METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Phillies, 11-4, last night in Philadelphia...The victory snapped a seven-game losing streak, their longest of the season and their longest since they lost seven straight from July 1-7, 2023... The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games (1-4)...The Mets are in the midst of a six-game road trip (1-4) to Atlanta (0-3) and Philadelphia (1-1)...New York is 19-21 on the road compared to 27-10 at Citi Field in 2025...Following the trip, the Mets return home for a brief four-game homestand against the Braves.

THE DAVID: Tonight will mark David Peterson's 100th career start, becoming the 11th franchise southpaw to reach the milestone...He has tossed 7.0+ innings in each of his last three starts dating back to June 5 and he joins himself (3 GS from 8/19-29/24) as the only Mets pitcher to do so since Zack Wheeler's four such starts from 9/10-26/19...The left-hander has also allowed three earned runs or fewer in a career-high 15 consecutive starts dating back to September 29, 2024.

MULTIPLICITY: Yesterday, Juan Soto and Brandon Nimmo both recorded multi-homer games...It is the second time this season that the Mets have had two players hit multiple homers in the same game...This is the third season in which the Mets have had two games with multiple players hitting two or more homers...They had two in both 2005 and 2010.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: The Mets hit seven solo home runs last night, which tied an MLB record...The Angels were the last team to do so on August 22, 2022 vs. Oakland...The Mets recorded seven or more homers in a game for the fifth time in franchise history...All five occurrences have come on the road and four of the instances have occurred at Citizens Bank Park...In addition, last night's game is the first game in MLB history to feature seven or more total home runs with all of them being solo homers by the same team...Courtesy of Stats Perform.

LUCKY LINDOR: The Mets have won the last 28 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history...Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...Carl Furillo (29, 1951-53) holds the record...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the NL...They are 1-4 in that span...New York is 13-8 against the NL East this season, sporting a 3.58 ERA...They have hit .256/.324/.443 against the division.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over the last 24 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .319 (30-94) with 17 runs, five doubles, seven homers, 14 RBI, nine walks, five steals and an .980 OPS...In 18 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .352/.418/.676 with five doubles, six homers, 12 RBI, seven walks and three steals.

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 85.9 (61-71) stolen base percentage this season which is the best mark in the majors...The Mets are one of eight teams in the majors to have four players with eight or more stolen bases this season (Lindor, Soto, Acuña, Taylor)...Mets catchers have combined to throw out 41.2% of potential base stealers this year (21-51), the best mark in the majors.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets own a 46-31 record this season...Their record through 77 games is tied for the fifth-best start in franchise history...Only the 1986 (55-22), 1988 (49-28), 2022 (48-29) and 2006 (47-30) teams had a better season-opening record...The 1990 team also went 46-31 through their first 77 games.

JUAN OF A KIND: In 19 games this month, Juan Soto is batting .338/.500/.708 with 18 runs, three doubles, seven home runs, 14 RBI, 20 walks and one steal...Over the last 14 games, he is batting .380 (19-50) with seven extra-base hits and a .508 OBP...He has recorded a Major League-leading 63 walks...His 63 walks through the team's first 76 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

LAST TIME OUT: Tonight's outing at Philadelphia will mark his 100th career start...He will become the 11th left-handed Mets pitcher to reach the milestone...Last pitched on June 17 at Atlanta and did not record a decision despite allowing just three runs over 7.0+ IP (5 H, 3 BB, 3 K)...Allowed a run in the third inning, snapping a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak (6/5-17)...Marked his third consecutive start of 7.0 or more innings, joining himself (3 GS from 8/19-29/24) as the only Mets pitcher to do so since Zack Wheeler's four such starts from 9/10-26/19.

ON A ROLL: Over 14 starts this season, has gone 5-2 with a 2.60 ERA (25 ER/86.2 IP), 28 walks and 74 strikeouts...Has pitched 5.0 innings or more in 12 straight starts, the longest such streak of his career...He has allowed three earned runs or less in each of his 14 starts this season and in each of his last 15 starts dating back to September 29, 2024...His 15 such games are the longest streak of his career...Is one of 11 Mets starters to record as long of a streak (19 times)...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, his 0.42 HR/9.0 IP ratio is third (first in NL), is fourth in groundball percentage (57.4, second in NL), 10th in opponents' SLG (.319, third in NL) and 11th in ERA (2.60, fourth in NL).

YEAR IN REVIEW: Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 30 of his 35 starts, going 15-5 with a 2.77 ERA (64 ER/207.2 IP), 74 walks and 175 strikeouts...21 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 24-11 over that span...Since 2024, has allowed just four runs in the first inning, which is the second fewest in the majors during that span, trailing only Reese Olson's two runs (min. 30 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 30 GS), he is first in HR/9.0 IP (0.52), sixth in groundball percentage (53.3, fourth in NL) and opponents' SLG (.336, second in NL), and eighth in ERA (2.77, fourth in NL).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Has made six road outings this season, each being quality starts...Despite his quality starts, the Mets have gone 1-5 in his road starts compared to an 8-0 record when he starts at home...Has combined to go 1-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP), 16 walks and 33 strikeouts in his five road starts...In 18 road starts since his start to the 2024 season, Peterson has gone 7-3 with a 2.77 ERA (34 ER/110.2 IP), 42 walks and 83 strikeouts...He has recorded quality starts in 14 of those games, including 11 of his last 13 (since August 3, 2024)...Allowed two runs or less in 14 of those 18 road outings.

VS. PHILADELPHIA/NATIONAL LEAGUE: Has recorded three runs or fewer in six of his 10 career appearances vs. the Phils...In his last eight games against Philadelphia, has recorded a 3.29 ERA (15 ER/41.0 IP) and a 10.76 K/9.0 IP...Has made four appearances vs. division opponents this season, posting a 2.30 ERA (7 ER/27.1 IP)...The Mets are 3-1 when Peterson has faced an NL East team this year and are 8-3 this year when he has started against a National League team.

TO THE LEFT TO THE LEFT: This season, Peterson has held lefties to a .198 batting average (16-81)...Among qualified southpaws facing left-handed hitters this season, is fourth in groundball percentage (63.6, third in NL), tied for fourth in strikeouts (26, third in NL), ninth in opponents' SLG (.247, fifth in NL) and 10th in opponents' OPS (.500, sixth in NL)...In his career, he has posted a .226 opponents' batting average against lefties (110-486).

ELECTRIC SLIDE: David Peterson has used his slider 20.7% of the time this season...Of his 74 strikeouts, 41 have come using this pitch...Has recorded a 34.2% put away rate and a 37.1% whiff rate with the pitch this season, both rates the highest among pitches in his arsenal.

QUALITY CONTROL: Has recorded nine quality starts in 14 total outings this season, including seven of his last eight starts...Had four consecutive quality starts from May 6-24, which was the second-longest such streak of his career (longest: five quality starts from 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson has recorded 21 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 19 of them coming in his last 30 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of 12 pitchers (one of six in NL) to record at least 19 quality starts.

SOUTHPAW SHUTOUT: On June 11 vs. the Nationals, tossed a complete game shutout for the first time in his career (6 H, 0 BB, 6 K)...Was the first Met to throw a shutout since Luis Severino on August 17, 2024 vs. MIA...He is the first franchise left-handed pitcher to throw a shutout since Steven Matz (7/27/19 vs. PIT)...Became the fourth pitcher in the majors this season to throw a 9.0+ IP complete game shutout without allowing a walk, and the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom (4/23/21 vs. WAS)...He became the 63rd pitcher in franchise history to record a shutout without allowing a walk.

APPLE PICKING: This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of five (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant...He is tied with teammate Griffin Canning and Atlanta's Grant Holmes for the most in the majors...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 29 net bases prevented is the most among Major League pitchers...José Berrios and Griffin

Canning are next on the list with 21...Peterson has recorded 16 career pickoffs (one this season), tied with Bobby Ojeda for the eighth-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20), Sid Fernandez (18)...Courtesy of *OPTA*.

CAREER NOTES: With a 2.90 ERA (39 ER/121.0 IP) last season, Peterson became the 10th left-hander in franchise history to record an ERA of 3.00-or-under while making at least 20 starts and was the first to accomplish the feat since Johan Santana's 2.98 ERA (66 ER/199.0 IP) over 29 starts in 2010...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 33-26 with a 3.85 ERA (231 ER/540.2 IP), 225 walks and 538 strikeouts in 115 games (99 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
