### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 18, 1969:** Joe Pepitone leads off the bottom of the 9th with a solo blast off Angels' reliever Hoyt Wilhelm breaking a scoreless tie and giving the Yankees a 1-0 "walk-off" win over California at Yankee Stadium.

**May 18, 1956:** Mickey Mantle hits home runs from both sides of the plate for the third time in his career in an 8-7, 10-inning win at the White Sox. Mantle and Yogi Berra each go 4-for-4 with 3RBI in the game.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 19, 2021:** Corey Kluber tosses his first career no-hitter in a 2-0 win at Texas, allowing just one baserunner (BB in the 3rd inning) while throwing 101 pitches. It marked the 12th no-hitter in Yankees franchise history (incl. postseason) and the first by a Yankee since David Cone's perfect game on 7/18/99 vs. Montreal.

**May 19, 1990:** Tied 4-4 in the bottom of the 11th, Don Mattingly hits a one-out double off future Yankee teammate and current Kansas City reliever Steve Farr to score Steve Sax from first and give the Yankees a 5-4 "walk-off" win.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight with the final game of a three-game Subway Series vs. the Mets (1-1 thus far)...will also play a three-game set vs. the Rangers (Tues.-Thurs.)...went 4-2 on their recent road trip, going 2-1 in both their series against the Athletics and Mariners.

- Have won seven of their last 10 games (since 5/6) and each of their last three completed series (since 5/5).
- Their 26-19 (.578) record is the second-best in the AL, trailing only Detroit (30-16, .652).
- Their +84 run differential this season is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (+86).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees fell to the Mets, 3-2, in the second game of the Subway Series on Saturday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Clarke Schmidt** (6.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 5BB, 5K, 0HR) started and did not record a decision...**2B DJ LeMahieu** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) recorded his first multi-hit game of the season, including his first HR of the year with a go-ahead solo shot in the third inning...**CF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base twice times, including a game-tying solo HR in the sixth inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (2-for-4, 1 double) recorded two hits, including a double in the eighth inning...**LF Jasson Dominguez** (2-for-3, 1BB) reached base three times...**RHP Mark Leiter Jr.** (1.0IP, 1H) and **LHP Tim Hill** (0.2IP, 1H) were both scoreless in relief...**RHP Fernando Cruz** (1.1IP, 1H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 1K, 1HP) took his second loss of the season.

**FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees have averaged 42,250 fans per home gate this season, their highest average attendance through their first 22 gates of a season since 2010 (45,050).**

- **Own the highest average home attendance in the American League and the third-highest in the Majors**, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (50,757) and San Diego (42,388).

**LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried is 6-0 with a 1.11 ERA (56.2IP, 7ER) in nine starts this season...his 1.11 ERA is the lowest by a Yankee through his first nine starts of a season** (since 1913 when ER became an official stat).

- Among pitchers to debut with a team since 1913 (when ER became an official stat in both leagues), **is just the second pitcher to go 6-0-or-better and post an ERA of 1.11-or-lower in his first nine starts with a franchise**, joining Los Angeles-NL's Max Scherzer (7-0 and 0.78 ERA in 2021) - confirmed by *Elias*.
- Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his nine starts and 1ER-or-fewer in seven of those starts...**is one of three pitchers in franchise history (excluding openers) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first nine starts of a season (since ER became an official stat in 1913)**, joining Michael Pineda (first nine starts in 2014) and Lefty Gomez (first nine starts in 1937)...Chad Green also did so in his first 11 starts as an opener in 2019.
- Leads the Majors in ERA, is tied for first in wins (tied for first in AL) and pickoffs (four, first in AL), ranks fourth in opponents' SLG (.270, fourth in AL) and opponents' OPS (.520, fourth in AL), seventh in opponents' OBP (.250, sixth in AL) and WHIP (0.94, sixth in AL), eighth in opponents' BA (.190, sixth in AL), tied for ninth in innings pitched (tied for fifth in AL) and 10th in groundball percentage (52.2%, fourth in AL).

**SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger** reached base twice times on Saturday vs. the Mets, including a game-tying solo HR in the sixth inning...**has hit safely in each of his last 12 games (since 5/3), batting .340/.400/.580 (17-for-50) with 10R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 6RBI, 5BB and 15B over that span...his 12-game hitting streak is tied for the second-longest of his career, trailing only a 13-game streak from 6/24-7/7/23** (also had 12-game streaks from 5/24-6/5/19 and 8/5-19/18).

**LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu** recorded his first multi-hit game of the season on Saturday vs. the Mets, including his first home run of the year with a go-ahead solo shot in the third inning.

- In 68 career games vs. the Mets, has batted .293 (71-for-242) with 32R, 14 doubles, 2 triples, 3HR, 18RBI, 30BB, 35F and 55B.
- As a Yankee (since 2019), has batted .292/376/451 (133-for-455) with 73R, 19 doubles, 4 triples, 15HR, 47RBI, 61BB, 3HP, 55F and 45B in 125 Interleague games.

**BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters** have hit 78HR this year, their most home runs through their first 45 games of a season in franchise history (previous: 72HR in 2002, 2009 and 2018)...are just the 11th team in the Modern Era (since 1900) to hit as many HR through their first 45 games of a season.

- Have scored 258R this season, their most through their first 45 games of a season since 2018 when they scored 264R over their first 45 games.
- Lead the Majors in HR (78) and walks (184), rank second in OBP (.347, first in AL), SLG (.476, first in AL), OPS (.823, first in AL), XBH (168, first in AL), times on base (613, first in AL) and total bases (734, first in AL), and third in BA (.262, first in AL), runs scored (258, first in AL) and runs per game (5.73, first in AL).

**ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge** did not reach base for only the third time this season on Saturday vs. the Mets...**has reached base in 42 of his 45 games this year**, batting .402/.488/.753 (70-for-174) with 42R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 15HR, 41RBI, 28BB/7IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 35B.

- **Leads the Majors in BA by 27 points, OBP by 47 points, SLG by 73 points and OPS by 126 points.**
- **Has reached base multiple times in 29 of his last 36 games (since 4/7), 32 of his last 40 games (since 4/3) and 34 of his 45 games this year...** his 34 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.

- **Is one of three Yankees (eighth time) in franchise history to reach base multiple times in 34 of the club's first 45 games of a season**, joining Babe Ruth (5x: 36G in 1927, 35G in 1923 and 1924, and 34G in 1921 and 1926) and Lou Gehrig (2x: 35G in 1936 and 34G in 1927).
- With 15HR and a .402 BA, is one of just five players in the Modern Era to record as many home runs and as high of a BA in their club's first 45 games of a season, joining Boston's Manny Ramirez (15HR and .405 BA in 2001), the Yankees' Mickey Mantle (20HR and .411 BA in 1956), Philadelphia-AL's Jimmie Foxx (19HR and .415 BA in 1932) and Philadelphia-NL's Chuck Klein (16HR and .415 BA in 1930).

- Over his last 36 games (since 4/7), has hit .423/.506/.715 (58-for-137) with 28R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 9HR, 24RBI, 23BB/5IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 15B.

- **Has hit 7HR in his last 16 games (since 4/29) and 8HR in his last 18 games (since 4/27-G2).**
- Has hit .455/.568/.788 (15-for-33) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 25RBI, 9BB/6IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year.
- Has hit .305/.396/.726 (29-for-95) with 19R, 4 doubles, 12HR, 22RBI, 12BB, 3HP, 1SF and 15B in 27 career games vs. the Mets...**has 7HR in his last 12 games against New York-NL** (since 9/11/21).

**NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC: The Yankees** are 81-67 (.547) all-time vs. the Mets...**their 81 wins are the second-most against a single opponent in Interleague games**, trailing only the Tampa Bay Rays' 82 wins over the Florida/Miami Marlins (82-61, .573).

**FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.89 ERA (162.0IP, 52ER) over their last 30 starts (since 4/14)...** have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 25 of their last 30 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts and one-or-zero ER in 15 starts...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.203), rank second in opponents' SLG (.326, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.603, second in AL), and third in opponents' OBP (.277, third in AL), ERA (third in AL) and WHIP (1.11, third in AL).

**OUT OF THIS WORLD: OF Jasson Dominguez** reached base three times on Saturday vs. the Mets...is hitting .306/.422/.611 (11-for-36) with 9R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI, 8BB, 1SF and 15B over his last 11 games (since 5/4).

**HIGH VOLTAGE: INF Anthony Volpe** recorded 2H on Saturday vs. the Mets, including a double in the eighth inning...is hitting .300/.378/.500 (21-for-70) with 11R, 8 doubles, 2HR, 10RBI, 9BB, 1HP, 2SF and 45B over his last 19 games (since 4/25).

**SCHMITTS CREEK: RHP Clarke Schmidt** started and did not record a decision on Saturday vs. the Mets (6.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 5BB, 5K, 0HR)...has tossed 6.0IP in each of his last three starts (since 5/6), **marking the first time in his career he has tossed at least 6.0IP in three consecutive starts**.

**BANNER EVENING:** Tonight, Yankee Stadium will celebrate the **2024 WNBA Champion New York Liberty** as team captain and four-time NCAA champion with UConn **Breanna Stewart** throws out the ceremonial first pitch...fans purchasing a [Special Event Ticket](#) for the game will receive a co-branded Yankees + Liberty cap...Stewart will be available to media in the Yankee Stadium Press Conference Room immediately following her first pitch.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (6-0, 1.11 ERA)

**LHP Max Fried** will make his 10th start of the season in tonight's series finale vs. the Mets...the 31-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Tuesday at Seattle and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 2-1 "walk-off" loss in 11 innings (5.0IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 5K, 0HR)...**is 6-0 with a 1.11 ERA (56.2IP, 7ER) in nine starts this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his starts and 1ER-or-fewer in seven of those starts...the Yankees are 8-1 in his starts this season...**...leads the Majors in ERA, is tied for first in wins (tied for first in AL) and pickoffs (four, first in AL), ranks fourth in opponents' SLG (.270, fourth in AL) and opponents' OPS (.520, fourth in AL), seventh in opponents' OBP (.250, sixth in AL) and WHIP (0.94, sixth in AL), eighth in opponents' BA (.190, sixth in AL), tied for eighth in innings pitched (tied for fifth in AL) and 10th in groundball percentage (52.2%, fourth in AL)...went 11-10 with two complete games (one shutout) and a 3.25 ERA (174.1IP, 146H, 71R/63ER, 57BB, 166K, 13HR) over 29 starts with the Atlanta Braves in 2024...over nine Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025), has gone 79-36 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 2.96 ERA (941.0IP, 823H, 344R/309ER, 259BB, 915K, 79HR) in 177 career games (160 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 500.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.68), tied for first in shutouts (four), second in winning percentage (.706), HR/9.0IP (0.65), opponents' SLG (.326), opponents' OPS (.605) and pickoffs (22), third in groundball percentage (54.3%), fourth in wins (60) and groundball/flyball ratio (2.23), and tied for sixth in complete games (five)...his 77 wins since 2019 rank second in the Majors, trailing only Gerrit Cole (79)...the two-time All-Star (2022 and '24) and three-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting twice in his career (second in 2022 and fifth in 2020)...has made seven career Opening Day rosters (2019-24 with Atlanta and 2025 with the Yankees)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, INF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed only 1R/ER in 5.0IP and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 2-1 "walk-off" loss on Tuesday at Seattle (4H, 2BB, 5K, 0HR)...marked the first time this season the Yankees lost a game Fried started...snapped a six-start streak of tossing at least 6.0IP (4/9-5/7).

**WINNING WAYS: The Yankees are 8-1 in Fried's starts this season...is one of three starting pitchers this season to have his team win at least eight of his starts**, joining San Francisco's Robbie Ray (team is 9-0) and the Mets' Griffin Canning (team is 8-1).

- ★ The Yankees won each of his first eight starts to begin the season (3/29-5/7), **marking just the fourth time in franchise history the Yankees have won a pitcher's first eight starts with the team**...the Yankees also won Whitey Ford's first 22 starts with the club from 1950-53 (won first 23GS when including postseason), Joe Cowley's first 11 starts in 1984 and Russ Ford's first eight starts in 1910.
- ★ **Was the 12th pitcher in franchise history and the third Yankees pitcher in the last 72 years since 1954 to have the Yankees go 8-0 in their first eight starts of a season (excluding openers)**, joining Joe Cowley (Yankees went 11-0 in his 11GS in 1974) and Orlando Hernández (Yankees went 8-0 in first 8GS in 2004)...the Yankees also won Chad Green's first nine opening assignments in 2019.
- ★ His team has won 106 of his starts since 2019, marking the second-most team wins in a pitcher's starts over that span, trailing only the 108 team wins in José Berrios' starts.
- ★ **Owns an eight game-inning streak dating back to last season (since 9/21/24)...is tied for the second-longest winning streak of his career**, trailing only a nine-game winning streak from 4/19-7/6/22 (also had eight-game winning streaks from 9/21/19-9/18/20 and 8/4/23-4/23/24)...has posted a 1.01 ERA (71.1IP, 8ER) over that span.
- ★ Won a career-high six straight starts from 4/4-5/2, posting a 0.68 ERA (40.0IP, 3ER) over that span.

**2025: Is 6-0 with a 1.11 ERA (56.2IP, 7ER) in nine starts this season...**...leads the Majors in ERA, is tied for first in wins (tied for first in AL) and pickoffs (four, first in AL), ranks fourth in opponents' SLG (.270, fourth in AL) and opponents' OPS (.520, fourth in AL), seventh in opponents' OBP (.250, sixth in AL) and WHIP (0.94, sixth in AL), eighth in opponents' BA (.190, sixth in AL), tied for eighth in innings pitched (tied for fifth in AL) and 10th in groundball percentage (52.2%, fourth in AL)...is also tied for seventh in the AL in HR/9.0IP (0.48).

- ★ **His 1.11 ERA is the lowest by a Yankee through his first nine starts of a season** (since 1913 when ER became an official stat).
- ★ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his nine starts and 1ER-or-fewer in seven of those starts...**has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in seven of his last eight starts (since 4/4), posting a 0.87 ERA (52.0IP, 5ER) in that span.**
- ★ **Is one of three pitchers in franchise history (excluding openers) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first nine starts of a season** (since ER became an official stat in 1913), joining Michael Pineda (first nine starts in 2014) and Lefty Gomez (first nine starts in 1937)...Chad Green also did so in his first 11 starts as an opener in 2019.
- ★ **Among pitchers to debut with a team since 1913 (when ER became an official stat in both leagues), is just the second pitcher to go 6-0-or-better and post an ERA of 1.11-or-lower in his first nine starts with a franchise**, joining Los Angeles-NL's Max Scherzer (7-0 and 0.78 ERA in 2021) - confirmed by *Elias*.
- ★ His nine starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Texas' Tyler Mahle's 10 such starts.
- ★ Has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in each of his nine starts.
- ★ Has allowed only 3HR to 228BF, posting a 0.48 HR/9.0IP ratio this season.
- ★ **Did not allow an ER in 27.1IP from 4/15-5/7...was longest single-season streak by a Yankees starting pitcher in the last 51 years (since 1975)**...the last Yankees starter to record a longer single-season streak without an ER was Rudy May's 30.2 inning streak from 7/10-8/18/74.
- ★ **Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in six of his last seven starts (since 4/9)...has also tossed at least 7.0 innings in three of his last five starts (since 4/20) and four of his last seven (since 4/9)**...his four starts of at least 7.0IP are tied for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Boston's Garrett Crochet (five) and San Francisco's Logan Webb (five).
