Didier Fuentes

The 21-year-old right-hander enters the second half of the season with an active 32.1-inning homerless streak, the eighth-longest active streak in the National League.

Among NL pitchers with as many appearances, Fuentes' 1.83 ERA in relief is fifth-best behind Robert Suarez (ATL, 0.56), Mason Miller (SD, 0.91), Jhoan Duran (PHI, 1.38) and Dylan Lee (ATL, 1.47).

In his 30 career outings as a major-league reliever, Fuentes has never allowed multiple runs in a game...That 30-game streak is tied for the fifth-longest active in MLB.

TODAY'S GAME: In a matchup of two first-place teams, the Atlanta Braves and Texas Rangers duel for three games to commence baseball's second half...This is the only scheduled meeting between these two clubs this season.

 Prior to the All-Star break, the Braves went 3-3 on their six-game road trip to Pittsburgh (2-1) and St. Louis (1-2)...They won their last game on Sunday, 4-3, over the Cardinals.

 The Rangers swept the Braves across three games in Arlington last July...Atlanta's last win against Texas occurred here at Truist Park on April 20, 2024, in a series the Braves secured, two games-to-one.

 Atlanta and Texas have met for just 11 series and 33 total games...The Braves swept the first two series in 2002 and '03, before the Rangers won six straight sets from 2005-22...The Braves have played to a 15-18 record (.455) against Texas, its fourth-worst interleague record since 2002 behind Seattle (.419), Houston (.421) and New York (.431).

 RH Cal Quantrill is set to make his fifth start and 20th appearance of the season with a 3-1 record and a 3.11 ERA (16 ER/46.1 IP)...He owns a 2.12 ERA (4 ER/17.0 IP) as a starter and a 3.68 mark (12 ER/29.1 IP) as a reliever...The right-hander from Port Hope, Ontario, made two starts for the Braves last season and pitched to a 13.50 ERA (12 ER/8.0 IP).

CHRIS SALE: Will make his 18th start of the season with a 9-6 record and a 2.20 ERA (24 ER/98.0 IP)...Sale's ERA ranks third in Major League Baseball behind Jacob Misiorowski (MIL, 1.62) and Cam Schlichtler (NYY, 2.20).

 Sale has made 13 starts and 17 appearances against the Rangers in his career, going 9-2 with a 2.53 ERA (26 ER/92.1 IP)...His nine wins against Texas are his most against any team with which he's never shared a division...Since 2014, Sale's 1.32 ERA (9 ER/61.1 IP) against Texas is the best of any pitcher (min. 5 starts).

 Since joining Atlanta, Sale has only been charged with one loss in the second half of a season...Overall, he's 7-1 with a 2.16 ERA (25 ER/104.0 IP), 136 strikeouts and 21 walks...The Chicago Cubs dealt Sale his only post-break loss with the Braves, scoring three earned runs off him on September 10, 2025, to win, 3-2.

 Sale hasn't allowed more than three earned runs in 14 consecutive starts, the second-longest streak in MLB this season behind Misiorowski (18, active)...He hasn't allowed more than three earned runs in 16 totals starts this year, tied for the sixth-most such starts in the majors.

 Since 1968, only three pitchers have maintained a sub-3.00 career ERA while making at least 300 starts: Pedro Martínez (2.93 ERA, 409 starts), Clayton Kershaw (2.53 ERA, 451 starts) and Chris Sale (2.97 ERA, 329 starts).

HOME STRETCH: Atlanta enters the second half of the season with a 55-40 record, reaching that pre-break win total for the ninth time in club history...The team won its division in each of its previous eight seasons doing so.

 The Braves will begin a 67-game sprint to complete the 2026 regular season...The team is scheduled to play 17 straight games before its next scheduled off day on August 3.

 Overall, Atlanta is slated to play 67 games in 73 days to round out the regular season...The club lost a pair of off days to makeup games with Chicago-AL (August 20) and San Francisco (August 31).

 The Braves currently own the fourth-best record in Major League Baseball behind the Los Angeles Dodgers (61-36, .629), Milwaukee Brewers (59-37, .615) and Tampa Bay Rays (56-38, .596).

MICHAEL HARRIS II: Has hit in 10 of 12 games this month and carries a batting average of .309 (17-for-55) in July...He has collected three doubles, two homers, eight runs scored and 10 RBI this month.

 During last season's series at Texas, Harris II batted .727/.750/1.818 (8-for-11) with a 2.568 OPS, including two singles, two doubles, two triples and two home runs...He scored five runs and drove in three.

 Per StatsPerform, he became the only player in the modern-era history of MLB (since 1901) to have two hits of each type of hit in a single three-game series.

 All-time, Harris II owns a slash line of .257/.292/.409 across 364 games before the All-Star break, and a .306/.337/.522 line in 247 games following the break.

 Harris II has registered an exit velocity over 100 mph on 104 of his batted balls this season, the fifth most in the National League and eighth most in Major League Baseball...His hard-hit percentage of 51.1 ranks seventh in the NL (min. 350 PA).

HOME FRIDAYS: Atlanta remains undefeated on Fridays at home this season, going a perfect 8-0... Tampa Bay is the only other club without a home loss to start the weekend (8-0)...The Braves' last loss on a home Friday occurred on September 26, 2025, to the Pittsburgh Pirates.

 Atlanta's eight-game winning streak at home on Fridays ties its single-season franchise best, which it set in 1993...The club strung together 10 straight such victories spanning the 1931 and '32 seasons.

 The Braves are 13-3 (.813) on Fridays overall this year, the most wins and highest winning percentage in MLB.

 Individually, Michael Harris II (.404) and Austin Riley (.385) own the fourth- and sixth-best qualified Friday batting averages in MLB...Riley's .484 on-base percentage on Fridays is the third-best in the majors.

- Earned the start behind the plate in his first All-Star Game, catching three innings and going 0-for-1 at the dish. - Despite missing 23 games with an oblique strain, he is one of two Braves’ primary catchers in modern franchise history with 49 runs in 95 team games, joining Joe Torre in 1964 (55) and ‘66 (50). - Hit his first career grand slam in the ninth inning on July 5...He’s the first Braves catcher with a grand slam in the ninth inning-or-later since Brian McCann on July 25, 2008, at Philadelphia. - Slugged a leadoff homer in his first at-bat back from the IL on June 16...It traveled 473 feet, surpassing Nick Kurtz (ATH, 471 ft.) for the longest of the season...Was his third leadoff homer of the year, making him one of five primary catchers since at least 1974 to slug three leadoff homers in a season, the first since Mitch Garver with Minnesota in 2019. - Slashing .232/.445/.343 (23-for-99) on pitches out of the strike zone this season, compared to the league averages of .159/.385/.220. - Has been successful on 29 of his 40 (73%) ABS challenges behind the plate, the fifth-best rate among active catchers in MLB (min. 20 challenges).
