TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 16, 2006: The Yankees overcome a nine-run deficit vs. Texas to win, 14-13, in nine innings. Jorge Posada hits a two-run, "walk-off" home run off Akinori Otsuka.

May 16, 1932: The Yankees shut out their opponent for the fourth consecutive game, defeating Cleveland, 8-0, at Yankee Stadium.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 17, 2010: Trailing 9-7 heading into the bottom of the ninth, Alex Rodriguez ties the game with a two-run homer off Red Sox closer Jonathan Papelbon before Marcus Thames wins it with a two-out, two-run, "walk-off" homer for an 11-9 Yankees win.

May 17, 2002: Jason Giambi hits a "walk-off" grand slam, giving the Yankees a 13-12 victory over Minnesota. The clubs combine for 40 hits (20 each) in a game that lasts 5 hours and 45 minutes, as Bernie Williams homers from both sides of the plate.

May 17, 1998: David Wells tosses the 14th regular season perfect game in Major League history (and first by a Yankee), defeating Minnesota, 4-0, at Yankee Stadium. He throws 120 pitches and records 11 strikeouts.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a six-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game Subway Series vs. the Mets (through Sun)...will also play a three-game set vs. the Rangers (Tues.-Thurs.)...went 4-2 on their recent road trip, going 2-1 in both their series against the Athletics and Mariners.

- Have won six of their last eight games (since 5/6) and each of their last three series (since 5/5).
- Are a season-high-tying 7G over .500 (also 24-17 on 5/12)
- Their 25-18 (.581) record is tied for second-best in the AL and tied for fifth-best in the Majors.
- Their +81 run differential this season is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (+86).

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees clinched a series win over the Mariners with a 3-2 comeback win on Wednesday at T-Mobile Park...**RHP Will Warren** (5.0IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 9K, 0HR, 1HP) started and recorded a career-high 9K in a no-decision...**LF Jasson Domínguez** (1-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the sixth inning...**PH/1B Paul Goldschmidt** (1-for-2, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his second career pinch-hit HR with a game-tying solo shot in the seventh inning...**DH Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his 15th home run of the season with a go-ahead solo shot in the eighth inning...**RF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-4, 1 double) extended his season-high hitting streak to 10 games...**LHP Tyler Matzek** (0.2IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K), **RHP Ian Hamilton** (W, 1.1IP, 2K), **RHP Fernando Cruz** (1.0IP, 1H, 1HP) and **RHP Luke Weaver** (SV, 1.0IP, 3K) combined to toss 4.0 scoreless innings of relief.

FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees have averaged 41,714 fans per home game this season, their highest average attendance through their first 20 games of a season since Derek Jeter's last season in 2014 (41,970).

- **Own the highest average home attendance in the American League and the third-highest in the Majors**, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (51,003) and San Diego (42,445).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 76HR this year, their most home runs through their first 43 games of a season in franchise history (previous: 71HR in 2009)...are just the ninth team in the Modern Era (since 1900) to hit as many HR through their first 43 games of a season.

- Their 250R scored this season are their most through their first 43G of a season since 2003 when they scored 251R over their first 43G.
- The Yankees' have a Major League-best eight players with 20RBI this season.
- Lead the Majors in HR (76), OBP (.347), OPS (.828) and XBH (164), are tied for first in walks (173, first in AL), ranks second in SLG (.481, first in AL), runs scored (250, first in AL), runs per game (5.81, first in AL), total bases (710, first in AL) and times on base (586, first in AL), and third in BA (.263, first in AL).

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham is hitting .283/.367/.628 (32-for-113) with 23R, 1 double, 1 triple, 12HR, 22RBI, 14BB and 1HP in 36 games this season...has 12HR in 36 games this season after hitting 9HR in 76 games in 2024.

- Has 4HR in his last eight games (since 5/5) and 8HR in his last 18 games (since 4/19).
- **Nine of his 12HR this season have either tied the game (three) or given the Yankees the lead (six).**
- Is tied for fourth in the Majors in game-winning RBI (six, tied for second in AL) and ranks seventh in HR (third in AL).

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger has hit safely in each of his last 10 games (since 5/3), batting .310/.370/.500 (13-for-42) with 7R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 5RBI, 4BB and 1SB over that span...his 10-game hitting streak is tied for the fifth-longest of his career, trailing only a 13-game streak from 6/24-7/7/23, 12-game streaks from 5/24-6/5/19 and 8/5-19/18, and an 11-game streak from 10/1-18-7/7/19 (also had a 10-game streak from 7/30-8/8/23).

DREAM WEAVER: RHP Luke Weaver struck out all 3BF on Wednesday at Seattle to record his fourth save of the year...has not allowed a run in 16-of-17 appearances this year, going 0-1 with four saves, a 0.45 ERA (20.0IP, 1ER) and 22K.

- Among Major League relievers this season, ranks first in opponents' BA (.092), second in opponents' OPS (.290, first in AL), third in ERA (third in AL), tied for third in opponents' OBP (.167, tied for second in AL), fourth in opponents' SLG (.123, third in AL) and tied for fourth in WHIP (0.60, tied for third in AL).

OUT OF THIS WORLD: OF Jasson Domínguez hit an RBI double in the sixth inning on Wednesday at Seattle...is hitting .290/.378/.645 (9-for-31) with 9R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI, 5BB and 1SF over his last nine games (since 5/4).

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have not allowed an ER in their last 10.0 innings (since 5/12)...have posted a 1.13 ERA (16.0IP, 2ER) and 20K over their last four games (since 5/11).

CRUZ CONTROL: RHP Fernando Cruz tossed a scoreless eighth inning on Wednesday at Seattle...has not allowed an ER in 18-of-20 appearances this year, going 1-1 with two saves and a 2.42 ERA (22.1IP, 6ER)...has struck out 34-of-86BF this season...leads Major League relievers in strikeouts, ranks fourth in strikeout rate (39.5%, third in AL) and ninth in K/9.OIP (13.70, seventh in AL).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge hit his 15th home run of the season on Wednesday at Seattle with a go-ahead solo shot in the eighth inning...**his 15HR are tied for the most in the Majors (first in AL)...seven of his 15HR this season have given the Yankees the lead.**

- **Has hit 7HR in his last 14 games (since 4/29) and 8HR in his last 16 games (since 4/27-G2).**
- Has hit 330HR in 1,036 career Major League games, the most HR through a player's first 1,036 career games in Major League history (previous: Ryan Howard and Ralph Kiner - 288HR).
- **Has reached base in 41 of his 43 games this year**, batting .412/.497/.782 (68-for-165) with 40R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 15HR, 41RBI, 27BB/7IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 3SB.
- **Leads the Majors in BA by 42 points, OBP by 62 points, SLG by 85 points and OPS by 147 points.**
- **Has reached base multiple times in 28 of his last 34 games (since 4/7), 31 of his last 38 games (since 4/3) and 33 of his 43 games this year...**his 33 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.
- With 15HR and a .412 BA, is one of just three players in the Modern Era to record as many home runs and as high of a BA in their club's first 43 games of a season, joining the Yankees' Mickey Mantle (20HR and .419 BA in 1956) and Philadelphia-AL's Jimmie Foxx (18HR and .415 BA in 1932).
- **Is one of three Yankees (sixth time) in franchise history to reach base multiple times in 33 of the club's first 43 games of a season**, joining Babe Ruth (4x: 35G in 1927 and 33G in 1923, 1924 and 1928) and Lou Gehrig (34G in 1936).
- Over his last 34G (since 4/7), has hit .438/.520/.750 (56-for-128) with 26R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 9HR, 24RBI, 22BB/5IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB.
- Has hit .469/.571/.813 (15-for-32) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 25RBI, 8BB/6IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year.
- Has hit .314/.406/.779 (27-for-86) with 17R, 4 doubles, 12HR, 22RBI, 11BB, 3HP, 1SF and 1SB in 25 career games vs. the Mets...**has 7HR in his last 10G against New York-NL** (since 9/11/21).

GOOD AS GOLD: INF Paul Goldschmidt hit his second career pinch-hit HR with a game-tying solo shot in the seventh inning on Wednesday at Seattle (also 8/11/11 vs. Houston w/ Arizona)...four of his 5HR this year have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (three).

- Has reached base safely in 34 of his 43 games this season, batting .346/.395/.506 (56-for-162) with 27R, 11 doubles, 5HR, 22RBI, 12BB/2IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 3SB.
- Has hit .429/.490/.595 (18-for-42) with 4 doubles, 1HR, 17RBI, 5BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, is tied for first in the Majors in hits (tied for first in AL), tied for eighth in BA (tied for fifth in AL) and ranks ninth in OBP (fourth in AL).
- Ranks second in the Majors in multi-hit games (19, second in AL), third in hits (third in AL) and fourth in BA (third in AL)...also ranks third in the AL in OBP.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.92 ERA (151.0IP, 49ER) over their last 28 starts (since 4/14)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 23 of their last 28 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 20 of those starts...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.208), rank second in opponents' OBP (.275, second in AL), opponents' OPS (.613, second in AL) and WHIP (1.10, second in AL), and third in opponents' SLG (.338, second in AL) and ERA (second in AL).

HIGH VOLTAGE: INF Anthony Volpe is hitting .302/.392/.508 (19-for-63) with 11R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 9RBI, 9BB, 1HP, 1SF and 4SB over his last 17 games (since 4/25).

BANNER EVENING: On Sunday, Yankee Stadium will celebrate the 2024 WNBA Champion New York Liberty as team captain and four-time NCAA champion with UConn Breanna Stewart throws out the ceremonial first pitch. On Saturday, the Liberty will open their season vs. Las Vegas and raise their championship banner.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CARLOS RODÓN (4-3, 3.29 ERA)

LHP Carlos Rodón will make his 10th start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. the Mets...the 32-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...made his ninth start of the season on Saturday at the Athletics, recording a season-high 10K over 6.0IP without recording a decision (8H, 4R/ER, 0BB, 2HR)...is 4-3 with a 3.29 ERA (54.2IP, 33H, 22R/20ER, 20BB, 67K, 8HR) in nine starts this season...among Major League pitchers this year, **ranked second in the Majors in opponents' BA (.171, second in AL), is tied for fourth in strikeouts (67, tied for second in AL), sixth in strikeout rate (31.2%, third in AL), eighth in opponents' OBP (.248, sixth in AL) and tied for ninth in innings pitched (54.2, seventh in AL)...also ranks eighth in the AL in opponents OPS (.569) and ninth in opponents' SLG (.321)**...has recorded at least 7K in seven of his nine starts this season, including eight-or-more strikeouts in five starts...since 2021, ranks third in the Majors with an 11.13 K/9.0IP ratio (748K/604.2IP), trailing only Blake Snell (11.85) and Dylan Cease (11.19)...is tied for in double-digit strikeout games (20) over that span, trailing only Gerrit Cole (24), Cease (22), Kevin Gausman (22), Snell (22) and Corbin Burnes (21)...has recorded at least 10K and 0BB in eight games, tied for the sixth-most such games in the Majors during that stretch, trailing only Jacob deGrom (10), Gausman (10), Cole (nine), Burnes (nine) and Zack Wheeler (nine)...has pitched over parts of 11 Major League seasons with the Chicago White Sox (2015-21), San Francisco Giants (2022) and Yankees (2023-25)...has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...is a two-time All-Star (2021 and 2022)...has made seven Opening Day rosters (2016, '19-22, '24-25)...began the 2017, 2018 and 2023 seasons on the injured list...was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 16th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play three seasons at North Carolina State University (2012-14)...was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 season on 12/21/22.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his ninth start of the season on Saturday at the Athletics, recording a season-high 10K over 6.0IP without recording a decision (8H, 4R/ER, 0BB, 2HR)...marked his 27th career double-digit strikeout game and his fourth as a Yankee...also marked his second double-digit strikeout game as a Yankee without issuing a walk (also 10K and 0BB on 9/17/23 at Pittsburgh)...his 8H surrendered marked a season high after allowing no more than 4H in each of his first eight starts of the season.

- **Retired all nine left-handed batters faced, striking out six...matched the most left-handed hitters he has struck out in a game in his career** (also 6K on 9/4/22 vs. Philadelphia with San Francisco).
- **Has issued one-or-zero walks in each of his last three starts (2BB total) after allowing two-or-more walks in each of his first six starts this season.**

2025: Is 4-3 with a 3.29 ERA (54.2IP, 33H, 22R/20ER, 20BB, 67K, 8HR) in nine starts this season...among Major League pitchers this season, **ranked second in the Majors in opponents' BA (.171, second in AL), is tied for fourth in strikeouts (67, tied for second in AL), sixth in strikeout rate (31.2%, third in AL), eighth in opponents' OBP (.248, sixth in AL) and tied for ninth in innings pitched (54.2, seventh in AL)...also ranks eighth in the AL in opponents OPS (.569) and ninth in opponents' SLG (.321)**.

- **Is 3-0 with a 1.71 ERA (31.2IP, 19H, 7R/6ER, 8BB, 39K, 3HR) over his last five starts** (since 4/18)...has tossed at least 6.0IP in all five starts and has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in four of those starts.
- Has recorded at least 7K in seven of his nine starts this season, including eight-or-more strikeouts in five starts...**recorded at least 8K in four straight starts from 4/7-23, matching the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 10-start streak from 5/21-7/18/21** (also 4GS from 4/9-26/22).
- **Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in eight of his nine starts, tied with San Diego's Michael King for the must such starts in the Majors this season**...has also allowed 3H-or-fewer in five of his starts...dating back to last season, **allowed 4H-or-fewer in nine straight starts from 9/27/24-5/5/25, marking the longest stretch in franchise history** (excluding openers)...Chad Green recorded 16 straight starts of 4H-or-fewer as an opener from 2017-19.
- Made his second career Opening Day start and first with the Yankees on 3/27 vs. Milwaukee, earning the win after allowing just 1R/ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR).
- **Reached 10 years of Major League service on 3/31.**
- Appeared in his 200th career game on 4/2 vs. Arizona...made his 200th career start on 4/29 at Baltimore.
- **Did not allow an earned run in two straight starts on 4/18 at Tampa Bay (0R) and 4/23 at Cleveland (1R/0ER)...marked the fourth time in his career he has not allowed an earned run in consecutive starts** (also 2GS from 8/4-10/18, 2GS from 4/5-14/21 and 2GS from 6/12-17/22).

HOME SWEET HOME: Is 1-2 with a 3.42 ERA (23.2IP, 13H, 9R/ER, 10BB, 25K, 4HR) in four starts at home this season.

- Made 14 starts at Yankee Stadium in 2024, going 9-2 with a 3.11 ERA (81.0IP, 61H, 31R/28ER, 27BB, 91K, 15HR)...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 13 of those starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 11 starts...over his final eight home starts last season (7/3-9/27), went 5-1 with a 2.54 ERA (46.0IP, 13ER) and 56K...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in all eight starts.
- In his first three seasons as a Yankee (2023-25), has gone 11-8 with a 3.90 ERA (138.1IP, 108H, 65R/60ER, 49BB, 141K, 26HR) in 25 starts at Yankee Stadium.
- Over his last five seasons (2021-25), **has posted a 2.96 ERA at home, the ninth-lowest ERA among Major League pitchers at home over that stretch** (min. 250.0IP)...**opposing batters are hitting .200 (207-for-1,035) when he pitches at home over that span, the third-lowest opponents' batting average among Major League pitchers** (min. 250.0IP).

VS. NEW YORK-NL/INTERLEAGUE: Has made two career starts vs. the Mets, going 2-0 with a 0.84 ERA (10.2IP, 7H, 1R/ER, 5BB, 12K, 0HR).

- Made his only start vs. the Mets as a member of the Yankees on 7/26/23 at Yankee Stadium, earning the win after allowing just 1R/ER over 5.2IP (4H, 3BB, 4K, 0HR, 1HP).
- Has made four Interleague starts this season, going 1-2 with a 3.42 ERA (23.2IP, 13H, 9R/ER, 10BB, 25K, 4HR).
