, Andy Hawkins' 8.0IP in a complete-game loss on 7/1/90 at Chicago-AL, and Whitey Ford's 7.0IP on 5/22/62 vs. Los Angeles-AL.  
 ✦ Made his only postseason start in ALDS Game 1 at Toronto and took the loss after allowing 2R/ER in 2.2IP (4H, 0BB, 2K, 2HR)...was not on the Yankees' ALWCS roster.

**THE RIGHT STUFF:** In his career, has limited right-handed batters to a .192/.299/.337 (95-for-496) slash line.  
 ✦ **Allowed just 2HR to 113 right-handed batters faced in 2025, including 1HR to his final 106 right-handed batters faced last season.**

**CAREER NOTES:** In 50 career Major League starts, has gone 21-10 with a 3.53 ERA (257.1IP, 186H, 105R/101ER, 139BB, 264K, 31HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 38 of his first 50 career starts and one-or-zero runs in 25 of those starts.  
 ✦ **His 264 career strikeouts are the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher over their first 50 career games**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (315K), Al Downing (303K) and Orlando Hernández (269K).  
 ✦ **His 38 starts of allowing 3R-or-fewer are tied with Masahiro Tanaka for the most by a Yankee over their first 50 career games.**  
 ✦ **Has struck out at least six batters in 23 of his first 50 career starts, the second-most such games in a pitcher's first 50 career games in franchise history**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (32)...**his nine games with at least eight strikeouts are tied for the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 50 career games**, trailing only Al Downing (15), Masahiro Tanaka (13), Ron Guidry (11) and Dave Righetti (10).
