METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Thursday...On Wednesday, the Mets defeated the Cubs, 4-3...The Mets continue a 10-day, 10-game homestand (2-1) against the Cubs (2-1), Braves (four games) and Pirates (three games).

PROGRAMMING NOTE: As a reminder, Sunday's contest against the Braves has been moved to a 7:10 p.m. start and will be broadcast nationally on ESPN.

RANK AND FILE: The Mets feature five players on MLB Pipelines revised 2023 Prospect Rankings - Luisangel Acuña(#40), Drew Gilbert (#57), Jett Williams (#84), Ronny Mauricio(#93) and Kevin Parada(#96).

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 16-14 against the NL East this season...The team has posted a 3.99 ERA against their division, while hitting .243/.325/.398.

JEFF McHITS: In 18 games since July 21, Jeff McNeil is batting .290 (20-69) with 12 runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, four walks with a .364 OBP and a .435 SLG...In 24 games (101 plate appearances) following the All-Star break, McNeil has struck out seven times...He is batting .346 (120-347) in 96 games against NL East foes since the start of 2022...He is hitting .361 (30-83) against the Braves in that span.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso smashed his 35th home run of the season on Wednesday night...He has homered in three consecutive games, hitting four home runs in that span...Alonso became the first Met to record four seasons with 35 or more home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 35 home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the NL with 87 RBI.

HEY NINETEEN: Alonso is hitting .333 (24-72) with 14 extra-base hits, 25 RBI, 13 runs and a 1.187 OPS in his last 19 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18-19).

I DECLARE AN fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks ninth in the majors with a 4.4 fWAR...That is fifth-best in the National League...Since he joined the Mets in 2021, Lindor ranks fifth in the major leagues with a 15.4 fWAR.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Francisco Lindor owns a seven-game hitting streak, batting .440 (11-25) with six runs, two doubles, one home run, four RBI, three walks with a .500 OBP and a .640 SLG in that span...He has safely hit in 11 of his last 12 games, batting .409 (18-44) with 11 runs, three doubles, three home runs, seven RBI, six walks, with a .490 OBP, a .682 SLG and a 1.172 OPS.

LINSANITY: Over his last 44 games, Lindor is batting .304 (40-161) with 34 runs, eight doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 25 walks, 12 steals with a .400 OBP, a .565 SLG and a .965 OPS...Lindor has stolen 18 bases in 112 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are in a stretch where 19 of 25 games are at home...New York is 2-1 in that span...The Mets are 28-24 at home this season...The team has posted a 3.73 ERA in Citi Field...That is the fourth-lowest mark in the National League...This compares to a 4.93 mark on the road...The team's 52 games at home are the fewest in the majors.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost three straight to Atlanta...New York went 6-3 against the Braves at Citi Field last year.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Francisco Alvarez has hit 21 home runs this season...He joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Alvarez leads all major league catchers with 19 home runs playing that position and is second behind Arizona's Corbin Carroll for the rookie lead in homers.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 34-9 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 82 steals in 91 attempts...The team's 90.1 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 55 of their last 59 stolen base attempts.

JUST PEACHY: The Mets and Braves will play their second doubleheader against each other this season...The two teams split a twinbill on May 1, with the Mets losing game one, 9-8, and won, 5-3 in the nightcap...The two teams played two doubleheaders last year, on May 3 in New York and again on August 6 in New York...The Mets swept both twinbills...Prior to that, the Mets and Braves had split each of their previous three doubleheaders...The Mets have not been swept by the Braves in a doubleheader since they dropped both games on September 8, 2011 in New York.

DOUBLE DARE: The Mets are set to play their fourth doubleheader of the season tomorrow...The team split a twinbill on May 1 vs. Atlanta, were swept by the Tigers in Detroit on May 3 and swept a twinbill against the Guardians in New York on May 21...The Mets have played 27 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in 26 of those 27 twinbills over the last two years...New York has swept eight of their last 14 doubleheaders, including one this year and five DH sweeps last season.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1988, Gary Carter hit his 300th career home run, a solo shot in the second inning...The Mets would go on to defeat the Cubs, 9-6, at Wrigley Field...Dwight Gooden made the start, but was ineffective in his five innings...Terry Leach earned the win, allowing only three hits and striking out two in 3.0 innings...Lenny Dykstra and Kevin McReynolds added home runs as the Mets improved to 68-46 on the season.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Syracuse Mets defeated the Scranton-Wilkes Barre Yankees, 10-1, last night...RHP José Butto hurled 5.2 scoreless innings and allowed only four hits, walked one and struck out four in the outing...1B Luke Ritter went 2-3 with three runs, one home run, one RBI and two walks...The seventh round selected from the 2019 First-Year Player Draft has appeared in 55 games at Triple-A this season, batting .257/.381/.428 with 14 extra-base hits and 27 RBI.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

BACK IN THE BIG LEAGUES: On August 5 at Baltimore, Megill made his first outing in the majors since June 21 at Houston...The right-hander suffered the loss after allowing five runs over 4.2 innings on nine hits, zero walks and three strikeouts...Threw 102 pitches, one shy of his season-high.

BRINING THE HEAT AGAINST HOTLANTA: Tonight, Megill will make his eighth career appearance, seventh start against the Braves, his most against any single one opponent in his career...For his career against Atlanta, Megill is 1-1 with a 4.02 ERA (14 ER/31.1 IP), a 10.63 SO/9 rate and a 1.15 WHIP...Megill's last outing against the Braves came on May 1 at Citi Field in the second game of a doubleheader...The righty allowed three runs over 5.2 innings on four hits, three walks and four strikeouts...Megill started that outing with 5.0 shutout innings before surrendering a bases-clearing double in the sixth.

NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK: This season, Megill is 4-1 with a 2.79 ERA (12 ER/38.2 IP) in seven home starts this season...In nine road starts this season, Megill is 2-4 with an 8.20 ERA (34 ER/37.1 IP)...In 23 career home games (21 starts), Megill is 8-4 with a 3.95 ERA (48 ER/109.1 IP) and in 26 career road games (22 starts), Megill is 6-9 with a 6.08 ERA (70 ER/103.2 IP).

THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY: On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

COMBINED NO-NO: Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

OPENOR: Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: JOSÉ QUINTANA (0-3, 3.42)

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs over 6.0 innings and suffered the loss on August 6 at Baltimore...Allowed six hits, two walks and struck out a season-high six batters.

HOT STREAK: Quintana has not allowed a home run over his last 85.1 innings dating back to August 4, 2022...That is the longest active streak in the majors.
